BALTIMORE ORIOLES (13-28) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (23-16)

RHP Andrew Cashner (1-4, 4.84) vs. RHP Nick Pivetta (2-2, 4.15)

EDGE OF SEVENTEEN: The Orioles defeated the Tampa Bay Rays by a score of 17-1 on Sunday at Oriole Park...The 17 runs marked a season-high and the most scored in a game since scoring 18 runs on August 16, 2015 vs. Oakland...The Orioles notched 19 hits, marking a season-high and most since collecting 21 hits on August 25, 2017 at Boston...According to STATS, LLC., the Orioles became the fourth team in Major League history with a winning percentage of .300 or below to win a game by 15-or-more runs...The last team to do so was the Cleveland Indians, who had a record of 3-8 on April 18, 2009, when they defeated the New York Yankees, 22-4.

BLAME IT ON THE RAIN: Tuesday's scheduled game between the Orioles and Philadelphia Phillies was postponed due to inclement weather...The game will be made up on Thursday, July 12...The game time will be announced at a later date...Additionally, the start time for this afternoon's game against the Phillies has been moved from 12:35 p.m. to 12:05 p.m. ET due to the threat of inclement weather.

INTERLEAGUE INFO: The Orioles will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season including Philadelphia (four games), Washington (six games), New York Mets (four games), Miami (three games), and Atlanta (three games)...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the Orioles are 183-200...The Orioles went 8-12 in Interleague Play last season...Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history...The Orioles notched 12 Interleague wins in 2014 and 2015.

YOU'RE LOOKING AT THE MAN-NY: SS Manny Machado has hit safely in 33-of-41 games played this season...Machado currently ranks among league leaders in many offensive categories (see chart at right)...Additionally, his .431 on-base percentage ranks third in the AL and ranks third in the majors...His .669 slugging percentage ranks second in the AL and second in the majors...His 17 multi-hit games rank second in the AL and are tied for third in the majors...His 105 total bases rank second in the AL and are tied for second in the majors...His seven intentional walks lead the AL and rank second in the majors.

MORE ABOUT MANNY: SS Manny Machado went 2-for-4 with two home runs (one grand slam) and six RBI on Friday night...It marked his first grand slam of the season and the eighth of his career...Machado's eight grand slams ties him with Chris Davis for most in the majors since his debut in 2012...On Friday, he hit the 149th and 150th home runs of his career, becoming the youngest Oriole to collect 150 career home runs (25 years, 309 days old)...Prior to Machado, Eddie Murray was the youngest Oriole to reach 150 home runs at 26 years, 165 days.

THE COMPANY YOU KEEP: SS Manny Machado hit two home runs on Friday against the Rays for his fourth multi-home run game of the season and the 18th of his career...According to STATS, LLC., Machado ranks fourth all-time among American League hitters in multi home run games before turning 26 years old...He trails Hal Trosky (20), Jimmie Foxx (19), and Alex Rodriguez (19)...With his 18th career multi-home run game, Machado passed Joe DiMaggio (17).

DANDY DEBUT: RHP David Hess made his Major League debut in Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader and earned the first win of his career after holding the Rays to three runs on six hits with three strikeouts over 6.0 innings of work...Hess retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced (two singles)...With C Chance Sisco behind the plate, Hess' start marked the first time an Orioles pitcher made their Major League debut with a rookie catcher behind the plate since August 4, 2009 when LHP Brian Matusz made his debut on the mound and the starting catcher was rookie Matt Wieters...Hess became the first Oriole pitcher to start and win his Major League debut since RHP Mike Wright, Jr. did so on May 17, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-AL (7.1 IP, 0 R, 4 H, 6 K).

TAKE A CHANCE: In Game 1 of Saturday's doubleheader, C Chance Sisco cut Baltimore's deficit to 3-2 with an RBI double in the second inning, then tied the game with his steal of home on a double steal with 3B Jace Peterson, who stole second base...It marked Sisco's first career stolen base, and the first steal of home by an Orioles player since Seth Smith did so on May 4, 2017 at Boston...According to STATS, LLC., Sisco is the first Orioles catcher to steal home (since 1974, when such data is available)...He is the first catcher in the majors to steal home since Toronto's Russell Martin did so on June 2, 2015 at Washington...Sisco is the 39th catcher in the majors to steal home (since 1974)...Became the first Oriole to steal home for their first career stolen base since Cal Ripken, Jr. on May 31, 1982 vs. Texas.

KEEPING UP WITH JONES: On May 4, OF Adam Jones played in his 1,500th game with the Orioles and went 3-for-4 with a home run...He became the eighth player in Orioles history (since 1954) to reach the 1,500 games played mark...Jones joined Cal Ripken, Jr. (3,001 games), Brooks Robinson (2,896), Mark Belanger (1,962), Eddie Murray (1,884), Boog Powell (1,763), Brady Anderson (1,759), and Paul Blair (1,700) as players to appear in at least 1,500 games with the Orioles...According to STATS, LLC., Jones became the seventh active player to reach 1,500 games with his current team...Jones joined the O's in February 2008 when he was acquired from the Seattle Mariners along with RHP Chris Tillman, LHP George Sherrill, RHP Kam Mickolio, and LHP Tony Butler in exchange for LHP Erik Bedard.

GRAND CENTRAL STATION: OF Adam Jones hit his 253rd career home run as a center fielder on Thursday...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 253 homers hit while playing center field rank 13th all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails Mickey Mantle (432), Ken Griffey, Jr. (382), Fred Lynn (266), and Bernie Williams (261)...Willie Mays is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY: RHP Dylan Bundy tossed the Orioles 18th Quality Start of the season on Sunday...The Orioles 18 Quality Starts this season are tied for fifth in the American League...Bundy and RHP Kevin Gausman are tied for 14th in the American League with five Quality Starts each this season...Orioles starters have received just 94 runs of support this season, which is fewest in the AL and is tied for second-fewest in the majors...Overall, Orioles pitchers have received 173 runs of support this season, with is sixth-fewest in the AL.

CATCH THIS: On April 21, C Chance Sisco threw out three Cleveland baserunners attempting to steal...He caught LF Michael Brantley attempting to steal second base in the sixth inning, SS Francisco Lindor at second base in the seventh inning, and PR Rajai Davis at third in the ninth inning...Sisco has caught 8-of-17 would-be base stealers this season...It marked the first time an Orioles catcher had three catcher-caught-stealing in a game since C Matt Wieters caught three baserunners on August 25, 2012 vs. Toronto.

VS. PHILADELPHIA: The Orioles and the Phillies play the first game of four matchups between the two clubs this season...The Orioles will visit Philadelphia, July 3-4...The two clubs last played in 2015 and the Orioles won the season series, 3-1...Baltimore leads Philadelphia in the all-time series, 29-23, with the O's going 15-14 at home and 14-9 at Philadelphia...The Orioles defeated the Phillies to win the 1983 World Series in five games (4-1)...Former Orioles catcher and current MASN broadcaster Rick Dempsey was named the series MVP.

THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY: On this date in 1965, 19-year-old rookie RHP Jim Palmer entered in relief and earned his first Major League win, defeating the Yankees, 7-5, at Memorial Stadium...Palmer also slugged his first career home run, a shot to right field off RHP Jim Bouton.

DISABLED LIST: Seven Orioles are currently on the disabled list...OF Colby Rasmus (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7), INF Luis Sardiñas (lower back strain, retroactive to 4/29), RHP Darren O'Day (retroactive to 5/6, hyperextended right elbow), and RHP Chris Tillman (lower back strain, since 5/11) are on the 10-day disabled list...LHP Zach Britton (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15), RHP Gabriel Ynoa (right shoulder inflammation, retroactive to 3/26), and INF Tim Beckham (left groin strain, retroactive to 4/24) are on the 60-day DL.

THE SKIPPER: A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), Buck Showalter is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (635-597, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,517 career wins rank 23rd all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 635 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

QUICK HITS: Cashner will be making his ninth start of 2018...Spent the entire 2017 season with Texas, posting a record of 11-11 with a 3.40 ERA (63 ER/166.2 IP) in 28 starts...His 11 wins marked a career-high, and his 3.40 ERA was the ninth-lowest in the American League...Tossed 18 Quality Starts, which tied for 11th-most in the AL...Signed by the Orioles as a free agent on February 15, 2018.

LAST START: Cashner did not factor in the decision his last time out on May 9 vs. Kansas City...He tossed 6.0 innings, allowing three runs on six hits, one home run, with two walks, one intentional, and three strikeouts...Has surrendered at least one home run in seven of his eight starts...Received three runs of support, just the third time getting three-or-more this season...Threw 111 pitches, 72 strikes.

CAREER VS. PHILADELPHIA: Cashner will be making his eighth career start (14th appearance) against the Phillies...Last faced Philadelphia on May 17, 2017 while with Texas at home; he earned the win after tossing 7.0 innings, allowing two runs on eight hits, one home run, with one walk and two strikeouts...He holds a career 4-1 record with 2.55 ERA (14 ER/49.1 IP) in his first 13 games against them; Cashner's teams have gone 9-4 against the Phillies in games that he starts...In nine home games (four starts) Philadelphia, he is 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER/31.2 IP).

VS. NL EAST: This will be Cashner's 29th career start (50th appearance) and first this season against an NL East opponent...He has gone 11-10 with a 3.94 ERA (80 ER/182.2 IP) in his previous 49 games against the division...In 25 home games (13 starts) against the NL East, he is 8-5 with a 3.11 ERA (32 ER/92.2 IP)...He has gone 3-5 with a 4.80 ERA (48 ER/90.0 IP) in 24 road games (15 starts) against the division.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Cashner will be making his first start against an interleague opponent this season...In 26 career interleague games (19 starts), he holds a record of 6-9 with a 3.45 ERA (49 ER/128.0 IP)...He went undefeated in interleague play in 2017, going 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (5 ER/20.0 IP) in three starts.

RUNS WANTED: Cashner has received two-or-fewer runs of support in five of his eight starts this season...His 2.82 run support average is third-lowest in the American League and fifth-lowest in baseball...He has made 29 career starts in which he did not receive any run support...He has gone 35-10 in 61 career starts when receiving three-or-more runs of support, as opposed to being 3-49 in 84 career starts in which he received two-or-fewer runs of support...Cashner's 5.40 run support average in 2017 marked a career-high, as his 3.50 run support average from 2013-16 was the lowest in the majors over that span.

TROUBLE WITH THE LONG BALL: Cashner has surrendered 10 home runs on the season, including at least one in seven of his eight starts...The 10 home runs are tied for fourth-most in the American League...His 2.01 HR/9 average this season is the highest of his career and his career average is 0.92 HR/9...The most home runs he has allowed in a season is 19, done both in 2015 with San Diego and 2016 with San Diego and Miami.

CRACKING DOWN: Cashner has allowed nine hits with runners in scoring position through his first eight starts of the season, as opposing batters are 9-for-48 (.188) with RISP against him this year...With two outs and runners in scoring position, opponents are hitting .105 (2-for-19).

AT HOME: Cashner will be making his sixth start at home this season; he is 0-3 with a 5.46 ERA (17 ER/28.0 IP) in his first five starts at Oriole Park...Cashner went 5-5 with a 2.72 ERA (25 ER/82.2 IP) in 14 starts at Globe Life Park for Texas in 2017, the fifth-lowest home ERA in the AL...Cashner has gone 27-33 and posted a 3.00 ERA (159 ER/477.2 IP) in 116 career home games (71 starts).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Cashner has made three road starts this season, going 1-1 with a 3.78 ERA (7 ER/16.2 IP)...He has made 74 career road starts (122 appearances), going 16-35 with a 4.73 ERA (242 ER/460.0 IP)...Last season he went 6-6 with a 4.07 ERA (38 ER/84.0 IP) in 14 road starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Cashner will be making his second day start of the season...He lost his first day start on April 22 vs. Cleveland after allowing four runs on eight hits with two walks and seven strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work; the Orioles lost 7-3...Cashner has gone 1-3 with a 4.66 ERA (20 ER/38.2 IP) in seven night starts this season...For his career, he has gone 39-48 with a 3.87 ERA (303 ER/704.1 IP) in 167 night games (111 starts) compared to going 4-20 with a 3.78 ERA (98 ER/233.1 IP) in 71 day games (34 starts).
