TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** won the final game of the three game series and avoided what would have been their fifth series-sweep... are 8-8 in their last 16 at Target Field and are 3-3 on the six-game homestand...get back to .500 at home this year (20-20)...improve to 269-271 against the Rangers all-time and 146-122 at home vs. Texas...this was the Twins sixth shutout of the season and the third started by Berrios...entering today 10 teams had as many as six shutouts on the season.
- **JOSÉ BERRÍOS** earned his eighth win to improve to 8-5 on the season and 6-2 at home...has won his last six starts at Target Field...recorded 12 strikeouts a new career high...previously had recorded 11 strikeouts, three times, twice this season...his 12 strikeouts are the most in Target Field history by a Twins pitcher since Francisco Liriano had 15 strikeouts on July 13, 2012...is only the third Twins pitcher since 2010 to record 12 or more strikeouts (Scott Baker- 12, Francisco Liriano- 15)...his two walks mark the 14th time this season Berrios has walked two-or-fewer batters in a start.
- **EDUARDO ESCOBAR** (1-for-3) snapped an 0-for-12 with a double in the fourth inning...he leads baseball in double with 33, is four shy of tying Chuck Knoblauch (37) for the club record of doubles before the All-Star break.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (2-for-4) recorded a leadoff single in the fourth inning...since May 1, is now hitting .360 (72-for-200) with 14 home runs, 17 doubles and 38 RBI...leads the AL in hits and is tied for second in RBI over that stretch...recorded his 30th multi-hit game of the season, leading the team.
- **ROBBIE GROSSMAN** (2-for-3) scored the first run of the game for the Twins after a double to lead off the fifth inning...hitting .289 (41-for-142) in 42 career games vs. Texas...drove in a run in the sixth inning with a single, marking his 11th multi-hit game of the season.
- **BRIAN DOZIER** (1-for-4) with a single in the eighth inning has reached safely in six straight vs. Texas...hitting .333 (7-for-21) during the streak.
- **TREVOR HILDENBERGER** entered in the eighth inning and recorded three groundouts...since May 23 he has not allowed a run to score in 15 appearances across 17.0 innings with 15 strikeouts.
- **FERNANDO RODNEY** recorded his 17th save of the season and has now converted 14 of his last 14 save opportunities since May 1...is one save away from tying Rick Aguilera (318) for 20th on baseball's all-time list.

RANGERS NOTES:

- **THE RANGERS** lost the final of three against the Twins after taking the series win last night...drop to 34-45 on the season and 19-10 on the road...are 5-1 on their current six-game road trip after sweeping Kansas City...this loss ended their season-long win-streak at seven, was longest active win-streak in MLB...are 8-17 when they do not hit a homerun and 4-9 in series finales on the road.
- **BARTOLO COLON** suffered his fifth loss of the season, dropping to 4-5 on the season...is 3-3 on the road this season...allowed just one walk and struck out five in 7.0 innings, his longest start since May 26 vs. Kansas City and his longest road start since May 16 at Seattle.
- **SHIN-SOO CHOO** (1-for-3) extend his hitting streak to eight games, hitting .355 (11-for-31)...has now reached safely in 37 straight...hitting .326 (45-for-138) with 36 walks during the streak...marks the second longest on-base-streak in MLB behind Herrera of the Phillies with 40 games...is

longest single-season streak in Choo's career...recorded his 17th double of the season, entering the game ranked second most on the team behind Jurickson Profar with 19.

- **ADRIAN BELTRE** (1-for-3) is eight hits away from tying Dave Winfield on the all-time hits list for 20th.
- **ROUGNED ODOR** (1-for-3) extended his hitting streak with a single in the seventh inning to six games...hitting .304 (7-for-23) during the streak.
