ROSTER MOVE—Yesterday the Rays traded SS **Adeiny Hechavarria**, who was designated for assignment on Wednesday, and cash considerations to the Pirates in exchange for minor league RH **Matt Seelinger**, who will join Class-A Bowling Green...Seelinger, 23, went 1-3 with a 3.03 ERA (32.2-IP, 11-ER) and 52 SO in 28 apps this season for Class-A West Virginia...he converted all seven of his save opportunities and led the South Atlantic League with 25 GF, while his 14.33 SO/9 IP ratio would have ranked 2nd among the league's relievers if he pitched enough innings to qualify.

MEDICAL MATTERS—This morning in St. Petersburg, Dr. **Doug Carlan** surgically repaired a torn ligament in **Daniel Robertson's** left thumb...the procedure likely will end his season, with an estimated recovery time of 6-8 weeks...Robertson suffered the injury sliding into second base on Sat vs. CWS...**Chaz Roe** (left meniscus tear) threw a live BP session, totaling 25 pitches, yesterday in Port Charlotte...he will be re-evaluated today.

RAY MATTER—The Rays were swept over the weekend in a 3-game series against the White Sox, on the heels of a 3-game sweep over the Angels...all 3 losses in the White Sox series came by 1 run, and the Rays lost after allowing tie-breaking runs in the 10th, 9th and 9th innings...the losing streak has dropped the Rays to .500 for the 11th time this season, and they would need a win tonight to avoid falling below .500 for the first time since the end of play on July 6 at NYM (43-44)...the Rays are 7-9 since the All-Star break and 8-12 in their last 20 games, going 5-1 over that stretch against teams entering the series with a .500 record or better and 3-11 against teams entering the series with a record under .500.

- + The Rays have lost two of their last four home series (Marlins, White Sox) following a stretch of five consecutive series wins at home...they are 6-6 in their last 12 home games, after going 14-1 at home from June 11-July 11...this is the final series of a 9-game homestand against the Angels (3-0), White Sox (0-3) and Orioles...the end of this series concludes a stretch of 15 of 19 games at home.
- + The White Sox series was the seventh time this season the Rays were swept, and the fourth time in a series of 3 games or more...in addition to being swept seven times, the Rays have also swept eight series—meaning 41.7 pct. of their series have ended in a sweep.
- + Sunday's 8-7 loss marked the fourth time this season the Rays lost when scoring 7 runs or more, first since July 15 at MIN...it was their first such loss at home since June 30, 2016 vs. DET...six of the club's 11 losses since July 13 have come when scoring 5 runs or more, while they did this in only one of their 45 losses through July 12.

CLOSE SHAVES—The Rays are 20-26 (.435) in 1-run games this season, leading the majors in 1-run games (Mariners, 42) and 1-run losses (Mets, 21)...the Rays have played three consecutive 1-run games for the first time since June 26-29 vs. WAS/HOU (2-1), and lost three consecutive games, all decided by 1 run, for the first time since March 30-April 1 vs. BOS...the 46 1-run games are the most for a team through 112 games since the 2005 Nationals (46) and most for an AL team since the 1993 Royals (50), while the 26 1-run losses are the most for an AL team through 112 games since the 2015 Athletics (26)...41.1 pct. of Rays games have been decided by 1 run, compared to 27.7 pct. of games in the majors...46.4 pct. of their losses have come by 1 run, highest rate in the majors (Astros, 45.2 pct.).

- + For the record, only once in franchise history have the Rays lost four straight games, all by 1 run: July 22-26, 2016 at OAK/LAD.
- + The Rays are on pace for 38 1-run losses, which hasn't been done by an AL club since the 1968 White Sox (44)...the club record for 1-run losses in a single season is 30 (2015)...42.3 pct. of their 1-run losses have come against the Red Sox (1-6) and Mariners (0-5).
- + Since May 26, the Rays have played 33 games at home: 23 wins, 9 1-run losses, and 1 loss by 2 runs or more (July 24 vs. NYY, 4-0).

RAYS vs. ORIOLES—The Rays are 6-7 this season against the Orioles (2-1 at home, 4-6 at Oriole Park at Camden Yards)...the remaining 6 games in the season series are at home, as they host the Orioles again from Sep 7-9...the Rays were outscored, 84-51, and outhomered, 25-10, in the 10 games in Baltimore, and the 84 runs and 25 HR allowed were both their most all-time for a single season at a visiting venue...previous highs were 77 runs at Yankee Stadium in 2004 and 22 HR at Yankee Stadium in 2017...for the record, the Rays have allowed 90 runs and 26 HR in the season series—their highest marks against a single opponent in a season are 136

- runs in 2002 vs. TOR and 33 HR in 2003 vs. BOS and 2002 vs. TOR.
- + The last 3 games against the Orioles have resulted in 15-5, 11-2 and 11-5 losses...it is the first time in franchise history the Rays have allowed double-digit runs in three consecutive games against them, as well as the first time they've yielded 15+ hits in three straight.
 - + The Rays also lost, 19-1, on May 13 at BAL...they have lost by at least 9 runs three times in 13 games against the Orioles, while the margin of defeat has been 9+ runs once in their other 99 games.
 - + 20.5 pct. of the Orioles wins this season have come vs. TB.

OLD FRIENDS AS FOES—Tonight's encounter with **Alex Cobb** will mark the second consecutive game and 13th time in 113 games this season the team will face a starting pitcher who was a former Ray...they are 5-7 thus far in games started by Cobb (3-0), **Jason Hammel** (1-0), **Matt Moore** (0-1), **Jake Odorizzi** (0-1), **David Price** (1-3) and **James Shields** (0-2)...Cobb, Moore, Odorizzi, Price and Shields all rank among the Rays Top 10 in career ERA, wins, starts and strikeouts...min. 50 decisions, Cobb's .578 winning pct. (48-35) ranks 4th in franchise history behind Price (.636, 82-47), **Jeff Niemann** (.606, 40-26) and Moore (.582, 39-28)...while Cobb (14) and Shields (13) rank 1st and 2nd in the majors this season in losses, Cobb posted only one losing record in six seasons with the Rays (1-2 in 2016).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH—With his major league debut on Sun vs. CWS, **Brandon Lowe** became the 20th rookie used by the Rays this season, extending the club record (18, 2015) and breaking a tie with the Marlins for most in the majors...he became the 10th player to make his major league debut for the Rays this season, tied with the Angels, Mets, Orioles and Padres for the most in the majors, according to Baseball Reference.

- + Rays rookies have combined for 442 games, most in the majors ahead of the Phillies (427)...the Rays have used seven different rookies as the starting pitcher, totaling 43 starts, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Marlins (49)...the Rays have used a rookie starting pitcher in 11 of their 16 games since the All-Star break.
- + 17 players on the active roster have less than 2 years of service time, including 12 players with less than 1 year of service time...the only pitchers on the active roster with more than 2 years of service time are **Sergio Romo** (10.057) and **Blake Snell** (2.032).
- + The average age of the Rays active roster is 26 years, 8 months.
- + On Sun vs. CWS, five of the nine hitters in the starting lineup were rookies, and all three pitchers used by the club were rookies.

PITCHING POINTS—The Rays have a major-league-most 19 losses when yielding 3 runs or fewer—the next closest team is the Pirates (16)...this is already the 4th-most in a single season in franchise history; the club record is 24 (2014)...they also have a major-league-most 11 losses when yielding 2 runs or fewer—no other team has more than 8 losses when doing so...this is the 2nd-most in franchise history behind 2012 (12).

- + Rays starters have gone 3 IP or fewer 42 times this season, most by a team since Baseball Reference data is available (1908), ahead of the 1949 St. Louis Browns (40)...their starters have gone 2 IP or fewer 33 times, most ever by a team ahead of the 1977 Mariners (27).
- + No Rays starter has recorded a win since **Nathan Eovaldi** on July 8 at NYM...Rays starters are 0-6 in 23 games since then...the bullpen's 59 decisions are the most in the majors (Dodgers, 46).
- + 21 different pitchers have recorded a win for the Rays this season, most in the majors (Dodgers/Marlins, 20) and a single-season club record (20, 2017)...the Rays have used a major-league-most and club-record 15 different starting pitchers, as well as a club-record 31 different pitchers, 2nd-most in the majors to the Cubs (32).

MINOR MATTERS—Double-A Montgomery 1B **Nate Lowe** was named the Southern League Player of the Week for July 30-Aug 5 after batting .455/.586/.864 (10-for-22) with 3 2B, 2 HR and 6 RBI...he tied for the league lead over that span with 5 XBH and 19 total bases...in addition, Class-A Charlotte INF **Tristan Gray** was named the Florida State League Player of the Week after batting .296 (8-for-27) with 1 2B, 3 HR and 11 RBI.

- + Rays affiliates this season are 407-279 (.593), the best combined winning pct. for any organization...all nine affiliates have winning records, and seven of them are at least 10 games over .500.
- + Seven Rays prospects were listed among *Baseball America's* updated Top 100 prospects, including five players in the Top 50.

LAST START—On Wed vs. LAA, made his Rays debut, and his first start since Sep 13, 2017 at MIL (with PIT)...his only run allowed was a 1st-inning solo homer to **Kole Calhoun**, his second batter faced, and it was the first time in his career he allowed a homer on an 0-2 pitch...allowed a 1-out walk to **Mike Trout** in the 1st inning and a 1-out single to **Andrelton Simmons** in the 2nd inning...went 3 IP, the fifth time in 35 apps (1 start) he went at least 3 IP, and it was his fourth time this season reaching 5 SO...threw 70.8 pct. of his pitches for strikes, compared to 59.4 pct. of pitches for strikes with the Pirates...his line: ND, 3 IP, 2 H, 1 R/ER, 1 BB, 5 SO, 1 HR, 48 pit, 34 str.

THE NEW GUY—Was acquired from the Pirates on July 31, along with OF **Austin Meadows** and a player to be named, for RH **Chris Archer**...at the time of the trade, his 72 SO were 3rd among NL relievers to MIL **Josh Hader** (99) and COL **Adam Ottavino** (77), and his 19 relief apps of at least 2 IP were most in the majors, ahead of TB/ARI **Matt Andriese** (18)...his season highs are 3.2 IP and 73 pitches, April 19 at PHI.

- + Is 2-9 with a 7.07 ERA (76.1-IP, 60-ER), 46 BB and 74 SO in 18 career starts.
- + Is 1-1 with a 2.74 ERA (46-IP, 14-ER) in outings of 2 IP or more this season.

STANDING TALL—Is the fifth pitcher in club history standing 6'8" or taller, according to Baseball Reference, following **Jeff Niemann** (6'9"), **Adam Russell** (6'8"), **Mark Hendrickson** (6'9") and **Billy Taylor** (6'8")...Rays pitching coach **Kyle Snyder** is also listed by Baseball Reference at 6'8" and spent parts of five years in the majors.

MAKING THE LEAP—Made the Pirates Opening Day roster for a second consecutive season...has pitched to a 3.38 ERA (24-IP, 9-ER) and .217 opp avg. (18-for-83) in 16 apps (1 start) since June 15 vs. CIN...has pitched to a lower ERA in each calendar month this season: 4.70 in April, 4.30 in May, 4.20 in June and 4.09 in July.

- + Was ranked by *Baseball America* as a Top 50 prospect in the minors for four consecutive seasons (2014-17), including No. 16 entering the 2015 season and No. 14 entering the 2016 season...is 45-21 with a 2.02 ERA (593.1-IP, 133-ER) and 785 SO over parts of six minor league seasons, and 19-6 with a 1.95 ERA (245-IP, 53-ER) and 321 SO over three seasons at the Triple-A level.
- + Despite spending the first two months of last season in the Pirates rotation, his 140 SO for Triple-A Indianapolis ranked 3rd in the International League behind Durham's **Ryan Yarbrough** (159) and **Brent Honeywell** (152).

MIX & MATCH—Is one of 15 different starting pitchers used by the Rays this season, most in the majors ahead of the Angels/Athletics/Mets (12)...this is a club record for an entire season, passing 2004 (14) and 2003 (14)...the Rays used eight starting pitchers all of last season—in fact, the 15 starters this season are more than the team's total from the previous three seasons combined (14, 2015-17)...the Rays have used 31 different pitchers this season, 2nd-most in the majors behind the Cubs (32)...this is also a club record for an entire season, passing 2017 (30).

ON THE CLOCK—Was selected by the Pirates in the fifth round of the 2011 June Draft out of William S. Hart High School in Santa Clarita, Calif.—the same school that produced former Ray and 2011 All-Star **James Shields** and Indians All-Star **Trevor Bauer** (signed with UCLA).

- + Selected by Astros Manager **A.J. Hinch** to join the AL coaching staff for the All-Star Game for a second consecutive season.
- + Is in his fourth season as Rays manager...at age 40, is the majors' youngest active skipper—5 months younger than SD **Andy Green**.
- + His last ejection was July 18, 2017 at OAK, his seventh ejection as Rays manager...his 7 ejections are tied for 4th in franchise history.
- + Is the sixth Tampa-born manager in major league history, and second

- to manage the Rays...that list includes Hall of Famers **Al Lopez** and **Tony La Russa**, **Lou Piniella**, **Dave Miley** and **John Hart**.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, incl. parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10) and two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).
