HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ Arizona is 6-3 in its last 9 games since July 22.
- ♦ The D-backs are 4-5 in Interleague Play (2-2 @ Chase Field)... Arizona is 10-4 in their last 14 games vs. AL opponents at home since the start of last season.
- ♦ The D-backs are 13-21 all-time vs. Rangers...the clubs last played 2-game, home-and-home series in 2015.
- ♦ Arizona is 7-0 at home on "Teal Tuesday."
- ♦ Paul Goldschmidt is 1 home run shy of 200 for his career.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs dropped the series opener vs. Rangers, 9-5.
- ♦ Steven Souza Jr. went 1-for-4 with a home run (2) and 3 RBI... Eduardo Escobar was 2-for-4 with 2 RBI in his first game as a D-back @ Chase Field.
- ♦ Robbie Ray allowed 4 runs in 5.1 innings with 6 strikeouts.

TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

- ♦ The D-backs today made the following roster moves:
 - Acquired RHP Brad Ziegler from Miami in exchange for RHP Tommy Eveld...to make room on the 40-man roster, the D-backs transferred RHP Shelby Miller to the 60-day disabled list (R elbow inflammation).
 - Acquired LHP Jake Diekmann from the Rangers in exchange for RHP Wei-Chieh Huang...to make room on the 40-man roster, LHP Jorge De La Rosa was designated for assignment.
 - Recalled RHP Silvino Bracho from Triple-A Reno and placed LHP Andrew Chafin was place on the Paternity Leave List.

WELCOME BACK, BRAD!

- ♦ Brad Ziegler, who played for the D-backs from 2011-16 and was named to the D-backs' 20th Anniversary Team, owns numerous club career records, including the most wins (21), innings pitched (335.2) and appearances (348) by a reliever [min. 75.0 IP], and is second in ERA (2.49), sixth in opponent on-base pct. (.294) and tied for 11th in opponent average (.230).

FUN FACT: NOT AN OLD TIMERS GAME

- ♦ There are only 2 active Major League players to play in a game during the D-backs inaugural season in 1998, and both play for the Rangers: Bartolo Colón and Adrian Beltre.
- ♦ Beltre played in 5 games vs. Arizona for Los Angeles-NL in 1998, going 0-for-12.

COLÓN & HIS D-BACKS CONNECTIONS

- ♦ Bartolo Colón, who made his debut on April 4, 1997, is the only active player in baseball to appear in a Major League game before the D-backs played their inaugural season in 1998.
- ♦ Torey Lovullo was teammates with Colón in 1998 with the Indians, appearing in 6 games, including 1 start by Colón (Aug. 22, 1998 @ Orioles; L, 4 ER in 5.1 IP).
- ♦ Tim Laker, D-backs assistant hitting coach, was teammates with Colón in 2001 with Cleveland, and struck out in his only career at-bat vs. the right-hander.
- ♦ D-backs radio broadcaster Tom Candiotti and Colón pitched on the 1999 Indians.
- ♦ Ketel Marte, the youngest player on the D-backs active roster (born on Oct. 12, 1993), was 3 years old when Colón made his Major League debut.

- ♦ Steven Souza Jr. is batting .353 (18-for-51)/.431 OBP/.569 SLG with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 10 RBI and 6 walks in his last 14 games...he's also hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games, batting .387 (12-for-31)/.457 OBP/.581 SLG with 3 doubles, 1 home run and 9 RBI in that time.

- ♦ Arizona is second in the Majors with 81 first-inning runs, behind Colorado (82) and ahead of the Mariners (77).
- ♦ The D-backs also are tied with Red Sox for third overall in runs scored in the first 2 innings (131), behind the Rockies (149) and Indians (134).

A COUPLE OF DEFENSIVE STALWARTS

- ♦ Nick Ahmed is tied for the Major League lead with Andrelton Simmons/LAA with 12 defensive runs saved at shortstop, ahead of Addison Russell/CHC (11) and Dansby Swanson/ATL (11).
- ♦ Jeff Mathis leads all Major League catchers with 10 defensive runs saved, ahead of Buster Posey/SF (9), Austin Barnes/LAD (9), Tony Wolters/COL (8) and Austin Romine/NYY (8).

GOLDY A FAN OF INTERLEAGUE

- ♦ Paul Goldschmidt, over his last 21 Interleague games at home, is hitting .329 (25-for-76)/.427 OBP/.579 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 12 RBI and 12 walks.

D-BACKS STARTERS GOING 6.0

- ♦ When D-backs starters work 6.0+ innings, they are 32-11 with a 2.34 ERA (96 ER in 369.0 IP), .202 opponent avg. and 377 strikeouts (Arizona is 37-20).

THE EYES OF TEXAS USED TO BE UPON YOU

- ♦ D-backs bench coach Jerry Narron spent parts of 8 seasons on the Rangers' coaching staff, serving as third base coach from 1995-2001 and as manager from 2001-02.
- ♦ Arizona hitting coach Dave Magadan served in the same capacity for Texas for 3 seasons from 2013-15.

ON-DECK: SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS

- ♦ The D-backs are 5-7 vs. Giants this season (2-4 @ Chase Field).
- ♦ Arizona is 9-5 in its last 14 home games vs. San Francisco.
- ♦ Paul Goldschmidt is hitting .419 (18-for-43) with 7 doubles, 3 home runs and 9 RBI vs. Giants this season.

THURSDAY'S STARTER: RHP ZACK GREINKE (12-5, 2.96)

- ♦ Ranks among the NL leaders in wins (T-2nd) and ERA (5th).
- ♦ Is 6-0 with a 1.16 ERA (6 ER in 46.2 IP), .202 opponents average, 48 strikeouts and 5 walks in his last 7 starts since June 23.
- ♦ Is 12-2 with a 2.31 ERA (30 ER in 117.0 IP) in 18 career starts vs. Giants.
