**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers won their third straight game on Friday night with a 5-2 victory over the Blue Jays at Comerica Park. Blaine Hardy started for the Tigers and earned his second consecutive win, allowing two runs on three hits with four walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings. Shane Greene pitched a scoreless ninth for his 14th save of the season. Offensively, Nicholas Castellanos recorded his third straight three-hit game, including hitting his sixth homer of the season, while JaCoby Jones had a pair of hits and two RBI. The Tigers and Blue Jays play the second game of their three-game series this afternoon. Following this weekend's series vs. the Blue Jays, the 12-game homestand concludes on Monday with a doubleheader vs. New York (AL).

**CASTELLANOS, BOYD EARN MAY HONORS:** Nicholas Castellanos and Matthew Boyd have been selected as the Tigers Player and Pitcher of the Month, respectively, for May. Castellanos posted a .356 (37x104) batting average with 14 runs scored, 12 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 12 RBI in 26 games during the month. Castellanos had multiple hits in 12-of-25 games with at least one at-bat during the month, including six three-hit performances. He finished the month ranked tied for third in the American League in doubles, while he was seventh in batting average and ninth in hits. Boyd started six games in May, compiling a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He limited opponents to a .210 (25x119) batting average during the month and allowed three runs-or-less in five-of-six starts.

**SAINT NICK:** Nicholas Castellanos had three hits in last night's game to record his 23rd multi-hit game of the season and his 11th game with three-or-more hits. Castellanos has posted three hits in three straight games for the second time this season (other, April 21-25), becoming the first Tiger to have two separate three-game streaks with three-or-more hits since Gee Walker in 1937. He is tied for the Major League lead in three-hit games and tied for third in multi-hit games. Castellanos has hit safely in 18 of his last 22 games with at least one at-bat, hitting .391 (36x92) with 14 runs scored, 11 doubles, one triple, three home runs and 10 RBI during the stretch.

**THE CANDY MAN CAN:** Jeimer Candelario hit a RBI single in the second inning of last night's game, extending his streak of reaching base safely to 26 games. Over the 26-game stretch, which is the longest active streak in the Majors, Candelario is batting .280 (28x100) with a .385 on-base percentage, 22 runs scored, nine doubles, one triple, five home runs and 15 RBI.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE:** The Tigers hit two doubles in last night's game, marking the 48th consecutive game that Detroit has recorded at least one double. The streak is the longest by a Tigers team, and is the fourth-longest streak among all MLB teams since at least 1908. The 1996 Cleveland Indians have the longest streak in the last 110 years, recording a double in 75 straight games from May 30-August 19, 1996.

**THE HARDY BOY:** Blaine Hardy won his second straight start last night, tossing 6.0 innings and giving up two runs on three hits with four walks and three strikeouts. Hardy has allowed two runs-or-less in each of his four starts this season, posting a 2.82 ERA (22.1IP/7ER) with 16 strikeouts.

**EASY BEING GREENE:** Shane Greene picked up his 14th save of the season last night, working a scoreless ninth inning with one strikeout. Greene ranks third in the American League in saves and has successfully converted 11 of his last 12 save opportunities.

**LOOKING FOR THE LEFTY:** Today's game marks the 17th time this season that the Tigers will face a lefthanded starting pitcher. Detroit has gone 9-7 against lefty starting pitchers so far this season, and is hitting .279 (140x501) as a team against southpaw hurlers. The Tigers lead the American League with a .279 batting average vs. lefties, while they are second with a .341

on-base percentage and third with a .449 slugging percentage. Individually, Nicholas Castellanos leads the Majors with a .446 (25x56) batting average vs. lefties.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** The Tigers are 6-2 on their 12-game, 11-day homestand, which includes three games vs. Chicago (AL) (2-1), four games vs. Los Angeles (AL) (3-1), three games vs. Toronto (1-0) and two games vs. New York (AL) (June 4). Detroit is in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 18-of-21 games at home. The Tigers are 18-12 at Comerica Park this season, and have won 17 of their last 24 home games. The Tigers are hitting .274 (282x1028) as a team at home, while the pitching staff has compiled a 3.98 ERA (278.0IP/123ER).

**TIGERS AND BLUE JAYS:** The Tigers opened their season series against the Blue Jays with a 5-2 win last night. Along with the three games this weekend in Detroit, the two teams will also play a four-game series in Toronto from June 29-July 2. The Tigers went 3-3 against the Blue Jays last season, including a 2-1 record at home. The Tigers have not won a season series against Toronto since 2013.

**#VOTETIGERS:** Balloting for the 2018 All-Star Game, presented by MasterCard, is now underway. The 89th midsummer classic will be hosted on Tuesday, July 17 at Nationals Park in Washington, D.C.

**ABOUT MATTHEW:** Boyd will make his 11th start of the season today vs. Toronto.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Boyd earned his third win of the season on Monday vs. Los Angeles (AL), throwing 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts.

**VS. TORONTO:** Boyd, who was originally drafted by the Blue Jays in 2013, has faced his former team three times in his career, compiling a 0-1 record with a 3.86 ERA (16.1IP/7ER) and 15 strikeouts. His last start against Toronto was on July 9, 2016, when he received a no decision after allowing one run on four hits with two walks and six strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

**AT COMERICA PARK:** Boyd has made 33 career appearances, including 31 starts, at Comerica Park and has compiled a 10-9 record with a 3.97 ERA (177.0IP/78ER) and 134 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Boyd is 3-1 with a 1.84 ERA (29.1IP/6ER) and 24 strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE AL EAST:** Boyd has made 12 career starts against teams from the American League East, posting a 1-4 record with a 6.38 ERA (55.0IP/39ER) and 49 strikeouts. In two starts vs. AL East teams this season, Boyd is 1-0 with a 1.46 ERA (12.1IP/2ER) and 13 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN JUNE:** Boyd has started five games in his career during the month of June, compiling a 0-3 record with a 7.52 ERA (26.1IP/22ER) and 19 strikeouts.

**TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MAY:** Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after posting a 3-2 record with a 3.18 ERA (34.0IP/12ER) and 31 strikeouts. He allowed three runs-or-less in five of his six starts in May.

**AMONG THE AL LEADERS:** Boyd currently ranks tied for ninth in the American League with a 3.00 ERA (57.0IP/19ER) and .204 (41x201) opponents batting average.

**PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF:** After finishing the 2017 season on a strong note, Boyd has allowed three runs-or-less in eight of his first 10 starts this season. Over his last 14 starts dating back to September 12, 2017, Boyd has posted a 2.83 ERA (82.2IP/26ER) and 66 strikeouts. Among American League pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched during that time span, Boyd ranks seventh with a .199 (59x296) opponents batting average and ninth with a 2.83 ERA.

**IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018:** Boyd threw 6.0-or-more innings and allowed one run-or-less in each of his first three starts this season. He became the first Tigers lefthanded pitcher since at least 1908 to work at least 6.0 innings and give up one run-or-less in each of his first three starts of the season.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Lefthanded hitters have posted a .257 (67x261) career batting average vs. Boyd, while righties are hitting him at a .276 (299x1083) clip. In 10 starts this season, lefties are hitting .159 (7x44) against Boyd, while righthanded hitters are batting .217 (34x157).

**NEAR NO-NO:** Boyd came just one out shy of his first career no-hitter on September 17, 2017 vs. Chicago (AL). Boyd threw 8.2 no-hit innings before allowing a double to Tim Anderson. He completed the shutout, allowing just one hit and striking out five.

**STRONG FINISH TO 2017:** Boyd was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for September, 2017 after compiling a 1-3 record with a 2.95 ERA (36.2IP/12ER), 30 hits allowed, 11 walks and 30 strikeouts. Boyd ranked fourth in the American League with 36.2 innings pitched during the month, while he was 10th with a .216 (30x139) opponents batting average.

**NAMED A MINOR LEAGUE ALL-STAR:** Boyd was selected as a 2015 Minor League All-Star by *Baseball America*. In 19 starts in the minors in 2015, Boyd had a 9-2 record with a 1.65 ERA (114.2IP/21ER) and 108 strikeouts. He led all qualified starters in the Minor Leagues in WHIP (0.85) and opponent average (.176), while he was second in ERA.

**EARNING HIS FIRST BIG LEAGUE WIN:** Boyd picked up the first win of his Major League career in his Tigers debut on August 5, 2015 vs. Kansas City. Boyd allowed just one run on seven hits with two strikeouts in 7.0 innings vs. the Royals.

**MAKING HIS MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT:** Boyd made his Major League debut with the Toronto Blue Jays on June 27, 2015 against Texas. Boyd took the loss in the game, allowing four runs on nine hits with seven strikeouts in 6.2 innings. Boyd's seven strikeouts tied the Toronto record for most strikeouts by a pitcher making their debut as a starter (also, Mark Rzepczynski, July 7, 2009 at Tampa Bay). Also, his 6.2 innings pitched without issuing a walk were the most by a Toronto starter making their debut.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Boyd was acquired by the Tigers along with lefthanded pitchers Daniel Norris and Jairo Labourt from the Blue Jays on July 30, 2015 in exchange for lefthanded pitcher David Price. Boyd was selected by the Blue Jays in the sixth round of the 2013 MLB First-Year Player Draft. Boyd attended Oregon State University and helped the Beavers to the 2013 College World Series. He earned All-Pac-12 First Team honors and was named a third-team All-American by *Baseball America* as a senior.

**VS. TORONTO/AT COMERICA PARK:** Fulmer has faced the Blue Jays twice in his career, posting a 2-0 record with a 0.64 ERA (14.0IP/1ER) and eight strikeouts. His last start against Toronto came on July 15, 2017, when he threw 8.0 innings and gave up one run on two hits with one walk and three strikeouts. Fulmer has made 28 career starts at Comerica Park, compiling a 9-9 record with a 3.60 ERA (177.1IP/71ER) and 125 strikeouts. In five home starts this season, Fulmer is 0-3 with a 5.02 ERA (28.2IP/16ER) and 18 strikeouts.
