OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-29) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (25-37)

TUESDAY, JUNE 5, 2018 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT

ABOUT THE A'S: With a 5-1 win in Kansas City on Sunday, the A's took the three-game set from the Royals...out-scored Kansas City 25-6 for the series... set a new season high for margin of victory on Friday night with a 16-0 defeat of the Royals in Kansas City...also set a new season high for runs scored in an inning that night, plating seven in both the third and ninth innings... are now 31-29 for the season...went 5-10 (.333) over the first 15 games, 20-12 (.625) over a 32-game stretch from April 15-May 20, and are 6-7 (.462) in 13 games since then...the A's are 10-19 (.345) against American League West competition, 21-10 (.677) against all other teams...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 41st consecutive day and trail first place Seattle by 6½ games...that is one short of the season high of 7½ (last on May 25)...have spent one day tied for first, one day tied for second, two days tied for third, 56 days in fourth and seven days tied for fourth.

THE HOT CORNER: Athletics third baseman **Matt Chapman** leads all Major League third basemen in nearly every major defensive statistic...he ranks first in total chances (216)...Kyle Seger, SEA is in second place with 179 total chances...Chapman also ranks first in putouts (49), assists (159), assists per nine innings (2.69), range factor per nine innings (3.51), range factor per game (3.47), and zone rating (.868)...Chapman has 49 more chances and 38 more assists than Nolan Arenado (167 chances, 121 assists)...Chapman leads all players across all positions in defensive runs saved (15)...he has a consecutive games played streak of 140 dating back to last season...offensively, Chapman has nine home runs and 24 RBI in 60 games, including eight doubles and three triples...is getting on base at a .324 clip and has a slugging percentage of .422.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their current five-game road trip after taking a three-game set from Kansas City...went 4-6 on their most recent homestand against Seattle (1-2), Arizona (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-3)...have not lost more than six games on a homestand since June 30-July 9, 2006 (3-7)...went 7-3 on the last road trip to New York-AL (1-2), Boston (2-1) and Toronto (4-0), which was the A's first seven-win trip since April 7-16, 2014 (7-2)...now continue their five-game road trip to Kansas City (2-1) and Texas (two games)...these are the A's only five road games over a 25-game stretch from May 22-June 17...have now won seven of their last nine road tilts...are 15-15 at home (.500) compared to 16-14 (.517) on the road...are averaging 5.50 runs per game on the road compared to 3.47 runs per game at the Coliseum.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 32 runs over their last four games after scoring five runs over their previous four...out-scored Kansas City 25-6 during their three-game series at Kauffman Stadium...the A's scored 16 runs Friday night, matching their highest total of the season...recorded two seven-run innings as a part of the 16-run barrage...the previous season high for runs in an inning was six...the 16-0 win set a new high for margin of victory...were held to one hit on Wednesday night for the first time since July 31, 2015 against Cleveland (Danny Salazar, Cody Allen)...have 33 hits in the last three games after snapping a 10 game streak of seven or fewer hits, which was the longest such streak in Oakland history...are batting .240 for the season, which is fourth lowest in the American League...also have the fifth lowest on-base percentage (.311)...are averaging 5.50 runs per game on the road compared to 3.47 runs per game at the Coliseum.

SCORING POSITION: The A's are hitting .591 (13-for-22) with runners in scoring position over the first three games of June...had been 3-for-37 (.081) with runners in scoring position over the previous seven contests...hit .194 (37-for-191) with RISP in May after batting .271 with RISP in April...are now hitting .251 with RISP for the season, which is eighth best in the American League.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Have not committed an error in four straight games...their longest errorless streak of the season is five games (April 15-20)...had a season-high tying four errors Wednesday night (April 29 at Houston) and have 38 for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...are tied for the ninth most double plays (49) and tied for the fifth most unearned runs (23)...lead the majors with 634 assists...A's outfielders have five assists, which is the fewest in the AL...Oakland catchers have six passed balls, tied for sixth most in the American League.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.55 ERA (42 er in 148.0 ip) and .204 (108-for-530) opponents batting average over the last 16 games...overall, have the third

fewest walks per nine innings in the American League (2.71) and the third fewest strikeouts per nine innings (7.45)...lead the majors with 39 wild pitches...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.05 ERA (31 er in 91.1 ip) over the last 16 games...Oakland relief pitchers have thrown 214.1 innings this season, fourth most in the AL...they are also fourth with a 3.44 ERA and seventh with a .251 batting average against...lead the AL with a .684 winning percentage (13-6).

HOME RUNS: The A's have hit 22 home runs in 30 games at home compared to 53 home runs in 30 games on the road...lead the majors in home runs on the road and have the third fewest at home...28 of the A's 75 home runs have given Oakland the lead and the A's rank second in go-ahead home runs in the American League (New York (AL), 29)...are tied for third in the majors to Washington (31)...have homered in each of their last 17 games on the road...the pitching staff has allowed 42 home runs on the road, which is tied for second most in the majors...have allowed 28 home runs at home, which is sixth fewest among all Major League teams and second fewest in the American League.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND OTHER CLOSE CALLS: Seven of the A's last 13 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 2-5 in those games...are 10-7 (.588) in one-run games for the season...are 3-3 in extra inning games...are 6-3 in games decided in the last at bat...have three walk-off wins.

THE SEVENTH INNING OR LATER: The A's have compiled a 3.19 ERA (64 er in 180.2 ip) in the seventh inning or later, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have a 4.30 ERA (169 er in 354.0 ip) over innings one through six...are 23-0 when leading after seven innings and are one of two teams in the majors that has not lost a game when leading after seven (Milwaukee, 31-0).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 12-for-25 (48.0%) in stolen base attempts...have the lowest stolen base percentage in the majors, the fewest stolen bases and the third fewest attempts...opponents have stolen 43 bases, which is the third most in the American League, but they have been caught stealing 17 times, which is tied for the most.

A'S ON RADIO: Due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on 1550 AM: Wednesday at Texas and June 8 against Kansas City...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 4-3...won a three-game set in Texas April 23-25 after splitting a four-game series in Oakland April 2-5...the A's won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...have won 10 of the last 12 home games but have lost 12 of the last 19 road games...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 53-49 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 356-364 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 189-172 in Oakland and 168-192 in Texas...are 101-104 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 453-445 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Olson has four home runs and nine RBI in his last four games...in 20 games since May 14, Olson is hitting .288 with a .366 on-base percentage and a .685 slugging percentage (1.051 OPS), including eight home runs, five doubles, 15 RBI, and eight walks...**Stephen Piscotty** has doubled in five of his last seven games, giving him 14 on the year...is hitting .269 with a .462 slugging percentage over the last seven games, including five runs and four RBI.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENTS

In **1983** Rickey Henderson homers off Cleveland's Bud Anderson in the second game of a double header for the 2000th home run in Oakland A's history...in **2004** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game eight-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win against Toronto, snapping the A's major league record tying streak of seven consecutive no decisions by a starter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (5-6, 3.60 ERA)

LAST FIVE, FIRST SIX: Has allowed four runs or more in each of his last six starts after yielding two runs or fewer in each of his first six starts (including one run or fewer five times)...is 1-4 with a 7.18 ERA (24 er in 31.1 ip) and .295 (39-for-132) opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 4-2 with a 1.03 ERA and .134 opponents batting average over his first six starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has walked two batters or fewer in 11 of his 12 starts and ranks fourth in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (1.68)...is tied for fifth in wild pitches (6) and is fifth in hit batters (7)...is averaging the second fewest pitches per inning in the AL (14.6).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 9-for-71 (.127) with three walks and three hit by pitches (.195 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is second lowest in the American League and the batting average ranks third...eight of the 10 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...has a .153 (15-for-98) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .296 (29-for-98) the second time and .176 (15-for-85) after that.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in eight of his 12 starts this year and his season run support average of 3.36 (28 rs in 75.0 ip) is eighth lowest in the American League...has received two runs of support or fewer in each of his six losses this year (4 rs in 33.0 ip, 1.09 RSA) and 24 of his 25 career losses (24 rs in 126.1 ip, 1.71 RSA)...is 15-0 in 22 career starts with run support of four or more and 21-1 in 29 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-4 with a 3.69 ERA (16 er in 39.0 ip) and .188 (27-for-144) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 3-2 with a 3.50 ERA (14 er in 36.0 ip) and .234 (32-for-137) opponents average in six starts on the road...has allowed six of his 10 home runs on the road...is now 13-10 with a 3.76 ERA (76 er in 182.0 ip) in 32 career games at home, 11-15 with a 4.47 ERA (93 er in 187.1 ip) in 33 starts on the road.

BY INNING: Has allowed nine of his 32 runs in the fifth inning for a 7.36 ERA (9 er in 11.0 ip)...has a 3.59 ERA (19 er in 47.2 ip) over innings one through four and a 1.10 ERA (2 er in 16.1 ip) and .107 (6-for-56) opponents batting average from the sixth inning on.

NO-HITTER: Tossed the seventh no-hitter in Oakland history and the 12th in Athletics history on April 1 against Boston in Oakland...was named American League Co-Player of the Week for the week of April 16-22 along with Manny Machado for his efforts...it was his first Player of the Week award...his no-hitter was the earliest by date (Catfish Hunter, May 8, 1968 vs. Minnesota) and second earliest by game number (Chief Bender, May 12, 1910 vs. Cleveland, game 18) in Athletics history...it was the 10th no-hitter in Coliseum history (six by A's, four by opponents)...it was the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Tampa Bay...is the third Oakland pitcher to strikeout 10 or more in a no-hitter...Dave Stewart had 12 and Catfish Hunter had 11...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in Major League history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season...the last pitcher to no hit a team that led the majors in runs per game entering the game was the A's Dave Stewart, who did it against Toronto on June 29, 1990 (also Elias).

2018 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed one run in 7.2 innings in his first start on March 30 against Los Angeles (AL) and one run in 8.0 innings in his second start on April 4 against Texas to become the first A's pitcher on an Opening Day roster to start the season with back-to-back outings of seven innings or more and one run or fewer since Steve Karsay in 1994...won three consecutive starts from April 15 to 27 and allowed just two runs (one earned) on six hits over that stretch (0.39 ERA, .078 opponents batting average)...allowed two hits in seven innings at Seattle April 15 and then no-hit Boston on April 21 to become the first A's pitcher with back-to-back starts of seven innings or more and two hits or fewer since Barry Zito (July 9-15, 2005)...shutout the Red Sox 3-0 in the no-hitter...walked Betts to start the game but then retired 14 straight before Leon reached on a Semien error...set down the next 12 before walking Benintendi with two outs in the ninth...then got Ramirez to hit into a game-ending force out for his first career complete game...it came in his 59th game and 58th start and his streak of 57 consecutive starts without a complete game was fourth longest in Oakland history...walked two and matched his career high with 10 strikeouts...the shutout came in the A's 21st game of the season and it was the earliest shutout by an Athletic since Barry Zito on April 18, 2003 vs. Texas, the A's 17th game of the season...allowed a fourth-inning single to Correa in his first start after the no-hitter on April 27 at Houston, snapping his streak of consecutive hitless innings at an Oakland record 14.0 innings...broke the previous mark of 13.0 held by John "Blue Moon" Odom from June 1-7, 1968...opponents went 0-for-47 off him during the hitless streak...yielded four runs on six hits in a 4-1 loss at Seattle May 3 to snap a season-opening streak where he allowed two runs or fewer

and tossed five innings or more in each of his first six starts...that tied for the third longest such season-opening streak in Oakland history...it was the longest since Dave Stewart had a seven-game streak in 1990.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-0 loss on May 30 at the Coliseum...he lasted five innings, giving up four runs for the sixth consecutive outing...was just the fifth time the A's were shut out this season...RHP Carlos Ramirez threw two scoreless innings in relief of Manaea before Coulombe yielded two earned runs in an inning of work...the A's collected just one hit, a season low...Lowrie's seventh inning single was the only hit of the evening for Oakland.

MANAEA vs. TEXAS: Is 4-2 with a 3.51 ERA (48.2 ip, 44 h, 21 r, 19 er, 9 bb, 45 so, 4 hr) in seven career starts...is 3-0 with a 2.25 ERA (6 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 4.74 ERA (13 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in Texas...was 2-1 with a 3.71 ERA (17.0 ip, 13 h, 9 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in three starts last year...the loss came in an 8-1 decision at Texas April 9...struck out a career-high 10 batters in just 5.1

innings...became just the sixth pitcher in Oakland history to strike out 10 or more in fewer than six innings, the first since Rich Harden on Sept. 5, 2011 against Kansas City (10 so in 5.0 ip)...allowed a three-run home run to Gallo in the second inning...loaded the bases with one out in the sixth and was relieved by Montas, who allowed all three runs to score...picked up the win in the A's 8-3 victory on Aug. 26 in Oakland...allowed a two-run double to Beltre in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow in five innings of work...left after five innings with a 6-2 lead...won again on Sept. 28 at Texas in a 4-1 decision...the A's scored a run in the fifth and he allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the fifth when Calhoun reached on a Semien error and later scored on a Robinson single...Oakland scored twice in the sixth to take the lead for good.

2017 RECAP: Compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts...led the A's in wins, games started, innings pitched (158.2), strikeouts (140), hits (167), walks (55) and hit batters (10)...allowed a .268 opponents batting average, including .227 (30-for-132) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (137-for-491) against right-handers...had a .593 OPS against lefties, .809 against righties.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (6-4, 2.91 ERA): Was 4-1 with a 1.51 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in six starts in May and 5-2 with a 2.01 ERA and .210 opponents batting average over his last nine starts dating back to April 16...has the third lowest ERA in the American League since the 16th and the seventh lowest in the majors...has a 2.91 ERA overall, which ranks eighth in the AL...has issued just eight walks in 74.1 innings and his average of 0.97 walks per nine innings is the lowest in the majors (Mikolas, STL 1.00)...has a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.00, which is third best in the American League...also ranks fifth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.246)...tossed a two-hit shutout on May 26, a 3-0 A's win over Arizona (0 bb, 5 so)...has picked up the win in each of his last four starts, which is the longest winning streak of his career (1.20 ERA, .171 opponents average)...is 1-2 with a 3.09 ERA in four career starts against Texas spanning 23.1 innings of work.
