HERE'S THE STORY

- ♦ The D-backs are 21-11 (.656) since May 28, tied for the Majors' second-best record with the Astros, behind the Yankees (21-10, .677) and Mariners (22-11, .667) and ahead of the Dodgers (20-11, .645), Red Sox (20-12, .625) and Giants (20-12, .625).
- ♦ The D-backs have won 7 of their last 11 games, 15 of their last 23 games and 19 of their last 29.
- ♦ The D-backs took 2 of 3 @ Cardinals from April 5-8 and are 8-6 in the last 14 games since April 28, 2016.
- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano** has a franchise-record 25-game scoreless streak (22.1 IP) [SEE NOTE], also the Majors' longest active streak (by games).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt**, in his last 24 games, is batting .385 (37-for-96)/.482 OBP/.802 SLG with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 10 homers, 24 RBI and 17 walks...in his last 10 home games, is hitting .316 (12-for-38) with 3 homers, 6 RBI and 7 walks.
- ♦ **Robbie Ray** has a career-long 9-decision winning streak and is making his 100th career appearance (97th start)...returned from the disabled list for his last start, June 27 @ Marlins, and tossed 6.0 shutout frames (2 H, 2 BB, 6 K)...got a 3-1 win @ Cardinals on April 5, allowing 1 runs in 6.0 innings (2 H, 5 BB, 9 K).

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost vs. Giants, 9-6.
- ♦ **Jarrod Dyson** went 2-for-4 with 2 RBI, becoming the ninth player in D-backs history with at least 2 hits, 2 RBI and 2 stolen bases in a single game (last: Jean Segura, Aug. 19, 2016 @ Padres).
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** went 1-for-3 with a home run (18), 2 RBI and 2 walks...**Jake Lamb** was 2-for-4 with a double and 2 runs scored.
- ♦ **Zack Godley** (9-6) suffered his first loss since June 4 (7 R in 4.0 IP)...**Jorge De La Rosa** tossed 2.0 shutout frames

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ The D-backs reinstated OF **A.J. Pollock** from the 10-day disabled list (fractured left thumb), purchased the contract of RHP **Joey Krehbiel** (@JoeyKrehbiel), optioned RHP **Silvino Bracho** and INF/OF **Christian Walker** to Triple-A Reno, and released RHP **Troy Scribner**.
- ♦ **Krehbiel** (pronounced KRAY-bull) will wear No. 65 and be making his Major League debut...ranked among the Pacific Coast League leaders as a reliever in baserunners per 9.0 innings (2nd, 10.31) and opponent average (3rd)...in his final 19 appearances with the Aces, owned a 0.73 ERA (2 ER in 24.2 IP), including a 13-game scoreless streak (19.0 IP) from May 6-June 14...in 29 games with Reno, was 2-1 with a 2.45 ERA (10 ER in 36.2 IP), 44 strikeouts (10.8 SO/9.0 IP) and a .192 opponent average.

GOLDSCHMIDT NAMED NL PLAYER OF THE MONTH

- ♦ Today, **Paul Goldschmidt** was named NL Player of the Month for June, his first monthly award, and ninth by a D-backs position player (last: A.J. Pollock in April).
- ♦ Goldschmidt ranked among NL leaders in June in average (1st, .364), home runs (T-1st, 10), OPS (2nd, 1.199), RBI (T-2nd, 23), on-base pct (3rd, .460) and slugging pct. (3rd, .738).

THAT'S WHAT SPEED DO

- ♦ **Jarrod Dyson** went 2-for-4 with 2 RBI and 2 stolen bases yesterday vs. Giants, becoming the ninth player in D-backs history with at least 2 hits, 2 RBI and 2 stolen bases in a single game (last: Jean Segura, Aug. 19, 2016 @ Padres).

RAY GOING STREAKING + KEEPING IT "100"

- ♦ **Robbie Ray's** career-long 9-decision winning streak, spanning 15 starts since Aug. 24 of last season, is tied for the fifth-longest such streak in team history and longest since Patrick Corbin's 9-gamer from April 6-June 2, 2013.
- ♦ Ray has a 3.04 ERA (26 ER in 77.0 IP), .196 opponent average and 118 strikeouts as the team has won 13 of those 15 starts.
- ♦ Ray, who is making his 100th career appearance, ranks fourth among left-handed pitchers in Major League history with 625 strikeouts in his first 100 career games [source: Elias Sports Bureau] behind Herb Score/CLE (679), Frank Tanana/CAL (638), Scott Kazmir/TB (628) and ahead of Oliver Perez/SD-PIT (615).

- ♦ **Jeff Mathis** is hitting .342 (13-for-38) with 3 doubles, 5 RBI and 4 walks in 11 career games vs. Cardinals.
- ♦ **Jon Jay**, who played for the Cardinals in the 2010-15, is hitting .296 (16-for-54) with 7 RBI and 3 walks in 20 career games vs. Cardinals.
- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** has 5 doubles, 8 homers, 22 RBI and 26 walks in 40 career games vs. Cardinals.

YOSHI'S FRANCHISE RECORD SCORELESS STREAK

- ♦ **Yoshihisa Hirano's** 25-game scoreless streak (22.1 IP) established a franchise record, surpassing 24-game scoreless streaks by J.J. Putz (June 23-August 31, 2012) and Brandon Lyon (April 9-June 12, 2008).
- ♦ His 25-gamer is the longest active streak in the Majors.
- ♦ His streak is the tied for the second longest by a Japanese-born pitcher [source: Elias Sports Bureau]:

- ♦ The D-backs' 47 wins through 81 games tied for fourth most in team history with 2000 (50 in 2001, 48 in 2017, 48 in 2002).
- ♦ The D-backs' 3.40 ERA is the lowest at the 81-game mark in club history, narrowly edging out the 3.41 ledger in 2017.

FROM THE TRAINING ROOM

- ♦ **Randall Delgado** (strained left oblique) threw 1.0 scoreless inning with Triple-A Reno on Friday @ Tacoma.
 - In 13 rehab games at Triple-A Reno and Single-A Advanced Visalia, is 2-1 with a 3.06 ERA (5 ER in 14.2 IP), .160 opponent average (4-for-25) and 9 strikeouts.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** (strained right pectoral) went 2-for-3 with 2 triples, 2 RBI and 2 walks in his second rehab appearance for Triple-A Reno on Saturday @ Tacoma.
 - In 4 rehab games at Triple-A Reno and Single-A Advanced Visalia, is hitting .438 (7-for-16) with 1 double, 2 triples, 3 RBI and 3 walks.
