PITTSBURGH PIRATES (60-56) vs. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (57-59)

August 10, 2018 at AT&T Park, San Francisco, CA --- GAME #117/ROAD #55

RHP CLAY HOLMES (1-1, 3.65 ERA) vs. LHP DEREK HOLLAND (5-8, 3.88 ERA)

THE PIRATES... have won three straight games after dropping three in a row...Have gone 7-7 in their last 14 games after winning 11 in a row between 7/11-24...Have produced the best record in the National League (20-9) since July 7...Have won 18 of their last 25 games and have gone 24-15 in their last 39 games, dating back to 6/25 (tied for the third-best record in MLB in that time)...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following the action on 5/17 (26-17)...Were 58-58 after 116 games in 2017 (58-59 after 117).

ON THE MOUND: Clay Holmes is expected to make his third Major League start tonight and his fifth big league appearance...In his last start with the Pirates (7/1 vs. Milwaukee), Holmes tossed 6.0 scoreless innings while winning his first Major League game...He made his big league debut on 4/6 vs. Cincinnati and gave up one run in 2.0ip...Pittsburgh's ninth-round selection in the 2011 First-Year Player Draft, the 25-year-old Holmes went 7-3 with a 3.43 ERA in 17 games (16 starts) with Triple-A Indianapolis this season, which included a 4-0 record an 0.71 ERA (25.1ip/2er) in four June starts.

NONE BETTER: Among all left-handed hitters with at least 100 at bats over the last three years, Adam Frazier has the highest batting average in the Majors against LHP (35-for-105 - .333)...He went 2-for-3 last night off Andrew Suárez.

DEEP FREESE: Last night David Freese connected for his 100th career home run and his fourth since July 26...Beginning with the action on July 3, Freese is hitting .351 (26-for-74) with three doubles, a triple, five home runs and 20 RBI in 25 games.

THE MEN BEHIND THE MASK: The Pittsburgh catchers have combined to produce the highest OPS (.807) and best on-base percentage (.356) among all Major League teams...The 17 home runs hit between Francisco Cervelli and Elias Diaz from the catching position trail only the Yankees (22), Dodgers (21), Mariners (18) and Rangers (18) this season.

RISPY BUSINESS: Josh Harrison is hitting .385 (20-for-52) with runners in scoring position; the third-highest mark in the National League among players with at least 50 plate appearances...Since 6/26, Gregory Polanco has gone 14-for-31 (.452) with RISP; the second-best average in the N.L. in that time.

FRAZIER ON FIRE: Adam Frazier has gone 6-for-9 in his last two starts and has gone 13-for-25 (.520) in his first seven games this month...Since being recalled from Indianapolis on 7/25, Frazier has gone 19-for-41 (.463) with eight doubles, a home run and eight RBI while hitting safely in nine of his 13 games.

DIALED IN AT AT&T: The Pirates have gone 8-2 in their last 10 games played in San Francisco and are 10-3 at AT&T Park since the 2014 season...In the last 13 games played here, the Bucco pitching staff has posted a 3.32 ERA (114.0ip/42er) and has surrendered just four home runs (none in the last six games - 52.0ip).

START ME UP: In the last 10 games played on the road, the Bucco starting pitchers have produced a 2.20 ERA (65.1ip/16er) and have pitched at least 6.0 inning eight times...The starters have pitched at least 7.0 innings in four of the last six road games and into the seventh inning six times in the last 10...Overall (home and road), Pittsburgh starting pitchers have posted a National League-leading 3.12 ERA (173.1ip/60er) since July 7.

TAKING IT THE EXTRA MILE: Gregory Polanco leads all National League outfielders with 49 extra-base hits...Since June 25, Polanco's 22 extra-base hits rank fourth among all players in the senior circuit.

HAPPY RETURNS: Kyle Crick, who was one of the two players acquired from the Giants in exchange for Andrew McCutchen, has been scored upon just three times in his last 22 appearances (21.2ip/3er/25so - 1.25 ERA) and has been scored upon eight times in his 46 appearances overall this season...Crick has held right-handed batters to a .172 average.

RUNNING BUCCO: Starling Marte enters today's action ranked second among the National League leaders with 28 stolen bases this season, trailing only Washington's Trea Turner (31)...Since 1900, Marte's 209 career steals rank seventh on the club's all-time list - Barry Bonds is fifth with 251.

LOCKING IT DOWN: All-Star closer Felipe Vázquez has converted each of his last 16 save opportunities and has set the single-season club record for most saves by a left-handed pitcher (26)...Vázquez was named the N.L. reliever of the month for July and has surrendered just two runs while striking out 35 batters in his last 22 outings (21.1ip - 0.84 ERA).

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: After leading the National League in home runs (36) and batting .275 as a team during the month of July, the Bucs began the month of August hitting .215 with two home runs in the first five games...However, the Bucco hitters have gone 34-for-112 (.304) with six home runs and 24 runs scored in the last three games.

ERA MOVEMENT: Dating back to July 7, the Pirates lead the National League with a 3.05 ERA (257.0ip/87er) and a 20-9 record...Only the Athletics (2.84) have a lower ERA in the Majors in that time.

ROAD TRIP: The Pirates are 3-1 on this 10-day, nine-game road trip after winning two-of-three in Colorado and taking the first game here in San Francisco...The trip concludes with two games against the Twins following a day off Monday...The Bucs have won eight of their last 10 road games and have gone 13-7 in their last 20.

TREVOR WILLIAMS: The 26-year-old righthander is expected to make his 23rd start of the season tomorrow night...His last start was a 2-1 loss to Jack Flaherty and the Cardinals at PNC Park Sunday afternoon (5.0ip/9h/2r/2er/Obb/3so)...Has surrendered two runs in his last four starts (22.0ip) and had a streak of 21.0 consecutive scoreless innings end in his last start...Has been the starting pitcher in six of the club's 12 shutouts this season...Has posted a 2.92 ERA (92.1ip/30er) in his 16 starts following the All-Star break in 2017-18...Pitched 6.0 scoreless innings in his last road start...Has gone 1-3 in his last six starts on the road after winning each of his first two road assignments.
