YOU ALREADY KNOW IT'S ROCKTOBER

- The Colorado Rockies will play in the National League Division Series for the fourth time in franchise history, the first time since 2009 when they fell to Philadelphia in four games ... it will be their first postseason series against the Milwaukee Brewers ... it will be their second postseason series against a NL Central opponent, with their first postseason game against an NL Central opponent having come in Tuesday's 2-1 NL Wild Card Game victory over the Cubs.
- Colorado is in the postseason for the second consecutive season for the first time in franchise history ... have advanced to the postseason as a Wild Card in 1995, 2007, 2009 and 2017.
- Colorado entered the postseason via the second Wild Card with a record of 91-72 in 163 games, the third season in franchise history in which they reached 90 wins ... their .562 winning percentage is the second-best in franchise history (92-70, .568 in 2009).

WHERE THE WILD THINGS ARE

- The Rockies advanced to their first NLDS since 2009 by winning the NL Wild Card Game at Chicago-NL in 13 innings by a score of 2-1 on Tuesday night ... Tony Wolters recorded the game-winning RBI on a single in the 13th inning ... the Rockies did not have an extra-base hit past the sixth inning.
- It was the longest postseason elimination game by time and innings in Major League history.
- Kyle Freeland pitched 6.2 shutout innings, tied for the second-most innings pitched in Rockies postseason history (most: Ubaldo Jimenez, Oct. 12, 2009 Game Four of the NLDS) and the most scoreless innings pitched in Rockies postseason history.
- Per Elias, Scott Oberg became the first pitcher in Major League history to win a postseason game in which he faced at least four batters and struck out each batter he faced.

FULL AND BY

- Bud Black, in his 11th season as a manager (second season with Colorado), earned his first managerial postseason win in Tuesday's Wild Card game ...

is the first manager to lead the Rockies to the postseason in multiple seasons.

- As a player, Black appeared in two postseasons with Kansas City, in 1984 and 1985 ... was a World Champion in 1985.
- Bench Coach Mike Redmond was a World Champion with the 2003 Florida Marlins.

SEEN IT ALL

- 12 players on the Rockies' Division Series roster have appeared in postseason play in their career prior to 2018: Nolan Arenado, Charlie Blackmon, DJ LeMahieu, Scott Oberg, Chris Rusin and Trevor Story all made their postseason debuts with Colorado in the 2017 Wild Card Game ... players who have appeared in other postseasons include Wade Davis (2010-11 with Tampa Bay; 2014-15 with Kansas City; 2017 with Chicago-NL), Ian Desmond (2012, 2014 with Washington; 2016 with Texas; 2017 with Colorado), Carlos González (2009, 2017 with Colorado), Matt Holliday (2007 with Colorado; 2009, 2011-15 with St. Louis; 2017 with New York-AL), Chris Iannetta (2014 with Los Angeles-AL; 2017 with Arizona) and Gerardo Parra (2011 with Arizona; 2017 with Colorado).
- David Dahl, Kyle Freeland, Garrett Hampson, DJ Johnson, Ryan McMahon, Harrison Musgrave, Seunghwan Oh, Adam Ottavino, Antonio Senzatela and Tony Wolters are all on their first postseason roster.

ALGONQUIN FOR "THE GOOD LAND"

- Colorado went 2-5 against the Brewers in the regular season, 1-3 at home and 1-2 at Miller Park.
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.
- Brewers pitcher Jhoulys Chacin spent the first six years of his career with Colorado after signing with the Rockies as a non-drafted international free agent in 2004 ... he ranks eighth in franchise history in starts (109) and wins (38) and eighth with 514 strikeouts.
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.

HI, AGAIN...

- In the Rockies' three-game series at Miller Park Aug. 3-5, Trevor Story hit a home run in each game, including a two-home run game on Aug. 4 ... per Elias, he is the only Rockies player to ever hit home runs in each of three consecutive games in one series at Miller Park.
- Story's 1.222 slugging percentage against Milwaukee was the highest by any NL player against one team (min. 20 at.bats).

#28 NOLAN ARENADO, 3b

Career vs. Woodruff: .250-4-1-0-1

- Went 1-for-5 with a first inning RBI sacrifice fly in Tuesday's 2-1 Wild Card win at Chicago ... 2-for-10 with one home run and two RBI in two career Postseason games.
- Including Tuesday has recorded a hit in 10 consecutive games, his longest hitting streak of the season ... batting .341 (14-for-41) with four doubles, four home runs and nine RBI over the streak ... four homers over his last four games.
- Named an All-Star for the fourth consecutive season and a starter for the second straight year.
- Led the National League with 38 home runs, the third time in his career he has led or tied for the league lead in home runs, the first time he has won the home run crown outright ... 12th player in National League history to lead the league in home runs three or more times, the first since Mike Schmidt.
- Among National League leaders in home runs (38-1st), multi-hit games (57-1st), RBI (110-T2), slugging percentage (.561-3rd), extra-base hits (78-T3), runs (104-5th), doubles (38-T8), batting average (.297-10th) and on-base percentage (.374-12th) ... per *Baseball Reference*, ranked fifth among NL position players with 5.6 WAR.
- Is the second player in Major League history to record at least 35 home runs and 35 doubles in four consecutive seasons (also: Albert Belle, 1993-96).
- Fourth consecutive season with at least 30 home runs and 100 RBI, the fourth Rockies player with four such seasons (also: Todd Helton, Vinny Castilla and Larry Walker) and the third with four consecutive years (also: Castilla and Helton) ... is the ninth third baseman in MLB history with four 30/100 seasons, the fourth to do it in four-straight seasons (also: Castilla, Chipper Jones and Alex Rodriguez).

#19 CHARLIE BLACKMON, of

Career vs. Woodruff: .250-4-1-0-1

- Went 1-for-3 with one run and one walk in Tuesday's Wild Card game ... 1-for-7 (.143) with one run and one RBI in two career Postseason games.
- Appeared in his third career All-Star Game, his second in a row.
- Led the NL with 119 runs scored, his second-straight season leading the National League in runs ... tied for fourth in the league with a team-high 182 hits and finished tied for seventh with 51 multi-hit games.
- Third straight season with at least 100 runs scored and 25 home runs ... joins Willie Mays and Duke Snider as the only NL center fielders to do so.
- Hit for his first career cycle, the ninth cycle in Rockies history, in the 162nd game of the season, the first cycle in the last game of the season in MLB history.
- His 17-game hitting streak Sept. 8-25 tied for the longest hitting streak in the National League in 2018 and the longest by a Rockies player since David Dahl's 17-game streak in 2016.
- Has 14 career hitting streaks of 10 or more games in his career, including three in 2018, the third-most such streaks in club history behind Todd Helton (25) and Larry Walker (17) ... his 13 double-digit hitting streaks since 2015 are the most in MLB.

#26 DAVID DAHL, of

Career vs. Woodruff: N/A

- Went 0-for-6 in Tuesday's Wild Card game, his first career Postseason game.
- Batted .287 (25-for-87) with nine home runs and 27 RBI in the September ... third in the NL in RBI, tied for third in the league in home runs in the month.
- Named the National League Player of the Week for Sept. 24-30 ... batted .333 (10-for-30) with six home runs.
- Homered in five consecutive games Sept. 24-28, the fourth player in franchise history to record a home run in five or more games, joining Dante Bichette (Aug. 1-5, 1995), Larry Walker (June 18-23, 1999) and Nolan Arenado, who homered in a franchise record six-straight games Sept. 1-5, 2015.
- Batted .272 (43-for-158) with eight doubles, one triple, 12 home runs and team-leading 35 RBI in 45 games after his Aug. 5 recall.

#20 IAN DESMOND, inf-of

Career vs. Woodruff: .500-2-1-0-1

- Went 1-for-5 with two strikeouts Tuesday in Chicago ... career .259 (15-for-58) hitter with two RBI in 14 career Postseason games.
- Appeared in a team-high 160 games in his second season with the Rockies.
- Second on the club with 20 stolen bases and fourth with 22 home runs, his fifth career 20/20 season ... ranked third on the club with 88 RBI, the eighth Rockies player (11th time) in franchise history to record 20 home runs, 20 stolen bases and 80 RBI in a season.
- Recorded a team-high 49 RBI on the road, tied for eighth in the NL.
- Career-high eight triples tied for third in the NL.

#5 CARLOS GONZÁLEZ, of

Career vs. Woodruff: .333-3-1-0-0

- Is a career .542 hitter (13-for-24) in the Postseason (six games), including 1-for-2 in Tuesday's game ... went 10-for-17 (.588) with one home run in his only Division Series appearance in 2009 vs. Philadelphia.
- Appeared in 132 games in his 10th season with the club, tied for the second-most seasons in franchise history (also: Larry Walker, Troy Tulowitzki, Aaron Cook) behind Todd Helton's 17 seasons.
- Finished the season ranking second in franchise history in games (1,247) and at-bats (4,586), third in hits (1,330), runs (769) and extra-base hits (543) and fourth in home runs (227), RBI (749) and multi-hit games (371).
- Recorded his seventh season with at least 15 home runs, tied for the third-most in franchise history.

#1 GARRETT HAMPSON, inf

Career vs. Woodruff: N/A

- Appeared in 24 games across three stints with the Rockies in his first Major League season.
- Contract purchased from Albuquerque on July 21 and made his Major League debut at Arizona starting at second base that night ... first hit an RBI double in the fifth inning.
- Started five games at shortstop and five games at second base ... hit safely in eight of his 10 starts, batting .313 (10-for-32) with a .421 OBP.
- Stole 37 bases with five caught stealing between Hartford and Albuquerque ... in 305 career Minor League games, has 123 stolen bases and 23 caught stealing.

#7 MATT HOLLIDAY, of

Career vs. Woodruff: N/A

- Went 1-for-3 with a double Monday in Chicago ... in 74 career Postseason games has batted .246 (70-for-285) with 13 home runs ... hit .435 (10-for-23) with one home run in six LCS games vs. the Brewers as a member of the 2011 World Champion St. Louis Cardinals.
- Signed by the Rockies to a Minor League contract on July 29 ... had his contract

selected from Triple-A Albuquerque on Aug. 23.

- Hit safely in 10 of his 14 starts, batting .273 (12-for-44) with one double and one home run.
- Went 3-for-9 (.333) with one double, one home run and one RBI as a pinch-hitter.
- Pinch-hit home run in the seventh inning Aug. 25 vs. St. Louis to snap a scoreless tie in his fourth game back with the Rockies ... it was his second career pinch-hit home run (also: Sept. 30, 2016 vs. Pittsburgh).

#22 CHRIS IANNETTA, c

Career vs. Woodruff: .500-2-1-1-1

- Went 0-for-3 with two strikeouts Tuesday vs. the Cubs ... is 1-for-18 with one home run in six career Postseason games.
- Appeared in 110 games in his first season with the Rockies since spending the first six seasons of his career with the Rockies (2006-11) ... 110 games played his most since appearing in 115 games with Los Angeles-AL in 2011.
- Made 83 starts at catcher with the Rockies going 45-38 ... posted a 4.35 catchers ERA in 753.1 innings behind the plate.
- Batted .277 (13-for-47) with a .452 on-base percentage in September, the fourth-best OBP in the National League in the month.
- With 11 home runs, became the first Rockies catcher to record four seasons with at least 10 home runs.

#9 DJ LeMAHIEU, 2b

Career vs. Woodruff: .600-5-3-0-0

- Went 1-for-6 with a first inning double Tuesday ... 1-for-11 in his two Postseason appearances.
- Hit a career-high 15 home runs in 128 games played, his fewest games played since appearing in 109 games in 2013.
- Hit 11 of his 15 home runs on the road ... 15 home runs the second-most by a second baseman in franchise history (Clint Barmes, 22, 2009) while his road home runs were the most at the position.
- Of his 15 home runs 12 were go-ahead home runs, the second-most on the club ... five of those home runs were in the seventh inning or later, the most on the Rockies and the second-most in MLB behind Khris Davis' six such home runs.
- Had three stints on the disabled list with three different injuries, his first career stints on the 10-day DL.

#24 RYAN McMAHON, inf

Career vs. Woodruff: N/A

- Entered Tuesday's game as a defensive replacement in the 11th inning and went 0-for-1 in his first career Postseason action.
- Made 21 starts at first base, eight at second and eight at third base ... hit .238 (31-for-130) with seven doubles, one triple, two home runs and nine RBI.
- Went 8-for-37 (.216) as a pinch-hitter with one double, two home runs and six RBI.
- First player in franchise history to hit a game-winning home run in the seventh inning or later in consecutive games Aug. 10-11 vs. the Dodgers ... two-out, three-run walk-off home run Aug. 11 ... two-run home run in the seventh inning Aug. 10.
- Four of his five home runs came in the seventh inning or later.

#8 GERARDO PARRA, of

Career vs. Woodruff: .750-4-3-0-0

- Went 1-for-2 with a walk Tuesday ... is 4-for-24 (.167) with one RBI in seven career Postseason games.
- Appeared in 142 games with the Rockies, his most in his three seasons with the club and his most in a single season with one club since playing in 156 games with Arizona in 2013.
- Batted .393 (11-for-28) as a pinch-hitter, the third-highest average in the NL ... 11 pinch-hits tied for fourth in the NL.
- Hit .326 (31-for-95) with runners in scoring position, the best average with RISP on the club and the ninth-best in the NL.
- Ranked first in the NL with a .366 (30-for-82) average with RISP from May 1 through the end of the season.

#27 TREVOR STORY, inf

Career vs. Woodruff: .000-3-0-0-1

- Scored the game-winning run in the 13th inning Tuesday reaching base with a two-out single ... went 3-for-6 with a double and is now 5-for-10 with one double and one single in two Postseason games.
- Hit seven home runs and recorded 18 RBI in seven games against the Brewers this season, the fifth player in franchise history with seven or more home runs against a non-divisional opponent in a single season ... his 18 RBI against the Brewers was tied for the fourth-most in franchise history against a non-divisional opponent and he became the first player in franchise history with four games of at least four RBI against a single opponent within a season.
- Homered in his first career All-Star appearance, the third player in franchise history with an All-Star Game home run.
- In his third Major League season, ranked among National League leaders in extra-base hits (85-1st), home runs (37-2nd), slugging percentage (.567-2nd), doubles (42-T4), RBI (108-T4), stolen bases (27-6th), hits (174-10th) and multi-hit games (51-T7).
- First shortstop in MLB history with at least 40 doubles, 30 home runs and 25 stolen bases ... 16th player (19th time) to reach those numbers, the third Rockies player to do so (Larry Walker, 1997 and Ellis Burks, 1996)
