WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost five of the last seven games and 14 of the last 20 as they continue a season-long, 10-game trip tonight with the series opener at Houston.
- LHP Carlos Rodón is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high matching 26 games under .500.
- The Sox are 2-4 on this trip, losing two out of three at both Texas and Cincinnati.
- Following this four-game series at Minute Maid Park, the White Sox will return to Guaranteed Rate Field for a five-game, six-day homestand vs. St. Louis (7/10-11) and Kansas City (7/13-15).
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) and 0-3 on their last trip to Cleveland.

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Chicago is 2-7 in its last nine road games (outscored 73-41).
- The White Sox have hit 17 home runs in the last 12 games after hitting just six in the previous 16 contests.
- The Sox have lost three straight games vs. Houston and five of the last six ... they have scored three runs or less in all six contests, and one or less four times.
- Carlos Rodón is 1-0 with a 1.71 ERA (5 ER/26.1 IP), 20 strikeouts and three walks in four career starts (four QS) vs. Houston ... he has allowed two earned runs or less in each game.
- Avisail García owns a career-high, 14-game hitting streak (since 4/22), hitting .377 (23-61) with three doubles, two triples, six home runs, 10 RBI, a 1.184 OPS and six multihit efforts ... he has hit five home runs over his last nine games.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Cincinnati overcame an early three-run deficit by scoring six runs in the fourth inning and went on to a 7-4 win.
- The White Sox took a 3-0 lead on Yoán Moncada's two-run home run in the third and Daniel Palka's solo shot in the fourth.
- The Reds responded by scoring six runs in the bottom half, including six consecutive batters reaching base safely.
- Covey suffered his fourth loss after allowing six runs on five hits over 3.2 IP ... five Sox relievers combined to allow just one unearned run on three hits with six strikeouts in 4.1 IP.
- Avisail García extended his career-high hitting streak to 14, Cincinnati native Adam Engel recorded Chicago's only multihit effort and Yolmer Sánchez was 1-4 with a double and RBI.

SIGNED, SEALED, DELIVERED

- The White Sox today signed INF Nick Madrigal, their first-round pick (No. 4 overall) in the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, to a minor-league contract with a \$6,411,400 signing bonus.
- Madrigal hit .367 (.66-180) with eight doubles, six triples, three homers, 34 RBI, 41 runs scored, 15 stolen bases, a .428 on-base percentage and .511 slugging percentage in 42 games as a junior in 2018 to help Oregon State win the national championship.
- He is scheduled to make his professional debut tonight with the Arizona Rookie League White Sox.

HE'S ON FIRE ... AVI-OUSLY

- Avisail García is currently on a 14-game hitting streak, the longest of his career, longest active and tied for the sixth-longest in MLB this season ... it is the longest streak by a White Sox in a season since Tim Anderson from 9/9-24/17 (15 games).
- He is 15-33 (.455) with three doubles, two triples, four homers and six RBI in his last seven games, and 20-55 (.364) with six home runs and nine RBI in 13 games since returning from the DL.

PITO STILL FIRST AT FIRST

- José Abreu continues to lead American League first basemen in fan balloting for the Major League Baseball All-Star Game ... voting ends tonight at 10:59 p.m. CT.
- Per MLB's latest update, Abreu currently leads Houston's Yuli Gurriel by approximately 213,000 votes.
- Starters/reserves will be announced this Sunday on the ASG Selection Show pres. by Camping World at 6 p.m. CT on ESPN.
- He would be the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan-elected as a starter, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit nine home runs over the last five games and 17 in the last 12, including five multihomer efforts.
- Daniel Palka and Avisail García have combined to hit six of the Sox last seven home runs since Monday.
- Palka's home runs were estimated at 428, 448 and 432 feet, and García's at 376, 414 and 431 feet (MLB Statcast).
- Palka is tied for eighth in MLB with an average distance of 419 feet per home run this season ... he ranks third among rookies in the AL and is tied for fourth in MLB with 10 homers this season.

WHITE SOX VS. HOUSTON ASTROS

- Houston leads the season series, 3-0, after recording a sweep from 4/20-22 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Astros outscored the White Sox, 27-2, in the three games.
- The Sox are batting .167/.257/.233 (15-90) with one home run and own a 9.00 ERA (27 ER/27.0 IP) with zero QS in 2018.
- The Sox have lost five of the last six games but are 6-5 in the last 11 and 12-9 in the last 21 ... Chicago is 6-5 in the last 11 games at Minute Maid Park.
- The Sox went 4-2 in 2017, including a 3-0 mark in Chicago.
- Chicago is 29-26 all-time, going 19-14 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 10-12 in Houston (9-10 at Minute Maid Park).
- Avisail García is a career .301 hitter (25-83) with three doubles, three homers and 10 RBI in 24 career games vs. the Astros.

WINDY AND SPACE CITY CONNECTIONS

- The White Sox swept the Astros in the 2005 World Series to capture the franchise's first championship since 1917.
- Houston's first-base coach, Álex Cintrón played for the White Sox from 2006-07.
- Gary Pettis, the Astros' third-base coach, served as the Sox first-base and outfield coach from 2001-02.
- Houston RHP Chris Devenski was selected by Chicago in the 25th round of the 2011 MLB First-Year Player Draft.

HEADING EAST, WAY EAST

- Chicago today released RHP Donn Roach for the purpose of allowing him to sign with a professional team in Japan ... he was named the International League Player of the Month for June.
- Roach went 9-2 with a 2.65 ERA (28 ER/95.0 IP) in 16 games (15 starts) this season with Class AAA Charlotte, his first in the White Sox organization ... he signed as a free agent on 1/24.

WILD WILD WEST

- The White Sox are 7-13 vs. the American League West in 2018, going 5-8 at home and 1-5 on the road ... they have won six of their last 11 games after losing eight of the first nine.
- Chicago has lost five of the last six games and 11 of 15 on the road against the division ... the club has scored four runs or less 10 times and allowed seven-plus eight times.
- The Sox are 185-167 vs. the West since 2008 (77-94 on road).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .352 (44-125) with six doubles, one home run, 14 RBI and 13 multihit efforts in 34 games since 6/1 ... they have hit safely in 29 contests.
- Narváez (1st, .377) and Smith (2nd, .333) lead all American League catchers in average since 6/1 (min. 55 PAs) ... Narváez also leads MLB and Smith is tied for second (Kurt Suzuki).
- Narváez owns seven multihit efforts and has hit safely in 13 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 17 of his 18 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.

BULLPEN BREAKDOWN

- The Sox bullpen has allowed a run in eight straight games, recording a 5.01 ERA (18 ER/32.1 IP) and .218 opp. average.
- Joakim Soria has made 15 straight scoreless appearances (15.1 IP), converting all eight save chances with just seven hits allowed, two walks and 18 strikeouts.
- Rookie Jace Fry owns a 2.63 ERA (8 ER/27.1 IP) with 33 strikeouts and a .146 (14-96) opp. average in 27 games in 2018.
- Xavier Cedeño has allowed just one earned run over 14 relief appearances (15 SO/11.2 IP) since joining the White Sox on 6/7.

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox rank second in the major leagues this season with 27 triples (Arizona is first with 31) ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their most since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez leads MLB with nine triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox lead MLB with 68 stolen bases in 2018... the Sox are on pace to steal 128 bases, which would be their most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB in steals since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 19 steals in 2018.

30/30 THREAT

- Tim Anderson (13 HR/19 SB) is one of six players in MLB this season with at least 13 homers and 13 steals, joining Javier Báez, Andrew Benintendi, Mookie Betts, José Ramírez and Mike Trout.
- Anderson is on pace for career highs with 24 home runs and 36 stolen bases ... the 24 homers would be the sixth-highest total by a White Sox shortstop, and the 36 steals would be the most since Ozzie Guillén in 1989 (also 36).

RODÓN AT A GLANCE

- The 25-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season, fourth on the road and first against Houston.
Is 0-5 with a 5.49 ERA (25 ER/41.0 IP), 45 strikeouts, 16 walks and a .252 (40-159) opponents average over his last seven road starts dating back to 7/9/17.
His 405 career strikeouts are the most by a White Sox pitcher in his first 71 career games ... is averaging 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (403.1 IP) lifetime ... has struck out 10-plus seven times in his career.
Started the 2018 season on the disabled list to continue his rehabilitation from left shoulder surgery ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis ... went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
Was selected in the first round (third overall) in the June 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of North Carolina State University ... was the highest pick by the Sox since taking outfielder Harold Baines first overall in 1977.
Entered the 2014 draft rated by Baseball America as the No. 1 college prospect and the No. 3 prospect overall ... was rated by MLB.com as the No. 2 overall prospect.

LAST START

- Suffered his third loss of the season on 6/30 at Texas, allowing five runs on six hits over 5.1 IP ... walked two and struck out three ... recorded his 400.0 IP after tossing 2.0 scoreless IP to begin the game.
Surrendered solo home runs to Joey Gallo in the third inning and Ryan Rua in the fifth ... allowed a three-run double to Robinson Chirinos in the fourth.
Departed with the Sox trailing, 5-3, in the sixth ... threw 89 pitches (53 strikes) ... the Sox lost 13-4.

HE GONE!

- Has averaged 9.04 strikeouts per 9.0 IP (405 SO/403.1 IP) over his career, the 12th-best mark in the AL since 2015.
Has recorded 10-plus strikeouts seven times in his career, including a career-high 11 on four occasions: 8/4/17 at Boston, 7/25/17 at the Cubs, 9/25/16 at Cleveland and 8/11/15 vs. Los Angeles-AL.

QUALITY IS KEY

- Made his first quality start of 2018 in on 6/24 vs. Oakland.
Six of his 12 starts last season were quality, including five straight from 7/30-8/21/17.
Made 17 quality starts in 2016, going 9-3 with a 2.16 ERA (26 ER/108.1 IP) in those outings ... recorded 16 quality starts in 2015, the most among American League rookies and second-most among major-league rookies behind Cincinnati's Anthony DeSclafani (17).
Recorded 10 consecutive quality starts from 8/11/15-4/13/16 ... went 6-3 with a 1.73 ERA (13 ER/67.2 IP), 61 strikeouts and a .202 (48-236) opponents average during that span.
Is 21-8 with a 2.44 ERA (80 ER/294.2 IP) in 45 career starts when working at least 6.0 IP (40 QS).

LOCKDOWN ON LEFTIES

- Is limiting lefties to a .228 (81-355) average with six home runs in his career ... right-handers are batting .267 (315-1,180) with 46 homers.
Charlie Blackmon, Jackie Bradley Jr., Robinson Canó, Joey Gallo, David Ortiz and Corey Seager are the only lefties to homer off Rodón.

CARLOS ON THE MEND

- Made four rehab starts during his stint on the disabled list: one with Class A Kannapolis and three with Class AAA Charlotte ... received a no decision in his only start with Kannapolis on 5/19 vs. Hickory ... allowed one run on three hits with no walks and six strikeouts over 5.0 IP ... went 1-0 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), five walks and 22 strikeouts over three starts with Charlotte ... opponents hit .222 (10-45).

2017 REVIEW

- Began the 2017 season on the disabled list with left biceps bursitis ... went 2-5 with a 4.15 ERA (32 ER/69.1 IP) and 76 strikeouts over 12 starts before going back on the disabled list with left shoulder inflammation ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left shoulder on 9/27/17.
Made five straight quality starts from 7/30-8/21-1 and pitched into the eighth inning or later in three straight starts for the first time in his career from 8/4-16
His streak of 90 consecutive batters faced without issuing a walk ended on 8/16 at Los Angeles-NL ... matched his career high with 8.0 IP on 8/10 vs. Houston
Struck out 10-plus batters for the seventh time in his career and third time in 2017 on 8/4 at Boston ... joined Sale (five times) and Jake Peavy (twice) as the only Sox pitchers since 2012 to record 11-plus strikeouts with zero walks in a game.
Posted a ND on 7/30 vs. Cleveland despite allowing one run over 6.2 IP ... matched his career high with 11 strikeouts over 4.0 IP on 7/25 at the Cubs ... according to STATS, became the first pitcher since at least 1913 to work 4.0 IP or fewer in a start or relief appearance and record 11 strikeouts or more.
Earned his first win on 7/3 at Oakland, allowing two runs on four hits over 6.1 IP ... made his season debut on 6/28 vs. the Yankees (L; 0 ER/5.0 IP; allowed three unearned runs).

VS. HOUSTON ASTROS

- Is scheduled to make his fifth career start against Houston and second at Minute Maid Park ... is 1-0 with a 1.71 ERA (5 ER/26.1 IP), 20 strikeouts and a .262 (27-103) opponents average lifetime ... all four of his starts have been quality.
Received a no decision in his last start on 8/10/17 at home, allowing two runs on nine hits over a career-high 8.0 IP ... received a no decision in his only start in Houston on 8/10/17, allowing three runs (one earned) on eight hits over 6.1 IP.

TOMORROW'S SCHEDULED STARTER

- RHP Reynaldo López (4-5, 3.68) is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season, 11th on the road and second against the Houston Astros.
Is 2-1 with a 2.63 ERA (7 ER/24.0 IP) and .222 (20-90) opponents average over his last four road starts.
Earned his fourth win in his last start on 7/1 at Texas, allowing two runs on seven hits and three walks with six strikeouts over 6.1 IP ... the Sox won, 10-5.
Is receiving a 3.95 run support average (44 RS/100.1 IP) this season, the 15th-lowest in the AL.
Will make his second career start against the Astros and first at Minute Maid Park ... received a no decision in his only start on 4/22 (1 ER/5.0 IP).
