OAKLAND ATHLETICS (3-4) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (2-5)

THURSDAY, APRIL 5, 2018 — OAKLAND COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two of the first three games of this series after losing three of four to Los Angeles (AL) to start the season...are 3-4 after seven games for the second consecutive season and third time in the last four years...the series loss to the Angeles marked the eighth consecutive year the A's lost or split the first series of the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 4119-3850 (.517) record over the previous 50 seasons in Oakland...only four teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8834-9322 (.487) in their previous 117 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-4 on the first homestand of the season, an eight-game stand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-1)...leave following the game today for the first road trip of the season, an eight-game jaunt to Los Angeles-AL (three games), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

PITCHING: The A's walked just one batter last night and have issued one free pass or fewer in four of the first seven games...have walked a Major League low 11 batters in 65.0 innings, an average of 1.52 walks per nine innings...however, have surrendered a ML high 65 hits and have a .258 opponents batting average, which is third highest in the American League...are tied with Arizona for the ML lead in wild pitches (7)...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea picked up the first win by an A's starting pitcher last night...starters had been 0-4 to start the season, which marked the second time in Oakland history A's starters lost at least each of their first four decisions (went 0-7 to start the 1979 season)...starters have allowed six runs in the first three games of this series (6 er in 18.0 ip, 3.00 ERA) after surrendering 16 runs in the four-game series against the Angels (6.04 ERA).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (26-for-96) in the first three games of this series after hitting .229 in the season-opening four game series against Los Angeles (AL)...are batting .246 overall, which ranks fifth in the American League...rank second in the AL in walks (27), tied for second in hit by pitches (4) and fourth in on-base percentage (.332)...are tied for second in most strikeouts (66)...are 4-for-26 (.154) with runners in scoring position against the Rangers after hitting .310 with RISP against the Angels.

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...after this eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas, the A's have an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16...are scheduled to play 11 games over the first 11 days of the season...then have two off days over the next four days (April 9 and 12) and will play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 14-16-2 (.469) this spring, which was the fifth worst record in the Cactus League...it marks the third consecutive year Oakland has finished with a losing record during the spring...this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have posted a losing record in at least three consecutive springs...also did it in three straight years from 2009-11 and four straight from 1974-77...the A's defense turned 39 double plays, which was second most in the majors (Atlanta, 42)...committed 24 errors, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL...the offense ranked third in the CL in fewest strikeouts (25), but were fourth in lowest on-base percentage (.325) and fewest doubles (59) and fifth in lowest batting average (.261)...tied with Houston for the Major League lead in sacrifice flies (16) and also tied for the fewest hit by pitches (8)...hit 44 home runs, which were the most by an A's team during the spring since 2004 when they had 50...the pitching staff has

compiled a 3.82 ERA (83 er in 195.2 ip) over the last 22 games after posting a 7.45 ERA over the first 10 contests...surrendered 38 home runs, which tied for fourth fewest in the CL, but issued 114 walks, which tied for second most.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 13 pitchers and 12 position players for the second consecutive year...10 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster and 10 other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year...two were signed as a free agent (Lucroy, Petit), and three were acquired in a trade (Buchter, Pagán, Piscotty)...the A's had no rookies on the Opening Day roster...Santiago Casilla had the most service time with 10 years and 148 days...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.56 years...Matt Olson, who turned 24 on Opening Day was the youngest player...Santiago Casilla was the oldest at 37 years, 255 days and is the oldest player on an A's Opening Day roster since Bartolo Colón in 2011 (38 years, 309 days).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only two played for the A's prior to the 2015 season (Casilla, Lowrie)...however, both of those have played for other teams since then and neither were with the A's in 2015...only two players have been on each of the A's last four Opening Day rosters (Graveman, Semien)...Bruce Maxwell and Matt Olson, who were drafted in 2012, have the longest interrupted tenure with the A's organization.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): today against Texas, Saturday and Sunday at Los Angeles (AL) and next Tuesday at Los Angeles (NL)...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A'S vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 2-1...the loss Tuesday night snapped Oakland's nine-game Coliseum winning streak against the Rangers, which is their longest home winning streak against Texas (previous: 8, June 17, 2003-April 6, 2004)...it is their longest Coliseum winning streak against any team since a nine-game streak against Minnesota from Aug. 21, 2012-Aug. 9, 2014...won the season series last year, 11-8...went 8-1 in Oakland and 3-7 in Texas...the eight home wins match the A's most ever against the Rangers (8-2 in 2001, 8-1 in 2003)...over the previous five seasons, the A's have won the season series in odd numbered years and the Rangers in even numbered years...are 51-47 against Texas dating back to the start of the 2013 season...are 354-362 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 188-171 in Oakland and 166-191 in Texas...are 99-103 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 451-444 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Matt Chapman has three straight multiple hit games for the first time in his career (6-for-12, .500) and is tied for the Major League lead with four multiple hit games...**Khris Davis** is a .302 (42-for-139) career hitter with 18 home runs and 38 RBI in 40 career games against Texas...the home runs and RBI are his most against any team...**Blake Treinen** has converted 13 straight save opportunities dating back to last season...his last blown save came on Aug. 4, 2017 at Los Angeles (AL).

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1993** Eric Fox hits the first Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history as the A's defeat the Detroit Tigers, 9-4...in **1994** Terry Steinbach hits the second Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history, but the A's lose 11-7 at Milwaukee.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-1, 7.94 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the 23rd of his career...it his 13th career start in a day game...is in his third season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

HOME AND AWAY: Took the loss in his first start last Saturday here in Oakland and allowed six runs in 5.2 innings...is now 0-9 with a 6.57 ERA (45 er in 61.2 ip) in 12 career starts in the Coliseum compared to 5-3 with a 4.12 ERA (27 er in 59.0 ip) in 10 starts on the road...his nine-game career-opening home losing streak is second longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1908...the longest is 11 by Bobby Hasty from Sept. 11, 1919 to Aug. 11, 1921...it is tied for the second longest home losing streak in Oakland history with Matt Keough, who also lost nine straight from Sept. 27, 1981 to July 9, 1982...Keough holds the Oakland record for consecutive home losses with 14 from July 14, 1978 to Aug. 8, 1979...went 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA in three starts at home last year, 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA in four starts on the road.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Trout in the first and two more runs, one earned, in the third...also yielded a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth...was relieved by Hendriks with two outs and runners on first and second in the sixth and the A's trailing 4-0...Hendriks allowed both inherited runners to score.

MENGDEN vs. TEXAS: Is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 15 h, 6 r, 5 er, 5 bb, 20 so, 2 hr) in three career starts...the win came in his only start last year on Oct. 1 in a 5-2 A's win at Texas...tossed 7.0 shutout innings and allowed just four hits while striking out eight...

retired each of the first 12 batters before Beltre singled to start the fifth...allowed just two baserunners to advance into scoring position...his other two start came in 2016...the loss came in a 5-1 decision in Oakland on June 16...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth...the no decision came in a 7-6 loss at Texas on July 25...allowed a solo home run to Desmond in the bottom of the first and a RBI double to Wilson in the fourth...then yielded a two-run single to Odor in the fifth and was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the fifth inning, runners on first and second, and the A's leading 5-4...Rzepczynski got the final out but Beltre hit a two-run walk-off home run off Madson.

0-0 with a 0.00 ERA in two starts with the A's affiliate in the Arizona Rookie League...walked just nine batters in 43.0 innings (1.88 per nine innings) with the A's for a .268 on-base percentage...went 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA and .371 opponents batting average in two starts during his first stint from May 29 to June 3...then went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .189 opponents batting average in five starts after returning to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded...his ERA during his second stint was fifth lowest in the American League over that span.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .187 (14-for-75) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .268 (22-for-82) against left-handers...issued seven of his nine walks to righties...allowed a .176 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position...had a .179 opponents average the first time through the lineup, .257 after that...his career splits are .208 (38-for-183) the first time through the lineup, .301 (88-for-292) after that.

THIS AND THAT: Had a 0.64 ERA in innings one and two, a 4.34 ERA from the third inning on...his career numbers are 2.05 (10 er in 44.0 ip) in innings one and two, 7.28 (62 er in 76.2 ip) from the third inning on...tied for fifth in the AL in complete games (1)...made five of his seven starts during the day...has made 12 of his 22 career starts in day games...the A's went 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments after going 3-11 (.214) in 2016.

MORE 2017: Began the season on Oakland's 10-day disabled list after fracturing his medial tibial sesamoid bone while throwing a bullpen at home Jan. 31...had surgery on his right foot Feb. 8 at Houston Methodist Hospital...the surgery, which involved a sesamoidectomy, was performed by Dr. Kevin Varner...made three rehab starts before he was reinstated from the DL and optioned to Nashville May 20...was recalled for the first time May 29 and allowed three home runs in 3.1 innings for the loss that day at Cleveland...it is the only time in his career he allowed more than one home run in a start...allowed four runs in 4.2 innings in his next start June 3 against Washington and was 0-1 with a 10.13 ERA in two starts when he was optioned back to Nashville June 3...returned to Oakland Sept. 5 when the Sounds season concluded and went 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA in five starts...including 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA in September...ranked fifth in the AL in ERA in September...tossed his first career complete game and the A's only complete game of the season a two-hit shutout in a 4-0 win at Philadelphia Sept. 15...did not walk a batter to become the 14th pitcher in Oakland history to allow two hits or fewer in a shutout and not walk a batter...struck out seven while tossing a career-high 118 pitches...tossed seven scoreless innings in his next start Sept. 20 at Detroit for the first winning streak of his career...it was his first career victory in 10 starts during the day...did not walk a batter and joins Catfish Hunter (Sept. 5-9, 1974) and Bartolo Colon (May 26-31, 2013) as the only A's pitchers since at least 1913 with back-to-back games of seven or more innings and no runs or walks...did not allow a run in the first three innings of his next start Sept. 26 against Seattle for a career-high and A's season-high 19.0-inning scoreless streak...tossed seven scoreless innings to defeat the Rangers in the final game of the season Oct. 1 at Texas...finished the season with a 23.0-inning scoreless streak on the road, which is two short of the Oakland record of 25.0 set by Gene Nelson (Aug. 21, 1989-April 25, 1990) and matched by Dennis Eckersley (June 5, 1990-April 16, 1991).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Gossett (0-1, 3.40 ERA): Is scheduled to make his second start of the season...was the losing pitcher in his first start last Sunday against Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland, a 7-4 loss (4.0 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 0 so)...went 4-11 in 18 starts last year and his 12 losses are second most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first 19 games of his career (Mike Morgan went 2-13 in 16 career games with Oakland)...is 0-2 with a 5.06 ERA (10.2 ip, 15 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 0 hr) in two career starts against Los Angeles...went 0-2 with a save and a 4.73 ERA in five games, including one start...allowed a .235 (12-for-51) opponents batting average...went 4-11 with a 6.11 ERA in 18 starts over two stints with Oakland in his Major League debut...his .267 winning percentage was third lowest in the American League and tied for fourth lowest in Oakland history...compiled a 4-4 record with a 3.66 ERA and .239 opponents batting average in 14 starts with Nashville

- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
- First batters faced hit .221, which was third lowest in the AL...ranked fifth in first batter on-base percentage (.294) and slugging percentage (.383)...had 43 first batter walks and 132 strikeouts, both of which are the most by an A's team since at least 1974.

- Became the last A's reliever to appear in a game this season on Sunday.
- Begins his 15th Major League season and has pitched for just two teams...has pitched in 216 games for Oakland (2004-09, 17-18) and 414 for San Francisco (2010-16).
- Is on his 10th Opening Day roster (2008-09, 17-18 with Oakland and 2011-16 with San Francisco).
- Logged a 10.80 ERA in seven spring training appearances...did not walk a batter in 6.2 innings but surrendered three home runs.
- Has made 27 career appearances against the Rangers...is 2-2 with a 9.53 ERA in those 27 outings (24 er in 22.2 ip), including four saves in seven opportunities.
- Has a 1.79 ERA (18 er in 90.2 ip) in 89 career appearances in April.

Last Year: Began the season as the A's closer and saved a team-leading 16 games before Blake Treinen took over in July...was 16-for-23 (69.6%) in save opportunities, which was the second lowest percentage in the majors...compiled a 4.27 ERA in 63 games.
