TWINS NOTES:

- **THE TWINS** won the second of four against Cleveland improving to 23-30 on the season, 12-13 at home and 9-6 in the division...the Twins are 2-2 against Cleveland this season and 405-432-1 All-Time against the Indians, 220-200-1 at home...tonight marked Paul Molitor's 250th career-managerial win, he is 18 wins away from 6th on Twins all-time list (Billy Gardner – 268).
- **JOSÉ BERRÍOS** earned his sixth win of the season in his 12th start...went 6.0 innings and allowed four runs on five hits, walking just one and struck out seven...marked his seventh quality start of the season and fourth in a row...improved to 4-2 at home.
- **EDUARDO ESCOBAR** (2-for-4) hit a three-run home run in the fifth inning, scoring Dozier and Morrison and giving the Twins their first three runs of the game and a solo home run in the seventh...this was his fourth multi-home run game of his career (last, May 4, 2018),...entering tonight's game he was leading the team in extra-base-hits with 27...his four RBI tonight was a season high and the seventh time in his career he has recorded four-or-more RBI in a game, last September 24, 2017 at Detroit (4)...has now hit double-digit home runs in back-to-back season and for the third season in his career.
- **BRIAN DOZIER** (2-for-5) recorded a double in the bottom of the first inning, he has hit safely in five of last six vs. Cleveland...with a single in the second inning this marked his 13th multi-hit game...he is hitting .517 (30-for-58) in multi-hit games this season...of his 13 multi-hit games, this was just the third at Target Field this season...in his career he has 107 multi-hit games at Target Field.
- **LOGAN MORRISON** (0-for-3) has now reached safely in all but two games at Target Field this season as a starter, dating back to April 10.
- **EDDIE ROSARIO** (1-for-3) recorded an RBI-single in the second and is now hitting .367 (44-for-120) since May 1...now hitting .333 (65-for-195) in 52 career games against Cleveland...extended his current hitting streak to seven games, hitting .419 (13-for-31) during the streak...was intentionally walked twice in the game marking the first time in his career he has been walked intentionally two times.
- **RYAN LaMARRE** (1-for-4) recorded a RBI-double in the fourth inning, this was his first double and first extra-base hit of his career.
- **MIGUEL SANÓ** (1-for-4) hit a two RBI-double in the fourth, extending his current hitting streak to six games...hitting .276 (8-for-29) with two home runs and three doubles during the streak.
- **BOBBY WILSON** (1-for-4) recorded his fourth double of the season in the sixth inning, his second consecutive start with a double.
- **FERNANDO RODNEY** recorded his ninth consecutive save of the season...passed Tom Henke and moved to 22nd on baseball's all-time list...needs two saves to tie Rob Nenn (314) for 21st on baseball's all-time list.

INDIANS NOTES:

- **THE INDIANS** lost the second of the four game series at Target Field, now 30-26 on the season...this loss snapped a six-game win-streak for the Indians...are now 12-15 on the road this season and 8-13 when the opponent scores first.
- **CARLOS CARRASCO** in his 12th start of the season, suffered his fourth loss and lasted just 3.2 innings, his second shortest-start of the season, with his shortest coming on April 28 vs. Seattle when he went 3.0 innings...allowed six runs on seven hits, three walks, two strikeout and one home run.
- **GREG ALLEN** (2-for-3) with a double in the third inning extended his current hitting streak to seven games, hitting .407 (11-for-27) during the streak...hit a triple in the seventh inning, his second of the season and first since May 15 at Detroit...now has seven extra-base hits on the season...this marked his sixth multi-hit game of the season and first multi-hit game consisting of a double and triple in his career.
- **EDWIN ENCARNACION** (2-for-4) extended his current hitting streak at eight games with a two-run home run in the sixth inning...hitting .438 (14-for-32) over that streak....this was his 14th home run of the season, entering today he was tied for ninth in the American League for home runs with 13 and second on the Indians behind Jose Ramirez (18)...with a single in the eighth inning he recorded his 13th multi-hit game of the season...it was his 13th career homer at Target Field, fourth most in the park's history for an opponent (Bautista – 14, S. Perez – 14, C. Santana – 14).
