LEADING OFF: PLEASE NOTE FRIDAY'S 7:27 PM START (VLADIMIR GUERRERO HOF CEREMONY)...Angels are off tomorrow...Halos play the third game of a six-game home stand (2-0) vs. Detroit (2-0) & Oakland (Aug. 10-12)...Angels seek fifth sweep of season with a win today...Halos are 6-1 in last seven home games (66 runs in the 7 G; 9.5 per)...LAA is 18-12 vs. A.L. Central foes...Halos are 3-4 this month, 8-10 since the break and 14-17 since July 1st...Angels are in fourth place, -16.0 in A.L. West (-10.5 for 2nd wild card)...Halos have spent last 41 days in fourth place...LAA is 11-21 when lefty starts (46-37 vs. RHS)...Following the home stand, LAA sets out on a nine-game trip to San Diego (8/13-15), Texas (8/16-19) and Arizona (8/21-22).

HI, MY NAME IS... With newly acquired Williams Jerez making his MLB debut last night (Kinsler trade), he became the 30th pitcher to appear for the Angels this season - one hurler shy of matching the club record (31 pitchers last season).

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Scoring change - please credit LAA with a double steal in first inning (credit Francisco Arcia with a stolen base of home)...LAA's seven runs in first inning were most in initial frame since April 20, 2013 vs. Tigers...Seven runs also matched most in any inning this season (also 7th inn. on 7/22 at HOU)...12th game this season scoring 10+ runs (10 of those efforts coming at home)...Shohei Ohtani logged his 12th HR (10th at home) and second 3 RBI effort in five games...Arcia collected two RBI - his 12 RBI thru first three MLB home games are a new MLB record...Kaleb Cowart logged a career-high three walks...Andrew Heaney earned his seventh win of the season, a new career best.

DID YOU KNOW? Albert Pujols is two hits shy of becoming one of nine players all-time with 1,000 hits in each league (2,073 hits with St. Louis; 998 with LAA)...Four former Angels are on the list - Dave Winfield, Frank Robinson, Vladimir Guerrero & Orlando Cabrera.

TAMING TIGERS: Andrelton Simmons is batting .343 (24/70) in career against Detroit...Halos are 23-7 at home vs. Tigers since 2010 (haven't lost a home series since Aug. 24-26, 2009).

#27 TURNS 27: Mike Trout turned 27 yesterday...His 61.9 career WAR is second-highest all time by a position player through age-26 season behind only Ty Cobb...He and Willie Mays are only players with three 30 HR/20 SB seasons by age-26 campaign-or-younger (first in A.L. history)...Trout joined Mickey Mantle, Jimmie Foxx & Eddie Mathews as only players with 600 BB & 225 HR prior to 27th birthday...Of the 15 other players with 200+ HR at 26-or-younger, none had more stolen bases (186) and only three had a higher OBP (.415) at that point in their career (ELIAS).

TROUT OUT: Mike Trout has missed the last six games with a right wrist contusion (day-to-day)...He suffered the injury on a head-first slide into third base last Wednesday at Tampa Bay...Monday he received a cortisone injection and remains day-to-day.

SAY WHAT? Ohtani is the first player in MLB history to hit 10+ HR & tally 50+ pitching strikeouts in same season (STATS)...Just the third player in baseball history with 12 HR & four wins in a season joining Jimmy Ryan (1888 White Stockings) & Babe Ruth (1919 Red Sox).

THE NEW ME: Kole Calhoun has nine HRs his last 23 affairs and his 13 HRs since June 18th lead the A.L....In those 23 games, hitting .318 (28/88) with 21 runs, six doubles, one triple, nine HR & 23 RBI...In 42 games since returning from D.L., batting .283 (43/152) with 31 runs, nine doubles, a triple, 13 HR & 32 RBI to raise season average from .145 to .211 (had 1 HR & 11 RBI over previous 50 G).

LOOKING AHEAD: 36 of 46 remaining games are with divisional foes: 13 vs. Texas (6 home, 7 road), 10 vs. Houston (3 home, 7 road), nine vs. Oakland (6 home, 3 road) & four vs. Seattle (all at home)...17 of 28 games this month are on road...Seven interleague games remain (8/13-15 at SD, 8/21-22 at ARI & 8/27-28 vs. COL).

MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 5 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HR (4th; 30), runs (T3rd; 82), runs created (1st; 119), times on base (1st; 221), walks (1st; 99), IBB (1st; 20), OBP (1st; .459), SLG (3rd; .624), OPS (1st; 1.083), OPS+ (1st; 196.0) and offensive WAR (7.3; 1st).

SOMETHING MINOR: Baseball America's Top 100 Prospects were posted this week with the Angels featuring four players: OF Jo Adell (11), RHP Griffin Canning (48), OF Brandon Marsh (89) & LHP Jose Suarez (90).

SHELVED: Angels have 12 players currently on the D.L...Average D.L. stint for LAA this season is 41 games...On June 15th, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history...53 players this season are most in MLB (team record is 55 in 2017)...30 pitchers are (12 starters), most in team history thru 115 games (LAA record 31 pitchers in '17)...22 players placed on D.L. in first half (most in MLB).

WALK TALK: Trout's 99 walks are most in club history through 114 games (club record is 116 walks in 2016 by Trout)...4th player in A.L. history with 20+ SB & 20+ IBB, joining Ichiro (2002; 2005), Rafael Palmeiro (1993) & Reggie Jackson (1974)...With his next walk, he will reach 100 BB, 25+ HR & 20 SB for third time in career (2013 & 2016)...No other American Leaguer has ever accomplished the feat more than once: Toby Harrah (1977) & Carl Yastrzemski (1970)...If Trout reaches 25 HR/30 SB/100 BB, it will be his third campaign doing so (Barry Bonds in 1991 is only other in MLB to accomplish).

GLOVE STORY: Club ranks tied for fourth in A.L. with .986 fielding pct...Halos lead MLB turning 127 double plays...Catchers own a 42.0 caught stealing pct. (22 of 53), tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)...A. Simmons leads MLB shortstops with 166 putouts and is T3rd for fewest errors (8; min. 90 GS)...Trout is only CF in MLB with a 1.000 fielding pct.

PITCHING POINTS: Halo relievers lead MLB in inherited runners scored pct. allowing just 20.4 % to score (40 of 196)...LAA pitchers have 46 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 115 affairs (5th in A.L. with 995 K)...Bullpen has logged 431 IP, second in A.L. to Tampa Bay...LAA has allowed 149 HRs, fourth-most in A.L...Since 2017, Jose Alvarez leads A.L. with 122 games pitched (Blake Parker ranks tied for third in the junior circuit with 121 games).

THIS N' THAT: Francisco Arcia's 12 RBI in first three home starts of career are an MLB record - previous Angels record: Shohei Ohtani - 7 (STATS LLC)...Arcia posted 10 RBI thru his first two career games (4 RBI in MLB debut, 6 RBI in 2nd game) to set an MLB record, passing Joe Cunningham (9 in 1954 with St. Louis)...Also tied MLB record (6th player) with four XBH thru first two games...A. Simmons leads MLB in PA per SO at 19.41 (427 PA/22 K)...He also leads MLB batting .318 (42/132) with 20 strikes...Angels' 155 HRs hit rank third in A.L...Trout's 7.8 WAR leads MLB...Justin Upton is only MLB left fielder with at least 20 HR every year since 2013...Mike Scioscia (1,627 wins) is in sole possession of 18th on all-time managerial wins list (Jim Leyland 17th with 1,769)...Since 2012, Trout hasn't gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base.

HOT HALOS: Over his last five games, Shohei Ohtani is batting .421 (8/19, 5 R, 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 3 SB)...A. Simmons boasts a five-game hit streak batting .381 (8/21; 4 R, 2B, HR, 4 RBI) and has hit safely in eight of his last nine games...Eric Young Jr. has hit in four of five (2 2B, HR, 4 RBI)...Trout has four HR his last seven games & five HR his last 10 affairs...Cam Bedrosian has a 2.00 ERA (27 IP - 6 ER) since June 1.

ALBERT ALERT: Albert Pujols ranks 24th all-time with 3,071 hits (Ichiro is 23rd with 3,089)...Pujols ranks sixth all-time with 631 HR (Willie Mays is 5th w/660 HR)...He is one of four players with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (Aaron, Mays & Rodriguez)...AP is seventh all-time with 1,973 RBI (BBREF)...Lou Gehrig is sixth with 1,995 RBI...Albert's 1,285 career extra-base hits rank sixth all-time (Mays is 5th w/ 1,323 XBH)...Only two players have logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI (H. Aaron & A. Rodriguez; Pujols is 27 RBI shy).

Vs. TIGERS: 2018 season series is tied 3-3...Angels are 21-5 in last 26 home games vs. Tigers (28-9 in last 37 overall meetings at Big A)...Albert Pujols owns a .322 (69/214) career clip against the Tigers with 13 home runs & 38 RBI in 58 games...His .322 average is second highest (Toronto, .337) against any A.L. opponent.

OAKLAND ON DECK: When these teams last met on June 17th, Angels were 38-34 and A's were 36-36...Since then, Halos have gone 19-24 while Oakland is 32-11...Angels are 11-5 in last 16 games vs. A's...Halos lead 2018 series 6-4...March 29th marked sixth Opening Day meeting between these clubs...LAA has won four consecutive season series vs. A's (2014-17)...Since 2013, Mike Trout is batting .331 (121/366) with 25 HR & 62 RBI in 96 games vs. Oakland

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

August 8

(1975) Angels tied a club record by turning six double plays in a 4-3 loss to New York; (1982) For the second time in five days (Aug. 3), Doug DeCinces homered three times to tie the club mark in a 9-5 win at Seattle...He remains the only player in A.L. history to hit three HR in the game twice in the same week.

August 9

(1967) Curt Simmons becomes the first player to throw a complete game shutout in his Angels debut with a 7-0 blanking of the Yankees...He is one of only three Angels to accomplish the feat (also Nolan Ryan in 1972 & Jerry Reuss in 1987); (2014) Angels defeat Boston 5-4 in 19 innings on Albert Pujols' first walk-off HR as an Angel...At 6 hours, 31 minutes, the game was the longest (in terms of time of game) in Angel Stadium history.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP JAIME BARRIA

6-7, 3.84 ERA

Has allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in eight of last 10 starts

- **BACK IN THE BIGS:** Is making 17th start of the season for Angels and 10th at home...Recalled from Adv.-A Inland Empire on July 23 for sixth stint of season with Angels (did not pitch for 66ers during stint with the team).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Friday at Cleveland after tossing five innings and allowing three earned runs on six hits with two walks and three strikeouts.
- **THREE-OR-FEWER:** Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in eight of last 10 starts and in 13 of 16 starts on the season.
- **WALKS UP:** Has walked 15 batters across last eight starts after walking nine in previous eight starts to begin the year.
- **ROUGH STRETCH:** During seven game period from June 12 – July 23, was 0-6 with a 5.19 ERA (34.2 IP – 20 ER) but allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in four of the seven games...In his first seven starts, Angels were 5-2 and he went 5-1 with a 2.48 ERA (36.1 IP – 10 ER).
- **ROOKIE RANKINGS:** Ranks tied for fourth among A.L. rookies in wins, is third (min. 50 IP) in batting average against (.245) and sixth in ERA.
- **FIRST HALF RECAP:** Made 13 first half starts for the Angels and pitched to a 5-6 record and 3.55 ERA (66 IP – 26 ER) with 52 strikeouts.
- **STREAKING:** Won four straight decisions between May 3 – June 1, which is the longest streak by any Angels pitcher in 2018.
- **HALOS FROM PANAMA:** Barria is the first Panama-born pitcher in Angels history...The only other player in franchise history who was born in Panama is Hall of Famer **Rod Carew**.
- **VS.DETROIT:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Tigers.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** In nine starts at Angel Stadium, is 3-4 with a 4.11 ERA (46 IP – 21 ER)...Victory in last home start (July 28 vs Seattle) was his first at The Big A since June 1 vs. Texas...Pitched career-high seven innings on May 15 vs. Houston...Carried no-hitter through 5.1 frames of start on Mat 3 vs. Orioles.
- **NO-HIT BID:** Carried a no-hitter through first 5.1 innings of start on May 3 vs. Baltimore before allowing a single to **Trey Mancini**...Recorded first quality start of career and first winning decision at Angel Stadium.
- **GENERATION GAP:** When they faced off on June 1, the 23 years, 55 days difference in age (8456 total days) between **Bartolo Colon** (45 years, 8 days) and **Jaime Barria** (21 years, 318 days) was the largest in any Angels game in franchise history.
- **RECORD BREAKING FRAME:** During start on April 22 vs. San Francisco, tossed 49 pitches in a scoreless first inning, including a Major League record 21-pitch at-bat vs. **Brandon Belt** (previous record was 20 pitches seen by Houston's **Ricky Gutierrez** vs. Cleveland RHP **Bartolo Colon** on June 26, 1998...Became first pitcher to throw 49+ pitches in an inning without allowing a run since D-backs **Nick Bierbrodt** on June 13, 2001 vs. Cubs.
- **BIG LEAGUE DEBUT:** Made Major League debut with Angels on April 11 at Texas and earned the win after tossing five innings and allowing one run on one hit (HR by **Ryan Rua**) with three walks and three strikeouts.
- **STARTING WITH A START:** In Major League debut on April 11, became the first player to make his Major League debut as a starting pitcher for the Angels since **Matt Shoemaker** on Sept. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle...He also became the first player to earn a win in MLB debut as a starter since **Sean O'Sullivan** on June 16, 2009 at San Francisco.
- **YOUTH WINS:** Is the youngest player (21.267 on day of first win) to have earned a winning decision in the American League this season.
- **YOUNG ANGELS:** At 21 years, 267 days, Barria was the youngest Angels player to make his Major League debut since **Mike Trout** (19 years, 335 days) on July 8, 2011...He's the youngest pitcher to debut with Angels since **Tyler Chatwood** (21 years, 85 days) on June 19, 2011.
- **WITH THE BEES:** In four starts with Triple-A Salt Lake this season, is 0-0 with a 3.60 ERA (15 IP – 6 ER) and 16 strikeouts.
- **IN THE RANKINGS:** Entered 2018 ranked by *Baseball America* as the #6 prospect in the Angels organization and was the top pitching exclusive prospect (RHP/DH **Shohei Ohtani** was ranked #1)...He was also ranked #7 by *MLB.com* in the Halos system.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Was selected to 2017 All-Star Futures Game at Marlins Park and pitched one scoreless inning in relief with one walk and two strikeouts for Team World...Named a 2017 California League Mid-Season All-Star and 2016 Midwest League Mid-Season All-Star...Selected as Angels Organizational Player of the Month for May and June 2017.
- **CAREER NOTES:** Native of Panama City, Panama...Originally signed with Angels as an international free agent, April 11, 2013.
