TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 6, 1967: With the No. 1 overall pick in the First-Year Player Draft, the Yankees select Ron Blomberg, who will later become Baseball's first designated hitter. The Yankees' only other No. 1 overall pick came in 1991, when they selected pitcher Brian Taylor.

June 6, 1944: The Liberation of Europe begins. Yogi Berra mans a missile boat off the Normandy coast.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

June 7, 2008: Johnny Damon leads the Yankees to a 12-11 win over Kansas City by going 6-for-6 with 4RBI, including a two-out, "walk-off" single in the bottom of the ninth. Damon becomes the second—and the most recent—Yankee to go 6-for-6 in a game.

June 7, 2007: With a 10-3 victory at the White Sox, Joe Torre wins his 2,000th game as a manager, becoming the first person in MLB history to win 2,000 games as a manager and have 2,000 hits as a player.

AT A GLANCE: Tonight the Yankees play the finale of their two-game series in Toronto (1-0 so far)...are 4-1 on their now-nine-game, four-city road trip, which began with a rain-shortened two-game series in Baltimore that included postponements on Thursday and Sunday, followed by a split doubleheader in Detroit on Monday (makeups from ppd. games on 4/14 and 4/15)...will have an off day tomorrow, followed by a three-game Subway Series at the Mets from Friday-Sunday.

- ▶ At 39-18 (.684), have the Majors' second-best winning pct.
- ▶ Trailing Boston by a season-high 7.5G at the start of play on 4/21 (Boston was 17-2, the Yankees were 9-9; since then, Boston is 25-17, the Yankees are 30-9).
- ▶ Are 21G over .500, matching their season-high (also 21G over after Game 1 of Monday's doubleheader)...reached a season-best 21G over .500 just once last season (91-70 after their 161st game on 9/30/17)...never reached 21G over at any point from 2013-16.
- ▶ Is the 11th season in franchise history and the second season over the last 63 years (since 1956) that they have reached 21G over within their first 57 decisions of a season (first went 21G over in 1998 after 39G, starting 30-9)...made the World Series in all 10 previous instances, winning seven times (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42, '55).
- ▶ Marks the 10th time in franchise history that the club has tallied at least 39 wins over their first 57 results...each of the other nine Yankees clubs reached the World Series (won: 1927-28, '32, '36, '39, '53, '98; lost: 1926, '42)...joins the 1998 team (44-13) as the only Yankees clubs with as good a 57G start over the last 65 seasons (since 1954).
- ▶ Over their last 13 completed series (since 4/19), are 11-1-1.
- ▶ Are in the midst of playing 64 consecutive games in the Eastern Time Zone from 5/25-8/5 (does not include 6/18 resumption of 5/15 game)...are 8-3 so far.
- ▶ Are 14-9 vs. the AL East and 25-9 vs. all other divisions.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 27-3 (.900) when their starters toss at least 6.0 innings this season.
- ▶ Are a Major League-best 30-2 (.938) when allowing four-or-fewer runs this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Yankees are 14-5 in their last 19 completed road games and 17-9 (.654) away from home in 2018...are 26-15 in 41 road games since 8/22/17.

- ▶ Are 5-2-2 in their first nine road series this year and 9-3-2 in 14 road series since 8/22/17.
- ▶ Their 27 road games are tied for second-fewest this season.

HOME(RS) AWAY FROM HOME: Yankees batters have hit 47HR in 27G on the road this season (1.74 HR/G), second-most in the Majors (Oakland-54HR)...would be their highest single-season road HR/G ratio in franchise history (highest: 1.56 HR/G in 1961)...are on pace to hit a franchise-record 141 road homers in 2018 (128HR on the road in 1961).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in runs (327), runs per game (5.64), HR (96), HR per game (1.66), SLG (.470), OPS (.808) and walks (231)...rank second in OBP (.338), XBHs (223) and total bases (936).

- ▶ Have homered in 46 of their 58 games, most in the Majors.
- ▶ Are on pace to hit 268HR...the MLB single-season HR record was set by the 1997 Mariners (264).

ANDÚSLAM: INF Miguel Andújar hit his first career grand slam on Tuesday at Toronto (at age 23y, 95d), becoming the youngest Yankee to hit a grand slam since Melky Cabrera (age 21y, 328d) on 7/5/06 at Cleveland...is 4-for-7 (.571) with 1 double, 1HR and 12RBI in his career with the bases loaded.

- ▶ According to research by the YES Network, is the third Yankee rookie 3B to hit a grand slam, joining Horace Clarke 9/21/65 and Mike Pagliarulo 9/18/1984.
- ▶ Has 31XBH (22 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR) in 54 career games, third-most in Yankees history through 54 games (Joe DiMaggio-43XBH; Gary Sánchez-32)...seven of his last 9H have gone for extra bases (5 doubles, 2HR).
- ▶ Leads all Major League rookies in batting average (.305), slugging pct. (.542) and extra-base hits (29), is tied for most multi-hit games (20) and ranks second in hits (58).
- ▶ Is hitting .368 (25-for-68) with 12R, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 4HR, 13RBI, 4BB and 1SB in his last 18 games (since 5/12), the AL's third-highest batting average over the span.
- ▶ Leads all rookies with 20 doubles and is tied for third among all Major Leaguers.

SS Didi Gregorius is batting .321 (9-for-28) with 6R, 2RBI, 1HP, 2BB and 5SB over his last seven games (since 5/28)...hit .060 (4-for-67) over his previous 16 games (5/4-27).

- ▶ Has stolen a base in four straight games, the longest streak of his career and the longest by a Yankee since Brett Gardner from 4/24-29/14 (also 4G)...the last Yankee with a longer stolen base streak was also Gardner (5G, 7/16-20/11).
- ▶ Has set a single-season career high with 8SB in 2018.

ROWING ALONG: C Austin Romine is batting .469 (15-for-32) with 10R, 4 doubles, 4HR and 13RBI during his career-high 11-game hitting streak (since 4/30), tied for the AL's second-longest active hitting streak...is the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankee this season (Judge, 12G from 4/1-16)...is tied for the second-longest hitting streak at catcher in 2018 (Tampa Bay's Wilson Ramos-17G, Miami's J.T. Realmuto-11G and Los Angeles-NL's Yasmani Grandal-11G)...is tied for the second-longest hitting streak by a Yankees catcher since 1994 (Jorge Posada-15G from 5/3-20/07).

- ▶ Has 4HR over his last seven games after hitting 4HR over his previous 132 games (6/4-16-5/11/18)...has tied his single-season career high in home runs (4HR in 2016).
- ▶ Has reached in 13-of-21PA w/ RISP in 2018 (.619 OBP), hitting 9-for-17 (.529) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI and 4BB...his 3.11 AB/RBI ratio (59AB/19RBI) leads the Majors (min. 50AB).

JUST FOR HICKS: OF Aaron Hicks has hit .328 (19-for-58) w/ 11R, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR, 11RBI and 8BB in 16G since 5/18, raising his season batting average from .208 to .253.

- ▶ Is hitting .342 (27-for-79) with 11XBH (4 doubles, 2 triples, 5HR) and 16RBI in 22 road games in 2018.

FEELING A DRAFT: Through the first 10 rounds of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, the Yankees have selected six pitchers (five RHP / one LHP), two catchers and two outfielders.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Blue Jays, 7-2, at Rogers Centre on Tuesday...**LHP CC Sabathia** (7.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 1BB, 6K, 2HR) earned his third win and matched his longest start of the season (also 4/29 at Los Angeles-AL)...**3B Miguel Andújar** (2-for-3, 1HP) hit his first career grand slam in the seventh inning, driving in the Yankees' first runs of the game...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-3, 2R, 1BB) hit a three-run HR in the eighth...**RF Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5, 1R, 1 double) also had a multi-hit game...**1B Greg Bird** (1-for-4, 1 double) extended his hitting streak to seven games, one game shy of his career high (8G, twice)...**LHP Chasen Shreve** (1.0IP, 2K) closed out the game with a perfect ninth in his first appearance since 5/26.

CC THE STOPPER: Since the start of 2017, **LHP CC Sabathia** is 10-0 with a 2.71 ERA (93.0IP, 28ER) in 16 regular season starts for the Yankees loss.

- ▶ Has faced the Blue Jays three times this season (3/31 at Rogers Centre and 4/19 at Yankee Stadium), going 1-0 with a 1.65 ERA (16.1IP, 3ER).
- ▶ Since the start of 2016, has gone 7-3 with a 2.46 ERA (95.0IP, 26ER) in 17 road starts against the AL East.
- ▶ Was his 266th start as a Yankee, surpassing Fritz Peterson (265) for sole possession of 10th place on the Yankees' all-time starts list...also reached 1,715.1IP as a Yankee, surpassing Ray Caldwell (1,713.0) for 12th place on the club's all-time list...was his 123rd win as a Yankee, tying Mike Mussina for 12th place on the franchise's wins list.
- ▶ Was his 240th career win, breaking a tie with RHP Mordecai Brown and LHP David Wells (239 each) and tying LHP Frank Tanana (240) for 55th place on the all-time wins list...now ranks 14th in wins among LHP all time.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees have come-from-behind in each of their last six wins (since 5/29), their longest such streak since 6/18-30/16 (also 6G)...their last longer streak was eight-in-a-row from 7/20-8/3/14...have 17 comeback wins this season, tied for second-most in the Majors (Boston-18).

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 6-3 vs. the Blue Jays in 2018...will play the 10th of 19 games vs. Toronto tonight (10G in the Bronx, 9G at Toronto)...**IN 2017:** Went 9-10 vs. Toronto in 2017, including 5-4 in the Bronx and 4-6 at Rogers Centre...**IN SEASON SERIES:** Have lost the last three season series, their first streak of consecutive season series losses to Toronto since 1990-94 (9-10 in 2017, 7-12 in 2016, 6-13 in 2015)...have still won 12 of the last 17 season series since 2001 (also went 8-10 in 2010 and 9-9 in 2008)...had double-digit losses vs. the Blue Jays just twice in 38 seasons from 1977-2014...**AT ROGERS CENTRE:** Are 3-2 at Rogers Centre in 2018...went 4-6 in Toronto in 2017...are 0-6-2 in their last eight series up north, with their last series win coming from 8/14-16/15...are 1-9-2 in 12 series since 6/23/14...have a sub-.500 record at Rogers Centre in each of the last eight seasons (2010-17), the club's longest active streak of losing seasons at any park...are 32-47 at Rogers Centre since the start of 2010.
