HEADED TO THE FUTURE...the Mariners continue a 10-day, 9-game homestand with the 2nd of 3 games vs. Kansas City (1-0)...will also face Los Angeles-AL (3 G) and Colorado (3 G) on this homestand...went 5-5 on a recently-concluded 11-day, 10-game, 3-city road trip to New York-AL (0-3), Boston (1-2) and Baltimore (4-0)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

PAST, PRESENT & FUTURE...the Mariners have won 5 straight games and are 6-6 over their last 12 contests...they have won 12 of their last 19 games, 19 of their last 28, 23 of their last 34, 28 of their last 40 and 30 of their last 44...Seattle is 38-20 in its last 58 games, 43-23 over its last 66 games and 48-27 in its last 75 games...Seattle is 15-14 during the day and 37-17 at night...Seattle is 26-14 at Safeco Field, 26-17 on the road.

- **Close Calls** - the Mariners have played 49 games decided by 2 or fewer runs this season, tops in the Majors...they are 35-14 (.714) in those games, the top winning percentage in all of baseball...4 of the team's last 5 games has been decided by 2 or fewer runs, with the Mariners going 4-0...since June 14, 9 of the club's last 15 games have been decided by 2 or fewer runs, with the Mariners going 6-3 in those 9 games.
- **Electric Eddie** - Edwin Díaz's 30 saves are the most in club history prior to the All-Star Break (previous: Kazuhiro Sasaki, 29, 2001)...the Mariners are 38-0 when Díaz enters the game with a lead, including 21-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...he is 19-for-21 in 1-run save opportunities (90.5%) with a 0.84 ERA (2 ER, 21.1 IP) with 37 strikeouts and 5 walks.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - Jean Segura leads the Majors with 35 multi-hit games, ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (33)...Segura also leads the Majors with 15 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Nicholas Castellanos-DET (12).
- **First Things First** - Dee Gordon is batting .338 (23x68) when leading off a game this season.
- **Four Score** - The Mariners are 38-10 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 14-21 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 22 of their first 27 series, posting a series record of 16-5-6.
- **Extra! Extra!** - The Mariners are 8-0 in extra inning games this season (the only undefeated team in the Majors)...dating back to July 16, 2017, the Mariners have won 14 consecutive extra-inning games, the longest such streak since the Orioles won 17 straight extra-inning contests, April 16, 2012 - April 18, 2013.

IF I COULD TURN BACK TIME...the Mariners have a .650 (26-14) winning percentage at Safeco Field this season, tied for the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Majors (also: San Francisco, .650/26-14)...they trail only New York-AL (.732/30-11), Boston (.700/28-12) and Cleveland (.675/27-13)...the Mariners have won 10 of their last 12 home games (5/31-c) and are 17-4 (.810) at Safeco Field since May 18...they have the top home winning percentage in the Majors during that span, ahead of Cleveland (.778/14-4) and New York-AL (.750/12-4)...Seattle's 17 wins at home are also tops in the Majors since May 18, ahead of Boston (15-6) and 5 clubs with 14 wins apiece.

GLORY DAYS...the Mariners are a season-high 21 games over .500 at 52-31 for the third time this season (also: 46-25 on June 17 and 43-24 on June 14)...with a win today, Seattle would be at least 22 games over .500 for the first time since being 93-69 (.574) after game #162 of the 2003 season (24 games over .500).

IT'S SO HARD TO SAY GOODBYE TO YESTERDAY...the Mariners have won a season-high 5 consecutive games for the 3rd time this season: May 18-23, May 31-June 5 and June 25-current...the last time the Mariners won 6 straight games was June 18-23, 2017.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT...I GOTTA WEAR SHADES...dating back to May 25, Ben Gamel has hit safely in 11 consecutive games at Safeco Field, batting .485 (16x33) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 RBI, 1 HBP, 2 walks and 3 stolen bases...overall this season he has reached base safely 18 of 22 games at home (w/AB), including 17 games with at least 1 hit, batting .400 (26x65) with 10 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 1 home run, 5 RBI, 1 HBP, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases...his .400 batting average at home this season is the highest in the Majors, ranking ahead of Mookie Betts-BOS (.375/36x96) and J.D. Martinez-BOS (.361/53x147)...also ranks 3rd in with a .451 on-base percentage (min. 70 PA).

TIMES LIKE THESE...the Mariners are 18-9 in the month of June...the 18 wins are tied for team high in a single month this season (also: May)...marks the 18th time in club history to finish June with at least a .500 record or better...the 18 wins in June are currently 3rd-most in club history (also: 2001, 2006 & 2007), trailing only 20 wins in 1997 (20-7/.741), 19 wins in 2000 (19-8/.704).

TIME AFTER TIME...Nelson Cruz has hit safely in 24 of his last 33 games (5/24-c), batting .328 (40x122) with 22 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 14 home runs, 33 RBI, 3 HBP, 14 walks, a .407 on-base percentage and a .721 slugging percentage (1.128 OPS)...Cruz leads the Major Leagues in home runs since May 24, while also ranking 2nd in RBI, slugging percentage and in OPS, T10th in hits and 13th in on-base percentage.

TIME MARCHES ON...since May 8, the Mariners have a .660 (33-17) winning percentage, 2nd-best in the Majors over that span...they trail only Houston (.702/33-14), while ranking ahead of New York-AL (.644/29-16), Boston (.612/30-19) and Milwaukee (.609/28-18)...the Mariners 33 wins are 2nd-most in the Majors since May 8, trailing only the Astros (33-14)...the Mariners join the Astros, Yankees and Red Sox as the only American League clubs with a .600 winning percentage since May 8.

FUTURE SAYS RUN...Dee Gordon enters tonight's game with 299 career stolen bases...he is 1 steal shy of becoming the 3rd active player (currently on a 25-man roster) with at least 300 career stolen bases...he would join Jose Reyes (516) and Rajai Davis (410) in that club...Gordon's 299 stolen bases are tops in the Majors since making his debut in 2011, ranking ahead of Davis (267) and Billy Hamilton (259)...Gordon, who currently leads the American League with 21 steals, has led his respective league in stolen bases in 3 previous seasons: 2014 with Los Angeles-NL (64), 2015 with Miami (58) and 2017 with Miami (60).

WHAT THE FUTURE HOLDS...dating back to June 5 the Mariners have recorded 37 home runs in 24 games, including homering in 5 straight games...the team's 37 home runs during this stretch are T2nd-most in the Majors (along with New York-AL) and trail Los Angeles-NL (45)...55 of the Mariners 111 runs scored (49.5%) during this 24-game stretch have come via the home run (22 solo HR, 12 2-R HR, 3 3-R HR)...the Mariners have had 7 players record at least 1 home run since June 5, including 11 home runs by Nelson Cruz and 6 home runs by Ryon Healy and Kyle Seager.

AS YOU KNOW...Nelson Cruz has ranked among the top 7 American League players in OPS in each of the past 4 seasons since joining the Mariners in 2015...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Cruz's career .925 OPS as a Mariner currently is the 4th-highest all-time in franchise history (min. 1500 PA)?...Cruz trails only Alex Rodriguez (.934), Edgar Martinez (.933) and Ken Griffey Jr. (.927).

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 393rd career start and his 16th career start vs. Kansas City tonight.
- Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
- A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Is 30-13 with a 2.97 ERA (135 ER, 409.2 IP) in 60 career GS in June.

LAST OUTING...W#7 in his 7th quality start of the season, a 5-3 Mariners win at Baltimore on June 25...allowed 3 runs on 4 hits and 3 walks while striking out 4 across 6.0 innings pitched...held the Orioles scoreless until allowing a solo home run to Jonathan Schoop to lead off the 5th inning; allowed 2 more runs on a pair of groundouts after loading the bases in the 6th.

TURNING A CORNER...despite a 3.0-inning, 6-run outing on June 9 at Tampa Bay, Félix has posted a 3.41 ERA (11 ER, 29.0 IP) with 3 quality starts in the month of June, going 5.0+ innings and allowing just 1 earned run in 3 of his 5 starts... across 5 starts in June, has recorded a 3.57 strikeout-to-walk ratio (25 K, 7 BB) as compared to a 2.17 mark in March/April (26 K, 12 BB) and a 1.81 mark in May (29 K, 16 BB)...has allowed just 2 home runs since the start of June.

THIS IS HIS HOUSE...is 3-3 with a 3.65 ERA (20 ER, 49.1 IP) in 8 starts in Safeco Field this season while holding opponents to a .224 average (41x183) and .388 slugging percentage, compared to 4-3, 6.65 in 9 road starts with opponents batting .288 (53x184) and slugging .473...for his career, is 89-60, 3.19 in 198 starts in Safeco Field (78-60, 3.36 in 194 road starts).

OUT OF THE GATE...in the 1st inning, Félix has posted a 9.00 ERA (17 ER, 17.0 IP), while earning a 4.25 ERA (37 ER, 78.1 IP) in the 2nd inning and later...Félix has allowed 3-or-more runs in the 1st inning in 3 of his 17 starts; he's 0-2 in those games & the Mariners are 1-2...has allowed 1 (3 G) or 0 (9 G) runs in the 1st inning of 12 of his 17 starts; he's 6-3 in those games & the Mariners are 7-5.

IMPRESSIVE START...since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (63)...the next closest pitcher is Justin Verlander with 51...during this stretch Félix has recorded 254 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (268).

HE'S OUR LEADER...became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chicago-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts... placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

CAREER...has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner... is 167-120 with a 3.27 ERA (944 ER, 2597.2 IP) in 392 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins (167), starts (392), quality starts (254), innings pitched (2597.2) and strikeouts (2,422).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JAMES PAXTON (7-2, 3.65)

29-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 18th start of the season tomorrow against the Royals...9 of his last 12 outings have been quality starts...W#7 in his last start, a 3-2 Mariners win on 6/26 at BAL (7.0,6,2,2,1,10,HR-1); marked 6th double-digit strikeout game of the season...tossed second complete game of his career on 5/19 vs. DET (9.0,3,2,2,1,8,HR-1)...pitched the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history, needing just 99 pitches in W#2, a 5-0 Mariners win on 5/8 at TOR (9.0,0,0,0,3,7); first complete game and first shutout of his career...notched a career-high 16 strikeouts in the Mariners 2-3 loss to OAK on 5/2 (7.0,5,0,0,1,16)...2017: Went 12-5 with a 2.98 ERA (45 ER, 136.0 IP) with 156 strikeouts and 37 walks in 24 starts...named the 2017 Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle BBWAA...led club in wins (12) and strikeouts (156)...earned a career-high 12 wins...logged 136.0 IP, the most in his career (previous: 121.0 IP in 2016)...CAREER: 37-22 with a 3.36 ERA (196 ER, 525.2 IP) in 91 starts in parts of 6 seasons...selected by Seattle in the 4th round of the 2010 MLB First-Year Player Draft...vs. KC: Is 2-0 with a 2.54 ERA (8 ER, 28.1 IP) in 5 career starts vs. the Royals...did not factor into the decision in the Mariners 4-2 win at Kansas City on April 11 (6.0,6,2,2,1,10).
