## HERE'S THE STORY

- The D-backs are 8-4 in their last 12 games since July 22.
- Clay Buchholz** has won 4 consecutive decisions since June 1, posting a 2.93 ERA (13 ER in 40.0 IP) and .248 opponent average in that time.
- Paul Goldschmidt** is hitting .373 (19-for-51) with 7 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs and 10 RBI vs. Giants this season.
- David Peralta** is hitting .409 (18-for-44)/.447 OBP/.591 SLG with 4 doubles, 1 home run, 1 RBI and 7 runs scored in his last 11 games since July 20.

## LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- The D-backs won vs. Giants, 6-3.
- Patrick Corbin** allowed 3 runs in 6.0 innings and went 1-for-3 with 2 RBI.
- Paul Goldschmidt** went 1-for-4 with a home run (24), the 200th of his career...**David Peralta** was a triple shy of the cycle and reached base 4 times, going 3-for-4 with a walk...his solo home run (17) tied his single season career-high.
- Yoshihisa Hirano** (1.0 IP), **Archie Bradley** (1.0) and **Brad Boxberger** (1.0) each threw a scoreless inning.

- Paul Goldschmidt** hit the 200th homer of his career in the first inning, joining Luis Gonzalez (224) as the only players in team history with 200+ home runs...his first career home run was also against the Giants on Aug. 2, 2011.

- Has recorded 3+ hits in back-to-back games for the second time this season (also June 8-9) and for the fifth time in his career (others: July 18-19, 2017; June 11-13, 2017; Aug. 9-10, 2015).

- Clay Buchholz** has won 4 consecutive decisions since June 1, posting a 2.93 ERA (13 ER in 38.0 IP), .201 opponent avg. and 400 strikeouts (Arizona is 39-21)...since June 1, the D-backs are 23-7 when their starter goes 6.0+ innings.
- Has allowed 3 or fewer runs in 8 of his 9 starts this year, as well as 2 or fewer 7 times, and 1 or fewer 6 times.

## D-BACKS STARTERS GOING 6.0

- When D-backs starters work 6.0+ innings, they are 34-12 with a 2.34 ERA (101 ER in 388.0 IP), .201 opponent avg. and 400 strikeouts (Arizona is 39-21)...since June 1, the D-backs are 23-7 when their starter goes 6.0+ innings.

BUCHHOLZ AT A GLANCE

- ◆ In his 12th Major League season...signed with Arizona as a Minor League free agent on May 4.
◆ Is a 2-time AL All-Star (2010, '13).
◆ Member of 2 Red Sox World Championship clubs (2007, '13).
◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
◆ Finished sixth in the 2010 AL Cy Young voting, going 17-7 with a 2.33 ERA.
◆ Selected by Boston in the supplemental first round (42nd overall) in 2005 as compensation for Pedro Martinez leaving as a free agent.

WHAT TO KNOW...

- ◆ Is 3-0 with a 1.96 ERA (5 ER in 23.0 IP) in his last 4 starts.
◆ Looking to win his fourth straight start for the first time since June 18-July 4, 2015.

LAST START

- ◆ Earned his third consecutive win on July 29 @ Padres, allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits with 7 strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

VS. GIANTS

- ◆ Is 0-0 with a 2.57 ERA (2 ER in 7.0 IP) in 2 starts.
◆ Did not factor into the decision on June 6 @ AT&T Park, giving up 2 earned runs on 7 hits with 7 strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

WESTWARD EXPANSION

- ◆ In 8 starts vs. NL West dating back to June 20, 2010, is 4-1 in with a 3.80 ERA (18 ER in 42.2 IP).
◆ Has allowed 2 or fewer earned runs in his last 2 of his last 3 starts vs. NL West opponents.

STILL NEW TO THIS CHASE THING

- ◆ Has made 3 career starts @ Chase Field (3.78 ERA; 7 ER in 16.2 IP), including 7.0 innings of 1-run baseball in his Chase Field debut on June 1 vs. Marlins.

SPLITS CITY

- ◆ Left-handers are hitting .195 (17-for-87)/.255 OBP/.310 SLG.
◆ Limiting opponents to .143 average (4-for-28) with runners in scoring position...the opposition are also 1-for-13 (.077) with RISP and 2 outs.

ORDER UP!

- ◆ Has limited opponents to a .171 average (13-for-76) the first time through the order in 2018.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Wore No. 11 in Boston because he was given the nickname "Sticks" as a kid for being skinny.
◆ Married to Lindsay, who was a former model on the TV show "Deal or No Deal" and featured in People magazine's "100 Most Beautiful People."
◆ Was introduced to his wife by Donald Trump at a 2008 UFC event in Anaheim, Calif...they were married at Trump National Golf Club in Palos Verdes, Calif. in 2009.
◆ Is a distant relative of former Major League pitcher, Taylor Buchholz...he pitched for the Astros (2006), Rockies (2007-08, '10), Blue Jays (2010) and Mets (2011).

WARM UP INNING

- ◆ After the first inning, opponents bat .212 (33-for-156) with 12 extra-base hits, compared to .265 (9-for-34) with 5 XBH in the first inning.

ONE AND DONE

- ◆ Allowed 1 run or fewer in 6 of his first 8 starts with Arizona...is the only pitcher in club history to accomplish this feat to start their career with the team [source: Elias Sports Bureau]...only Albie Lopez started with 5 in his first 8.

OUT OF THE GATE HOT

- ◆ Was 1 of 4 pitchers in team history to allow 2 or fewer runs in each of his first 4 starts with the team, joining Matt Koch (2016-18), Robbie Ray (2015) and Archie Bradley (2015).
◆ Was the first pitcher in D-backs history to allow 1 or fewer runs in each of his first 3 starts with the team.

2018 MINOR LEAGUE REVIEW

- ◆ Was 1-1 with a 2.93 ERA (9 ER in 27.2 IP) in 5 starts with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, Triple-A Omaha and Triple-A Reno.

NO-HITTER NOTES

- ◆ Threw the 17th no-hitter in Red Sox history in his second start on Sept. 1, 2007 vs. Orioles, the second pitcher to throw a no-hitter in their first or second career Major League start (also: Wilson Alvarez/CWS on Aug. 11, 1992 @ Orioles).
◆ Then-GM Theo Epstein spoke by phone with Terry Francona during the no-hitter, concerned about Buchholz's pitch count, who had not exceeded 98 in a game all season...Epstein said Buchholz would have been pulled if he reached 120, no-hitter or not, and finished with 115.

- ◆ Acquired on July 25 from the Rays for C Michael Perez and RHP Brian Shaffer.
◆ Has thrown 2.0+ innings 18 times, tied for second most in baseball (also: Brian Flynn/KC) and behind Tyler Glasnow/PIT (19)...thrown 3.0+ 5 times, tied for fourth most (5 others).
◆ Lefties are hitting .186 (19-for-102), ninth-lowest among all relievers (min. 100 BF).

#31 • BRAD BOXBERGER • R/R 6-2 • 205 • 30 (May 27, 1988) SF Series: SV, 0 ER/1.0 IP

- ◆ NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS): 3rd in SV (26), 8th in SV PCT. (83.9).
◆ Is 26-for-31 in save chances with a .202 opp. average (22-for-109) and 41 strikeouts.
◆ Right-handed hitters are batting .100 (4-for-40) over his last 19 games since June 6.
◆ First batters faced are hitting .081 (3-for-37), the fourth-lowest average in the NL.

◆ 20 of his last 22 outings have been scoreless (1.06 ERA; 2 ER in 17.0 IP).
◆ Lefties are 5-for-34 (.147) with 11 strikeouts since June 2.
◆ Has a 59-game homerless streak (last HR: Wil Myers on Sept. 9, 2017 @ Chase Field).

◆ In 47 games for the Rangers, was 1-1 with 2 saves, 14 holds and a 3.69 ERA.
◆ Missed most of 2017 following 3 surgeries related to his colon...this January, named winner of the 53rd annual Hutch Award by the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle, given annually to a Major Leaguer who best exemplifies the honor, courage and dedication of the legendary player and manager, Fred Hutchinson.

#66 • YOSHIHISA HIRANO • R/R 6-2 • 195 • 34 (March 8, 1984) SF Series: HLD, 0 ER/1.0 IP

- ◆ NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS): 2nd in HLD (25), T-6th in G (52).
◆ Owns a 1.91 ERA (7 ER in 33.0 IP) in his last 38 games.
◆ Is scoreless in 15 of his 18 games @ Chase Field (1.84 ERA; 3 ER in 14.2 IP).
◆ His 26-game scoreless streak (22.2 IP) from May 6-July 3 was a club record and second longest by a Japanese-born pitcher in the Majors (1 shy of the record).

◆ Became the first D-backs pitcher to ride the OnTrac Bullpen Cart on Aug. 2 vs. Giants.
◆ Acquired from the Marlins on July 31 for RHP Tommy Eveld.
◆ Ranks second for all MLB relievers since June 5 (min. 10.0 IP) in ground-ball pct. (77.8) behind T.J. McFarland (77.9).
◆ Named to the D-backs' 20th Anniversary Team...pitched 6 seasons with Arizona from 2011-16, going 21-11 with 62 saves, 65 holds and a 2.49 ERA, .230 opponent average and 218 strikeouts.

- ◆ Hit his first career grand slam on July 26 @ Cubs.
- ◆ His 48 defensive runs saved at shortstop ranks third in the NL since 2015, behind Brandon Crawford (57) and Addison Russell (55).
