METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 0-2 on their five-game road trip...The Mets are 1-9 in their last 10 games, 5-22 in their last 27 games and 7-27 in their last 34 contests...New York went 5-21 (.192) in June, the worst June in team history...New York has now gone 12 straight series without a series win (10 series losses, two splits) since sweeping Arizona from May 18-20...The Mets are a season-high 16 games below .500.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are 18-22 on the road this season... New York is 5-14 in its last 19 road games.

GAME 81: Today marks the halfway point of the season...New York was 38-43 after 81 games last year...The last time the Mets had 32 or fewer wins after 81 games was in 1995 (32-49).

VS. MIAMI: After dropping the first two games of this series, the Mets will look to avoid being swept for the first time by the Marlins since September 18-20, 2017 in Miami.

SINCE MAY: The Mets are 15-39 since May 1...The club is hitting .228 with 58 homers during that span...The pitching staff has posted a 4.61 ERA since the beginning of May.

HOMERS: The Mets have hit 25 home runs in their last 21 games and 39 homers in their last 35 games, but, 28 of those have been solo blasts.

HOMERS ALLOWED: New York's pitching staff has surrendered 24 homers in its last 10 games and 38 home runs in its last 20 contests.

JOSÉ BAUTISTA: Has a .438 OBP since joining the Mets on May 22...Has reached base safely in each of his last 15 games dating to June 15 (.466 OBP in that time)...He has three homers and six RBI over his last eight contests...Bautista is hitting .343 (12-35) with five doubles, three homers, 10 RBI and 11 runs scored over his last 13 games...He has drawn 15 base-on-balls in his last 15 games and 24 walks in 35 games with the Mets since May 22.

HEADING BACK TO THE SIX: José Bautista will play his first game in Toronto as a visitor since 2004 on Tuesday...From 2008-2017, Bautista hit 288 homers, the second-most in franchise history...He ranks third in team history with 766 RBI, second in walks (803), had a .372 OBP and appeared in the fifth-most games in team history (1,235).

FLORES FLOURISHING: Wilmer Flores has driven in nine runs in his last seven games and 12 RBI in his last 12 games...Flores has hit in eight straight games, going 9-30 (.300)...Flores' career-high is a nine-game hitting streak from August 18-31, 2016...He has reached base in a career-best 15 straight games with a plate appearance...Over his last 34 games, Flores is batting .295 (31-105) with nine doubles, four home runs, 20 RBI, 11 runs scored, 10 nine walks and a .350 OBP (dating back to May 4).

ASDRÚBAL CABRERA: Is hitting .340 (18-53) with two doubles, two homers, eight RBI and five runs scored in his last 12 games...Cabrera has 44 RBI this season, his second-highest total prior to the All-Star break during his career...Cabrera had 51 RBI in 2011 for Cleveland in the first half.

METS-MARLINS NOTES: The Mets have had a winning record in Miami in two of the last three years.

HONORING RUSTY STAUB: Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



STEVEN MATZ: Will make his eighth road start of the season... Is 2-2 with a 2.60 ERA (10 earned runs/34.2 innings) this year... He has the eighth-lowest road ERA in the NL (min. 34.0 innings)... Matz has allowed one run or fewer in five of his seven road starts this year...He is 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA (two earned runs/18.1 innings) in three career starts at Marlins Park.

BULLPEN: The pen has 21 losses, the most in the majors...The pen is 3-13 with a 6.29 ERA (82 earned runs/117.1 innings) in their last 33 games (since May 25).

FROM ELIAS: Tim Peterson has held righthanders to 0-21, which is the longest hitless start-of-career streak for any Mets pitcher... Peterson has allowed one run in his last 9.1 innings and two runs in his in first 11.1 innings (1.59 ERA) in the majors.

BRANDON NIMMO: Is seventh in the NL and 14th in the majors with a .389 on-base percentage, fourth in the NL and 13th in the majors with a .540 slugging percentage and is fourth in the NL and 11th in the majors with a .929 OPS...He is tied for fourth in the majors with six triples...Nimmo is tied for second in the majors with 12 hit by pitches...Nimmo has a career-high 12 home runs... He has 10 homers since May 23 tied for the 10th-most in the majors during that span...Nimmo's previous professional career-high was 11 homers in 97 games (392 at-bats) with Las Vegas (AAA) in 2011.

MICHAEL CONFORTO: He has a 15.0% walk rate for the year, ranking ninth in the majors...Conforto has four doubles, three homers, 12 walks and eight RBI in his last 17 games...Conforto is batting .267 (165-60) with a .392 on-base percentage during that span.

AMED ROSARIO: Has walked four times in his last two games... Is hitting .293 (12-41) with a .370 OBP over his last 15 games.

LAST START: Matz tonight makes his 16th start of the season and his eighth on the road...Took a no-decision in his last start vs. Pittsburgh on June 26, a 4-3 Mets walk-off victory...The southpaw tied a season-high with 7.0 innings, giving up three runs, earned, on six hits with no walks and seven strikeouts...Matz faced the minimum and held the Pirates hitless through his first 4.0 innings before surrendering two runs on four-consecutive hits in the top of the fifth and a solo home run in the top of the seventh...The homer (Gregory Polanco) was just his fourth long ball allowed to a lefty in his career (43 total home runs allowed)... Was his fourth quality start in five June outings...Did not walk a batter for the first time this season and was his fifth-career start with no walks and at least seven strikeouts (first since May 20, 2016 vs. Milwaukee)...Matz has now allowed six or fewer hits in 14 of his 15 starts this season...Matz gave up eight hits in his last road start against Colorado on June 21.

VS. MIAMI: Will be making his first start vs. Miami this season...Matz has pitched 13.1-consecutive scoreless innings at Marlins Park, including back-to-back scoreless outings there...In three-career starts in Miami, he is 2-0 with a 0.98 ERA (two earned runs/18.1 innings)...Stephen Strasburg is the only visiting pitcher to make three-straight scoreless outings at Marlins Park...In five-career starts vs. the Fish, Matz is 2-2 with a 3.67 ERA (11 earned runs/27.0 innings).

ROAD WARRIOR: Will make his eighth road start of the season tonight at Toronto...In seven road starts this season, Matz is 2-2 with a 2.60 ERA (10 earned runs/34.2 innings)...Has allowed one or no earned runs in five of his seven road starts this season...In 29 career starts on the road, Matz is 11-9 with a 3.46 ERA (62 earned runs/161.1 innings).

MATZ SINCE MAY: Is 2-3 with a 3.20 ERA (20 earned runs/56.1 innings) in 10 starts since the beginning of May...All six of his quality starts this season have come in that span...Has allowed three or fewer earned runs in nine of those 10 starts in that stretch.

STRANDED: In his last 10 starts, opponents are hitting .185 (17/92) against Matz with men on base...Opponents are also hitting .149 (7/47) with runners in scoring position in his last 10 starts...Opponents are hitting .220 (26/118) with runners on base and .232 (16/69) with a runner in scoring position so far this season.

BALLS IN PLAY: Only 14.6 percent of balls put in play against Steven Matz this season have been line drives, the lowest percentage against any major-league pitcher this year (min. 70.0 innings)...52.6 percent of the balls put in play against Matz have been grounders, the eighth-highest percentage among that same group of pitchers, and the highest season percentage total of his career.

SUNNY DELIGHT: Matz will make his fifth daytime start of the season today...Has an 0-3 record with a 4.15 ERA in his previous four day starts (10 earned runs/21.2 innings)...In his 16-career daytime starts, Matz owns a 7-7 overall record with a 3.13 ERA (33 earned runs/95.0 innings) with 96 strikeouts and 29 walks...The lefty owns a 9.1 K/9 ratio in 16-career day starts.

TOP FIVE IN THE ORDER: The top five batters in opposing lineups are hitting for a combined .234 average (39-167) with seven homers and 37 strikeouts against Matz this season...The sixth-eighth spots in the order have gone 26-90 (.289) with five homers and 20 strikeouts against the southpaw.

STRIKING OUT THE COMPETITION: Through his first 15 starts of the 2018 season, Matz owns a 8.1 K/9 ratio (70 strikeouts/78.0 innings)...The southpaw has struck out 21.4 percent of the batters he's faced so far this season...Has fanned at least five batters in eight of his 15 starts this season.

TUESDAY'S STARTER: RHP ZACK WHEELER (2-6, 4.47)

LAST START: Took a no-decision in his last start on June 27 vs. the Pirates at Citi Field despite tossing 7.0-shutout innings...Allowed five hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in the Mets' 5-3 setback vs. Pittsburgh...Was his second scoreless start of the season and his second-career scoreless home outing (also, 7.0-scoreless innings vs. Baltimore on June 6).

HOT WHEELS: Wheeler has completed at least 6.0 innings in 11 of his 15 starts this season...Eight of those 11 starts of at least 6.0 innings have been quality starts...Five of his last eight starts have been quality outings...Tossed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last three starts and in seven of his last eight starts...Has a 3.38 ERA (19 earned runs/50.2 innings) in eight starts since May 22.
