**LEADING OFF:** Angels play the second contest (1-0) of a six-game home stand against **Dodgers** (July 6-8; 1-0) & **Mariners** (July 10-12)...Angels head up the 5 freeway to **Dodger Stadium** (July 13-15) before reaching the All-Star Break...**PLEASE NOTE TOMORROW'S 5:08 PM FIRST PITCH FOR ESPN'S SUNDAY NIGHT BASEBALL (Clubhouse opens at 1:30 pm)**...14 of next 17 games are at home (LAA is 11-4 in last 15 games at Big A)...Angels are 4-3 in last seven affairs but have dropped seven of 11 and nine of 13 overall...LAA is in fourth place, a season-high 13.5 games back (2<sup>nd</sup> time) of pace in A.L. West (11.0 games behind second Wild Card spot)...Angels are 32-41 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 6-16 when a left-hander starts (39-28 vs. RHS).

**A STAR IS BORN:** On this date in 2011, the Angels selected the contract of 19 year-old **Mike Trout** as he became the youngest player in the Majors (19 years, 335 days). He made his debut the following day (7/8/11) becoming the youngest Halo in MLB since **Andy Hassler** (19 years, 224 days) on May 30, 1971.

**FAST FACT:** Halo relievers lead the A.L. in lowest inherited runners scoring percentage (20.7%). **Just 31 of 150 inherited runners have scored against the Halo bullpen this season.**

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** 3-2 comeback victory was fourth walk-off win of season (7<sup>th</sup> all-time vs. Dodgers – last two have been by way of an error)...Just second win when trailing after eight innings (2-35)...**First time overcoming a deficit in final at-bat for a walk-off win since May 16, 2017 vs. White Sox (scored two runs in bottom of 11th for 7-6 win)**...**Mike Trout** joins **Jason Giambi** (78 in 2000) as only A.L. players since 2000 with 78 walks before All-Star break...**Ian Kinsler's** ninth career walk-off plate appearance (first since June 7, 2016 for Detroit vs. Toronto)...**David Fletcher** (two-out, game-tying single in 9<sup>th</sup>) becomes first Angels' rookie with a game-tying hit down to last out since **Carlos Perez** (Oct. 3, 2015 at Texas)...**Last night's first pitch temperature of 108 degrees marked hottest home temp in club history** (previously 106 degrees twice; 9/4/88 vs. Boston, day game & 9/3/07 vs. Oakland, night game).

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** Angels' top prospect **OF Jo Adell** will play on the U.S. Roster in the All-Star Futures Game Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park. Adell, selected in the first round of the 2017 amateur draft, has a combined slash line of .323/.374/.617 between **Burlington (A)** and **Inland Empire (A+)**. In 65 combined games, he has 21 doubles, 3 triples, 17 HRs, 61 RBI & 11 SBs.

**SCIOSCIA 3K:** June 30<sup>th</sup> marked the 3,000<sup>th</sup> career game for **Mike Scioscia** as manager of the Angels...He's just the sixth skipper to have at least 3,000 games with one team (**Connie Mack, John McGraw, Bobby Cox, Walter Alston** and **Tommy Lasorda**).

**HALL PASS:** On July 29<sup>th</sup>, **Vladimir Guerrero** will become the first player inducted into the Hall of Fame in Cooperstown as an Angel...He played six seasons with LAA (2004-09) batting .319 (1034/3237) with 194 doubles, 173 HRs & 616 RBI in 846 games. His .319 average is highest in franchise history (min. 250 PA)...**Named 2004 A.L. MVP after batting .337, with 39 HRs, 126 RBI, a league-leading 124 runs and a franchise record 366 total bases.**

**OHTANI UPDATE:** Shohei Ohtani (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7<sup>th</sup>. On June 28<sup>th</sup>, an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. On Tuesday, he was reinstated from the 10-day DL (missed 21 games) in a return to the team as a designated hitter. In approximately three weeks (from 6/28), he will be re-assessed to determine if he can pitch this season.

**FROM THE START:** Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 49 of last 61 games...**Starters have fashioned a 3.33 ERA (332.2 IP – 123 ER) since May 1, second in A.L. in span (3rd in MLB).**

**MAKE WAR:** Trout's 6.6 WAR this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **Jose Ramirez (CLE)** at 5.7...On pace for a 12.1 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is **Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)**...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his 60.7 career WAR is tops in MLB history thru 1,014 games.

**SHELVED:** Angels have 13 players currently on the disabled list...The average D.L. stint for an Angel player this season is 31 games...On **June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)**...50 players have appeared for LAA this season, most in MLB (franchise record is 55 in 2017)...29 pitchers have played for LAA (12 starters), most in team history thru 89 games (LAA used a club-record 31 pitchers last season).

**MVP x 3? Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout ranks in Top 4 in MLB in several offensive categories**, including HRs (T2nd; 24), runs (2nd; 67), times on base (1<sup>st</sup>; 177), walks (1<sup>st</sup>; 78), IBB (1<sup>st</sup>; 15), OBP (1<sup>st</sup>; .452), SLG (3<sup>rd</sup>; .619), OPS (2nd; 1.070) & OPS+ (1<sup>st</sup>; 196.0)...**Trout has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (12)**...Since his call-up in 2012, Trout has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His 78 walks are most in Angel history through 89 games.

**GLOVE STORY:** LAA is errorless in 56 of 89 games...**Club has 41 errors thru 89 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .987 fielding pct.**...Catchers own a 47.2 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2<sup>nd</sup> in MLB)...**Mike Trout and Charlie Blackmon are only CF's in MLB with 1.000 fielding pct.**

**PITCHING POINTS:** LAA pitchers have 41 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 89 affairs (LAA ranks 4<sup>th</sup> in A.L. with 805 Ks)...305 walks are third-most in A.L...Angels' bullpen has logged 329.1 IP, second in A.L. to TB...15 blown saves are third-most in A.L...Halos have allowed 117 HRs, third-most in MLB (2<sup>nd</sup> in A.L.)

**HOT HALOS:** In his last two outings, **Felix Pena** has logged 10.2 innings allowing two earned runs (2.53 ERA) while striking out 13...In 15 outings since June 1, **Cam Bedrosian** has allowed one earned run (15 IP; 0.60 ERA) with five walks and 15 Ks...**Andreton Simmons** has hit safely in 12 of his last 13 overall games batting (.353; 18/51)...**Rookie David Fletcher** has hit safely in seven of eight and nine of his first 12 MLB starts (4 multi-hit games)...He has reached base safely in 13-of-18 games with an at-bat...**Martin Maldonado** has 12 RBI in his last 14 games...**Tyler Skaggs** went 3-1 with a 0.84 ERA (32 IP – 3 ER) in June (5 GS)...**His 0.84 ERA led all MLB starters last month**...Has allowed two earned runs or less in 13 of his 16 starts and his 2.64 ERA ranks eighth in A.L.

**A BIT ON ALBERT:** **Albert Pujols** is 36 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez**...**Albert's** double July 4<sup>th</sup> at Seattle (4<sup>th</sup> inn) marked his 1,275<sup>th</sup> career extra-base hit, tying **Alex Rodriguez** for sixth all-time...Next up is **Willie Mays** at 1,323 XBH (5<sup>th</sup>).

**NOT A FAN:** **Andreton Simmons** has struck out just seven times since May 1 (216 PA)...He went 90 PA without fanning (May 18-June 22)...He leads MLB in PA per SO with 21.40 (321 PA/15 K) while **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB (10.73; 322 PA/30 K)...**Simmons leads MLB batting .347 (34/98) with two strikes.**

**TRIPLE THREATS at 1K:** June 21<sup>st</sup> marked the 1,000<sup>th</sup> career game for **Trout**...He joined **Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a .300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases at the 1K milestone.

**ALBERT ALERT:** **Albert Pujols** is 27<sup>th</sup> all-time with 3,049 hits...**Rod Carew** is 26<sup>th</sup> at 3,053...His 3,000<sup>th</sup> hit came May 4<sup>th</sup> at Seattle to become fourth player with 3,000 hits & 600 HRs (**Aaron, Mays & A. Rodriguez**)...**AP is seventh all-time with 1,964 RBI (BBREF)**...**Lou Gehrig** is sixth with 1,995 RBI.

DODGERS:** Clubs split 2017 season series 2-2...Angels have won seven of last 10 matchups...**Since 2005, Angels are 41-29 vs. LAD (24-12 at Angel Stadium)**...All-time, Halos are 37-21 at home, 27-30 on road and 64-51 overall against LAD...**Under Mike Scioscia, LAA is 59-42 vs. LAD**...In his career vs. LAD, **Albert Pujols** is batting .311 (115/370) with 30 2Bs, 18 HRs, 68 RBI and 56 BB in 98 games.

**MARINERS ON DECK:** Angels have dropped five of last six to M's (all on road)...Mariners lead 2018 series 6-3 (all at SAFECO)...**Angels are 6-3 in last nine home games vs. Seattle**...LAA is 101-79 over M's since 2009...**A. Simmons** is batting .379 (11/29) vs. M's this season.

**THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY**

**July 7**  
**(2014)** The Angels win over the Toronto pushes the Halos all-time record to the .500 mark (4,272-4,272-3) as a franchise for the first time since opening its debut campaign 1-1 in 1961; **(2006)** **John Lackey** surrenders a lead-off double to **Mark Kotsay** in Oakland and then retires the next 27 batters for a one-hit shutout, the 21<sup>st</sup> one-hitter in club history; **(2011)** Angels select the contract of **Mike Trout**. Trout immediately became the youngest player in MLB (19 years, 335 days).

**July 8**  
**(2006)** Rookie **Jered Weaver** earns the win over Oakland to start his career 6-0 – the only player in club history to win his first six Major League starts; **(2011)** **Mike Trout** makes MLB debut (19 years, 335 days), becoming the youngest Halo to debut since May 30, 1971 (**Andy Hassler**, 19 years, 224 days); **(2012)** **Mike Trout** is the first rookie in A.L. history to lead the league in both batting (.341) and stolen bases (26) at the All-Star Break.

**TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP DECK MCGUIRE**

**0-1, 7.56 ERA**

*First career appearance vs. Dodgers*

- **BACK TO STARTING:** Making eighth appearance (second start of the season); Fourth appearance (second start for Angels)...First six outings of the year came in relief (four with Blue Jays and two with Angels).
- **AS A STARTER:** In three career starts, is 1-2 with a 7.15 ERA (11.1 IP – 9 ER)...Start on July 1 at Baltimore was his first Major League start since Oct. 1, 2017 for Cincinnati at Chicago (N.L.) when he earned his first Major League win (W; 5 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO).
- **A NEW HALO:** Acquired from Texas on June 19 in exchange for cash considerations or a player to be named later...He was optioned to Triple-A Salt Lake after the trade and recalled from Salt Lake the following day (did not appear in a game for Bees)...Made one appearance for Triple-A Round Rock during four day stint in Rangers organization after being acquired by Texas on June 15
- **FAMILIAR FOES:** Made Angels debut on June 24 vs. Toronto after having previous Major League appearance come on May 24 for Blue Jays vs. Angels...**He became the first pitcher to have consecutive appearances come in this fashion since Francisco Liriano in 2012** (pitched for Twins at White Sox on July 23 and then pitched for White Sox at Twins on July 31)...Additionally, the last pitcher to appear for and against the Blue Jays in the same season also happens to be **Francisco Liriano** in 2017. (STATS LLC)...The last pitcher to appear for and against the Angels in the same season was **Fernando Salas** last year.
- **STARTER #12:** On July 1, became 12<sup>th</sup> different starting pitcher for Angels this season, which is tied with Oakland for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 13).
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with loss in first start of the year on July 1 at Baltimore after tossing 3.1 innings and allowing five earned runs on five hits with two walks and four strikeouts...All five runs allowed came in the 4<sup>th</sup> inning...Yielded back-to-back HR to **Manny Machado** (2-run) and **Mark Trumbo** (solo).
- **LONG RELIEF:** Pitched four innings in last relief appearance on June 26 at Boston, marking longest relief appearance of career and longest relief outing by any Angels pitcher this season...Allowed three HR in the game after having allowed three HR total in his previous 11 Major League appearances.
- **2010 DRAFT, ROUND 1:** Was selected 11<sup>th</sup> overall by Toronto in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft...Is one of three players from that round of the draft to appear for Angels this year (**Kaleb Cowart** – 18<sup>th</sup> overall and **Cam Bedrosian** – 29<sup>th</sup> overall).
- **WITH THE JAYS:** Appeared in four games (all in relief) for Toronto earlier this season...Did not record a decision and pitched to a 6.48 ERA (8.1 IP – 6 ER) with five walks and seven strikeouts...Two of four outings were scoreless...Was designated for assignment by Blue Jays on June 9.
- **WITH BUFFALO:** Appeared in eight games (all starts) for Triple-A Buffalo this season, going 4-2 with a 3.22 ERA (44.2 IP – 16 ER) and 40 strikeouts...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in six of eight starts and tossed eight innings in back-to-back starts on May 4 vs. Syracuse and May 9 vs. Rochester.
- **VS. DODGERS:** Tonight marks first career appearance vs. Dodgers.
- **AT ANGEL STADIUM:** Tonight marks second appearance (first start) at The Big A...Is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (1 IP – 0 ER)...Only previous appearance at Angel Stadium was Angels debut on June 24 vs. Toronto, where he worked one inning and allowed one run (unearned).
- **2017 WITH THE REDS:** Made Major League debut on Sept. 12, 2017 for Cincinnati vs. St. Louis (1.2 IP, 1 H, 1 SO)...In six total games for the Reds (two starts), went 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (13.2 IP – 4 ER).
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2011 (Florida State League) and 2017 (Southern League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally selected by Toronto in the first round (11<sup>th</sup> overall) in the 2010 First-Year Player Draft out of Georgia Tech...Has played in minor with affiliates of the Blue Jays (2011-14, '18), A's (2014), Dodgers (2015), Cardinals (2016), Reds (2017) and Rangers (2018).
