LEADING OFF: HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ANGELS' PR GURU ADAM CHODZKO!!!...Adam enjoys rollerblading in his free time... Tonight the Angels open a nine-game road trip to Minnesota (June 8-10), Seattle (June 11-13) and Oakland (June 15-17)... Club has on off day June 14...Halos went 5-1 on the six-game home stand vs. Texas (2-1) and Kansas City (3-0), outscoring opponents 25-13 in the six games...Sweep of KC marked fourth series sweep of season...Halos have won four straight and five of last six games...Angels are 22-25 since a club-record 13-3 start...LAA is 11-7-2 in 20 series.

TODAY'S ROSTER MOVES: RHP/DH Shohei Ohtani has been placed on the disabled list with a grade 2 sprain of the UCL...He underwent a PRP and Stem Cell injection yesterday with Dr. Steve Yoon in Los Angeles...Additionally, INF Kaleb Cowart has been placed on the DL with a left ankle sprain...The Angels have selected the contract of INF José Fernández and INF Nolan Fontana has been recalled from Salt Lake.

RICHARDS TONIGHT: In last six starts, Garrett Richards is 1-3 with a 1.89 ERA (33.1 IP – 7 ER) and 32 strikeouts...In six career games vs. Minnesota, is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (36.1 IP – 12 ER).

FROM THE START: Halo starters have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 30 of last 35 games...LAA starting pitchers have fashioned an A.L. best 2.61 ERA (203.2 IP – 59 ER) since May 1...Angels are only team in MLB to boast five starters with 3.50 ERAs or lower (min. 7 starts)...Angels' team ERA of 2.86 ERA for May was best month since September 2010 (2.72), and best May since 1989 (2.66).

YOU READ THAT RIGHT: Mike Trout is on pace for a 14.2 WAR season...Since 1900, the only player to finish with a 14+ WAR campaign was Babe Ruth in 1923...Trout had 54.2 career wins above replacement entering 2018 - only player with more WAR through his age-25 season was Ty Cobb (56.0). ESPN STATS

MVP x 3? Mike Trout ranks second in MLB with 19 HRs...On pace for a career-best 49 homers...Ranks second in MLB with 147 total bases and leads MLB with 52 runs and a .444 OBP.

HOT HALOS: Over his last nine games, Ian Kinsler is batting .351 (13/37) with eight runs, four doubles, four home runs and eight RBI...Since a 6-for-44 (.136) slide to end May (5/16-31), Justin Upton has opened June 10-for-23 (.435) with three home runs and four RBI...He is the first Angel with 14 home runs as a left fielder (min. 100 G in LF) in a season since Vernon Wells (25 home runs) in 2011...Martín Maldonado has hits in 11 of last 14 games...11 RBI his last 14 games...Hitting .311 (.28/90) with six doubles and three home runs since May 1.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TO ME! On his 27th birthday Tuesday, Andrew Heaney tossed his first career complete game and shutout...First complete game one-hitter for Angels since Ervin Santana on June 16, 2012 vs. Arizona...First Angels lefty with a one-hit shutout since Chuck Finley on May 26, 1989 at Boston...First player to throw a one-hit shutout on his birthday since Cardinals' Vicente Palacios on July 19, 1994 at Houston...First Angel to throw a shutout on his birthday since Andy Messersmith on August 6, 1971 vs. Minnesota.

YOUNG BLOODS: Angels selected outfielder Jordyn Adams (1st round, 17th overall) out of Green Hope HS (Cary, NC) and INF Jeremiah Jackson (2nd round, 57th overall) from St. Luke's Episcopal School (Mobile, AL) on the first day of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft...LAA chose high school players with their first two picks for the first time since 2010 when Kaleb Cowart (18th overall) and Cam Bedrosian (29th overall) were selected.

JUNE BUG: Mike Trout's .352 (184-for-524) career batting average in the month of June is the highest average amongst active players (min. 400 PA) in any month of the season...He is hitting .391 (9-for-23) so far this June.

SHO-ING OFF: Despite his last outing cut short with a blister, Shohei Ohtani became the fourth Japanese-born pitcher with 60+ strikeouts through his first nine MLB games, joining Hideo Nomo (75), Masahiro Tanaka (73) and Yu Darvish (63)...His 61 strikeouts are a club record through a pitchers' first nine career starts and leads 2018 A.L. rookies...Ranks second among A.L. rookies in ERA with 3.10 (behind teammate Jaime Barria's 2.48 ERA)...Has allowed two-or-fewer runs over each of his last five starts with a 2.17 ERA (29.0 IP – 7 ER)...Halos are 7-2 overall in his starts.

ALL-STAR SIMMONS? Andrelton Simmons has hits in 11 of 12 with an AB and 31 of his last 36 games hitting .350 (48-for-137) with 13 XBH and 25 RBI in the span...He has struck out just twice since May 1 (139 PA)...Has reached base safely in 39 of last 41 games...Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.2 (242 PA/10 K) and ranks fifth in A.L. batting .330...Leads LAA with 19 multi-hit games.

MIKE'S MILESTONE: Mike Scioscia posted career win #1,600 on May 29th to pass his former manager of 13 seasons Tommy Lasorda (1,599).

WHERE THE 'O' GO? LAA limited to three runs or less in 33 of 63 games on season and in 17 of last 27 contests...Held to two runs or less nine times in May...LAA has six 10+ hit efforts in last 25 games...Angels hitting .234 (67/286) with RISP since May 1 (32 G).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: Ohtani leads A.L. rookies in strikeouts (61) and ranks third in wins (4)...Has a hit in 23-of-32 games with an at-bat...3rd in A.L. among rookies in extra base hits with 15...His six HRs are fourth-most in A.L. among rookies (all six hit at home) while his 20 RBI rank fifth...A.L. Rookie of Month for April.

PUJOLS POINTS: Albert Pujols has 3,025 career hits – good for 27th all-time...Rod Carew is next on the all-time hit list at 3,053...Pujols collected his 3,000th hit on May 4th at Seattle to become just 4th player to log 600 HR and 3,000 hits (Hank Aaron, Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez)...Pujols sits at 629 career two-baggers (11th all-time) to move within three of Top 10 (David Ortiz, 632)...Pujols ranks seventh all-time in RBI with 1,950...Stan Musial is next on the list with 1,951 RBI (Baseball-Reference.com).

THIS N' THAT: Halo outfielders lead MLB with 15 OF assists (Calhoun tied for MLB lead with 7)...Halos' average home attendance (37,074) ranks second in A.L...Club boasts nine sellouts thru 35 home games...LAA has 25 errors thru 63 games (third-fewest in A.L.) and rank third in circuit with a .989 fielding pct.

Vs. TWINS: 2018 season series is knotted at 2-2...Club split four-game series at Angel Stadium, May 10-13...LAA is 6-12 in last 18 overall games vs. Twins...Halos are 18-11 in last 29 home games vs. Minnesota but 11-12 in last 23 on road (1-5 in last six games at Target Field)...Halos lead all-time series 372-344.

(1977) Nolan Ryan tied his club record striking out 19 batters in 10 innings vs. Toronto in the 2-1 win...Ryan ended his career with the Angels posting four 19-strikeout games; **(2004)** The Angels tied an MLB record striking out 26 Brewer batters in a 17-inning 1-0 loss... Ironically, it was the Angels' batters who struck out 26 times in a 20-inning contest at Oakland on July 9, 1971 to set the record.

June 9
(1961) Angels' pitcher Ryne Duran, in the second game of a doubleheader at Boston, set an A.L. record by striking out seven consecutive batters in the Angels' 5-1 win.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER – RHP GARRETT RICHARDS

4-4, 3.25 ERA

Since 2014, is 8-2 with a 2.38 ERA (75.2 IP – 20 ER) in month of June

- Making 13th start of the season and seventh on the road...Second start of 2018 vs. Minnesota.
- **OFF THE BOARDS:** Is pitching to a 1.89 ERA (33.1 IP – 7 ER) across last six starts...His ERA ranks fourth in the American League in that span (since May 4)...Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 10 of last 11 games.
- **RUNS OF SUPPORT:** Angels have scored 39 runs while Richards was in the game across his 12 starts (61 IP) this season...That average of 5.75 runs per nine innings leads Angels and ranks as 11th best in the American League (min. 40 IP).
- **HAPPY JUNE!** In 12 June starts since 2014, is 8-2 with a 2.38 ERA (75.2 IP – 20 ER)...In June of 2014, went 4-0 with a 1.05 ERA (34.1 IP – 4 ER) and established a franchise ERA record (min. 30 IP) for the month, breaking **John Lackey's** mark of 1.16 (38.2 IP – 5 ER) in June of 2008.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks second in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .217 (400/1842) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind only **Chris Sale**.
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In 13 road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2-3 record and 2.60 ERA (62.1 IP – 18 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in 10 of the 13 starts.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Saturday vs. Texas after tossing a season-high seven innings and allowing one run (unearned) on one hit with one walk and nine strikeouts.
- **SCORELESS START:** Tossed 6.2 shutout innings on May 4 at Seattle, marking 15th career scoreless start (first of 2018); 11th scoreless start of at least 6.2 IP.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 20-17 record and 3.15 ERA (323 IP – 113 ER) in 60 games (51 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 20 wins are eighth most in the Majors in that span.
- **GROUNDED:** This season, has a ground ball rate of 54.4%, which ranks third in the A.L. (min. 50 IP).
- **UNEARNED:** Leads the Majors with 11 unearned runs this season...His 11 UER are the most by any Angels pitcher before the All-Star Break since **Kelvin Escobar** matched **Chuck Finley's** club record of 16 in 2006.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to *Fangraphs*, ranks third among A.L. players currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 40 IP), ranks fourth in the A.L. with a 95.9 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, NYY (97.6 MPH), **Gerrit Cole**, HOU (96.2 MPH) and **Charlie Morton**, HOU (96.1 MPH).
- **VS. MINNESOTA:** In six career games (five starts) vs. Minnesota, is 2-1 with a 2.97 ERA (36.1 IP – 12 ER)...Has allowed three-or-fewer runs in all five starts vs. Twins...Did not factor in decision in start vs. Twins earlier this year on May 10 at Angel Stadium after pitching 5.1 innings and allowing three earned runs on five hits with no walks and four strikeouts; all three runs came on a three-run HR by **Brian Dozier**.
- **AGAINST THE A.L. CENTRAL:** Owns a 10-5 record and 3.47 ERA (150.1 IP – 58 ER) in 38 career games (20 starts) against the A.L. Central...In three starts this year, is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (16 IP – 6 ER) against Central division opponents.
- **AT TARGET FIELD:** Tonight marks first start at Target Field since April 15, 2016...In two career games at the ballpark, is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (14.2 IP – 4 ER)...Earned win in first start in Minnesota on Sept. 19, 2015 (Game 2) and came one out away from a complete game victory.
- **CAREER-HIGH K'S:** Matched career-high (fourth time) with 11 strikeouts on April 21 vs. San Francisco...Became first Angels pitcher with 11+ strikeouts in six-or-fewer innings pitched since **Zack Greinke** on Sept. 25, 2012 vs. Seattle.
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 166 career games (111 starts), is 44-38 with a 3.50 ERA (729.1 IP – 284 ER) and 627 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 33-25 with a 3.08 ERA (499.1 IP – 171 ER).
