Since joining the Mariners on May 28, Denard Span is batting .301 (47x156) with a .343 OBP and a .468 SLG (.811 OPS)...among club leaders during that span (min. 150 PA), he ranks 2nd in batting, 2nd in slugging, 2nd in OPS and 3rd in OBP.

# .625

The Mariners have a .625 (35-21) winning percentage at Safeco Field this season, the 5th-best home winning percentage in the Majors...trail only Boston (.717/38-15), New York-AL (.704/38-16), Philadelphia (.654/34-18) and Chicago-NL (.635/33-19).

# 1.98

Mariners relievers have combined for a 1.98 ERA (11 ER, 50.0 IP) over the club's last 16 home games (6/30-c).

**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue a 2-team, 7-day, 7-game homestand with the first of four games vs. the Toronto Blue Jays...went 1-2 against Houston to open the homestand...following this series, will embark on a 2-state, 3-city, 10-day, 10-game road trip to Texas (3 G), Houston (4 G) and Oakland (3 G)... tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners have won 16 of their last 30 games, including a season-high 8-game winning streak (6/25-7/3)...the Mariners have also won 23 of their last 44 games, 30 of their last 53, 34 of their last 59, 39 of their last 65 and 41 of their last 69...Seattle is 49-34 in its last 83 games, 54-37 over its last 91 games and 59-41 in its last 100 games...Seattle is 20-18 during the day and 43-27 at night...Seattle is 35-21 at Safeco Field, 28-24 on the road.

- **Bird Hunting - Jean Segura** is batting .438 (7x16) with 3 runs, 2 doubles and 1 RBI in 3 games vs. the Blue Jays this season...he collected 3 hits on May 9 at Toronto, followed by 4 hits on May 10 north of the border.
- **Whiff - Edwin Díaz** has struck out his first batter faced 24 times this season, tied with Adam Ottavino-COL for most in the Majors...Díaz has struck out his first batter in 45.3% (24x53) of his appearances this season.
- **As Easy as 1-2-3 - Edwin Díaz** retired the Astros in order in the 9th inning Monday for his 40th save of the season...in 24 of his 40 saves, he has faced the minimum 3 batters in an outing of exactly 1.0 inning, the most such saves in the Majors...Craig Kimbrel-BOS is 2nd with 17 saves of 1.0 inning and 3 batters faced.
- **First Things First - Dee Gordon** is batting .356 (32x91) with 21 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 1 walk and 2 HBP when leading off a game this season...his 32 hits to lead off a game are the most in the Majors.
- **Close Games** - the Mariners are 41-17 (.707) this season in games decided by 1 or 2 runs, the highest winning percentage in the Majors...the Mariners are 27-14 (.659) in 1-run games (most 1-run wins in MLB) and 14-3 (.824) in games decided by exactly 2 runs (best 2-run winning percentage in MLB).
- **Four Score** - the Mariners are 44-13 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 19-32 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Get Through 8** - the Mariners are 1 of 3 Major League clubs with a 1.000 winning percentage (56-0) when leading after 8 innings this season, joining New York-AL (58-0) and Oakland (52-0).
- **Bullpen Bullies - Edwin Díaz** has not allowed an earned run over his last 14.0 innings spanning 14 appearances (6/25-c), while **Alex Colomé** has an active 12.2 scoreless innings streak over 13 games (6/30-c).

**DIABOLICAL DÍAZ**...Edwin Díaz recorded his first career Major League save two years ago today, striking out 3 of the 4 batters he faced in a 5-4 win over Boston on Aug. 2, 2016 at Safeco Field...over that span (8/2/16-c), Díaz leads the Major Leagues with 92 saves, ranking ahead of Kenley Jansen (87), Craig Kimbrel (81) and Alex Colomé (71)...during that same time, he ranks T3rd among primary relievers with 215 strikeouts (also: Dellin Betances), trailing only Craig Kimbrel (220) and Brad Hand (219).

**RELIEVER OF THE MONTH**...earlier today, Mariners closer Edwin Díaz was named American League Reliever of the Month for July...Díaz has earned back-to-back AL Reliever of the Month awards and has won 3 such honors this season and 4 over his career (also: July 2017, April 2018 and June 2018)...he converted 9-of-9 save opportunities while posting a spotless 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 10.0 IP) in 10 relief appearances in the month of July...Díaz struck out 19 and walked only 2 while limiting opponents to a .063 (2x32) average against and while recording a 0.40 WHIP (2 BB, 2 H, 10.0 IP)...he averaged 17.10 strikeouts-per-9.0-innings (19 K, 10.0 IP) in the month...his 9 saves were tied with Boston's Craig Kimbrel for the AL lead.

**THIS IS HIS HOUSE**...over his last 3 starts against the Blue Jays, dating back to 2015, Félix Hernández is 2-0 with a 0.86 ERA (2 ER, 21.0 IP) with 19 strikeouts and 6 walks...he has worked 7.0 innings in each of those 3 starts, while limiting Toronto to 1 or fewer earned runs in each of those outings...over those 3 starts, Félix has held the Blue Jays to a .167 (12x72) average against while posting a 0.86 WHIP (6 BB, 12 H, 21.0 IP).

**NO POUTINE HERE**...entering this three-game set vs. the Blue Jays, the Mariners are 13-7-2 in the 22 series between the two clubs at Safeco Field...Seattle has recorded three 3-game sweeps of Toronto at Safeco Field (last: 8/11-13/14) and a 2-game sweep (9/7-8/99)...since 2010, the Mariners are 4-4-1 in their last 9 home series vs. their neighbors from the North...the Mariners are 15-11 vs. Toronto at Safeco Field over that span with 18 of those 26 games being decided by 3 or fewer runs.

**THE EDWIN DÍAZ FILE**...Edwin Díaz recorded his Major League-leading 40th save of the season on Monday...he becomes the 4th pitcher in single-season club history to notch at least 40 saves, joining Fernando Rodney (48, 2014), Kazuhiro Sasaki (45, 2001) and J.J. Putz (40, 2007)...Díaz has 87 strikeouts this season, 3 shy of setting a single-season career-high; he had 89 strikeouts last season after recording 88 punchouts in his rookie campaign of 2016 (appeared in 49 games after being called up to the Majors in June)...with his next strikeout, Díaz will join Dick Radatz (1962-64 w/BOS) as the only primary relievers in Major League history to record at least 88 strikeouts in each of their first 3 seasons.

**WHAT A RELIEF**...the Mariners lead the Major Leagues in saves (42) and holds (78)...since 1973, only 6 clubs have led the Majors in saves and holds in the same season, most recently the 1992 Oakland Athletics...Edwin Díaz leads the Majors with 40 saves, while Juan Nicasio is T9th in MLB with 19 holds, and Alex Colomé is T11th with 18 holds.

**ELECTRIC EDDIE**...Edwin Díaz leads the Majors with 40 saves, while ranking 2nd among all relievers with 87 strikeouts (Josh Hader-MIL, 99)...of Díaz's 40 saves, 21 have come in 1-run games, most in the Majors this season (Craig Kimbrel-BOS, 12)...his 21 1-run saves are only 2 shy of equalling the Major League single-season record, set by Francisco Rodriguez in 2008 (23)...the Mariners are 48-0 when Díaz enters with a lead this season, including 23-0 when he enters with a 1-run lead...Díaz is 21-for-23 in 1-run save opportunities (91.3%) with a 0.77 ERA (2 ER, 23.1 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 5 walks.

**DID YOU KNOW?**...that with the addition of **Cameron Maybin**, the Mariners have 2 of the top-25 Major League leaders in Outs Above Average?...**Guillermo Heredia** ranks 19th in the Majors with 6 Outs Above Average, while Maybin is 25th with 4...Outs Above Average is a range-based metric from Statcast which measures a player's fielding skills and accounts for the number of plays made and the difficulty of those plays (e.g. a fielder who makes a 25% Catch Probability play gets +.75; one who fails to make the play gets -.25).

ABOUT FÉLIX...

- 32-year-old right-hander is making his 397th career start, his 22nd start of the season and his 17th career start vs. Toronto tonight.
- Is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and career strikeouts (see more in "He's Our Leader").
- Is the second pitcher in franchise history to record 300 games started as a Mariner (also: Jamie Moyer, 323 GS w/Seattle 1996-2006).
- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes... joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners pitchers to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL Pitcher of the Year...was 2nd in Cy Young voting in 2014.
- ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005.
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher...youngest pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days, 7/6/84 at MIN).
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted FA 7/4/02.
- A.L. All-Star: 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014 (starter) & 2015, most by any Mariner pitcher and 4th most overall behind Ken Griffey Jr. (10), Ichiro Suzuki (10) and Edgar Martinez (7).
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Is 32-22 with a 3.32 ERA (172 ER, 465.2 IP) in 69 career GS in August.

LAST OUTING...

tossed a season-low 2.2 innings while allowing 7 runs on 6 hits and 2 walks with 1 strikeout in his last outing, a 5-11 Mariners loss at Los Angeles-AL on July 28...sundered a solo home run to Mike Trout in the 1st inning... with 2 outs in the 2nd inning, allowed 4 consecutive batters to reach (BB, 2B, BB, 2B) and 3 runs to score before recording the final out...with 2 outs and 2 on in the 3rd inning, issued a 2-RBI single to Ian Kinsler before being relieved by Casey Lawrence; Lawrence allowed a 3-run home run to his 1st batter faced.

THIS IS HIS HOUSE...

is 4-5 with a 4.06 ERA (43 ER, 64.1 IP) in 11 starts in Safeco Field this season while holding opponents to a .245 average (60x245) and .420 slugging percentage, compared to 4-4, 7.58 in 10 road starts with opponents batting .298 (59x198) and slugging .495...for his career, is 90-62, 3.21 in 201 starts in Safeco Field (78-61, 3.41 in 195 road starts).

CLIMBING THE RANKS...

has 2,437 career strikeouts, 42nd-most in Major League history...with 4 more strikeouts, Félix will tie Jamie Moyer for 41st most strikeouts in MLB history with 2,441...Félix has struck out 4+ batters in 6 of his last 9 starts.

HE'S BACK...

activated from the 10-day disabled list on July 21...originally placed on the DL on July 10 (retroactive to July 8) with lower back stiffness.

OUT OF THE GATE...

in the 1st inning, Félix has posted a 9.43 ERA (22 ER, 21.0 IP), while earning a 4.22 ERA (48 ER, 102.1 IP) in the 2nd inning and later...Félix has allowed 3-or-more runs in the 1st inning in 4 of his 21 starts; he's 1-2 in those games & the Mariners are 2-2...has allowed 1 (5 G) or 0 (10 G) runs in the 1st inning of 14 of his 21 starts; he's 6-6 in those games & the Mariners are 7-8.

IMPRESSIVE START...

since 2005, has recorded 55 starts in which he has thrown at least 6.0 innings and not allowed a run...that total ranks 2nd among starting pitchers behind only Clayton Kershaw (64)...the next closest pitcher is Justin Verlander with 53...during this stretch Félix has recorded 254 quality starts, the 2nd-most in the Major Leagues, behind only Verlander (271).

2017 SEASON RECAP...

went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts... placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14.

HE'S OUR LEADER...

became the Mariners all-time career leader in strikeouts on April 23, 2016 at the Angels (previous: Randy Johnson, 2,162)...became the club's all-time career leader in wins on May 9, 2016 vs. the Rays (previous: Jamie Moyer, 145)...is the only active pitcher in MLB who holds his current club's all-time record for career wins and strikeouts...Chica-go-AL's James Shields holds both records for Tampa Bay, while Arizona's Jorge De La Rosa owns both records for Colorado.

VENEZUELAN PRIDE...

Félix is one of two pitchers from Venezuela to win the Cy Young (also: Johan Santana, 2004 & 2006)...among pitchers born in Venezuela, Félix holds the all-time record for wins, starts, innings pitched and strikeouts.

CAREER...

has spent entire pro career with Seattle...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time ERA champ (2010, 2014), 2010 AL Cy Young Award winner... is 168-123 with a 3.30 ERA (960 ER, 2615.1 IP) in 396 career starts with 25 CG, 11 ShO, and 1 perfect game...holds Mariners all-time career records for wins, starts, quality starts (254), innings pitched and strikeouts (2,437).

26-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his 22nd start of the 2018 season tomorrow vs. Toronto...has won 5 straight starts, allowing just 6 earned runs across 34.1 IP (1.57 ERA) over that span...is one of 7 AL pitchers with at least 12 wins...W#12 in his last start, an 8-5 Mariners win on 7/29 at LAA (6.0,7,2,2,2,7,HR-1)...W#8 was the 1st complete game of his career, a 4-1 Mariners win on 6/29 vs. KC (9.0,6,1,1,0,7)...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 15 of his last 17 starts (4/24-c), going 11-3 with a 2.72 ERA (33 ER, 109.0 IP) with 92 strikeouts and 22 walks; has 11 quality starts over that span...2017: Went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)... was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle. CAREER: Drafted by St. Louis with 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...made MLB debut with the Cardinals on June 25, 2014 at Colorado...is 17-8 with a 4.17 ERA (94 ER, 203.0 IP) with 175 strikeouts in 43 games (35 starts) in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c)...missed the 2016 season while recovering from ligament replacement surgery on his left elbow...vs. TOR: Will be making his 1st career start vs. Toronto.
