TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 4, 2008: In the bottom of the third, Hideki Matsui (HR), Jose Molina (double), Derek Jeter (triple) and Alex Rodriguez (single) hit for a team cycle vs. Tampa Bay. Jason Giambi adds another double in the 4R inning, but the Yankees lose, 13-4.

April 4, 1989: On Opening Day at Minnesota, Yankees starter Tommy John sets an MLB record by pitching in his 26th Major League season (since broken by Nolan Ryan with 27). He allows just 2R in 7.0IP, earning the 287th win of his career in a 4-2 Yankees victory.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 5, 2005: Derek Jeter hits his only career regular season "walk-off" HR, breaking a 3-3 tie vs. Boston with a ninth-inning solo shot off Keith Foulke.

April 5, 1995: The Yankees acquire closer John Wetteland from Montreal. Wetteland would go on to become the 1996 World Series MVP, recording a save in each of the Yankees' four wins.

April 5, 1977: The Yankees acquire shortstop Bucky Dent from the Chicago White Sox for Oscar Gamble, LaMarr Hoyt, Bob Polinsky and cash.

April 5, 1913: The Yankees lose to the Brooklyn Dodgers, 3-2 in an exhibition game at Ebbets Field, marking the stadium's first contest.

AT A GLANCE: Today the Yankees play the final game of their two-game series vs. Tampa Bay after winning the home opener, 11-4, on Tuesday...the opener had been rescheduled following Monday's postponement due to snow...split a season-opening four-game series at Toronto...are 1-0 on their six-game homestand; will finish with 4G vs. Baltimore (Thurs.-Sun)...will have an off day on Mon., followed by 3G at Boston (4/10-12) and 3G at Detroit (4/13-15).

- ▶ Are scheduled to play their first 13G vs. the AL East.
- ▶ Are one game into a stretch of 16 of 22G at home (4/3-26).
- ▶ Seven of the Yankees' first 10G of 2018 are day games.
- ▶ Have two scheduled off days (4/9, 18) before starting a season-long stretch of games on 18 consecutive days (4/19-5/6).
- ▶ With Tuesday's win, are 16-3 in series openers vs. Tampa Bay since the start of 2015, including 10-0 at Yankee Stadium...coming into today, have won 10 consecutive home series over the Rays, their longest such streak ever vs. Tampa Bay and the longest streak over any opponent at the current Yankee Stadium.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: On Tuesday, the Yankees defeated Tampa Bay, 11-4, in their home opener, which had been postponed due to snow on Monday...**LHP Jordan Montgomery** started and allowed 1ER in 5.0IP (2H, 4BB, 4K) in a no-decision...**SS Didi Gregorius** (4-for-4, 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 8RBI, 1BB) had a leadoff double in the second, hit a pair of three-run HRs (in the third and seventh innings), walked in the fifth, and had a two-run single in the eighth, tallying a career-high 8RBI and setting a single-game franchise record for RBI by a shortstop and RBI by any Yankee in a home opener...also tied his career high with four hits (7x, first since 9/10/17 at Texas) and reached base safely a career-high-tying five times (4x, first since 6/12/17 at Los Angeles-AL)...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-3, 1RBI, 2BB) reached base safely four times and had his first RBI of the season with a bases-loaded walk in the eighth...**LF Brett Gardner** (2-for-4) scored 3R and threw out a runner at the plate...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (0-for-5) struck out five times, the most in a game in his career, tying the Yankees' single-game franchise mark (eighth time, first since now-GCL Yankees West manager David Adams on 9/29/13 at Houston)...**RHP Tommy Kahnle** (1.2IP, 1H, 4K) recorded his second career win as a Yankee (also 8/16/17 at the Mets).

- ▶ Improved to 6-4 in home openers at the current Yankee Stadium...are 17-4 in all home openers since 1998, 22-5 since 1992 and 28-7 since 1984...are 76-39-1 in home openers all time since the franchise's inception in 1903.
- ▶ **1978 WS MVP Bucky Dent** and **Mickey Rivers** threw out the ceremonial first pitches.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 1.40 ERA (25.2IP, 4ER) over their first five games this season, the second-best mark in the Majors (Boston-1.03).

- ▶ With **RHP Luis Severino** tossing 5.2 scoreless innings on Thursday, **RHP Masahiro Tanaka** allowing 1ER in 6.0IP on Friday, **LHP CC Sabathia** allowing 2R/1ER in 5.0IP on Saturday, **RHP Sonny Gray** allowing 1ER in 4.0IP on Sunday, and **LHP Jordan Montgomery** allowing 1ER in 5.0IP on Tuesday, marks the first time in franchise history since earned runs became an official statistic in the AL in 1913 that all five Yankees starters over the first five games of a season each allowed 1ER-or-fewer...are one of just two such teams this season (Boston-6G).
- ▶ Three of five starters this season (Severino, Tanaka and Montgomery) have allowed 3H-or-fewer in their start.

BABY BOMBERS: Despite having no rookies, the Yankees Opening Day active roster's average age was 28 years, 150 days, the club's youngest since at least 1993...marks the third consecutive year that the Yankees' average age on Opening Day was under 30 years old (28.334 in 2017, 29.099 in 2016)...every Yankees Opening Day roster from 1997-2015 averaged over 30 years old.

- ▶ Both players recalled since O.D. are rookies (OF Billy McKinney, INF Miguel Andujar).

OCTA-GONE: In Tuesday's home opener win vs. Tampa Bay, **SS Didi Gregorius** went 4-for-4 with 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 1BB and a career-high 8RBI, setting a single-game franchise record for RBI by a shortstop and RBI by a Yankee in a home opener...also tied his career high with four hits (7x) and reached base safely a career-high-tying five times (4x)...marked his second career multi-home run game (also 2HR on 7/23/17 at Seattle).

- ▶ Is the 11th Yankee all-time with at least 8RBI in a game and just the second in the last 22 seasons (since 1997), joining Alex Rodriguez (10RBI on 4/26/05 vs. Los Angeles-AL)...is just the second middle infielder in Yankees history to accomplish the feat, joining single-game franchise recordholder 2B Tony Lazzari (11RBI on 5/24/36 at Philadelphia)...the Yankees are the first franchise to have a player at all eight positions (excl. pitcher) record at least 8RBI in a game (see chart)-credit: Mark Simon, Sports Info Solutions.

- ▶ Marked the seventh time a Major League shortstop had at least 8RBI in a game and first since Boston's Nomar Garciaparra had 8RBI on 7/23/02-G1 vs. Tampa Bay...is the sixth SS in MLB history to accomplish the feat (also Garciaparra-twice, Miguel Tejada, Cal Ripken Jr., Chris Speier and Travis Jackson)...is just the third shortstop to do it with 4H (Tejada, 6/30/01 at Texas; Jackson, 8/4/23 at Cincinnati).

- ▶ His 8RBI marked the highest single-game total in the history of the current Yankee Stadium (since 2009).

- ▶ Has 8H this season, including an **MLB-leading seven extra-base hits** (4 doubles, 1 triple, 2HR)...according to YES Network research, his 7XBH are tied for the most through the first five games of a season in Yankees history (Alex Rodriguez-7XBH in 2007)...are also tied for the sixth-most XBHs through five team games of a season for any player since at least 1908.
- ▶ According to YES Network research, is one of three shortstops in Yankees franchise history with at least 2HR and 6RBI in a game, joining Roy Smalley (9/5/82 at Kansas City) and Everett Scott (7/4/23-G1 vs. Washington-AL).
- ▶ His 47HR since 2016 rank fourth among all MLB players whose primary position is shortstop (Trevor Story-51, Francisco Lindor-48, Corey Seager-48).
- ▶ Has hit 30HR at Yankee Stadium since being acquired by the team prior to the 2015 season, trailing only Aaron Judge (36).
- ▶ Is just the second Yankees cleanup hitter in the last 61 years (since 1958) with at least 8RBI in a game (also Danny Tartabull, 9RBI on 9/8/92 at Baltimore) and the fifth all time (Berra-1x, DiMaggio-2x, Gehrig-2x, Tartabull-1x)...over his last 25G batting cleanup (since 9/4/17), is batting .316/.346/.633 (31-for-98) with 8 doubles, 1 triple, 7HR, 33RBI.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: With **SS Didi Gregorius** hitting 2HR in Tuesday's win vs. Tampa Bay, **1B Tyler Austin** hitting 2HR in Saturday's loss at Toronto and **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hitting 2HR in the season-opening win on Thursday at Toronto, it marks the first time in franchise history that three Yankees players tallied multi-HR games within the club's first 5G of a season (previous best was 1990, when Mike Blowers, Dave Winfield and Jesse Barfield accomplished the feat within the club's first 13G).

NEW SKIP ON THE BLOCK: Manager **Aaron Boone** won his first game as an MLB manager on Thurs. at Toronto...is the 18th manager to win his Yankees managerial debut.

- ▶ According to *Elias*, he and his father, Bob, are the third father-son duo to serve as Major League managers, following George and Dick Sisler and Bob and Joel Skinner.
- ▶ Is the sixth consecutive Yankees manager to win his home Yankees managerial debut (also Girardi-2008, Torre-1996,

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS SEVERINO (1-0, 0.00 ERA)

RHP Luis Severino will make his second start of the season today vs. Tampa Bay...the 24-year-old will start on extended five days' rest due to the off day on Tuesday...made his first career Opening Day start on Friday at Toronto, allowing just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings (3BB, 7K) to earn the win...was the first scoreless Opening Day start by a Yankee since Roger Clemens (6.0IP, 3H) on 3/31/03 at Toronto...at 24 years, 37 days, Severino was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days) on 4/12/32 at Philadelphia-AL...was 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP, 5ER) in three starts this spring...marks his third straight season beginning the year in the starting rotation...finished third in 2017 AL Cy Young Award voting after posting a 14-6 record and 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) in 31 starts...made his first career AL All-Star Team in 2017...was originally signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 12/26/11.

LAST START: Made his first career Opening Day start on Friday at Toronto, yielding just 1H over 5.2 scoreless innings (3BB, 7K) to earn the win...was the first scoreless Opening Day start by a Yankee since Roger Clemens (6.0IP, 3H) on 3/31/03 at Toronto...the 1H marked the fewest by a Yankees Opening Day starter since at least 1908.

- ✦ At 24 years, 37 days, was the **fifth-youngest pitcher** since 1908 to allow 1H-or-fewer in a scoreless Opening Day start...was the youngest since 21-year-old Bob Feller threw a no-hitter for Cleveland on 4/16/40 at Chicago-AL.
- ✦ Is the first Yankees starter to earn a win on Opening Day since Chien-Ming Wang on 4/1/08 vs. Toronto.
- ✦ Was the first Dominican-born pitcher in Yankees history to earn the nod...was the fourth foreign-born pitcher to start for the Yankees on Opening Day, joining Masahiro Tanaka (Japan) in 2015-17, Chien-Ming Wang (Taiwan) in 2008 and Orlando Hernandez (Cuba) in 2000.
- ✦ At 24 years, 37 days, was the youngest Yankees Opening Day starter since Lefty Gomez (23 years, 138 days on 4/12/1932 at Philadelphia-AL)...only three pitchers younger than Severino have started for the Yankees on Opening Day: Gomez, Ray Caldwell (23 years, 351 days on 4/11/1912 vs. Boston) and Hippo Vaughn twice (23 years, 3 days on 4/12/1911 at Philadelphia-AL; 22 years, 5 days on 4/14/1910 vs. Boston).

SPRING TRAINING: Made three official spring starts, going 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP, 12H, 6R/5ER, 3BB, 17K)...completed 5.0IP and recorded 7K in each of his final two starts...made his last spring start on 3/24 against Atlanta in Lake Buena Vista (5.0IP, 2ER).

HOME SWEET HOME: Went 8-5 with a 3.71 ERA (97.0IP, 40ER) in 16 home starts...won five of his last eight starts at Yankee Stadium (5-2)...his 114K were the second-highest single-season total in the history of the current Stadium (Sabathia-120K in 2011).

VS. TAMPA BAY: Has a 5-1 record and 2.83 ERA (41.1IP, 38H, 13ER, 12BB, 55K, 5HR) in 10 games (six starts) in his career against the Rays...is 3-1 with a 3.91 ERA (25.1IP, 11ER) in five games (four starts) vs. the Rays at Yankee Stadium...went 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA (18.0IP, 4ER) in three starts vs. the Rays in 2017.

2017: Went 14-6 with a 2.98 ERA (193.1IP, 64ER) and 230K in 31 regular season starts in 2017...had the lowest ERA by a qualified Yankee since David Cone (2.82) and Andy Pettitte (2.88) in 1997...won nine of his final 13 reg. season starts...the Yankees went 20-11 in his 31 starts, winning 13 of his last 15...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in 10-of-14 starts after the All-Star Break, going 9-2 with a 2.28 ERA (86.2IP, 22ER).

- ✦ Ranked third in the AL in ERA, fourth in strikeouts, ninth in innings pitched and tied for ninth in wins...his 5.7 WAR (FanGraphs) was third among AL pitchers and fourth in the Majors.
- ✦ Ranked sixth in the Majors with 230K, the fourth Yankees pitcher to record 230K in a season, joining Ron Guidry (248 in 1978), Jack Chesbro (239 in 1904) and CC Sabathia (230 in 2011)...recorded the highest K/9.0IP ratio by a qualifying pitcher in Yankees history (10.71).

2017 POSTSEASON: Went 1-1 with a 5.63 ERA (16.0IP, 10ER) in his first four career postseason starts in 2017.

- ✦ Made his postseason debut in the 2017 AL Wild Card Game vs. Minnesota (ND, 0.1IP, 3ER), matching the shortest start by a Yankees pitcher in postseason history (also Art Ditmar in 1960 WS Game 1 at Pittsburgh and Bob Turley in 1958 WS Game 2 at Milwaukee)...at 23 years, 225 days old, was the youngest Yankee to start a postseason game since Andy Pettitte (23.111) in 1995 ALDS Game 2 vs. Seattle.
- ✦ With 9K in 2017 ALDS Game 4 vs. Cleveland, is the second-youngest Yankee (23 years, 231 days) to record 9K in a postseason game, behind Dave Righetti (22 years, 314 days for 1981 ALDS Game 2 at Milwaukee-10K).
- ✦ Started two potential elimination games at age-23; only two other such games in Yankees history were started by pitchers 23-or-younger: Mel Stottlemyre (22 years, 337 days in 1964 WS Game 7 at St. Louis) and Waite Hoyt (22 years, 34 days in 1921 WS Game 8 vs. New York Giants).
