MOM, MOM, MOMMY, MOMMY, MUM, MA

- The Colorado Rockies continue their six-game homestand with the final game of a four-game set against the Milwaukee Brewers, looking to salvage a series split after dropping the first two games prior to last night's 4-0 shutout victory ... split a two-game series against the Los Angeles Angels Tuesday and Wednesday, their first Interleague action of the season.
- Will be playing at home on Mother's Day for the second consecutive season ... are 10-15 overall on the holiday and have won each of their last two Mother's Day games.

WE'LL BE WAITING

- Right-hander Freddy Peralta will be making his Major League debut for the Brewers today, the eighth opposing starting pitcher to make his Major League debut at Coors Field, the second this season (also: San Diego's Eric Lauer, April 24) ... this is the first season in which two opposing starting pitchers have made debuts at Coors Field ... overall, opposing starters are 1-2 with a 8.38 ERA (29.0 IP, 27 ER) in debuts at Coors Field.

NOT EXACTLY CONSISTENT

- The Rockies won 4-0 last night, their fifth shutout win on the season and their second at home (also: April 24 vs. San Diego) ... Kyle Freeland recorded his fourth consecutive quality start, his fifth overall, after pitching 6.1 scoreless innings with four hits, four walks and six strikeouts ... he is the first starter to log four consecutive quality starts in 2018 (two pitchers had streaks of five or more in 2017).
- The Rockies lost 11-10 in 10 innings to the Brewers on Friday night ... led the Brewers 9-3 after four innings and entered the ninth inning up 10-8 before losing 11-10 in 10 innings ... the six-run blown lead was their largest blown lead since Aug. 31, 2016 vs. Los Angeles-NL (led 8-2 after seven innings, lost 10-8).
- All nine Rockies starters, including the starting pitcher, recorded at least one hit on Friday ... seven different players recorded at least one RBI.
- It was the first time two teams recorded at least 16 hits at Coors Field since June 20, 2014, also vs. Milwaukee.

GO JOE

- Trevor Story accounted for all four runs batted in on Saturday, his second consecutive four-RBI game ... is the first player with back-to-back four-RBI games since Nolan Arenado did so Sept. 26-27, 2015 ... Dante Bichette is the only Rockies player to ever have four or more RBI in three consecutive games, July 24-26, 1997.

TIME TO START A NEW ONE

- The Rockies club-record streak of nine consecutive quality starts was snapped on Wednesday after Tyler Anderson allowed four runs over five innings ... over that nine-game span, Rockies starters went 6-3 with a 1.92 ERA (61.0 IP, 13 ER) with an opponents' batting average of .190 (42-for-221).

PRESS START

- After allowing 13 runs to San Diego on April 23, including nine in the seventh inning, Colorado has posted a 3.04 ERA (142.0 IP, 48 ER) over their past 16 games while going 10-6 ... over that span, starting pitchers have allowed 29 earned runs over 96.1 innings of work (2.71 ERA) with 12 quality starts.
- The 3.04 ERA since April 24 ranks third in the NL, fourth in MLB.
- Have allowed greater than three runs five times over the last 16 games.

THAT WAS THEN

- The Rockies were 6-3 on the road trip to Miami (1-2), Chicago-NL (2-1) and New York-NL (3-0) ... won the final two games in Chicago prior to a three-game sweep of the Mets, the Rockies' first sweep of 2018 ... Colorado hit .223 on the trip, including .280 in the final four games ... the pitching staff posted a 2.31 ERA (78.0 IP, 20 ER) on the trip.

ALGONQUIN FOR THE GOOD LAND

- Colorado plays the Brewers seven times this season, this four-game series at home and a three-game series at Miller Park August 3-5.
- The Rockies took the season series vs. the Brewers in 2017, taking four of seven games ... lost two of three at Coors Field but took three of four at Miller Park.
- Colorado has dropped each of the past two series at Coors Field vs. Milwaukee, having last beat them in a series at home in 2015 ... are 5-10 vs. the Brewers at Coors Field since 2014.
- Nolan Arenado's .367 (36-for-98) batting average against Milwaukee is fourth-highest among all active players (min. 100 plate appearances).
- Rockies outfielder Gerardo Parra spent parts of two seasons with Milwaukee (2014-15), batting a combined .312 (139-for-446).
- Brewers Manager Craig Counsell was originally selected by the Rockies in the 11th round of the 1992 First-Year Player Draft, the first draft in Rockies history.
- Rockies bullpen coach Darren Holmes spent two seasons with the Brewers (1991-92) before being selected by the Rockies with the fifth pick in the 1992 Expansion Draft.

LEAVE A MINT ON THE PILLOW

- Colorado's 3.35 road ERA (199.0 IP, 74 ER) is fourth-best in the NL ... rank fourth in the NL with 191 road strikeouts.
- Over their 23 road games Colorado starters have one 10-7 with a 3.06 ERA (129.1 IP, 44 ER) with 13 quality starts.
- Have averaged 3.78 runs scored per game with a .215 batting average (163-for-759), ranking 14th in the NL and 28th in MLB.

#COORS!

- 33 of the Rockies' 51 home runs have come on the road, the second-most road home runs in the NL and tied for the third-most in MLB.
- Charlie Blackmon is tied for the Major League lead with 10 road home runs ... hit is first seven home runs on the road before homering at Coors Field on April 22 vs. Chicago-NL ... per Elias, he is the first Rockies player to have his first seven home runs come on the road since Ian Stewart in 2010.

BEAT THE STREAK

- Nolan Arenado has reached base in 22 consecutive games since April 12, tied for the second-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career ... reached base in 30 consecutive games in 2014.
- Has batted .317 (26-for-82) with five doubles, seven home runs, 16 RBI, 14 walks and 21 strikeouts over the course of the streak.
- Arenado currently ranks third in the NL in slugging percentage (.598), eighth in on-base percentage (.409) and ninth in batting average (.315).

GRAY DAY

- Colorado's 2013 first-round pick (third overall) out of the University of Oklahoma will make his ninth start of the season, his five at home, riding a season-high three-game winning streak ... Rockies are 4-4 in his previous eight outings.
- Started for the Rockies on Opening Day in Arizona on March 29, and joined Kevin Ritz (1996-97), Darryl Kile (1998-99), Mike Hampton (2001-02) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010-11) as the only Rockies starting pitchers to make consecutive Opening Day starts ... also started Opening Day at Milwaukee in 2017 ... Jason Jennings (2003, 2006), Aaron Cook (2007, 2009) and Jorge De La Rosa (2014, 2016) all made two Opening Day starts but not in consecutive years.

LAST TIME OUT

- Worked a season-high tying seven innings for the third time (second game in a row) en route to a four-hit scoreless performance in a 4-2 win vs. the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim on Tuesday to begin the homestand.

ZELCH

- Since allowing a first-inning leadoff home run to the Chicago Cubs' Anthony Rizzo on May 1 at Wrigley Field, has not allowed a run spanning 13.0 innings, the fifth-longest current streak in the National League and the longest by a Rockies this year.

STREAKING THROUGH THE QUAD

- Allowed 10 hits and one run with three walks and 25 strikeouts over 20 innings during his three-game winning streak ... opponents have hit .147 (10-for-68).
- Left-handed hitters are batting .071 (2-for-28) during the winning streak, right-handers .200 (8-for-40).
- Began the string by fanning 11 on April 25 in a 5-2 win over San Diego, snapping a career-long three-game losing streak.

CRAFT BREW

- No decisions in two previous starts (10.0 IP, 7 ER) vs. the Milwaukee Brewers, both at Miller Park ... allowed four hits and two runs over six innings on Aug. 23, 2016 ... left with a 4-2 lead after six.
- Also didn't figure in the 7-5 win on April 3, 2017, his first Opening Day start.

I'M A FAN

- His strikeout-to-walk ratio of 4.45 ranks 11th in the National League ... has struck out 49 while walking 11.
- Tied for fifth in the NL with four wins ... tied for 13th in the league with 46.2 innings and is 11th with 49 strikeouts.
- His 3.21 FIP (Fielding Independent Pitching) ranks ninth in the National League ... the 1.03 difference between his FIP and ERA is the fourth-largest differential in the NL ... his 1.2 Fangraphs WAR ranks eighth in the NL

#COORS

- In 31 career starts at Coors Field, has gone 14-6 with a 4.57 ERA (173.1 IP, 88 ER) ... his .700 winning percentage at home is the fourth-best mark in franchise history (min. 20 starts) ... the Rockies are 18-13.
- In 23 starts at Coors Field since May 13, 2016, has gone 14-5 with a 3.63 ERA (144.0 IP, 58 ER), 34 walks and 149 strikeouts ... the Rockies have gone 15-8 in his home starts over that span.

THOSE WHO WANDER

- Overall, in 35 starts on the road, has gone 10-14 with a 4.21 ERA (192.1 IP, 90 ER), 71 walks and 210 strikeouts.
- Has made four starts on the road in 2018, going 2-2 with a 3.42 ERA (23.2 IP, 9 ER) ... tossed seven shutout innings at San Diego on April 4.
- After allowing eight runs at New York-NL on July 14, went 4-2 with a 2.55 ERA (49.1 IP, 14 ER), nine walks and 52 strikeouts over his final eight starts on the road in 2017 ... logged six quality starts over that span.

WINNING

- Ranks fourth with a .545 winning percentage among Rockies all-time with 50 or more starts, behind Jorge De La Rosa (.585), Ubaldo Jimenez (.554) and Chad Bettis (.547).

A PERFECT 10

- Having fanned 10+ nine times, only Pedro Astacio (15) and Ubaldo Jimenez (10) have more games with double-digit strikeouts in Rockies history.
- Four of his double-digit strikeout games have coming against the Padres.

PRINCE OF PUNCHIES

- His 386 career strikeouts are 11th in franchise history, four behind John Thomson (1997-2002) for 10th ... ranks ninth among all-time Rockies starters in strikeouts.
- In 2016, set a Rockies rookie record with 185 strikeouts, the sixth-most strikeouts by any Rockies pitcher in franchise history and the most since Ubaldo Jimenez recorded the franchise record 214 strikeouts in 2010 ... his 9.91 strikeouts-per-nine-innings was a Rockies franchise record.
- Set a Rockies and Coors Field record with 16 strikeouts in his first career complete-game shutout, Sept. 17, 2016 vs. San Diego.

APRIL SHOWERS BRING MAY FLOWERS

- Finished April 2-3 with a 5.65 ERA (28.2 IP, 18 ER) ... allowed 33 hits with six walks and 31 strikeouts ... opponents hit .289.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP TYLER ANDERSON (2-1, 4.23)

The 28-year-old left-hander pitches Monday at San Diego as Colorado begins a three-city, nine-game, 10-day road trip ... first loss Wednesday vs. the Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim, 8-0 ... six hits and four runs, including two homers, in five innings ... is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (30.0 IP, 6 ER) in five career starts vs. San Diego ... debuted vs the Padres on June 12, 2016, a no-decision in a 2-1 win ... no decisions and a 1.50 ERA (12.0 IP, 2 ER) in two starts vs. the Padres this year ... Rockies won 3-1 in San Diego April 5 (6.0,4,0,0,4), but lost at home five days later, 5-2 (6.0,7,2,2,2,8) ... 0-1 with a 2.31 ERA (11.21 IP, 3 ER) in two career starts at Petco Park ... 1-0 with a 4.22 ERA (21.1 IP 10 ER) in five road starts this season.

- Ranks third in the National League with a .598 slugging percentage, eighth with a .409 OBP and ninth with a .315 batting average ... eight home runs rank tied for ninth.
- Has reached base in 22 consecutive games, tied for the second-longest active streak in MLB and the second-longest streak of his career (longest: 30 games, April 9-May 10, 2014).
- Has hit safely in 15 of 20 games (.333, 25-for-75) with seven home runs, 16 RBI, 12 walks and 20 strikeouts since returning from his five-game suspension April 20.
