**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets have lost 10 of their last 12 games, including five straight...New York has lost seven straight home games and is 12-18 at Citi Field this season...The last time the Mets dropped seven consecutive games at home was when they lost eight consecutive home games from May 10-25, 2013... The Mets are 7-12 in one-run games (3-5 in such games at home).

**INTERLEAGUE:** New York is 1-2 in Interleague action this year, after going 7-13 vs. the AL last year...The Mets will travel to Baltimore on August 14-15...Since 1997, when Interleague play began, the Mets are 186-179...The .510 Interleague winning percentage is the best all-time among NL clubs.

**VS. BALTIMORE:** The Mets had their six-game home winning streak vs. the Orioles snapped last night...New York is 10-4 all-time vs. Baltimore at home...The Mets have never been swept in a series of any length vs. Baltimore.

**INTERESTING TO NOTE:** The Mets are 22-11 (.667) in Interleague play against the Orioles, the third-best record in an Interleague series with 25 or more games played...The Marlins are 20-7 (.741) against the Orioles and the Angels are 25-9 (.735) against the Rockies.

**METS OFFENSE:** New York has scored two runs in its last 33.0 innings dating to the ninth inning of Friday night's game...New York has scored two or fewer runs in three straight games and in 22 contests this season, tied for sixth-most in the majors.

**INNINGS:** The Mets allowed two first-inning runs last night...New York has allowed 40 first-inning runs, tied for the seventh-most in the majors...New York has scored 41 runs in the eighth frame this year (the club's highest total for any inning)...The Mets 41 eighth-inning runs are tied for the second-most in the majors with the Braves...Houston is first with 42.

**HOME RUNS:** The Mets have homered in nine of their last 12 games...New York has 14 homers during this stretch...The club has 20 homers in its last 18 games and 30 long balls in its last 26 contests.

**MICHAEL CONFORTO:** Has three home runs in his last 12 games and four homers in his last 18 contests...Conforto has at least one hit in nine of his last 12 starts.

**NIMMO POWER:** Brandon Nimmo has 11 extra-base hits and nine RBI in his last 14 games (five doubles, one triple, five homers).... He has three homers in his last eight games...He has a career-high seven homers this season in 131 at-bats...Nimmo had six homers combined over his first two seasons (2016-2017) in 250 at-bats...Nimmo owns a .411 OBP entering play today, fourth-best in the NL and sixth-best in the majors (min. 150 PA)...He is tied for sixth in the majors with four triples.

**DEVIN MESORACO:** Has five homers, two doubles, 10 RBI and 12 runs scored with a .500 slugging percentage in 19 games with the Mets since he was acquired from Cincinnati on May 8.

**ORIOLES-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 6-1 in their last seven home games vs. the O's dating to June 18, 2006.

**HONORING RUSTY STAUB:** Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub passed away on March 29 at age 73... The Mets will wear a patch on the right sleeve on their home and away uniforms during the 2018 season honoring Staub...A six-time All-Star, he had 2,716 hits and 292 homers during his 23-year career.



**ZACK WHEELER:** In his 10 starts this season, Wheeler is striking out batters at a rate of 9.2 K/9 (57 strikeouts/56.0 IP)...Has fanned seven or more batters in five of his 10 starts this season, including three of his last five outings...Wheeler has gone 6.0 or more innings in seven of his 10 starts...He already has a career-high five hits this year (5-19, .263).

**STARTERS:** Over its last 17 games, New York starters have a 2.54 ERA (26 earned runs/92.0 innings).

**BULLPEN:** Over its two games, the pen has tossed 6.0 scoreless innings...In its last 12 games, the Mets bullpen is 1-8 with a 7.30 ERA (40 earned runs/49.1 innings).

**SETH LUGO:** Fired 3.0 shutout innings last night and has hurled 7.0 scoreless frames in his last two games...Lugo has allowed three earned runs in his last 25.1 innings (1.07 ERA)...He ranks seventh in the majors with a 2.04 ERA (min. 35.0 IP)...Lugo has held lefties to a .117 (7-60) batting average, the third-lowest mark in the majors (min 50 at-bats).

**JEURYS FAMILIA:** Is tied for seventh in the majors with 14 saves... Since 2015, he has the third-most saves in the majors (114).

**ANTHONY SWARZAK:** Made his first appearance since March 31 last night with 1.0 scoreless inning.

**MINOR LEAGUE STREAK:** Columbia (A) outfielder Raphael Gladu extended his hitting streak to 19 games last night...Gladu is hitting .377 (26-69) during the streak and has reached base safely in 24-straight games dating to May 2.

**FSL ALL-STARS:** Three St. Lucie Mets have been selected to the 2018 Florida State League All-Star Team...RHP relievers Ryder Ryan, Matt Blackham and Matt Pobereyko were named to team...Blackham leads St. Lucie with four wins and is 2-2 in save chances...He has given up only five earned runs in 23.2 innings (1.90 ERA) and has 29 strikeouts...Pobereyko leads St. Lucie with four saves...He has allowed two earned runs in 14 games (19.0 innings) for a 0.95 ERA with 25 strikeouts...Ryan made 16 relief appearance for St. Lucie and went 1-0 with two saves before he was promoted to Binghamton (AA)...He had 23 strikeouts in 20.1 innings and posted a 1.77 ERA (four earned runs/20.1 innings).

### MEDICAL HISTORY

- » Underwent Tommy John Surgery at the Hospital for Special Surgery on March 24, 2015...Did not pitch in the majors in 2015 or 2016.
- » On the D.L. from June 20-July 1, 2017 (biceps tendinitis)
- » On the D.L. from July 24-end of 2017 season (stress reaction in right arm)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Was dealt his fourth no-decision of the season in a 7-4 Mets setback on June 1 at Citi Field...Wheeler threw 6.0 innings, surrendering two runs, earned, on seven hits with two walks and four strikeouts...Both runs scored after he exited with no outs in the seventh inning...Completed at least 6.0 innings for the seventh time in 10 starts this season...Has issued two or fewer walks in six of his ten starts this season... Was Wheeler's fifth quality start of the year...Wheeler had six quality starts in 2017.

**INTERLEAGUE:** Today marks Wheeler's first-career start against the O's...Will be Wheeler's 12th start against an American League team...In his 11 Interleague starts, Wheeler is 3-4 and owns a 6.26 ERA (38 earned runs/54.2 innings) with 45 strikeouts and 41 walks...Today's start is Wheeler's second Interleague outing of the season (also faced Toronto at home on May 16).

**AT CITI:** Wheeler will make his 36th-career start at Citi Field and his sixth this season...Is 0-4 with a 6.43 ERA (20 earned runs/28.0 innings) in five starts at home this season...In 35-career home starts, Wheeler is 8-19 with a 5.12 ERA (109 earned runs/191.2 innings)...Has fanned 188 and walked 90 batters at home...Last season, he was 2-5 with a 5.88 ERA (32 earned runs/49.0 innings) in 10 home starts.

**DAY GAMES:** Today will be Wheeler's 28th daytime start of his career and his fifth of the season...In four day starts this year, Wheeler is 1-1 with a 5.71 ERA (13 earned runs/21.0 innings)...In his 27-career day games, the righty is 7-10 with a 3.97 ERA (66 earned runs/149.2 innings)...Last season, Wheeler made four starts during the day in which he posted a 2.18 ERA (five earned runs/20.2 innings) dealing 19 strikeouts and walking eight.

**CAREER-BEST STRIKEOUT PACE:** Wheeler owns a lifetime 8.61 K/9 ratio (409 strikeouts/427.2 innings)...In his 10 starts this season, he is striking out batters at a rate of 9.16 K/9 (57 strikeouts/56.0 innings)...Has fanned seven or more batters in five of his 10 starts this season, including three of his last five outings...His 57 strikeouts are a career high for strikeouts produced in his first 10 starts of a single season in his career.

**RISP-ECT:** Since his debut in 2013, Wheeler has held opposing batters to a .249 batting average (94-377) with runners in scoring position...This season, opponents are 16-48 (.333) with RISP...With runners in scoring position and two outs, opponents have hit .194 (33-170) against the righthander, including a .118 (2-17) mark this season...Has allowed five homers to 450 batters faced in RISP situations (1.1% HR rate with RISP) in his career...Only six of the 145 active pitchers with at least 400 batters faced with runners in scoring position since 2013 have allowed fewer homers in those scenarios (Lance McCullers Jr., Dellin Betances and Brad Ziegler have allowed three homers each and Vance Worley, Jared Hughes, James Paxton have surrendered four home runs each with RISP).

**WHEELING & DEALING:** This season, Wheeler has surpassed the 400 strikeouts mark and now has 409 punchouts...The righthander is one of five Mets pitchers to record at least one strikeout in each of his first 76-career games (also Matt Harvey, Dwight Gooden, Dillon Gee and Jacob deGrom)...Joined Harvey, Gooden, deGrom, Sid Fernandez and staffmate Noah Syndergaard as the only pitchers in franchise history to record 400 or more strikeouts in their first 75-career games.

**2017:** In 2017, he made his second-career Opening Day roster after missing the entire 2015 and 2016 seasons...Went 3-7 with a 5.21 ERA (50 earned runs/86.1 innings) in 17 start...Placed on the 10-Day D.L. on July 24, retroactive to July 23, with a stress reaction in his right arm and did not pitch the remainder of the season.

## FRIDAY'S STARTER: RHP JACOB deGROM (4-0, 1.49)

**LAST START:** Pitched 7.0 innings of one-run ball with a career-high-tying 13 strikeouts, yet was left without a decision in the Mets' 14-inning, 7-1 setback vs. the Cubs on June 2 at Citi Field...Was his eighth no-decision of the season, tied for the most in the majors...DeGrom lowered his ERA to 1.49 for the season (12 earned runs/72.1 innings), the lowest mark in the NL.

**HISTORIC STREAK:** DeGrom has allowed one or no runs in each of his last eight starts...He is one of seven pitchers in the last 50 seasons (since 1969) to string together eight-consecutive starts allowing one or no runs...There have only been two longer such streaks in the majors since at least 1908 (Bob Gibson, 11-straight in 1968; Jack Coombs, 10 in a row in 1910).

- Hit his third home run of the season with his go-ahead, two-run homer on May 11 at Philadelphia with the Mets trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning...It was the third home run in Mets history that gave the Mets a lead when trailing 1-0 in the ninth inning or later...The other two were hit by Lucas Duda (September 27, 2014, two-run walk off homer vs. Houston) and Daniel Murphy (April 27, 2015, a three-run homer in the top of the ninth at Miami).
- Hit his seventh career leadoff homer with his solo shot to start the game on May 7 in Cincinnati.
