METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets are 6-4 in their last 10 games... The Mets are 32-22 in their last 54 games and 44-37 since July 1...New York is 39-36 vs. the NL East...The Mets are 36-44 overall at home...The Mets are 10-8 in rubber games, including 7-2 in their last nine rubber games...Last night was New York's 14th shutout of the year.

RECORD NOTES: The Mets are 76-85 heading into today's final game...Last year the club went 70-92.

SERIES NOTE: New York is 11-3-2 in its last 16 series.

SEPTEMBER: The Mets are 17-10 this month, the seventh-best winning percentage (.630) in the majors...The pitching staff has a 3.26 ERA this month, the third-lowest in the majors.

WALK-OFFS: The Mets posted their eighth walk-off win this year last night, tied for the eighth-most in the majors...It's the most walk-off wins since the club had 10 walk-off victories in 2013... The last 1-0 walk-off win was September 15, 2013 vs. Miami (Travis d'Arnaud 12th-inning single)...Last night's 1-0, walk-off win in 13 innings was the longest such victory by innings for the Mets since May 31, 2006 vs. Arizona...Austin Jackson ended the game with a walk-off double in the 13th inning...It was his fourth-career walk-off RBI and first since August 11, 2015 (a walk-off single for Seattle vs. Baltimore).

THE CAPTAIN: David Wright is a seven-time All-Star, two-time Gold Glove winner and two-time Silver Slugger recipient...He holds the franchise record for hits (1,777), RBI (970), runs scored (949), doubles (390), total bases (2,945), extra-base hits (658), walks (762) and go-ahead homers (87).

SPECIAL DUO COURTESY OF ELIAS: David Wright and José Reyes started together for the first time since September 28, 2011 vs. Cincinnati last night...It was the 878th time the pair started together, the most of any teammate duo in franchise history... Wright and Reyes are the first pair of players in modern major league history (since 1900) with at least 12 years separating their first and last games started together at third and short for one team (August 4, 2004/September 29, 2018)...The previous longest gap was 11 years and 354 days between the first and last games started together by the Orioles' combo of Brooks Robinson (3B) and Mark Belanger (SS)...Their first game was in August 1965 and their last in July 1977...Research courtesy of Elias.

HIT MACHINE: Jeff McNeil has a .326 (72-221) batting average since his debut on July 24, which is the ninth-highest in the majors (min. 200 PA)...He is tied for ninth in the majors in hits since his debut...Is tied for fourth in the majors with 34 hits this month...Has the 10th-highest batting average (.333) in the majors this month (min. 70 AB)...McNeil's .326 average in his first 62 career major league games with the Mets is the highest average in franchise history (min. 190 PA).

SEPTEMBER STARTERS: Mets starting pitchers are 10-4 with a 2.50 ERA (44 earned runs/158.2 innings), the lowest ERA in the majors this month.

STARTERS STRIKEOUTS: Mets starters have 926 strikeouts in 905.1 innings this season...The franchise record for strikeouts by starting pitchers is 934 by the 1990 Mets rotation...This year's starting staff has a collective 9.2 K/9 ratio, on pace to smash the franchise record (8.13 K/9, set last year).

NOAH NOTES: Noah Syndergaard is 10-3 in his last 16 starts... He is 3-1 with a 2.20 ERA (eight earned runs/32.2 innings) and 32 strikeouts in September...He is 7-1 in 12 starts at Citi Field this year.

MLB RECORDS: Jacob deGrom has held opponents to three runs or less in 29 straight starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...DeGrom has hurled 24 straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak in major league history...He has set a major league record with 19 starts in which he pitched 6.0 or more innings and allowed three or fewer runs but did not win...Research courtesy of Elias.

CONFORTO CONNECTS: Michael Conforto has 17 homers (tied for the seventh-most in the majors) and 52 RBI (fourth in the majors) since the All-Star break...He is third in the majors with 43 RBI since August 1 and tied for sixth in homers (14) during that span...Conforto has 82 RBI, extending his career-high (had 68 RBI last season)...He also has a career-high 28 homers (one more than last year).

SIZZLING SEPTEMBER: Conforto is second in the majors with 29 RBI and is tied for the second in the majors with nine homers and 18 extra-base hits this month...Only two other Mets players have had 29 or more RBI in September: Gary Carter (34 in 1985) and Darryl Strawberry (30 in 1984)...The last Met with 30 or more RBI in a month was Carlos Beltran (32 RBI in July, 2006).

AMED ROSARIO: Has 72 hits since the All-Star break, tied for the 11th-most in the NL...Rosario is tied for fifth in the NL with 32 hits in September...Overall, ranks is tied for seventh in the NL with 24 stolen bases...He is tied for fourth in the NL with eight triples.

GOOD EYE: The Mets are tied for sixth in the majors with 464 walks.

2019 SCHEDULE: The Mets will open the 2019 campaign on Thursday, March 28 at Washington...The Home Opener is Thursday, April 4 vs. the Nationals...The Subway Series at Citi Field will be July 2-3...Additional Interleague series at Citi Field will be Twins (April 9-10), Tigers (May 24-26) and Indians (August 20-22)...Promotional details for the 2019 season, including a 50th Anniversary celebration of the 1969 World Champions, will be announced in the weeks ahead...The complete 2019 schedule can be found on mets.com.

LAST START: Syndergaard today makes his 25th and final start of the season... Took a no-decision in his last start on September 25 against the Braves at Citi Field...The righty tossed 6.0 shutout innings, allowing three hits and two walks with five strikeouts...Was his second scoreless start of the season, both of which have come in his last three starts.

VS. MIAMI: Syndergaard has gone 5-0 with a 1.96 ERA (10 earned runs/46.0 innings) with 54 strikeouts and six walks in seven-career starts vs. the Marlins...All seven of those starts have been quality outings...Has allowed exactly one earned run in five of those seven starts, including four of his last five...Has never allowed more than three runs in a start against the Fish...His 1.96 ERA against Miami is tied for the eighth-best all-time and his 9.00 K/BB ratio against the club is the third-best (min. five starts)...His streak of seven-straight quality starts vs. Miami is the second-longest active streak in the majors (trails only Jordan Zimmermann, eight-straight)...His five-game winning streak vs. Miami is tied for the third-longest in franchise history (Al Leiter is second with a six-game streak...R.A. Dickey won eight-straight decisions vs. the Marlins).

SYN-CITI: Syndergaard tonight makes his 13th home start of the season...Has won each of his last six home decisions and is 7-1 with a 3.25 ERA (25 earned runs/69.1 innings) overall in 12 starts at Citi Field this season with 74 punchouts and 22 walks...The Mets are 9-3 in those 12 starts...Is tied for seventh in the NL with seven home victories this season...Has yielded three or fewer earned runs in 29 of his last 34 home starts...Owns a 2.75 ERA (83 earned runs/271.2 innings) in 45 games (44 starts) at Citi Field, the second-lowest ERA among all pitchers with at least 120.0 innings pitched at the ballpark, trailing only staffmate Jacob deGrom and his 2.14 ERA at home.

CITI STREAK: Syndergaard tonight aims to win his seventh-straight decision at home...Is 6-0 with a 3.00 ERA (14 earned runs/42.0 innings) in his last seven outings at Citi Field...The last Mets pitcher to win at least seven-consecutive home decisions was Jacob deGrom from July 8, 2014-April 18, 2015.

LIMITING THE LONG BALL: Syndergaard has allowed three home runs in his last four starts after having his career-best 49.0-inning homerless streak snapped on September 8...Has allowed home runs at a rate of 0.56 HR/9 this season (nine home runs/145.1 innings), third-lowest in the majors (min. 145.0 innings)... After allowing two home runs in 6.0 innings on Opening Day, has allowed seven homers in his next 139.1 innings (0.45 HR/9)...Since the start of 2016, has the lowest HR/9 rate (0.50) among all 119 pitchers who have thrown at least 300.0 innings over the last three seasons...Is the only pitcher in that group with a HR/9 rate under 0.65 in that span.

CONTACT: According to Fangraphs, Syndergaard induces soft contact 24.6 percent of the time, the second-highest rate in the NL and fourth-highest in the majors...Only 22.0 percent of balls in play against Syndergaard are of the hard-hit variety, the lowest percentage in the majors by over two percentage points (min. 14.0 innings)...Staffmate Zack Wheeler is next-closest with a 24.8 percent hard-hit rate.

FAST AS LIGHTNING: According to PitchF/X average pitch velocity data, Syndergaard throws MLB's fastest four-seam fastball (97.8 mph), changeup (90.6 mph), slider (92.3 mph) and curveball (83.4 mph) among all 87 pitchers who have thrown at least 140.0 innings this season.

IN ELITE COMPANY: Syndergaard is one of four active major league hurlers with at least 75 career starts to sport a sub-3.00 career ERA...His 2.99 career ERA (169 earned runs/509.1 innings) trails only Clayton Kershaw's 2.39 career ERA, staffmate Jacob deGrom's 2.67 career ERA and Chris Sale's 2.89 ERA...Has the best strikeout-to-walk ratio among active NL pitchers with at least 75 starts (4.89 K/BB)...Is the only pitcher in modern MLB history (since 1900) to have a SO/BB ratio of 5.0 or greater in each of his first three seasons.
