

- ◆ **2011** Led the club in games (74), relief innings (72.0) and relief wins (10)...10 wins set a new career-high, and were the most relief victories in the majors and the second-most relief victories for a Rockies pitcher in franchise history (Gabe White - 11 wins in 2000).
- ◆ **2010** In his first full season with the Rockies, posted a career-low 2.93 ERA...His 92.0 relief innings were the third-most in the majors and second-most in the National League...91 strikeouts as a relief pitcher T7th in the majors and were most among Rockies relievers...his 5.69 strikeout-to-walk ratio was fifth among N.L. relief pitchers.

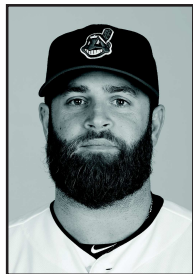

- Spent the season with the Texas Rangers, signing at the onset of spring training...Finished third on the club in homers (29), which was tied for 21st in the American League...Struggled against LHP in 2017, hitting just .196 (21-107) with eight homers and 17 RBI...He is still batting .270 (.892 OPS) in his career against lefties, 34 points ahead of his .236 career mark vs. RHP (.792 OPS)...His 241 home runs since 2008 rank 10th in the A.L. among active players...Batted .193, lowest in any season in his career and lowest in Rangers history for a player with 475+ PAs.
On May 11 vs. SD, ended a shutout bid with a solo HR in the 8th and ended the game with a 3-R walk-off HR in the 9th...Elias Sports Bureau noted that Napoli became 1st player in Rangers history with HR in back-to-back innings, the 2nd of which ended the game...Also had 2-HR game on 6/17 vs. SEA, career HR no. 250 and 251 (now has 16 career 2-homer games)...Made 116 total starts at 1B (90) and DH (26)...Suffered stress reaction in his lower right leg in September, and final game was Sept. 14 vs. SEA...Also on the D.L., June 4-15 with a lower back strain.

- 2016 Key off-season signing enjoyed his most prolific offensive season in 2016, collecting career-highs in home runs (34), RBI (101), games (150), plate appearances (645), runs (92) and hits (133)...His 34 home runs were the most by an Indians batter since Travis Hafner (42) in 2006, the most by an age 34-or-older player in franchise history...He and Carlos Santana teamed to become the first Indians hitters since 2002 (Jim Thome/Ellis Burks) to club at least 30 home runs in the same season...Led the team in home runs and RBI and finished 2nd in the walks and runs scored...On 9/23 became the first Indians hitter since 2007 (Hafner/Martinez) to top the 100-RBI and at 34 years old, became oldest Indians player to record 100 RBI in a season since Luke Easter (age 35, 103) in 1951...Was the first Indians right-handed hitter since Juan Gonzalez (2001) to eclipse 100 RBI mark...Made 98 starts at first base and 51 starts at designated hitter...Homered in 5 straight games, 7/30-8/3, to equal a career-high and become the first Indians hitter to homer in 5 straight games since Travis Hafner in Sept. 2005...Led the A.L. by seeing 4.57 pitches per plate appearance...Batted cleanup in 140 games...Collected his 1000th career base hit on 7/31, a home run against Oakland's Sonny Gray...Finished T2nd in the A.L. in home HR and 2nd in home RBI and homered every 12.45 at bats in Cleveland...Enjoyed a career-high 16-game hitting streak from 7/30-8/16...From 8/17 thru the end of the season he batted .157 (22-140)...His 194 strikeouts were a single-season franchise record, surpassing Jim Thome's 185 in 2001...Hit a combined .173 (9-52) w/3 2B, 1 HR & 3 RBI in 15 games in the 2016 Postseason run to the A.L. pennant.

- ◆ **2015** Split the season between Boston and Texas, acquired by the Rangers in early August as he returned to Arlington and became a key contributor in their march towards the A.L. West title...For the year, batted .224 (91-407) with 18 HR and 50 RBI in 133 games with Boston and Texas... Hit .278/.391/.563/.954 (42-151) in 179 PA's against left-handed pitching combined on the year and with the Rangers batted .364/.470/.673/1.142 (20-55) with 5 HR and 20 RBI against lefties.
- ◆ **2014** Reached base via hit, walk or HBP in 100 of 116 starts (86%)...Among AL players with at least 450 PA, ranked 11th with a .370 OBP...Drew a career-high and team-leading 78 walks, 5th-most in the A.L....Led the majors with an average of 4.47 pitches/PA (min. 400 PA)...Topped MLB with a career-best .450 OBP against left-handed pitching... Hit .300 (33-for-110) in 140 PA vs. LHP compared to .230 (70-for-305) vs. RHP...Paced the Sox with 9 game-winning RBI...Reached safely in a career-high 33 straight games from 4/4-5/14 ...Was the longest on-base streak by a Red Sox in 2014 and 2nd longest in the A.L. - ◆ **2013** In 1st season with the Red Sox, set career highs in RBI (92), hits (129), 2B (38), XBH (63), runs (79), BB (73), and AB (498)...Finished 2nd on the club in HR (23), RBI, SLG (.482), and OPS (.842)...His 92 RBI ranked T11th in the A.L.... Placed 6th with an AVG of 5.41 AB/RBI...Tallied 6 games with at least 4 RBI, tied for the MLB lead and the most by a Red Sox since Mike Lowell in 2007 (6)...Led the majors with a career-high 4.58 pitches/PA, the highest mark by a Red Sox as far back as data is available (beginning 1988)... - ◆ **2010** Led the Angels in HR (26) and SLG (.468) in final season with the club...Played a career-high 140 games...Tied for 7th in the AL in strikeouts (137) and tied for 8th in HBP (11)...Homered 8 times in May, which tied the club's single-month record as a catcher (also Earl Averill in May 1961).
- ◆ **2009** Led the Angels with 84 starts and 96 total games at catcher...Had a .330 AVG (31-94) vs. left-handed pitchers... Totaled 20 HR and tied for 4th in the AL with 17 HR as a catcher.
