WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost four straight games, eight of the last 10 and 17 of the last 23 as they conclude a season-long, 10-game trip this afternoon at Houston.
- RHP Lucas Giolito is scheduled to start for the White Sox, who are a season-high 29 games under .500.
- The Sox are 2-7 on this trip, losing the first three games at the Astros and two out of three at both Texas and Cincinnati.
- Following today's series finale at Minute Maid Park, the White Sox will return to Guaranteed Rate Field for a five-game, six-day homestand vs. St. Louis (7/10-11) and Kansas City (7/13-15) to conclude the pre All-Star portion of their schedule.
- The Sox went 4-3 on their last homestand vs. Oakland (2-2) and Minnesota (2-1) and 0-3 on their last trip to Cleveland.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- The White Sox are trying to avoid going winless in a season series of seven-plus games for the first time in franchise history.
- Chicago is 2-1 in its last 12 road games (outscored 100-54).
- The Sox have homered in six consecutive games (12 home runs total) and hit 22 in the last 15 contests.
- Lucas Giolito is 2-3 with a 7.50 ERA (35 ER/42.0 IP), 1.67 WHIP and 12 homers allowed over his last eight starts (two QS).
- Avisail Garcia has hit eight homers in his last 12 games, and hit safely in 16 of his last 17 games, batting .347 (25-72) with three doubles, two triples, eight HRs, 14 RBI and a 1.138 OPS.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- Chicago cut into an early five-run deficit and trailed by one before Houston scored six times from the sixth through the eighth inning en route to a 12-6 victory at Minute Maid Park.
- The Astros led 6-1 but the Sox scored four in the sixth on Matt Davidson's RBI single and Omar Narváez's three-run double.
- Houston answered with two runs in the sixth, one in the seventh and three in the eighth off four White Sox pitchers.
- James Shields suffered his 10th loss after allowing eight runs on 10 hits, including two home runs, over 5.2 IP.
- Avisail Garcia hit a solo homer in the ninth, his ninth of the season, fifth in the last six games and sixth on the trip.

TRYING TO BREAK THE BROOMS

- Chicago has never gone winless in a season series of seven games or more ... the club also is trying to avoid going winless in a season series against an American League opponent (STATS).
- The White Sox are trying to avoid being swept for the 10th time in 2018 in a series of two games or more, and the first time in a four-game set ... the Sox have never been swept by Houston in a four-game set, or at Minute Maid Park in a series of any length.

HOMER HAPPY

- The White Sox have hit 14 homers in the last eight games and 22 in the last 15 ... Daniel Palka and Avisail Garcia have combined to hit nine of the Sox last 12 home runs since Monday.
- Garcia's home runs were estimated at 376, 414, 431, 363 and 419 feet, and Palka's at 428, 448, 432 and 357 feet (Statcast).
- Palka 14th in MLB with an average distance of 415 ft. per home run this season ... he ranks third among rookies in the American League and fourth in MLB with 11 homers in 2018.

HE'S ON FIRE ... AVI-OUSLY

- Avisail Garcia is 18-48 (.375) with three doubles, two triples, seven homers and 11 RBI in his last 11 games since 6/27, and 21-62 (.339) with eight homers and 13 RBI in his last 14 contests.
- Garcia ranks among the MLB leaders since 6/27 in homers (1st, 7), slugging pct (1st, .958) and OPS (3rd, 1.350).
- His 14-game hitting streak from 4/22-7/4 was the longest of his career, tied for the sixth-longest in MLB in 2018 and the longest by a Sox in a season since Tim Anderson from 9/9-24/17 (15).

POWER AND SPEED

- Tim Anderson (13 HR/21 SB) is the only player in MLB this season with 13-plus home runs and 20-plus stolen bases.
- His 21 steals are a career high, and his 13 homers are four shy of his career-high 17 last season.
- Anderson is on pace for 24 home runs and 38 stolen bases in 2018 ... the 24 homers would be the sixth-highest total by a White Sox shortstop, and the 38 steals would be the most since Luis Aparicio in 1961 (53).

ON THE MEND

- OF Nicky Delmonico is 1-4 with a run scored in his first two injury rehab assignment games with Class AA Birmingham.
- Delmonico has been on the disabled list since 5/19 with a fractured third metacarpal on his right hand ... he suffered the injury after being hit by a Matt Moore pitch on 5/18 vs. Texas.

WHITE SOX VS. HOUSTON ASTROS

- Houston leads the season series, 6-0, including a sweep from 4/20-22 at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Astros have outscored the White Sox, 54-15, this season.
- The Sox are batting .177/.241/.306 (33-186) with six home runs, and own an 9.29 ERA (53 ER/51.1 IP) with one QS in 2018.
- The Sox have lost eight of the last nine games, are 6-8 in the last 14 and 12-12 in the last 24 ... Chicago is 6-8 in the last 14 games at Minute Maid Park.
- The Sox went 4-2 in 2017, including a 3-0 mark in Chicago.
- Chicago is 29-29 all-time, going 19-14 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 10-15 in Houston (9-13 at Minute Maid Park).

WILD WILD WEST

- The White Sox are 7-16 vs. the American League West in 2018, going 5-8 at home and 1-8 on the road ... they have won six of their last 14 games after losing eight of the first nine.
- Chicago has lost eight of the last nine games and 14 of 18 on the road against the division ... the club has scored four runs or less 12 times and allowed seven-plus 10 times.
- The Sox are 185-170 vs. the West since 2008 (77-97 on road).

BARRELING BACKSTOPS

- Omar Narváez and Kevan Smith are hitting a combined .358 (48-134) with seven doubles, two homers, 18 RBI and 15 multihit efforts in 37 games since 6/1 ... they have hit safely in 31 contests.
- Narváez (1st, .400) and Smith (2nd, .324) lead all MLB catchers in average since 6/1 (minimum 65 PAs).
- Narváez owns nine multihit efforts and has hit safely in 15 games since 6/1 ... Smith has hit safely in 17 of his 19 games in 2018 since being recalled from Class AAA Charlotte on 6/5.

BULLPEN BREAKDOWN

- The Sox bullpen has allowed a run in 11 straight games, recording a 6.92 ERA (31 ER/40.1 IP) and .268 opp. average.
- Joaquin Soria has not allowed a run in 15 of his last 16 appearances (2 ER/15.2 IP; 19 SO), going 8-9 in save chances.
- Rookie Jace Fry has surrendered 12 runs in his last 19 outings (18.0 IP) after making nine scoreless games to open the season.
- Xavier Cedeño has allowed just one earned run over 15 relief appearances (15 SO/12.0 IP) since joining the White Sox on 6/7.

STOP! THIEF!

- The Sox lead MLB with 70 stolen bases in 2018 ... Chicago is on pace to steal 127 bases, which would be its most since 2010 (160) ... they have not led MLB in steals since 1966 (153).
- Tim Anderson ranks second in the AL with 20 steals in 2018 ... he has stolen a base in each of his last four games.

TRIPLE THE FUN

- The White Sox rank second in the major leagues this season with 27 triples (Arizona is first with 31) ... the Sox led the AL with 37 triples last season, their most since 1999 (also 37).
- Yolmer Sánchez leads MLB with nine triples in 2018 after ranking sixth last season with eight.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- Reynaldo López (T12th, 11) and James Shields (T12th, 11) rank in the Top 15 in the American League in QS in 2018.
- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,351 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, one more than the second-place New York Mets (1,350) and 43 more than Oakland (1,308), the next-closest American League team.

PITO STILL FIRST AT FIRST

- José Abreu led American League first basemen in fan balloting for the Major League Baseball All-Star Game at the time of Thursday's final voting update.
- Starters and reserves will be announced tonight on the ASG Selection Show pres. by Camping World at 6 p.m. CT on ESPN.
- Abreu is the first White Sox to lead at any point in the balloting process since Frank Thomas won the fan election at 1B in 1996.
- He would be the sixth Sox player (11th time) to be fan-elected as a starter, joining Thomas (1994-96), Carlton Fisk (1981-82), Richie Zisk (1977), Dick Allen (1972-74) and Luis Aparicio (1970).

ON DECK: VS. ST. LOUIS CARDINALS

- The White Sox open the five-game homestand with a pair of interleague games vs. St. Louis ... the Cardinals recorded a pair of 3-2 wins from 5/1-2 at Busch Stadium.
- The Sox are hitting .190/.268/.222 with zero home runs, own a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP) and have been outscored, 6-4.
- Chicago has lost four consecutive games and six of the last eight in the series ... the club is 4-2 over the last six contests at Guaranteed Rate Field and 6-5 all-time.

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 23-year-old makes his 18th start of the season (ninth on the road) and second against Houston.
- Is 2-4 with an 8.65 ERA (41 ER/42.2 IP) in nine starts at home and 3-3 with a 5.36 ERA (28 ER/47.0 IP) in eight road starts this season.
- Ranks last among major-league pitchers (minimum 15 starts) in ERA (6.98), SO/BB ratio (1.00) and on-base percentage (.372) and second-to-last in walks per 9.0 IP (5.42).
- Owns an 10.06 ERA (19 ER/17.0 IP) and .465 opponents on-base percentage in the first inning this season.
- Has received zero runs of support seven times and one run on two occasions.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Lost 10 pounds in the offseason, dropping from 255 to 245.
- Was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.

LAST START

- Posted a no decision on 7/3 at Cincinnati despite allowing seven runs on eight hits over 5.0 IP ... walked three, struck out three and yielded a career-high tying three home runs ... gave up a pair of two-run homers in the first inning and a three-run shot to Adam Duvall in the fifth ... left with a 7-6 deficit after throwing 91 pitches (59 strikes) ... Sox rallied to tie the game before winning, 12-8, in 12 innings.

2018 STARTS OF INTEREST

- Carried a no-hitter through 5.1 IP on 6/28 vs. Minnesota ... pitched into the eighth inning for the first time in his career on 6/22-2 vs. Oakland.
- Allowed a career-high nine hits on 5/29 at Cleveland but did not issue a walk for the first time this season ... lasted 1.1 IP on 5/24 vs. Baltimore, the shortest start of his career ... won 5/13 at the Cubs despite walking a career-high tying seven batters ... became the third Sox pitcher since 2005 to earn the victory while issuing seven-plus walks, joining Derek Holland on 8/8/17 vs. Houston (seven over 5.2 IP) and Gavin Floyd on 4/13/09 at Detroit (seven over 5.0 IP).
- Earned his first victory of the season and first career road win on 4/26 at Kansas City ... allowed career highs of nine runs and seven walks over 2.0 IP on 4/21 vs. Houston ... his three HBP on 4/7 vs. Detroit were the most by a Sox starter since Chris Sale on 9/21/16 at Philadelphia (also three).

DAY AND NIGHT

- Has gone 6-3 with a 4.18 ERA (33 ER/71.0 IP) and .207 (54-261) opponents average over 12 starts during the day since 2017, compared to 2-7 with a 6.75 ERA (48 ER/64.0 IP) and .273 (68-249) opponents average in 12 starts at night.
- His 0.99 ERA during the day in 2017 would have led the American League with the required IP.

IT'S ALL ME

- Is one of 35 members of the Taylor Hooton Foundation advisory board, which is recognized as the leader in advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing drug use by the youth of America.
- The advisory board is comprised of at least one member from each of the 30 Major League clubs ... the players will participate in the THF 2018 public service campaign, including "It's All Me" themed PSAs which will appear in MLB's 2018 All-Star Game, League Championship Series and World Series programs.

2017 RECAP

- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
- Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts ... five of the outings were quality.
- Was recalled on 8/23 and made his White Sox debut that night vs. Minnesota (4 ER/6.0 IP; 3 HR) ... earned his first win with the Sox on 8/27 vs. Detroit, allowing just three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.
- Allowed one run and struck out a career-high 10 over 7.0 IP on 9/3 vs. Tampa Bay ... became the first Sox pitcher to strike out 10-plus batters within his first three starts with the club since Chris Sale in 2012.
- Received a ND on 9/13 at Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits in 6.1 IP ... became the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed ... earned the win in his final start on 9/24 vs. Kansas City (1 ER/7.0 IP).
- Began the season with Charlotte ... threw his first professional no-hitter on 5/25-1 vs. Syracuse (7.0 IP), marking the first no-hitter in BB&T Ballpark history ... was named IL Pitcher of the Week for 5/22-28.
- Entered the season ranked by MLB.com as the No. 12 Prospect in baseball.

- His parents, Rick Giolito and Lindsay Frost, are Hollywood actors ... Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
- His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks."
- Grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
- Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with RHP Max Fried ... Fried was selected by San Diego with the seventh overall pick in the 2012 draft and currently pitches for the Atlanta Braves.

VS. HOUSTON ASTROS

- Makes his third career start against the Astros ... is 0-2 with an 11.42 ERA (11 ER/8.2 IP) lifetime ... lost his last start on 4/21 at Guaranteed Rate Field, allowing a career-high nine runs on five hits and seven walks over 2.0 IP ... lost his other start on 9/19/17 in Houston, allowing two runs on seven hits over 6.2 IP.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Dylan Covey (3-3, 4.82) is scheduled to make his 11th start of the season, fifth at home and first career against St. Louis.
- Is 0-3 with a 13.20 ERA (22 ER/15.0 IP), 13 walks and five strikeouts over his last four starts ... was 2-0 with a 1.00 ERA (2 ER/18.0 IP) over his first three starts in June, including a streak of 18.0 consecutive IP without allowing an earned run to begin the month ... lost his last start on 7/4 at Cincinnati (6 ER/3.2 IP).
- Is 0-1 with a 7.16 ERA (13 ER/16.1 IP) in six career interleague starts and 0-2 with a 6.23 ERA (6 ER/8.2 IP) in two starts this season.
