CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2017: Spent the first half of the season with the Cubs' triple-A affiliate...threw a complete game shut out (7.0 innings) on June 7 against the Oklahoma City Dodgers, allowing just two hits.

- Was released by the Iowa Cubs on July 20...was signed by San Francisco on July 29 and went 2-3 with a 4.17 ERA in seven starts for the RiverCats.

2016: Split time between the Braves and triple-A Gwinnett...made one start for Atlanta on May 22 at Philadelphia and allowed three runs on seven hits over 5.0 innings.

- Had his best performance with triple-A on April 29...allowed just one hit and one run (unearned) in seven innings.
- Placed on the minor league seven-day disabled list, July 31, with a back strain...missed the rest of the season.

2015: Pitched at three levels including a brief stint (three games) with the San Diego Padres...spent the majority of the season with the Padres' triple-A and double-A affiliates in his first full season after Tommy John surgery, making a combined 31 appearances, including seven starts.

- Posted a 3.13 ERA through his first 15 appearances (one start) of the season.
- Earned his first career save on May 2 with San Antonio (double-A).

2014: Missed almost the entire season while recovering from Tommy John surgery.

- Made four rehab appearances from May 3-19 (two with single-A, two with double-A), going 1-0 with a 2.21 ERA and 17 strikeouts and one walk.
- Had his rehab assignment cut short after suffering soreness in his right elbow and missed the remainder of the season.

2013: Missed the entire season after undergoing Tommy John surgery on April 1, performed by Dr. James Andrews.

2012: Missed time while on the minor league disabled list, making eight starts between the AZL Padres, double-A San Antonio, and triple-A Tucson before seeing his first Major League action with six starts for the Padres to end the season.

NOTES

Drafted in the first round (30th overall) by Boston in 2008...was also offered a scholarship to play baseball and football at the University of Tennessee...was a two-time regional player of the year at Sarasota High School, where he played quarterback.

Was drafted as a pitcher but wanted to play shortstop...played the first half of the 2009 season as a pitcher and was elected to the All-Star Futures Game...played second half at shortstop before deciding to focus on pitching.

Father Pat Kelly and uncle Mike Kelly both played in the Majors...brother Chris and cousin Dustin played in the minors...Casey made his Major League debut on his father's birthday in 2012...his dad is currently the Reds' bench coach.

Underwent Tommy John surgery in 2013 and missed the entire season.

- Selected from double-A San Antonio on August 27 and made his big league debut that day with a start against Atlanta...worked 6.0 scoreless innings, allowing just three hits and two walks while striking out four to notch his first career victory...collected his first Major League hit in his debut with a single.
- Named the No. 4 prospect in the Padres organization by Baseball America heading into the season.

2011: Spent the season with double-A San Antonio, helping the Missions win a Texas League championship...named to the Texas League mid-season All-Star team.

- Ranked tied for fifth in the Texas League in wins (11), eighth in ERA (3.98) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (142.1).

2010: Made 21 starts for Portland (double-A), going 3-5 with a 5.31 ERA...struck out 81 batters while walking 35.

- Invited to Boston's Major League spring training for the first time in his career.
- Converted to a full-time pitcher over the winter after spending all or part of the previous two professional seasons splitting time between the mound and shortstop.
- Entered the season ranked as the No. 2 prospect in the Red Sox organization and the No. 1 pitcher according to Baseball America.

2009: Named Red Sox Minor League Pitcher of the Year, posting a 7-5 record and 2.08 ERA.

- Played at three levels of the Red Sox organization, beginning the season as a pitcher before switching to shortstop/designated hitter in mid-July.
- Participated in the 2009 All-Star Futures Game on July 12 at Busch Stadium, tossing a perfect 6th inning.
- Selected to the South Atlantic League All-Star team.

2008: Signed with the Red Sox on July 17 and played for the GCL Red Sox and short-season Lowell Spinners...played exclusively in the field as a shortstop, hitting .215.

- Pitched in the Instructional League in October.
