AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 3-3 on their seven-game homestand...will finish their four-game series vs. Detroit today (2-1)...dropped 2-of-3 vs. Chicago-AL...on Monday, begin a nine-game, 10-day road trip to Oakland (3G, Mon.-Wed.), Seattle (3G, Fri.-Sun.) and Minnesota (3G, 9/10-12).

- ▶ Are 11-4 in their last 15G and 18-8 (.692) in 26G since 8/6, the third-best record in the Majors over that span (St. Louis, 18-6, .705; Tampa Bay, 16-7, .696)...are 77-41 since 4/21.
- ▶ At 86-50 (.632), have the Majors' second-best record and second-most wins behind Boston (94-43, .686)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held the Majors' two best records for 24 consecutive days (since the end of play on 8/9), and held (at least a share of) the two best records for 108 of the last 122 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are a season-high-tying 36G over .500 for the third time this season (first since 84-48 at the end of play on Tuesday)...prior to this season, had not reached 36G over .500 since they were 86-50 at the end of play on 9/4/10...have not been 37G over .500 since finishing the 2009 season 44G over .500 at 103-59.
- ▶ Are 7.5G behind Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Today marks the end of a stretch of playing 18-of-24 games at home...are 15-8 so far: 10-7 at home, and 5-1 on the road.
- ▶ Have lost only 8-of-40 series since 4/19 (25-8-7).
- ▶ Own the Majors' best record when their starter tosses at least 6.0IP (53-9, .855).
- ▶ Have the Majors' second-best mark when scoring first (60-11, .845), behind Boston (63-11, .851).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated Detroit, 2-1, on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**Yankees batters** were held to 2R and 2H...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (7.0IP, 7H, 1ER, 1BB, 6K) started and earned his 10th win...**SS/2B Gleyber Torres** (1-for-3) hit a two-run HR in the fifth inning...**RF Andrew McCutchen** (0-for-3, 1HP) and **SS Adeiny Hechavarria** made their Yankees debuts.

- ▶ Was their third game with 2H-or-fewer this season...was their first win with 2H-or-fewer since 5/27/17 vs. Oakland (2H in a 3-2 win)...since the start of 2016, have won three of their 7G in which they were held to 2H-or-fewer...improved to 5-22 when scoring 2R-or-fewer.

COMEBACK KIDS: The Yankees recorded their 35th come-from-behind win of the season on Saturday...five of their last seven wins and seven of their last 11 have been comeback wins.

SLIM SHADY: The Yankees' 2-1 win on Saturday was just their sixth one-run game since 7/29...have won four of their last five one-run games.

TEN-AKA: RHP Masahiro Tanaka is the second pitcher in Yankees history to reach double-digit wins in each of his first five Major League seasons, joining Andy Pettitte, who did it in each of his first nine campaigns (1995-2003).

CENTRAL PERK: The Yankees are 22-8 (.733) vs. the AL Central this season...along with their 19-7 mark vs. the AL West (.731), own two of the top-four records by an AL team vs. an AL division (Oakland, 24-7, .774 vs. AL Central; Houston, 19-7, .731 vs. AL Central)...are 26-8 in their last 34G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 52-24 (.684) outside the AL East and 34-26 (.567) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ This series is the second in a stretch of five straight vs. AL Central and AL West opponents...will finish the season with five consecutive series vs. AL East teams.

SUMMER BREAK: Today finishes a stretch in which the Yankees play 30-of-37 games against teams currently under .500 (7/26-9/2)...are 22-14 so far, including 21-8 vs. teams under .500 and 1-6 vs. teams which are .500-or-better.

- ▶ Starting on Mon. at Oakland, will play 16 of their final 25 games against teams above .500...13 of their 16 remaining road games are against teams with winning records.

DELLIN DONUTS: RHP Dellin Betances converted his second save of the season on Sat. vs. Detroit...struck out Jeimer Candelario to begin the ninth inning to become **the first reliever in Major League history to record at least 100K in five consecutive seasons.**

- ▶ Extended his AL record by notching a strikeout for the 36th consecutive relief appearance (since 5/29)...is the fourth-longest streak in Major League history, behind Aroldis Chapman (49, 8/21/13-8/13/14), Corey Knebel (46, 10/2/16-7/15/17) and Bruce Sutter (39, 6/1-10/2/77)...has recorded at least 1K in 54-of-56 games this season.

EARNING THEIR PINSTRIPES: Yankees July acquisitions LHP J.A. Happ (5-0, 3.38 ERA, 34.2IP, 14ER in 6GS) and RHP Lance Lynn (1-1, 3.98 ERA, 31.2IP, 14ER in 6G/5GS) have combined for a 6-1 record and 3.66 ERA (66.1IP, 27ER) in 12 games (11 starts) with the team, with the Yankees going 9-2 in their 11 starts.

GLEYBER DAY WEEKEND: INF Gleyber Torres hit a two-run HR in the fifth inning of Saturday's win vs. Detroit...was his 22nd HR of the season, tied with Ronald Acuña Jr. for second-most among MLB rookies (Miguel Andújar-23).

- ▶ Has 2RBI in three consecutive games, the longest multi-RBI streak of his career...has homered in 2-of-3, 3-of-6 and 4-of-9...has reached safely multiple times in 5-of-6 games on the homestand, batting .526/.609/1.000 (10-for-19) with 3R, 3HR, 8RBI, 4BB and 1SB.
- ▶ Reached 22 career HRs in his 98th game on Sat. vs. Detroit, at the age of 21 years, 262 days...in Major League history, only seven other players as young as Torres reached the milestone in as few games (Ronald Acuña Jr., Tony Conigliaro, Carlos Correa, Bob Horner, Albert Pujols, Frank Robinson and Giancarlo Stanton).
- ▶ Has collected the game-winning RBI in each of the last 2G (two-run HR in the fifth on Saturday, two-run single in the eighth on Friday)...his with 11 game-winning RBI this season are tied with Miguel Andújar for the second-most on the team (Aaron Hicks-12).
- ▶ Has multiple hits in 3-of-4, 5-of-9 and 8-of-14...is batting .420/.500/.660 (21-for-50) with 9R, 4HR, 11RBI, 8BB and 2SB in his last 14G (since 8/18).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit at least 3HR in three of their last five games and five of their last 10G...lead the Majors with 32G with at least 3HR...are the second-most in a season in Yankees history (33 in 2004)...have hit 20HR in the last 10G and 47HR in the last 26G (since 8/6).

- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 222HR...is tied for the ninth-highest single-season total in franchise history...are on pace to hit 264HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Have hit nine of their last 12HR with runners on base, as well as 14-of-21 since 8/19.
- ▶ Lead the Majors with 21 individual multi-HR games, tied for the 13th-highest single-season total in Major League history...need three more to tie the 1966 Braves and 1961 Yankees (24 each) for the record.
- ▶ Have scored prior to the fifth inning in just two of six games on this homestand.

FAN FAVORITES: With a total attendance of 3,061,081 fans through 71 home dates in 2018, the Yankees have surpassed **3,000,000 for the Major League-record 20th consecutive season** (1999-2018).

- ▶ The Yankees have also set a record for the current Yankee Stadium with 22 home sellouts in 2018.
- ▶ The Yankees rank second in the Majors with an average home attendance of 43,114 per date (behind Los Angeles-NL, 46,861), and their total home attendance also ranks second to the Dodgers (3,327,101)...also lead the AL in average road attendance at 31,970.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY TOE YOU: INF Ronald Torreyes (born 9/2/92) turns 26 years old today.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 2, 2001: In a 1-0 Yankees win over the Red Sox, RHP Mike Mussina comes within one out of a perfect game at Fenway Park as Carl Everett delivers a pinch-hit, two-out single in the bottom of the ninth. Mussina records 13K and OBB in his 9.0IP.

Sept. 2, 1996: David Cone tosses 7.0IP of no-hit ball at Oakland (3BB, 6K) in his first start since surgery in May for an aneurysm. The Yankees win, 5-0, as Mariano Rivera allows the A's only hit.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 3, 1995: Tony Fernandez becomes the 10th Yankee to hit for the cycle in a 10-9, 10-inning loss vs. Oakland. Fernandez completes the cycle with a leadoff double in the bottom of the ninth and comes around to score the tying run.

OVERALL TRENDS: The Yankees are 4-2 through six of 7G vs. the Tigers in 2018 (one game at Comerica Park in April, a doubleheader in June and a four-game set at Yankee Stadium continuing today)...are 7-7 in the last 14 meetings but are 22-14 in 36 games since 4/7/13... Yankee pitchers have allowed more than 4R just seven times in their last 33 games vs. Detroit... **AT YANKEE STADIUM:** Are 2-1 at Yankee Stadium this year... the Yankees have lost 2-of-3 at home to Detroit in each of the last two seasons (2016-17) after winning each of their first seven consecutive series over the Tigers at the current Yankee Stadium... are still 21-11 (.656) at the current Yankee Stadium... since the start of 2001, are 41-19 at home vs. Detroit.

LAST START: Took a no-decision in the Yankees' "walk-off" victory on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL (5.2IP, 7H, 3ER, 1BB, 5K)...left the game trailing 1-0 with runners on first and second...held the White Sox hitless in 7AB with runners in scoring position, his best mark since the Red Sox went 0-for-9 with RISP off him on 6/20/18 vs. Boston w/ Minnesota.
