BALTIMORE ORIOLES (5-8) at BOSTON RED SOX (10-2)  
RHP Chris Tillman (0-2, 8.68) vs. LHP Eduardo Rodriguez (0-0, 7.36)

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Orioles resume their road schedule tonight as they begin a seven-game road trip to Boston (four games) and Detroit (three games)...The Orioles began the season at home with a three-game series against the Minnesota Twins before departing for a seven-game road trip to Houston (three games) and New York (four games)...The Orioles recently completed a three-game homestand against the Toronto Blue Jays...By the time the O's begin their next 10-game homestand on April 20, they will have played just six games at home.

**NO MINOR FEAT:** Double-A Bowie Manager **Gary Kendall** will manage his 1,000<sup>th</sup> game with the Baysox on Saturday night at Harrisburg...He owns a record of 508-490 in eight seasons at the helm of the Baysox...Kendall has led the Baysox to three of their seven playoff appearances in franchise history, including their first and only league title in 2015...He is the longest tenured and winningest manager in franchise history...It is Kendall's 19<sup>th</sup> overall season in the Orioles organization, having previously managed at Short-Season Aberdeen (2008-10), Class-A Delmarva (2005-07), and Rookie Level Bluefield (2004), as well as being a Field Coach at Aberdeen (2002-03) and Bluefield (2000-01)...Kendall is a 1981 graduate of Sparrows Point High School in Baltimore and went on to play at the Community College of Baltimore (MD) and at Atlantic Christian College (NC), where he received his degree in 1987.

**QUALITY IS JOB ONE:** Through 13 games played, Orioles starters have notched six "Quality Starts" this season...The Orioles rank tied for fourth in the American League in "Quality Starts" and are tied for fifth in the majors...Orioles starters have received 25 runs of support this season, eighth-least in the majors (fourth-least in the AL).

**MAKE MINE A DOUBLE:** In the 12<sup>th</sup> inning of Sunday's game at New York, the Orioles turned a 1-2-5 double play when a bases-loaded grounder to **RHP Brad Brach** was thrown to **C Caleb Joseph** and was completed with a throw by Joseph to **3B Tim Beckham**...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the 1-2-5 double play was the first of its kind in the majors since September 7, 2012 when the Houston Astros (**RHP Lucas Harrell**, **C Chris Snyder**, **3B Matt Dominguez**) did so against the Cincinnati Reds...Also, according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Sunday's 12<sup>th</sup>-inning two-out play marked the first 1-2-5 double play in Orioles history.

**GRAND CENTRAL STATION:** **OF Adam Jones** hit his 250<sup>th</sup> career home run as a center fielder last Thursday night at Yankee Stadium...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 250 homers hit while playing center field rank 13<sup>th</sup> all-time in Major League history...He also ranks fifth all-time among American League hitters...Among AL hitters, he trails **Mickey Mantle** (432), **Ken Griffey, Jr.** (382), **Fred Lynn** (266), and **Bernie Williams** (261)...**Willie Mays** is the all-time leader with 640 home runs as a center fielder.

**OPENING DAY:** The Orioles defeated the Twins, 3-2, in 11 innings on Opening Day at Oriole Park...The O's have won eight consecutive Opening Day games (since 2011) and have won 15 of their last 18 openers...The O's are now 43-22 all-time on Opening Day...According to STATS, LLC., the O's eight consecutive Opening Day wins are tied for sixth all-time and rank first in Orioles history...The Orioles won seven straight Opening Day games from 1970-76...**Adam Jones** hit a walk-off home run in the 11<sup>th</sup> inning in the season opener...Last year, **Mark Trumbo** also hit an 11<sup>th</sup>-inning walk-off homer in the Orioles season opener...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Orioles are the first team in Major League history to hit an Opening Day walk-off home run in consecutive seasons...The Orioles also won in walk-off fashion on Opening Day in 2016 when **Matt Wieters** hit a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth inning on April 4, 2016 vs. Minnesota.

**VS. BOSTON:** The Orioles and Red Sox play the first game of 19 matchups between the two clubs this season...The Orioles won the 2017 season series, 10-9...Baltimore trails Boston in the all-time series, 489-563, with the O's trailing 249-280 at home and trailing 240-283 at Boston.

**THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY:** On this date in 1954, the Orioles played their first game, falling 3-0 at Briggs Stadium in Detroit...The Orioles notched seven hits as **RHP Steve Gromek** defeated **RHP Don Larsen**...**CF Gil Coan** singled for the first Orioles hit.

**DISABLED LIST:** Four Orioles are currently on the disabled list...**INF/OF Mark Trumbo** (right quad strain, retroactive to 3/26), **RHP Gabriel Ynoa** (right shin stress reaction, retroactive to 3/26), and **OF Colby Rasmus** (left hip flexor strain, since 4/7) are on the 10-day disabled list...**LHP Zach Britton** (right Achilles surgery, since 2/15) is on the 60-day disabled list.

**SIX PACK:** Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Orioles hitters lead the majors with 1,352 home runs hit and also lead the majors in fewest number of errors committed with 505...Several current hitters rank among Major League leaders in home runs since 2012...**Chris Davis** ranks second with 224, **Adam Jones** ranks seventh with 179, and **Mark Trumbo** ranks 11<sup>th</sup> with 172 home runs...Also since 2012, the Orioles rank first among American League clubs with 288 wins at home.

**HOMER HAPPY:** The Orioles hit 232 home runs in 2017 to rank fifth in the majors...The Orioles were tied for the Major League lead in homers after the All-Star break with 109...The O's have led the majors in home runs in three of the past six seasons (2016, 2014, 2013), finishing second in 2012, third in 2015, and fifth in 2017...For four of the past five seasons, the Major League leader in home runs was an Oriole (**Chris Davis** in 2013, **Nelson Cruz** in 2014, **Chris Davis** in 2015, and **Mark Trumbo** in 2016).

**FEEL THE DRAFT:** The Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft will be held from Monday, June 4 through Wednesday, June 6 at MLB Network's Studio 42 in Secaucus, NJ...Rounds one and two and both competitive balance rounds will take place on Monday, with rounds 3-10 on Tuesday, and rounds 11-40 on Wednesday...The draft will air on MLB Network and MLB.com...The Orioles own three picks in the top 100 of the 2018 Draft; the No. 11, 37, and 87 overall selections.

**SPRING TRAINING WRAP:** The Orioles finished third in the Grapefruit League with a 17-12-2 record, posting a 4.86 ERA in 274.0 IP and batting .271/.450/.332, scoring 171 runs in 31 games...The Orioles drew a total of 103,294 fans for 15 home games in Sarasota...It was the eighth time in nine seasons that the Orioles have welcomed more than 100,000 fans at Ed Smith Stadium...The Orioles had six sellouts this spring, including the second-highest single-game attendance total at Ed Smith Stadium with 8,782 in attendance on March 14...Ed Smith Stadium was recently recognized by *USA Today* as the top Spring Training venue in Major League Baseball.

**ORIOLES HALL OF FAME:** Former **2B Brian Roberts** has been elected to the Orioles Hall of Fame...Additionally, long-time Orioles Radio broadcaster **Fred Manfra** will be inducted as this year's Herb Armstrong Award winner...Roberts and Manfra will be honored at a luncheon at Oriole Park on August 10, as well as during an on-field ceremony prior to the August 11 game...Roberts played 13 seasons with the Orioles from 2001-13, compiling a .278 batting average and 1,452 hits...He ranks first in O's history among second baseman in all major offensive categories...Drafted by Baltimore in the first round of the 1999 First-Year Player Draft (No. 50 overall), Roberts was a two-time All-Star (2005 and 2007)...Roberts will provide analysis for select games on the Orioles Radio Network this season...Before retiring in 2017, Manfra spent 24 years with the Orioles Radio Network...The East Baltimore native and Patterson High School graduate joined Orioles Radio broadcasts in 1993...In his 47-year broadcasting career, Manfra covered numerous O's highlights and other marquee sporting events.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O's welcomed back each member of the coaching staff from 2017...2018 marks the second season for **Howie Clark** (assistant hitting), **Roger McDowell** (pitching), and **Alan Mills** (bullpen); the fourth for **Scott Coolbaugh** (hitting); and sixth season for **Bobby Dickerson** (third base) and **Einar Diaz** (coach); while **Wayne Kirby** (first base) and **John Russell** (bench) return for their eighth years on the staff.

**THE SKIPPER:** A three-time Manager of the Year (1994, 2004, 2014), **Buck Showalter** is in his ninth season as Orioles manager...He has managed the Yankees (313-268, 1992-95), Diamondbacks (250-236, 1998-2000), Rangers (319-329, 2003-06), and Orioles (627-577, Aug. 2010-current)...Showalter's 1,509 career wins rank 23<sup>rd</sup> all-time and are third among active managers behind Bruce Bochy and Mike Scioscia...His 627 wins as O's manager are second-most in club history behind only Earl Weaver (1,480).

**QUICK HITS:** Tillman is making his third start of the 2018 season...Made 19 starts (24 appearances) in 2017...Made five relief appearances for the first time in his career...He ranks tied for 12<sup>th</sup> place with Sidney Ponson on the Orioles all-time wins list (since 1954) with 73 career victories...Also ranks 10<sup>th</sup> on the Orioles all-time strikeouts list with 837, 21 shy of tying Dennis Martinez (858) for ninth place in Orioles history.

**LAST START:** Tillman lost his second-straight start on April 7 at New York-AL, losing 8-3 to the Yankees...Is winless in his last 20 starts, his last win came in his 2017 season debut on May 7 vs. Chicago-AL...He worked 5.1 innings, allowing five runs on eight hits with four walks and three strikeouts...Has lost three-straight decisions against the Yankees and falls to 8-9 lifetime against New York...Has walked four batters in both of his starts this season; had four starts all of last year in which he walked four-or-more batters...Threw 106 pitches, 58 strikes; his first time throwing 100-or-more pitches since July 28 of last year at Texas.

**CAREER VS. BOSTON:** Tillman will be making his first start of the season against the Red Sox and the 22<sup>nd</sup> of his career...He has gone 10-4 with a 3.03 ERA (39 ER/116.0 IP) and 96 strikeouts in his first 21 starts...His last start against Boston was last season on June 4 at Oriole Park when he worked 6.0 innings, allowing five runs, three earned, on six hits with four walks and three strikeouts; he was dealt the loss as the Orioles were defeated 7-3...Tonight will be his 10<sup>th</sup> career start at Fenway Park, where he has gone 5-1 with a 2.39 ERA (14 ER/52.2 IP)...He has won each of his last four starts in Boston, with his last one coming on June 14, 2016 when he tossed 7.0 innings, surrendering one run on five hits, one home run, with two walks and seven strikeouts; the Orioles won the game 3-2...In 12 career starts against the Red Sox at Oriole Park, he has gone 5-3 with a 3.55 ERA (25 ER/63.1 IP).

**VS. AL EAST:** Tillman will be making his second consecutive start against an AL East opponent this season...He made 10 appearances (eight starts) against AL East opponents last season, going 0-3 with a 8.69 ERA (37 ER/38.1 IP), 22 walks, and 25 strikeouts...The Orioles went 4-4 in his eight starts against the division...He made six starts at home against the division during the 2017 season, going 0-2 with a 6.51 ERA (20 ER/27.2 IP)...He made two starts (four appearances) on the road against the division, going 0-1 with a 14.34 ERA (17 ER/10.2 IP)...In 99 career outings (97 starts) against the AL East, he holds a 31-33 record with a 4.68 ERA (282 ER/542.2 IP), 204 walks, and 409 strikeouts...He did not earn a win against the division for the second time in his career, the first since he went 0-4 with a 7.92 ERA (27 ER/30.2 IP) in seven starts against the AL East in 2010.

**LEFT IS NOT RIGHT:** Tillman has allowed a .538 (7-for-13) opponent batting average with three extra-base hits to left-handed hitters this season...Right-handers are hitting .296 (8-for-27) on the season...Last year he allowed an average of .329 (54-for-164) with an OBP of .458, and slugging percentage of .543 to left-handed hitters...His OBP allowed against lefties was the highest in baseball and the batting average was seventh-highest in baseball...For his career, lefties are hitting .259 (583-for-2254)...Right-handers hit .320 (71-for-222) with a .363 OBP, and a .599 slugging percentage against Tillman last season...For his career, righties are hitting .258 (532-for-2060).

**ON THE ROAD:** Tillman will be making his third-straight road start...He suffered the loss in each of his first two starts, April 2 at Houston and April 7 at New York-AL...Opponents are hitting .375 (15-for-40) on the road against him this season...He made five starts (10 appearances) on the road last season, going 0-3 with a 10.87 ERA (33 ER/27.1 IP)...Opponents hit .400 (50-for-125) with seven home runs on the road against him...In 95 career road starts (100 appearances), he has gone 37-29 with a 4.63 ERA (276 ER/536.0 IP) and 43 Quality Starts.

**AT ORIOLE PARK:** Tillman has yet to make an appearance in a home game this season...He made 14 starts at home last season...He went 1-4 with a 6.58 ERA (48 ER/65.2 IP), 38 walks and 36 strikeouts...He won his 2017 home opener on May 7 against Chicago-AL and then went winless in his remaining 13 starts...He is 36-28 with a 4.32 ERA (284 ER/591.2 IP) in 105 career starts (53 Quality Starts) at Oriole Park...The Orioles have gone 65-40 in those 105 games.

**OUT IN RELIEF:** Tillman made five relief appearances last season, going 0-0 with a 4.70 ERA (4 ER/7.2 IP), three walks and five strikeouts...His first career relief appearance was on August 13 at Oakland when he tossed 1.1 innings, allowing no runs or hits with two strikeouts...His most recent relief appearance occurred on September 29 at Tampa Bay when he tossed 2.0 innings and allowed three runs on one hit (one home run) with one hit batsman and one strikeout.

**SPRING NOTES:** Made three starts for the Orioles in Grapefruit League play...Made his spring debut on March 13 at Minnesota, starting and tossing 2.0 innings, allowing four runs on three hits with six walks and one strikeout; he did not factor in the decision...Earned the win on March 19 at Detroit after he allowed one run on six hits over 5.0 innings of work...Tossed a spring-high 5.1 innings on March 24 against Minnesota, allowing six runs on seven hits (one home run) with two walks and three strikeouts.
