Futures Game

Major League Baseball today announced that RHP Kyle Wright will play for the U.S. team in SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, which will take place on Sunday, July 15 at Nationals Park in Washington D.C.

Wright, 22, has made 17 starts for Double-A Mississippi this season, going 5-7 with a 4.18 ERA (41 ER/88.1 IP) in 17 starts for the M-Braves this year, his first full professional season.

The Braves took Wright fifth overall last year.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Brewers continue a four-game set tonight with the second meeting between the clubs this season...The Braves took four of six matchups last season to win the season series with Milwaukee for the third time in the last four seasons...The Brewers will travel to Atlanta for a three-game set, August 10-12.

- Atlanta has not lost a series in Milwaukee since 2013.
- RHP Mike Foltynewicz is set for his sixth career game, fifth start, against Milwaukee, and the right-hander is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA against the Brewers...He has allowed one earned run in each of his five appearances.
- RHP Freddy Peralta is scheduled to make his sixth career start tonight...In his only start on his home mound, struck out 10 over 7.0 innings, allowing one hit and one walk to beat Kansas City, 5-1 on June 26.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today placed LHP Max Fried on the 10-day disabled list with a left middle finger blister and recalled RHP Evan Phillips from Triple-A Gwinnett.

- Fried started and went 3.0 innings last night before leaving with the injury.
- Phillips returns for his third stint with the team this season...He appeared in one game for the Braves during his first two appearances, tossing 2.1 innings and allowing two runs on July 3 at New York (AL).

SKID: The Braves lost their season high-tying third consecutive game last night, the club's fourth such streak this season...They are the only National League team to not have a losing streak longer than three games this season.

- Since the start of World War II, only four Braves teams finished a season with their longest losing streak being three games: 2004, 2003, 1957, 1947.

OZZIE: 2B Ozzie Albies finished 2-for-4 yesterday with a double and a triple and has now hit safely in 14 of his last 15 games (29-for-69, .420)...Albies' hot streak began with a pinch-hit double on June 17 vs. San Diego, the first game he did not start this season.

- Albies collected his N.L.-high 11th game this season with multiple extra-base hits...He is now six games shy of the Atlanta franchise record (since 1966), first set by Chipper Jones in 1999...Javy Lopez matched the mark in 2003.
- Albies now has a N.L.-most 49 extra-base hits this season, tied for the third most prior to the All-Star break in franchise history...Hank Aaron (1969) and Gary Matthews (1979) both had 49...The club record is 53 by Aaron in 1959...Darrell Evans is the only other Braves hitter to reach 50 by the break, finishing with 51 in 1973.

FOLTYNEWICZ DOMINATING: RHP Mike Foltynewicz has compiled a 0.87 ERA (5 ER/52.0 IP) and limited the opposition to a .146 batting average against over his last nine starts, dating to May 10 at Miami...His ERA and batting average against leads all qualifying major leaguers since that date.

- The next closest ERA is the Yankees' Luis Severino's 1.79 mark...Boston's Chris Sale is second with a .165 average against.
- Foltynewicz has allowed one run or less in 11 of his 16 turns this season...That is tied for the most such starts in the majors with Tampa Bay's Blake Snell.
- Foltynewicz's 2.02 ERA is the third best mark in the majors, and trails only Jacob deGrom's 1.84 ERA in the National League...Since the first All-Star game in 1933, only five Braves pitchers have entered the break with an ERA under 2.00...Greg Maddux did it three times, and has the two lowest marks of 1.54 (in 1998) and 1.64 (in 1995)...Phil Niekro (1.65 in 1967), Jair Jurrjens (1.87 in 2011), Lou Fette (1.89 in 1939) and Tom Glavine (1.98 in 1991) were the other four to accomplish the feat...All of the pitchers, with the exception of Niekro, made the All-Star team that season.
- Brandon Beachy had a 2.00 ERA in 2012.

TOP THE LINEUP: Since returning to the top two spots in the lineup on June 22, OF Ender Inciarte and 2B Ozzie Albies have combined to hit .353 and compile a .414 on-base percentage with 27 runs scored.

- Inciarte has played all 13 of the Braves' games in this stretch, while Albies has played 12.
- When the pair hit together at the top of the lineup, the Braves are 26-19 (.578).

MINTER: A.J. Minter has converted all four of his save chances this season, and is the first Braves left-hander with multiple saves in a season since Jonny Venters had five in 2011.

- The last rookie lefty with more than four saves in a season was Chris Sale, who had eight in 2011.

FIRST INNING: The Braves plated both of their runs in the first inning last night, and now have scored 50 such times this season, tied for the 10th most in the majors... They have hit .268 in the first, the third-best average in the National League.

50 WINS: Atlanta is looking for its 50th win of the season tonight, and the club is trying to become the 18th Braves team in franchise history to reach that milestone prior to the All-Star break.

- The franchise record is 61 by the 2003 team...The last Braves team to reach 50 by the break was the 2014 club, which was 52-43.

Tonight's Game

- A** Set to make his 17th start of the season and the 82nd of his career...Is his 102nd career appearance.
- A** Allowed just one hit over 5.0 scoreless innings in last start, 7/1 at St. Louis...Has allowed no more than two earned runs in 15 of his 16 starts on the season, and has allowed one run or fewer 11 times.
- A** His 11 starts allowing one run or less are tied for the most such starts in the majors...Only one other pitcher, TB's Blake Snell, has as many such starts.
- A** Foltyniewicz's 11 starts of one run or less have come in 16 turns on the season...The Atlanta franchise record for starts allowing no more than one run is 19, set by Greg Maddux over 34 starts in 2002.
- A** Ranks third in the majors and second in the National League with a 2.02 ERA (20 ER/89.0 IP)...Trails just NYM's Jacob deGrom (1.84) and NYY's Luis Severino (1.98).
- A** His 2.02 ERA is the eighth lowest by a qualified Braves pitcher before the All-Star break since the franchise moved to Atlanta in 1966, and the lowest since Brandon Beachy had a 2.00 ERA before the break in 2012.
- A** Faces the Brewers for the sixth time and makes his fifth career start against them...Is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA (5 ER/25.0 IP) in his previous five appearances.
- A** Has allowed exactly one earned run in each of his five appearances, and has yet to allow more than four hits in an outing against Milwaukee in his career.

2018 Recap

- A** Reinstated from the 10-day disabled list, 6/25, and started vs. Cincinnati...Allowed one hit and one run over 5.0 innings.
- A** Missed seven games with right triceps tightness.
- A** Tossed 5.0 scoreless innings, 6/12 vs. NYM, allowing just two hits while fanning six.
- A** Threw a season-low 73 pitches before exiting the game with right triceps tightness...Was placed on the 10-day disabled list, 6/16.
- A** Threw the first shutout of his major league career, 6/1 vs. WSH...Allowed just two hits and struck out 11.
- A** Became the seventh pitcher in Atlanta-era history to throw a two-hitter or better with double-digit strikeouts and the first since Greg Maddux fanned 14 Brewers in a two-hit, 1-0 win on May 2, 2001 at Turner Field.
- A** Was saddled with the loss, 5/21 at PHI, despite allowing one run over 6.0 innings of work...The start was his fourth against Philadelphia this season and the fourth time in which he faced Phillies starter RHP Nick Pivetta.
- A** According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time two pitchers faced off for a fourth time in a team's 46th game or earlier was on 5/31/59, when Lew Burdette faced Robin Roberts in the Braves' 44th game and the Phillies' 45th game.
- A** Went 5.0 innings and allowed three hits and one unearned run, 5/15 vs. CHI...Walked a season-most five, and struck out a season-most 10.
- A** Was the fourth double-digit strikeout game of his career, and has since tossed one more...Since he joined Atlanta in 2015, his five 10+ strikeout games are most on the pitching staff.
- A** Earned his third win of the season, 5/10 at MIA, after tossing 5.0 innings and allowing just three hits and one unearned run.
- A** Received eight runs of support, his most on the season and his most since also getting eight runs on 6/7/17...Entered his start against Miami averaging just 2.83 runs of support per 9.0 innings over his last 14 turns, fewest in the N.L.
- A** Allowed a season-most nine hits and six runs over 5.0 innings, 5/4 vs. SF...All six runs he allowed came in the second inning.
- A** The outing snapped a 10-start stretch in which he allowed three earned runs or fewer, the longest such stretch of his career...Went 2-5 with a 3.04 ERA during the run, which started 8/27/17...Was one of just five starters in the majors to have as long a streak of three earned runs or fewer in that span, and was the only one with a losing record -- the other four pitchers went a combined 40-5.
- A** Held the Nationals to four hits and one run over 5.1 innings, 4/4 at SunTrust Park...Walked two and fanned eight to earn his first win of the season and snap a career-worst seven-game losing streak.
- A** Went 0-7 with a 7.34 ERA (31 ER/38.0 IP) over the spell, the longest losing streak of his career and tied for the second longest active streak in the majors at the time...The run dated to 8/11/17 at STL and spanned eight total starts.
- A** Took a no-decision in his season debut, 3/30 vs. PHI...Allowed five hits and three runs over 5.0 innings, striking out seven.
- A** The no-decision snapped streak of seven consecutive losses after he dropped each of his final seven starts of 2017...His skid in consecutive starts was one short of the franchise record, set by Preston Hanna from 1976-1978 and matched by Shelby Miller in 2015.

- A** Acquired by the Atlanta Braves along with RHP Andrew Thurman and INF Rio Ruiz from the Houston Astros in exchange for C/OF Evan Gattis and RHP James Hoyt on 1/14/15.

- Has gone hitless in back-to-back games for just the third time in 36 games this season, last night at MIL and Wed. at NYY...Has not been held hitless in three straight games.
- Has hit in four of his seven games since coming off the DL last Friday, 6/29 at StL.
- Drove a 1-2, 11th-inning pitch from NYY's David Robertson over the wall in right field on Monday night at NYY, giving Atlanta the 5-3 win...With his game-winning homer, he became the only player to ever hit a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium prior to his 21st birthday...Prior to Acuña Jr., the youngest player with a game-winning extra-inning home run at Yankee Stadium was MIN's Kent Hrbek (21 years, 95 days) on 8/24/81.
- At 20 years, 196 days, became the youngest player to hit a game-winning, extra-inning home run for the Braves since Andruw Jones (20 years, 3 days) hit a two-run, game-ending home run in the 10th inning off SD's Trevor Hoffman on 4/26/97...The last younger major leaguer with a game-winning homer in extra innings was FLA's Miguel Cabrera (20 years, 155 days) on 9/20/03 at ATL
- Has three home runs in his last nine games, dating to 5/26 at BOS...Six of his seven home runs have come on the road and four have come when the game is tied.
- Has five game-winning RBI since his MLB debut on 4/25 at CIN, tied for the most on the team over that time frame.
- Reinstated from the 10-day disabled on 6/28...Went to the DL on 5/28 and missed 28 games with a left knee mild ACL sprain, left knee contusion and lower back contusion.
- Became the youngest player to homer for the Braves since Andruw Jones in 1997, hitting a solo shot off Homer Bailey for his first career homer on 4/26 at CIN.
- Atlanta selected his contract from Triple-A Gwinnett, 4/25,
- Named Minor League Player of the Year by Baseball America and USA Today in 2017.
