THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 4-3 through seven games on their 11-day homestand... today they will play the four-game series finale with the White Sox...they will complete the homestand with the first of three vs. Los Angeles-AL this weekend...16 of the Twins last 18 games have been decided by three runs-or-less with the Twins going 6-10 in those games.

TWINS GET BEAT IN MIDDLE INNINGS BY SOX: The Twins lost to the White Sox last night by a score of 5-2, allowing four runs in the sixth inning...Jake Odorizzi (3-3) was the starter and loser, allowing three runs on six hits in 5.0 innings pitched with one walk and seven strikeouts...the offense recorded eight hits, two from both Mitch Garver and Ehire Adrianza... Adrianza doubled twice and Eduardo Escobar recorded his MLB-leading 24th double.

TWINS AND SOX: The Twins and White Sox are playing the ninth of 19 games this season... the Twins have won eight of their last 11 over the Sox and 14 of their last 21.

☞ Brian Dozier is hitting .322 (46-for-143) with 11 doubles, 12 home runs, 24 RBI and a .405 on-base percentage in his last 37 games vs. the White Sox...Dozier is a career .316 (12-for-38) hitter vs. James Shields with five doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks and a .413 on-base percentage.

☞ Eduardo Escobar is hitting .345 (29-for-84) with 10 doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI and a .446 on-base percentage in his last 24 games vs. his former club...he has hit safely in six straight against the Sox and has reached safely in 12 straight via hit or walk.

EXTRA-BASE ESCY: Eduardo Escobar has hit safely in seven of his last eight games...during that stretch he is hitting .433 (13-for-30) with six doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI and five multi-hit games...he enters today first in baseball in doubles with 24 and is on pace to have 38 prior to this year's All-Star Break which would be the most in club history, passing Chuck Knoblauch's 37 doubles pre-ASG in 1994.

ROSIES ARE RED (HOT): Since the start of May, Eddie Rosario is hitting .357 (50-for-140) with 11 doubles, 10 home runs, 28 RBI, 25 runs scored, a .396 on-base percentage, .650 slugging percentage and a 1.046 OPS in 34 games...among AL players since the start of May, he ranks third in batting average, fourth in RBI, fifth in OPS, sixth in slugging and eighth in OBP.

DRAFT COMPLETE: The Twins completed the 2018 MLB Draft yesterday...in all, the Twins selected 15 right-handed pitchers, five left-handed pitchers, six infielders, nine outfielders and four catchers...of the 39 total players selected, 30 were drafted out of college and nine out of high school...additionally, the Twins selected one player from Minnesota in right-handed pitcher Seth Halvorsen from Heritage Christian High School in Maple Grove in the 30th round...below are notable Twins to be drafted past round 10:

ON THIS DAY IN MINNESOTA AND WHITE SOX HISTORY: In 1977, the Chicago White Sox selected Harold Baines with the first pick in the First-Year Player Draft, pitcher Bill Gullickson was taken with the second pick by the Montreal Expos, and the Milwaukee Brewers selected University of Minnesota infielder Paul Molitor with the third pick...Molitor made his major league debut the next season with Milwaukee on April 7, 1978 vs. Baltimore.

SOUTHERN LEAGUE STARS: The Southern League announced the 2018 North Division All-Star Team on Tuesday...the initial roster features seven Double-A Chattanooga Lookouts including outfielder LaMonte Wade, outfielder Zander Wiel, right-handed starter Omar Bencomo, right-handed reliever Ryne Harper, right-handed starter Randy LeBlanc, right-handed reliever Williams Ramirez and right-handed reliever Todd Van Steensel...the 2018 All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, June 19 at Regions Field in Birmingham, Alabama...Wade will be making his third straight appearance in a Midseason All-Star Game.

PURPLE RAIN: The Twins will celebrate Prince Night at Target Field tomorrow night, honoring the late Minneapolis icon who passed away in April of 2016...some highlights of the night include: First 10,000 fans receive a limited-edition Inflatable Prince Guitar, Twins players will wear Prince-themed T-shirts during batting practice, Prince's Model C guitar will be displayed at the Twins Digital Clubhouse, and many more elements.

THIS AND THAT:

- ☞ Through games of June 7 of last season, the Twins were 29-26 with a -25 run differential...today they have a run differential of -15.
- ☞ The Twins rank seventh in baseball in plate appearances-per-walk at 10.50; second in the AL, trailing only New York 9.84.
- ☞ Twins outfielders have recorded five outfield assists in their last 13 games since May 25, tied for most in baseball since that date.

LAST START: Berríos earned his team-high with win his last start on June 1 against Cleveland in a 7-4 victory, opposite Carlos Carrasco...in his second outing of the year against the Indians, allowed four runs on five hits and one walk with seven strikeouts over 6.0 innings...this marked his fourth straight start of 6.0+ innings, which is the longest stretch of 6.0+ inning outings of his career.

AGAINST THE WHITE SOX: Berríos is making his seventh career start and third of the season against the White Sox...in 2018, is 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA (13.0 IP, 4 ER) with two walks and 13 strikeouts...last start against the White Sox was May 4, allowed four runs on six hits and two walks with two strikeouts over 6.0 innings...only career loss to the White Sox came August 24, 2017, allowed five runs (3 earned) on four hits and three walks with nine strikeouts over 5.1 innings.

WIZARD OF WHIFF: With his outing on April 12 vs. Chicago-AL, Berríos has now thrown the three most recent 10+ K, 0 run games in Twins history (August 30, 2017 vs. Chicago-AL, May 18, 2017 vs. Colorado)...the last to do it before Berríos was Ervin Santana on August 30, 2015 vs. Houston...now with three games of 10+ strikeouts and 0 walks, he follows Johan Santana (8) and Bert Blyleven (6) for most such performances in Twins history...Berríos is seventh in the American League in strikeout-to-walk ratio at 5.15...two 10+ strikeout starts in 2018.

KEEPING 'EM OFF THE BASES: Through 12 starts in 2018, Berríos has walked 14 batters, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL and tied for ninth fewest in baseball...his BB/9 rate is 1.69, which is third best in the AL and sixth in baseball...Berríos has also only allowed 57 hits and owns a 0.95 WHIP, which is sixth best in the AL and ninth in baseball...he is one of eight qualifying pitchers in the AL with a WHIP below 1.00...opponents are only hitting .207 off of Berríos this year, ninth best in the AL and 17th in baseball.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: Since the beginning of 2017, Berríos is 13-3 with a 2.77 ERA (110.1IP, 34 ER) in 18 games (17 starts) in home games...his 2.77 ERA at home in that span is sixth best in the AL and 12th best in baseball...Berríos is 4-2 with a 3.35 ERA (43.0 IP, 16 ER) in four home starts in 2018, which is 16th best in the AL...on the road, Berríos is 7-10 with a 4.99 ERA (110.0 IP, 61 ER) in 20 starts since the beginning of 2017.

SOUVENIRS FROM THE ISLAND: Berríos made the start in his native Puerto Rico on April 18 vs. Cleveland...he became the just the second different Puerto Rican pitcher to start a major league game at Hiram Bithorn Stadium, the other being Javier Vazquez (4 starts)...two other pitchers appeared in relief: Pedro Feliciano (1 game) and Roberto Hernandez (3 game)...he and teammate Eddie Rosario became the first Twins Puerto Rico natives to play in Hiram Bithorn.

THE ROCKET AND LA MAQUINA: By shutting out Cleveland over 7.0 innings in his start on April 18, Berríos became the first pitcher since Roger Clemens in 1991 to throw 7.0+ shutout innings three times in their teams' first 13 games of a season...Clemens went on to lead the AL in ERA (2.62) and win the Cy Young Award.

ON THE LEADERBOARD: Berríos' is leading the Twins in innings pitched (74.2), strikeouts (74), quality starts (6), opponent batting average (.207) and WHIP (0.95)...among Twins starters with more than seven starts, has allowed the fewest walks (14) and is second in ERA (3.86)...leads the team in both wins and losses...among AL starters with 10-or-more starts, he is third in walks-per-nine inning (1.69), ninth in opponent batting average, 11th in wins, 14th in strikeouts and tied for 16th in innings pitched.

2017 RECAP:

- Berríos started 25 games, a single-season career-high.
- In first full season, Berríos finished 14-8 with 139 strikeouts and 48 walks over 145.2 innings.
- Set career highs in wins (14), strikeouts (139), innings (145.2) and ERA (3.89)...he ranked second on Twins staff in wins, and strikeouts, and third in starts and innings pitched.
- Tied for ninth in the AL in wins.
- The youngest pitcher in baseball to record an 11-strikeout game last year against Colorado on May 18.
- Made first career postseason appearance against New York-AL in the Wild Card Game...allowed three runs in three innings and was credited with a loss.

TOMORROW'S STARTER - LANCE LYNN, RHP [SEASON: 4-4, 5.46 ERA // CAREER: 76-51, 3.49 ERA]

Lynn is coming off his third straight win of the season...he will face the Los Angeles Angels for the third time in his career and second time this season...over his two career starts he is 0-1 with a 7.59 ERA (10.2 IP, 9 ER) vs. LAA...his start against the Angels was on May 11 and he did not factor in the decision after going 4.2 innings and surrendering four runs on eight hits...is 0-2 against the American League West in his career across four career-starts.
