AT A GLANCE: The Yankees are 1-1 on their six-game road trip, which continues in Boston tonight...will also visit Detroit for 3G (Fri.-Sun.)...went 3-3 on their six-game homestand (2-0 vs. TB, 1-3 vs. BAL).

- ▶ Are .500 for the fourth time this season (2-2, 4-4, 5-5, 6-6).
- ▶ After playing their first 13G vs. the AL East, will play outside the division for the first time tomorrow...following tonight, will not visit another AL East city until a four-game series from 5/31-6/3 at Baltimore.
- ▶ Are 4-4 thus far on a stretch of 16-of-22G at home (4/3-26): 3-3 at home, 1-1 on the road.
- ▶ Have won the series in their first trip to Fenway Park in three of the last four seasons (2014-15, '17).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees defeated the Red Sox, 10-7, on Wednesday at Fenway Park...led 8-1 after four innings...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (5.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 2BB, 3K, 2HR, 1WP) earned the win...was the first Yankee to earn a win while allowing at least 6ER since Michael Pineda (5.0IP, 6ER) on 4/6/16 vs. Houston...**C Gary Sánchez** (3-for-5, 3R, 1 double, 2HR, 4RBI) snapped a 1-for-33 slump with 3XBH...marked his eighth career multi-HR game...**LF Giancarlo Stanton** (3-for-5, 2R, 1 triple, 3RBI) had his second consecutive multi-hit game...**CF Brett Gardner** (2-for-3, 3R, 2BB, 1SB) scored a run for the fourth straight game...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 2R, 1BB) pushed his hitting streak to 9G.
▶ **DH Tyler Austin** (1-for-2, 1RBI, 1BB, 1HP), **RHP Tommy Kahnle**, **third base coach Phil Nevin** and Red Sox RHP Joe Kelly were ejected for their roles in a benches-clearing brawl in the seventh inning.

THE SANCHINO: **C Gary Sánchez** snapped a 1-for-33 slump on Wed. at Boston, going 3-for-5 with 3R, 1 double, 2HR and 4RBI.

- ▶ Marked his eighth career 2HR game in his 187th career game...**are the most multi-HR games in a player's first 200G in Major League history**...the Yankees have scored at least 9R in each of his last six 2HR games.
- ▶ Marked his 55th and 56th career home runs...**is the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 56HR through 187 games**, joining Rudy York (57), Aaron Judge (56) and Mark McGwire (56)...is tied for the fourth-most HRs in a player's first 200 games (see chart in upper right).
- ▶ Homered off David Price in the first inning...is 6-for-12 (.500) with 5HR off Price...are his most HRs vs. any pitcher.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Four different Yankees have hit 2HR in a game this season: **C Gary Sánchez** on Wed. at Boston; **SS Didi Gregorius** on 4/3 vs. Tampa Bay; **1B Tyler Austin** on 3/31 at Toronto; **OF Giancarlo Stanton** on 3/29 at Toronto (all 2HR games).

- ▶ The 12G marks the earliest into a season the Yankees have ever had four individual multi-HR games...the previous mark was set in 2012, when Nick Swisher joined Curtis Granderson, Eric Chavez and Mark Teixeira in the multi-HR game club in the Yankees' 20th game.
- ▶ **Is tied for the fourth-fastest mark to four multi-HR games by an AL club**, behind the 2014 White Sox (10th game), the 2006 Tigers (10th game) and 1973 Red Sox (11th game).

OVERLOADED: Yankees pitchers have allowed four grand slams in the first 12G of the season: Boston's J.D. Martinez on Wednesday and Mookie Betts on Tuesday; Baltimore's Pedro Álvarez on 4/6; Toronto's Justin Smoak on 4/1.

- ▶ Is the earliest into a season the Yankees have allowed their fourth grand slam (previously 17th game in 2009).

RUNNING A DEFICIT: The Yankees have been outscored, 20-9, while splitting the first 2G of this three-game series at Boston.

- ▶ **Have not won a series with a negative run differential since 8/29-31/16 at Kansas City** (went 2-1 while being outscored, 16-15)...are 0-22-1 in their last 23 series with a negative run differential...in 2017, lost four different series despite outscoring their opponent (4/7-9 at Baltimore, 4/21-23 at Pittsburgh, 6/30-7/2 at Houston, 7/31-8/2 vs. Detroit).

ALL RISE: RF Aaron Judge extended his hitting streak to 9G on Wed. at Boston, going 2-for-4 with 2R and 1BB...is the longest hitting streak by a Yankee in 2018 and tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the Majors...is batting .412/.545/.706 (14-for-34) with 9BB and 11K during the streak.

- ▶ Hit his 59th career HR on Tuesday (in his 193rd career game), which **tied the all-time Major League record for HRs through 200 career games**, set by Mark McGwire and Rudy York (see chart)...McGwire is the fastest ever to 60HR, reaching the mark in 202 games.
- ▶ Is 5-for-8 during this series, surpassing his prior career hit total at Fenway Park (went 3-for-36 here in 2016-17)...**is batting .343 (23-for-67) with 7HR in his last 20 road games** (since 8/22/17) after hitting just .218 (58-for-266) with 14HR in his first 75 career road contests.
- ▶ Is tied for second in the AL with 10BB...leads the AL with 27 times on base.
- ▶ Has scored runs in four straight and is tied for fifth in the AL with 11R.
- ▶ Has RBI in six of his last 8G (8RBI)...his five-game RBI streak from 4/3-7 is tied with Pittsburgh's Corey Dickerson (4/5-10) for the longest in the Majors this season.

SS Didi Gregorius went 0-for-3 with 2RBI and 2SF on Wed. at Boston, snapping his five-game streak of reaching base multiple times...marked just his second game this season in which he did not reach base...is still batting .359/.471/.795 through 12G this season.

- ▶ **Leads the Majors in slugging average**...**leads the AL in extra-base hits (10) and OPS (1.265)**, is tied for the AL lead with 12RBI and ranks fifth in BA and OBP.
- ▶ His 1.1 WAR is second in the Majors to Oakland's Matt Chapman (1.1) - FanGraphs.
- ▶ Has 14 hits in 2018, including 10 for extra-bases (4 singles, 6 doubles, 1 triple, 3HR)...in 2017, did not pick up his 10th (and 11th) extra-base hits until his 32nd game of the season on 6/3/17.
- ▶ Is tied for fourth in the AL with 9BB in 51PA in 2018 (17.6%)...drew walks in just 4.4% of his PAs over his first three years with the Yankees...did not draw his ninth walk last season until his 58th game of the year (7/3/17).
- ▶ In 30 career games at Fenway Park, is batting .292/.342/.425 (31-for-106) with 18R, 5 doubles, 3HR, 8RBI and 7BB.

GOING, GOING, GIAN: **OF Giancarlo Stanton** hit a two-run triple in the first inning on Wed. at Boston, finishing the night 3-for-5 with 2R and 3RBI.

- ▶ Was his first triple since 7/3/16 at Atlanta...hit 74HR in 219 games between the two three-baggers.
- ▶ Has 10RBI, the most through 12 team games by a first-year Yankee since Nick Swisher in 2009 (11RBI).
- ▶ Has 270 home runs in 998 career games...marks the fourth-most HRs through a player's first 1,000 career games, behind Ryan Howard (279), Ralph Kiner (277) and Harmon Killebrew (272).

GARDY PARTY: **OF Brett Gardner** has reached safely in 13-of-23 plate appearances in his last 4G, hitting safely and scoring at least 1R in each game...is batting .438/.591/.563 (7-for-16) with 7R, 2 doubles, 2RBI, 6BB and 1SB in that span.

- ▶ Is tied for second in the Majors with 13R and tied for fourth in the AL with 9BB.
- ▶ Is 14-for-46 (.304) with 3 doubles and 2HR in his career vs. Rick Porcello, tied for his most hits against any pitcher.

April 12, 1993: Paul O'Neill makes his Yankee Stadium debut, going 4-for-4 with 1 double, 1 triple and 2RBI as the Yankees defeat Kansas City, 4-1.

April 12, 1935: Lou Gehrig is officially named captain of the Yankees, the club's first since Everett Scott was placed on waivers in June 1925.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

April 13, 1978: The Yankees defeat the White Sox, 4-2, in the Yankee Stadium opener on "Reggie!" Candy Bar Day. After Jackson slugs a three-run HR in the first inning, the field is showered with the chocolate and peanut treats, which were given out free to fans at the game.

April 13, 1921: Babe Ruth goes 5-for-5 with 2 doubles and 2RBI as the Yankees defeat the Philadelphia A's, 11-1 on Opening Day at the Polo Grounds.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP SONNY GRAY (1-0, 3.60 ERA)

RHP Sonny Gray will make his third start of the season tonight vs. Boston...the 28-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...earned his first win of the season on Saturday vs. Baltimore (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 4K)...has 49 career wins in 127 games/125 career starts, with 32-of-49 wins coming while not allowing a home run...made his fourth career Opening Day active roster (also: 2014-16 with Oakland)...was on the 10-day disabled list and missed the start of the 2017 season...went 4-7 with a 3.72 ERA (65.1IP, 27ER) in 11 regular season starts with the Yankees in 2017 after being acquired along with international signing bonus pool money from Oakland in exchange for OF Dustin Fowler, RHP James Kaprielian and INF/OF Jorge Mateo on 7/31/17...has thrown at least 6.0IP in 91-of-125 career starts...was an AL All-Star and finished third in AL Cy Young Award voting in 2015...was originally selected by Oakland in the first round (18th overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Vanderbilt University.

LAST START: Earned his first victory of the season on Saturday vs. the Orioles after giving up 3ER in 6.0IP (4H, 2BB, 4K) in a 8-3 Yankees win...used just 11 pitches in the first two innings to retire 6BF in order...gave up two runs on a Machado double in the third...the Orioles added another run in the fourth on a Beckham single...did not allow another hit to his last 9BF...used just 86 pitches in 6.0IP, tying his lowest pitch count in a start of 6.0IP-or-more (also: 86 pitches in 6.0IP on 9/25/15 vs. San Francisco).

2018: Is 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (10.0IP, 4ER) in two starts...has not allowed a home run...is the first time he has yielded 0HR in back-to-back starts since five straight starts from 7/14-8/10/17 (3GS w/ Oakland, 2GS w/ Yankees)...has limited hitters to a .200 BA (3-for-15) with no extra-base hits and 5K the first time through the lineup.

VS. BOSTON: Is 1-4 with a 4.93 ERA (34.2IP, 19ER) in six career starts against Boston.

- ✦ Has made three career starts at Fenway Park and is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (14.2IP, 11ER).
- ✦ After joining the Yankees last season, went 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA (12.0IP, 6ER) in two starts facing the Red Sox...allowed a career-high tying 3HR on 9/1/17...made one start with Oakland vs. Boston last season on 5/18, and earned the win (6.0IP, 4H, 3ER, 2BB, 8K, 1HR).
- ✦ Is his ninth straight regular season start facing an AL East opponent, dating back to 9/1/17...is 3-4 with a 4.37 ERA (45.1IP, 22ER) in those starts.

SONNY FORECAST IN APRIL: In 17 career April starts, is 11-3 with a 2.63 ERA (109.2IP, 32ER) with 1CG...is his lowest monthly ERA and is the eighth-lowest among all active starters (min. 100.0IP in April)...made two scoreless Opening Day starts with Oakland in 2014 and '15, going 1-0 (14.0IP, 6H, 4BB, 10K)...was on the D.L. from 3/30-5/1/17 with a right shoulder sprain and missed 25 team games.

IN THE ROAD GRAYS: In seven road starts with the Yankees, has gone 2-4 with a 2.21 ERA (40.2IP, 10ER)...has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 10 consecutive road starts dating back to 6/10/17, the longest active streak in the Majors (3GS with Oakland and 7GS with Yankees)...his seven-game streak (8/3/17-pres.) is the tied for the third-longest by a Yankees starter since 1970.

- ✦ Has received one-or-zero runs of support in 5-of-10 road starts during the streak.
- ✦ Is 21-20 with a 3.20 ERA (359.2IP, 128ER) in 61 career road appearances (59 starts), the sixth-lowest ERA among active pitchers with at least 50 career road starts.

2017: Ranked 10th in the AL in ERA...was sixth in opponents' BA (.226), and seventh in opponents' OBP (.294) and opponents' SLG (.374)...tied for fourth in the Majors with 15 unearned runs allowed; had permitted a total of 14 unearned runs in 53 starts over the 2015-16 seasons...opponents batted .139 (19-for-137) with 72K and 2BB in plate appearances ending with a slider (Brooks Baseball).

- ✦ Held LHB to a .221/.293/.352 line...was the seventh-lowest opp. BA by a RHP in the Majors (min. 300PA by LHB).
- ✦ Tossed at least 6.0IP in 19 of his 27 starts and has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 18-of-27.
- ✦ Allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 11 consecutive starts from 6/25-8/26, the longest such streak in the Majors in 2017.
- ✦ Was 8-9 with a 2.84 ERA (104.2IP, 78H, 42R/33ER, 36BB, 95K, 13HR) over his final 17 regular season starts, the Majors' seventh-lowest ERA from 6/25 through the end of the season.
- ✦ Took a decision in each of his final 18 starts (beginning 6/20), tied for the second-longest streak in the Majors in 2017 (Mets' Jacob deGrom-20, Detroit's Michael Fulmer-18).

2017 POSTSEASON: Started once in each of the two Yankees' postseason series, going 0-1 with a 4.32 ERA (8.1IP, 4H, 5R/4ER, 6BB, 6K, 1HR)...took the loss in ALDS Game 1 at Cleveland, lasting 3.1IP (3H, 3ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...allowed just 1H over 5.0IP (2R/1ER, 2BB, 4K) in a no-decision in ALCS Game 4 vs. Houston...was the sixth Yankees pitcher (seventh time) to permit one-or-zero hits in a postseason start of at least 5.0IP, the first since Roger Clemens (5.0IP, 1H, 0R) in 2001 ALCS Game 4 vs. Seattle.
