### TIGERS STREAKS

**RECENT RESULTS:** The Tigers dropped the series finale to the Twins, 9-3, on Thursday night at Target Field. Christin Stewart reached base four times, going 3x4 with a RBI and a walk, while Jeimer Candelario added a hit and a RBI. Niko Goodrum, Pete Kozma, Dawel Lugo and Mikie Mahtook each contributed one hit. Francisco Liriano started for Detroit and took the loss, allowing four runs on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 2.2 innings. The Tigers begin their final series of 2018 tonight as they open a three-game set at Milwaukee.

**STEWART IN SEPTEMBER:** Christin Stewart posted the second three-hit game of his Major League career last night, going 3x4 with a RBI and a walk. Stewart has reached base safely in 14 of the 16 games he has started to begin his big league career. In those 16 games, Stewart is hitting .271/.380/.424 with seven runs scored, one double, one triple, two home runs and 10 RBI.

**LIRIANO'S MILESTONE START:** Francisco Liriano made the 300th start of his Major League career last night at Minnesota. Liriano became the eighth Dominican-born pitcher and the 16th active pitcher to make 300 starts in the Majors.

**FARMER'S ALMANAC:** Buck Farmer tossed a scoreless sixth inning in last night's game, allowing one hit. Farmer has not allowed a run in eight consecutive appearances, throwing 9.1 shutout innings and limiting the opposition to a .206 (7x34) batting average.

**STREAKING:** Niko Goodrum and Ronny Rodriguez each enter tonight's game on a five-game hitting streak. Goodrum is batting .318/.318/.364 with two runs scored, one double and four RBI during his current streak, while Rodriguez is batting .421/.421/.632 with one run scored, one double, one home run and one RBI over his last five games.

**VMART CONCLUDES IMPRESSIVE CAREER:** Victor Martinez wrapped up an impressive 16-year Major League career on Saturday, starting at first base and going 1x1 with an infield single. In 1,973 games in his big league career, Martinez hit .295/.360/.455 with 914 runs scored, 423 doubles, three triples, 246 home runs and 1,178 RBI. Among all switch-hitters in MLB history, Martinez ranks 15th in RBI, tied for 16th in home runs, 18th in doubles and 23rd in hits (2,153). Martinez will finish his career as the Tigers all-time leader in RBI among switch-hitters, with 540. He is a five-time All-Star selection, a two-time Silver Slugger Award winner and the 2014 Edgar Martinez Award winner.

**ON THE ROAD:** The Tigers are 1-2 on their current six-game road trip, which includes three games at Minnesota (1-2) and three games at Milwaukee (September 28-30). Detroit is 26-52 (.333) on the road this season, but has won seven of its last 13 games away from home. As a team, the Tigers are hitting .235/.294/.370 on the road in 2018, while the pitching staff has compiled a 5.05 ERA (661.1IP/371ER).

**TIGERS AND BREWERS:** The Tigers close the 2018 season this weekend with a three-game series at Milwaukee. Detroit has a 222-199 advantage in the all-time series vs. the Brewers. The two teams last played in 2015, when the Brewers won two-of-three games at Comerica Park. The Tigers have played just six games all time at Miller Park, going 3-3. Detroit took two-of-three games from Milwaukee in its last visit to Miller Park in 2006.

**INTERLEAGUE INTRIGUE:** The Tigers are 6-11 in Interleague play this season. Detroit has a 212-188

(.530) record vs. National League opponents since Interleague play began in 1997. Over the last 13 seasons (since 2006), the Tigers are 141-102 (.580) in IL play, which ranks third among all ML teams over that stretch, trailing only Boston (166-80, .675) and New York (AL) (144-102, .585).

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

\*Enters tonight's game with a 64-95 (.403) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,132-1,134 (.500) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 52nd in baseball history.

\*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

\*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

\*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

\*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

\*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

## TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - JORDAN ZIMMERMANN

**ABOUT JORDAN:** In his third season with the Tigers and his 10th season in the Majors, Zimmermann will make his 25th start of 2018 tonight in the series opener at Milwaukee.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Zimmermann recorded his eighth quality start of the season, but did not factor into the decision on Saturday vs. Kansas City, allowing two runs on three hits with two walks and five strikeouts in 7.0 innings.

**VS. MILWAUKEE:** Zimmermann has faced the Brewers seven times in his career, posting a 5-1 record with a 4.08 ERA (39.2IP/18ER) and 43 strikeouts. His last start against Milwaukee came on August 23, 2015, as a member of the Washington Nationals, when he picked up the win, giving up four runs on eight hits with one walk and seven strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

**ON THE ROAD:** Zimmermann has started 118 career games on the road, posting a 41-39 record with a 3.75 ERA (702.1IP/293ER) and 594 strikeouts. In 11 road starts this season, Zimmermann has a 3-3 record with a 4.00 ERA (54.0IP/24ER) and 46 strikeouts.

**AT MILLER PARK:** Zimmermann is making his fifth career start at Miller Park tonight. In four previous starts in Milwaukee, Zimmermann has a 2-1 record with a 3.80 ERA (21.1IP/9ER) and 24 strikeouts.

**INTERLEAGUE ACTION:** Zimmermann has started 35 games in his career in Interleague play, compiling a 14-11 record with a 3.56 ERA (215.0IP/85ER) and 171 strikeouts. In three starts vs. National League teams this season, Zimmermann has a 1-0 record with a 4.80 ERA (15.0IP/8ER) and 17 strikeouts.

**RECORD IN SEPTEMBER:** Zimmermann has made 35 appearances, including 34 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 15-10 record with a 4.20 ERA (193.0IP/90ER) and 165 strikeouts. In four September starts this season, Zimmermann is 1-2 with a 4.79 ERA (20.2IP/11ER) and 13 strikeouts.

**LEFT VS. RIGHT:** Zimmermann has limited righthanded hitters to a .256 (727x2835) batting average during his career, while lefties are hitting .267 (774x2897) against him. In 24 starts this season, righties are hitting .267 (64x240), while lefthanded batters are hitting .259 (68x263).

**KEEPIN' IT 1,000:** Zimmermann recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his Major League career in his start on May 23, 2017 at Houston, striking out Jake Marisnick to end the second inning. Zimmermann is one of 48 active pitchers to record 1,000 career strikeouts.

**NO FREE PASSES:** Zimmermann has been one of the best at limiting walks since making his debut in 2009. Zimmermann enters tonight's game ranked second among all active pitchers (min. 1,000.0 innings pitched) with 1.91 walks per nine innings. This season, Zimmermann has issued 24 walks in 127.1 innings for 1.70 walks per nine innings, which is the fifth-lowest among American League pitchers (min. 120.0 innings pitched).

**SCORELESS STREAK TO START 2016:** Zimmermann began the 2016 season by not allowing a run in his first 24.1 innings pitched. The streak was snapped on April 25 when he allowed a run in the top of the sixth inning vs. Oakland. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Zimmermann became the first starting pitcher to begin his tenure with a team with a scoreless streak of 20.0-or-more innings since Fred Norman began his time with the Cincinnati Reds in 1973 with 26.0 consecutive innings without allowing a run. Zimmermann's streak ranked as the longest by a Tigers pitcher to begin a season and was tied for the eighth longest by any MLB pitcher to start a season in the Expansion Era (since 1961).

**ALL-STAR SELECTION:** Zimmermann has been selected to the National League All-Star Team twice in his career, earning the honor in 2013 and 2014.

**TOSSING A NO-HITTER:** Zimmermann threw the first no-hitter in Washington Nationals history on September 28, 2014 vs. Miami. Zimmermann allowed just one walk and struck out 10 in his no-hit performance.

**MISCELLANEOUS NOTES:** Zimmermann was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on November 30, 2015. He was originally drafted by the Washington Nationals in the second round (67th overall) of the June 2007 draft.
