LEADING OFF: Angels play the sixth game (5-0) of their second road trip of 2018 to **Texas** (April 9-11; 3-0) and **Kansas City** (April 12-15; 2-0)...Angels riding a six-game win streak, matching longest last season (Aug. 8-13)...Last seven-game win streak came Sept. 22-29, 2015...Halos have won nine of 10 contests (Club has won eight straight road affairs, longest on road since Sept. 4-11, 2014 – last longer streak was 10 games on the road in 2012)...**LAA is 12-3 thru 15 games to match best 15-game start in Club annals (1979)**...Best mark after 16 games is 12-4 in 1993 & 1979...**Angels 8-1 start on the road is best road start in Club history through nine game (STATS LLC)**...Following the trip, Angels return home to face **Boston** (April 17-19) & **San Francisco** (April 20-22)...Angels are off Monday.

PITCHING IN: **Andrew Heaney** was the ninth different starting pitcher for the Angels thru 15 games played (most in the Majors since the 1960 Baltimore Orioles had nine pitchers in 15 G)...With **Blake Wood** earning the win last night, marked the 10th different Angel in 15 G to earn a win – in last 100 years, only the 2002 Seattle Mariners had as many as 10 different winning pitchers thru 15 G. MLB's TOP OFFENSE: Halos lead MLB with +46 run differential (98-52)...**Angels' offense leads the Majors with a .294 average, 98 runs scored, 165 hits, 53 extra base hits, 23 HR and 269 total bases**...Halos are just the third team ever to have eight games of 13+ hits within first 15 games (2006 Indians and 1931 Indians).

SHOHEI'S NEXT START: Shohei Ohtani will make his third start as a pitcher on Sunday...With a win, he'd be the first Angels rookie to win each of his first three career games since **Jered Weaver** won his first seven games in 2006...**Ohtani would need two strikeouts on Sunday to break Tim Fortugno's club record of 19 strikeouts through his first three career games.**

SO FAR, SHO GOOD: Shohei Ohtani has 23 total bases this season. Only one player in Angels history has more thru first eight games (**Jackie Warner** – 26 TB in 1966)...Has a hit in all seven starts as a batter this season (0-for-1 as a pinch hitter)...**Posted 11 RBI in first 7 G with an AB...Only Dale Alexander (14 RBI for 1929 Tigers) and Mitchell Page (13 RBI for 1977 A's) drove in more RBI in the A.L. during first seven career games**... On Monday he was named the American League Player of the Week...Set Angels' records with 16 total bases and 7 RBI through first four career games with a plate appearance...Just fourth player all-time to homer in his first three career home games with a plate appearance (also, **Chris Davis, Tom Murphy** and **Matt Kemp**)...Became the first player with two wins and 3+ home runs in his team's first 10 games of a season since **Jim Shaw** for the 1919 Washington Senators (Shaw's 3 HR came in the games where he pitched (STATS LLC).

SHOKKKKKKKKK OHTANI: 18 total strikeouts this year tie Angels record in first two career pitching appearances (also, **Tim Fortugno**)...**12 strikeouts last Sunday tied the American League record for a player in one of their first two games as a pitcher (Fortugno in 1992 and Elmer Myers (Philadelphia A's) in 1915**...Third Angels rookie with 12+ strikeouts in a game (**Fortugno** in 1992 and **Jorge Rubio** (15 SO) in 1966).

FISH FACTS: Last Sunday **Mike Trout** scored his 700th career run...Only eight players have hit 200 home runs and scored 700 runs prior to their age-27 season all-time: **Albert Pujols, Alex Rodriguez, Frank Robinson, Hank Aaron, Mickey Mantle, Eddie Matthews, Mel Ott and Jimmie Foxx.**

THIS N' THAT: Halo relievers rank second in A.L. with a 2.33 ERA (65.2 IP – 17 ER) and .207 BAA...**LAA has committed just four errors thru 15 games**...Halos hurlers have issued 66 free passes, most in Majors...**Blake Wood** (8 IP) and **Jose Alvarez** (7 IP) have combined for 15 scoreless innings in 17 combined games in 2018.

PLAYER POINTS: **Mike Trout** has homered in all five series this season (5 HRs tied for A.L. lead)...On Thursday, **Nick Tropeano** (6.2 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 6 SO) made his first MLB appearance since July 18, 2016 – span of 633 days...**Albert Pujols** (1,927 RBI) ranks 9th on the all-time RBI list – up next is **Ty Cobb** (1,944) - *baseball-reference.com*...**Andrelton Simmons** leads Majors with 21 hits...In March/April-May across last two seasons, **Zack Cozart** is batting .330 (76/230)...**Cozart** is riding a six-game hit streak...**Shohei Ohtani** is the first Angel rookie to homer in each of his first three home games with an AB and the second Angel to hit a HR in each of his first three home games of a season (**Bobby Bonds** in 1977).

TWO-WAY SHOHEI: **Ohtani** is the first A.L. player to homer in three straight games in the same season that he started a game as a pitcher since **Babe Ruth** (five times; 1918-1921, 1930 - STATS LLC)...First player to earn a win and then hit a home run in a start as a non-pitcher in his next game since **Babe Ruth** on June 13-14, 1921...**Ohtani** became the first player to start as a non-pitcher on Opening Day and then start as a pitcher within his team's first 10 games since **Ruth** (BOS) in 1919 (STATS LLC).

ANOTHER TROUT NIBBLE: **Mike Trout** has four 9+ WAR seasons through his 26 year-old campaign. Only others to do so? **Rogers Hornsby** (4) and **Ty Cobb** (4).

3000/600: **Albert Pujols** is 13 hits shy of 3,000...When he reaches the mark, he will become just the fourth player in MLB history with at least 3,000 knocks and 600 HR joining **Hank Aaron, Willie Mays** and **Alex Rodriguez.**

@ ROYALS: **LAA** leads 2018 season series 2-0...Royals claimed 2017 season series 6-1 and have won seven of last 10 games vs. Halos...**LAA** is 9-13 in last 22 matchups spanning back to 2015...**Angels are 4-7 in last 11 meetings at Kauffman Stadium...LAA leads all-time series 292-286**...**Pujols** is a career .312 (114/365) hitter with 24 HR and 80 RBI in 94 career games vs. Kansas City...**Mike Trout** is batting .345 (46/133) with 10 HR and 25 RBI (.623 SLG) vs. KC...His .623 SLG pct. is highest by any opponent with 100 at bats.

RED SOX ON DECK: Halos claimed 2017 season series 4-2...**LAA** is 4-1-1 in last six season series...**Since 2012, Halos are 26-13 vs. Red Sox**...**Angels are 14-6 in last 20 meetings at Angel Stadium**... **Pujols** is batting .321 (54/168) with 10 home runs and 36 RBI in 43 career tilts vs. Boston.

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

April 14

(1982) In a continuation from the night before, the Angels finished the longest game in Club history, winning 4-3 in 20 innings vs. Seattle (6:06).

April 15

(1994) The Angels overcame their largest deficit in a victory in club history (seven runs) to beat Toronto 14-13 in Anaheim in 10 innings (Angels have overcome seven runs to win three times in club history); **(1977) Nolan Ryan** threw a one-hitter vs. Seattle, yielding only a fifth-inning single, in the Angels' 7-0 victory...In his tenure with the Angels, Ryan threw six one-hitters (four no-hitters); **(2011) Jered Weaver** sets a Major League record for earliest calendar date on which a starting pitcher has won his 4th game of season

First start vs. Royals since April 25, 2016

- Making fourth start of the season and third on the road.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Monday at Texas after tossing 4.1 innings and allowing one earned run on four hits with five walks and six strikeouts...Five walks matched second-highest total of career.
- **LOW AVERAGE:** Ranks second in the American League (min. 400 IP) with a .219 (366/1672) batting average against since the start of 2014 behind only **Corey Kluber** (.217).
- **ROAD WARRIOR:** In nine road starts since 2016, has pitched to a 2.70 ERA (43.1 IP – 13 ER)...Has allowed two-or-fewer earned runs in seven of the nine starts...Seeking first winning decision on the road since Sept. 19, 2015 (Game 2) at Twins.
- **DIVISIONAL PLAY:** Since 2013, owns a 19-16 record and 3.36 ERA (302.1 IP – 113 ER) in 57 games (48 starts) vs. A.L. West opponents...The 19 wins are seventh most in the Majors in that span.
- **BRINGING THE HEAT:** According to Fangraphs, leads all Major Leaguers currently on active rosters with an average fastball velocity of 95.9 MPH since the start of the 2014 season (min. 400 IP)...This season (min. 10 IP), ranks fourth in Majors with a 96.2 MPH average, behind **Luis Severino**, NYY (97.7 MPH), **Noah Syndergaard**, NYM (97.3 MPH) and **Shohei Ohtani**, LAA (97.2 MPH).
- **VS. KANSAS CITY:** Tonight marks first appearance vs. Kansas City since April 25, 2016 at Angel Stadium (6.2 IP, 3 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 5 BB, 5 SO)...In 10 career games (four starts) vs. Royals, is 1-1 with a 3.38 ERA (32 IP – 12 ER)...As a starter, is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (24.2 IP – 10 ER) vs. KC.
- **AT KAUFFMAN STADIUM:** Making second career start at Kauffman Stadium...In six games (one start) at the ballpark, is 0-0 with a 3.18 ERA (11.1 IP – 4 ER)...Did not factor in decision in only previous start at the ballpark on Aug. 13, 2015 (6 IP, 8 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO).
- **OPENING DAY STARTER:** Made second career Opening Day start on April 29 in Oakland...Previously got the nod on Opening Day in 2016 against the Chicago Cubs at Angel Stadium.
- **STREAK SNAPPED:** Four runs allowed in first start on Opening Day in Oakland, snapped streak of 16 consecutive starts having allowed three-or-fewer earned runs, which dated back to Sept. 19, 2015...The streak was the longest of his career (previous was 10 straight starts, Aug. 4, 2014 – May 17, 2015) and is tied for fifth longest in Angels history.
- **2017 SEASON:** Exited first start of year (Apr. 5, 2017 at OAK) after five scoreless innings with right biceps strain...Missed 135 games on disabled list...Returned to Angels on Sept. 5, 2017 at OAK...Made five September starts and pitched to a 2.74 ERA (23 IP – 7 ER) for the month...Allowed one-or-fewer runs in four of six starts on the season.
- **CAREER TOTALS:** In 157 career games (102 starts), is 41-34 with a 3.54 ERA (683.1 IP – 269 ER) and 577 strikeouts across eight seasons with the Angels...Since 2014, is 30-21 with a 3.10 ERA (453.1 IP – 156 ER).
