LEADING OFF: Angels play the fifth contest (0-4) of a four-city, 10-game road trip to **Kansas City** (makeup; 0-1), **Boston** (0-3), **Baltimore** (June 29-July 1) and **Seattle** (July 3-5)...**Angels were swept by Red Sox, 4th time swept this season (2nd time vs. Boston in '18)**...Marked first time in club history dropping all games in a season series to **Red Sox** (0-6) and just fourth time overall to any opponent (min. 6 G)...**Halos have dropped a season-high six straight, eight of 11 and 13 of last 17 games**... At 41-41, LAA at .500 mark for first time since starting season 1-1 (March 30)...**Club is in fourth place and sits a season-high 13.5 games back of pace in A.L. West (10.0 games behind Seattle for second Wild Card spot)**...Angels are 28-38 since a club-record 13-3 start...Club is 11-14 this month...**16 of 24 games in July will be at home**...LAA is 6-14 when a left-hander starts (35-27 vs. RHS)...**LAA is 10-19 on road since a team-record 11-1 start**.

OHTANI UPDATE: Shohei Ohtani (10-day DL; Grade 2 sprain of ulnar collateral ligament in right elbow) received a stem cell platelet-rich plasma (PRP) injection June 7th. **Yesterday an MRI revealed improvements to the UCL in the elbow. He will begin a hitting progression immediately. Depending on day-to-day progress, Ohtani could see live pitching as early as this weekend.** He will not partake on a minor league rehab assignment but rather hit in a controlled environment. **In approximately three weeks, he will be re-assessed to see if he can pitch this season.**

INJURY UPDATE: **Jake Jewell** will undergo right ankle surgery tomorrow (fractured right fibula). The procedure will be performed by **Dr. Kenneth Jung** of Kerlan-Jobe in Los Angeles. Updates will be provided when appropriate.

WE LIKE IT HERE: Following players have strong career numbers at Camden Yards: **Ian Kinsler** (.353; 66/187, 9 HR 28 RBI in 45 games), **Chris Young** (.313; 21/67, 5 HR, 6 RBI in 25 games), **Mike Trout** (7 HR and 14 RBI in 22 games; 1st MLB HR on 7/24/11) and **Albert Pujols** (.286; 20/70, 4 HR, 12 RBI in 17 games).

THEY KNOW O's: **Justin Upton** has four home runs and 15 RBI in his last seven games vs. Orioles...**Ian Kinsler** is batting .343 (124/361) with 13 HRs & 52 RBI in career vs. Baltimore...**Andrelton Simmons** has a .344 career clip vs. O's (21/61; 2 HRs).

SURGERY FOR COZART: **Zack Cozart** received a second opinion on his left shoulder after experiencing continued discomfort during his progressions. After additional imaging and clinical examination, it was recommended that he undergo surgery to repair a torn labrum in his left shoulder. **He had surgery today in Los Angeles with Dr. Neal ElAttrache.**

ALWAYS ON: Since his call-up in 2012, **Mike Trout** has never gone more than two consecutive games without reaching base...His **71 walks** are most in Angels' history through 82 games.

FROM THE START: Halo starters have allowed three earned runs-or-less in 43 of last 54 games...**LAA starters have fashioned a 3.27 ERA (297 IP – 108 ER) since May 1, second in MLB in span.**

TRIPLE THREATS at 1K: June 21st marked the 1,000th career game for **Mike Trout**...He joins **Willie Mays & Alex Rodriguez** as only players in MLB history with at least a **.300 average, 450 extra-base hits & 150 stolen bases** at the 1K milestone.

A BIT ON ALBERT: **Albert Pujols** is 39 RBI shy of 2,000 – only two other players have ever logged 3,000 hits, 600 HR & 2,000 RBI – **Hank Aaron & Alex Rodriguez**.

MAKE WAR: **Trout's 6.7 WAR** this season (Wins Above Replacement) leads MLB...Next highest MLB player in 2018 WAR is **J. Ramirez** (CLE) at 5.4...**On pace for a 13.2 WAR campaign (BBREF) – best single-season mark in MLB history is Babe Ruth (14.1 in 1923)**...He has led A.L. in WAR in six of last seven seasons and his **60.8 career WAR** is tops in MLB history thru 1,007 games.

JUNE BUG: **Trout's .352 (206/586)** career average in June is highest among active players in any month (min. 400 PA)...This month, he boasts a slash line of .365/.495/.588 with 16 runs, five HRs & 12 RBI (21 BB/ 6 IBB)...**His top average for any month is .392 (10 HR, 23 RBI) in July of 2012, his first full season in MLB.**

SHELVED: Angels currently have 14 players on the D.L...**On June 15, Halos had 15 players on D.L. for first time in Club history (STATS' D.L. data spans to 1987)**...**48 players have appeared for Angels this season, most in MLB (Club record is 55 in 2017)**...**27 pitchers have played for LAA, most in team history thru 82 games (STATS).**

MVP x 3? **Two-time A.L. MVP Mike Trout** ranks in **Top 3 in MLB in several offensive categories, including HRs (2nd; 23), runs (2nd; 63), times on base (1st; 166), total bases (2nd; 182), walks (1st; 71), OBP (1st; .460), OPS (1st; 1.101) & OPS+ (1st; 205.0)**...**Trout** has more games reaching base 4+ times (13) than games he hasn't at all (11).

GLOVE STORY: LAA has gone errorless in 53 of 82 games...**Club has 35 errors thru 82 G (second-fewest in A.L.) and rank second in circuit with a .988 fielding pct.**...**Catchers own a 47.1 caught stealing percentage, tops in A.L. (2nd in MLB)**...**Trout** is one of four MLB CFs with a 1.000 fielding pct.

BATS ARE BETTER: Despite being held to two runs or less in five of last seven games, LAA has posted 4+ runs in nine of last 14 and in 14 of 25 games in June...**Club's 37 HRs this month rank fourth in A.L.**...LAA totaled 36 HRs in May.

PITCHING POINTS: **LAA pitchers have 38 games this season with 10+ Ks, a franchise record through 82 affairs (LAA ranks 4th in A.L. with 738 Ks)**...**287 walks are third-most in A.L.**...Angels' bullpen has logged 306 IP, second in A.L. to TB...**15 blown saves are third-most in A.L.**...Halos have allowed 109 HRs, third-most in A.L.

HOT HALOS: **Chris Young** has connected for four HRs and six RBI over his last nine starts (2 HR & 6 RBI first 22 starts)...**Tyler Skaggs** is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP – 2 ER) this month (4 GS)...**The 0.67 ERA is a club record for June (min. 4 GS)**...**He has allowed two earned runs or less in 12 of his 15 starts**...His 2.69 ERA ranks ninth in A.L...**David Fletcher** has multi-hit games in three of his first six MLB starts (3 hits in MLB debut)...Over his last 28 contests, **Ian Kinsler** has 18 runs, seven doubles, nine HRs and 16 RBI...**Jose Briceño** has opened his big league career batting .333 (9/27) in nine games with an AB...**Luis Valbuena** has three home runs and six RBI his last six starts...**In his return from D.L., Kole Calhoun has hit safely in six of eight starts with an AB hitting .333 (9/27), with six runs, a double, two HRs & five RBI.**

NO-K GUYS: **A. Simmons** has struck out just five times since May 1 (187 PA)...He went 90 PA without a K (May 18-June 22)...He Leads MLB in PA per SO with 24.46 (292 PA/13 K) while teammate **Ian Kinsler** ranks third in MLB in PA per SO (9.97).

First road appearance of the season for Angels

- **IN THE ROTATION:** Making fifth appearance (third start) of the season for Angels; first appearance of the season on the road...First 38 big league outings came in relief before making first start on June 19 vs. Arizona...Recalled from Triple-A Salt Lake on June 15 for third stint of season with Angels.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Did not factor in decision in last start on Sunday vs. Toronto after tossing five innings and allowing three earned runs on eight hits with one walk and six strikeouts; set single-game career high in innings pitched and matched career-high in strikeouts (second consecutive start with six strikeouts).
- **RISP:** With runners in scoring position this season, opponents are batting .200 (2/10).
- **WITH THE BEES:** In 10 games (nine starts) this season with Triple-A Salt Lake, is 1-2 with a 3.51 ERA (33.1 IP – 13 ER)...Recorded 38 strikeouts with 16 walks...Did not allow a run in last 10.2 innings pitched for Salt Lake before being called up by Angels on June 15...The first batter he has faced of each inning with Salt Lake batted .091 (3/33).
- **FIRST HALOS STINTS:** Made Angels debut on April 8 vs. A's (1 IP, 2 H, 1 ER)...Made one appearance for LAA during second stint with team on May 17 vs. Tampa bay (1.2 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 SO).
- **DOMINICAN NATIVE:** Is a native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic...Is one of five Dominican pitcher to start a game for the Angels and the first since **Ervin Santana** in 2012; the other three are **Bartolo Colon**, **Ramon Ortiz** and **Hector Carrasco**.
- **STARTER #11:** Became 11th different starting pitcher for Angels this season, which is tied with Dodgers and A's for second most in the Majors (behind Tampa Bay – 13).
- **VS. BALTIMORE:** Tonight marks first career appearance against the Orioles.
- **AT CAMDEN YARDS:** Tonight marks first career appearance at Camden Yards.
- **2018 SPRING TRAINING:** Made 11 appearances for Angels in Spring Training and went 1-0 with one save, a 4.09 ERA (11 IP – 5 ER) and 17 strikeouts.
- **2017 WITH THE CUBS:** Appeared in 25 games for Cubs last season and went 1-0 with a 5.24 ERA (34.1 IP – 20 ER) and 37 strikeouts.
- **MAJOR LEAGUE EXPERIENCE:** Pitched parts of last two seasons with Cubs, appearing in 36 total games and going 1-0 with a 4.98 ERA (43.1 IP – 24 ER) and 52 strikeouts...Made Major League debut on Aug. 19, 2016 vs. Colorado.
- **MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS:** Was honored as a minor league All-Star in 2013 (Southern League), 2014 (Florida State League) and 2015 (Midwest League).
- **CAREER NOTES:** Originally signed by Cubs as an international free agent...Acquired by Angels from Cubs for cash considerations or a player to be named later on Oct. 9, 2017.

Making 16th start of the season for Angels and 10th on the road...In four starts during month of June this season, is 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (27 IP – 2 ER) and 30 strikeouts...Charged with loss in last start on Monday at Kansas City after tossing seven innings and allowing one earned run on seven hits with two walks and eight strikeouts...Has pitched exactly seven innings and recorded exactly eight strikeouts in each of last three starts...In nine road starts this season, is 5-2 with a 2.14 ERA (54.2 IP – 13 ER)...Only previous start of career vs. Baltimore came on July 31, 2014 at Camden Yards; tossed 4.2 scoreless, no-hit innings allowing two walks with seven strikeouts but left game with left forearm tightness which would lead to Tommy John surgery (missed nearly two full seasons).
