Last night's 7-4 Reds win was **Jim Riggleman's 700th** as a Major League manager.

### RED HOT

Since an **8-27 start** through games of **5/7** the Redlegs are **33-24** (.579), the fourth-best record in the National League behind the **Cubs** (35-22, .614), **Brewers** (35-22, .614) and **Dodgers** (34-23, .596)...in their last 4 series **vs first-place teams**, beginning **6/21**, the Reds went **4-0 vs Cubs**, **2-1 at Atl**, **2-2 vs Mil** and **2-0 so far vs Cle**.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 3** (2-0) of a 3-game series vs **John Krepop's** first-place **Indians** and **Game 6** (3-2) of a 10-day, 9-game road trip heading into the **All-Star break** that included a **2-1 series loss** at Chi's **Wrigley Field** and features an upcoming weekend series at StL's **Busch Stadium** (off day, 3g)...the Redlegs will open up the championship season's second half on **Fri, 7/20** with a 10-game homestand vs the **Pirates** (3g), **Cardinals** (3g) and **Phillies** (4g).

**ABOUT LAST NIGHT:** In last night's **7-4 win** the Reds scored all 7 runs with 2 outs in the ninth inning...was their first **7-run ninth inning** since **5/9/2015 at WSox** (Game 1 of DH, 10-4 win)...was the first time the Reds scored at least 7 runs in the ninth after entering the inning being shut out since **8/23/1919 at Phi** (8 runs, 8-3 win)...the Reds overcame a 4-run ninth-inning deficit for the first time since **6/30/2006 at Great American Ball Park** in a game won by **Adam Dunn's** walkoff grand slam off **Bob Wickman**...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** was 0-for-3 with 3 strikeouts entering the ninth but produced 2 hits in that inning to extend his hitting streak to **13 games**, the longest active streak in the Major Leagues and tying his career high...**LHP Kyle Crockett** earned his first Major League victory since **2014**, when during his rookie season he went **4-1 for the Indians**.

**SERIES NOTES:** Tonight the Reds are looking for their first **3-game series sweep** of the Tribe since **6/12-6/14 at Great American Ball Park** and their first **series sweep** of any length here at **Progressive Field**...the Redlegs won or tied **12** of the first **20 Ohio Cup** season series, including **9** of the **last 12**, but lost **2** of the **last 3** season series (1-5, 0-4, 2-2)...the Indians have won **6** of the **last 9 games** at **Progressive Field** and **16** of the **last 20 games** here...the Reds have won **18** of the last **27 games** vs Cle at **Great American Ball Park** but lost **5** of the last **7 games** there...**Reds vs Indians** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

**INTERLEAGUE NOTES:** This season the Reds are **10-2 vs the American League** (2-1 at Min, 2-0 at KC, 2-0 vs Det, 2-1 vs WSox, 2-0 at Cle), tied with the **Pirates** and **Brewers** for the most interleague wins this season and including a **6-game winning streak vs the AL** from **4/29-7/2** that ranks as their **longest interleague winning streak**...regardless of tonight's outcome, the Reds will have won both of this season's **3-game interleague road series** (2-1 at Min)...prior to this season hadn't won an interleague road series of **at least 3 games** since a **3-0 series sweep** at Hou's **Minute Maid Park** in **September 2013**...between those series wins the Reds went **0-9 in interleague road series** of at least 3 games and **4-23 in games** in those series...the remaining interleague schedule includes home games vs the **Indians** (3g, 8/13-8/15) and **Royals** (2g, 9/25-9/26) and road games at Det's **Comerica Park** (2g, 8/1-8/2)...beginning in **1997** the Reds are **148-199 all-time vs the AL**, at **427** the **second-lowest interleague winning percentage** of any Major League team (SD, 151-213, .415)...Cin hasn't produced a **winning record vs the American League** since **2013** (11-9)...in **5 seasons** since then are **33-59 vs AL** (.402)...**Reds vs AL opponents** information is on media guide **Page 332**.

**CARDINALS UP NEXT:** The Reds have **999 wins vs StL** since 1900...since a 4-game sweep from **6/5-6/8, 2017 at Great American Ball Park**, the Reds have lost each of the **last 6 series vs StL**, (1-2 at Cin, 1-2 at StL, 0-3 vs StL, 0-4 vs StL, 0-3 at StL, 1-2 vs StL)...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, Cin's **.337 winning percentage at Busch Stadium** (35-69) is its second-lowest at any current road ballpark in that span (17-34, **.333 at Phi**)...the Reds' **6-3 win** on **6/10 at GABP** snapped their **13-game losing streak** to the Cardinals, their longest skid vs StL since an **18-game winning streak vs StL** from **7/4/1930-5/23/1931**...was the Reds' **longest active losing streak** vs any team and their longest vs any team since a **14-game losing streak** to the **Mets** from **9/7/2014-9/7/2016**...**Reds vs Cardinals** info is on **Page 328**.

**APRIL 19:** The Reds are **38-36** since **4/19**, when they replaced manager **Bryan Price** and pitching coach **Mack Jenkins**...bench coach **Jim Riggleman** became interim manager, Class AAA Louisville manager **Pat Kelly** (#60) was promoted to serve as interim bench coach, and Class AA Pensacola pitching coach **Danny Darwin** (#52) joined the Reds' Major League staff as interim pitching coach...**Price** went **279-387 (.419)** in his 5 seasons as manager, including **3-15 this year**.

**STREAKING:** The Reds' **2-1 series loss** at Cubs completed Sunday snapped their **5-series unbeaten streak** (2-0 vs Det, 4-0 vs Chc, 2-1 at Atl, 2-2 vs Mil, 2-1 vs Cws), their longest since a **6-series winning streak** from **7/15-8/4, 2016**...in **fifth place** since the **fourth day of the season**, the Reds have pulled to within **1.5 games** of the fourth-place **Pirates**...at **15-11** (.577), the Redlegs had the best record in the NL Central Division in **June**.

**ALL-STAR INFIELD:** The Reds' **infield** includes **3 National League All-Stars** and collectively leads the Major Leagues in **hits** (417), **batting average** (.288) and **on-base percentage** (.370)...**All-Star 1B Joey Votto** leads the National League in **on-base percentage** and **hitting vs RHP**...**All-Star 2B Scooter Gennett** ranks second in the NL **hitting**, just .002 behind the leader, and leads the league in **hitting on the road**...**All-Star 3B Eugenio Suárez** leads the National League in **RBI** while ranking second in **on-base percentage**, third in both **slugging percentage** and **hitting with RISP** (.390), fourth in **hitting** and sixth in **home runs**...**SS José Peraza** in his last 37 apps beginning 5/27 is **hitting .322** with a **.382 on-base percentage**.

**REHABBING:** RHP **Homer Bailey** is 5 apps into a **rehabilitation assignment at Louisville** (5g, 4gs, 1-2, 5.84, 24.2ip, 30h, 16er, 4bb, 15k, 4hr, 1hbp)...he has been disabled since **6/2** with **right knee inflammation**...made his most recent appearance **Sun vs Toledo**, in relief threw the sixth and seventh innings of the **Bats'** 6-1 win (2ip, 1h, 0r, 2bb, 1k, 42 pitches, 25 strikes)...was his first regular season relief appearance since he pitched out of the bullpen once on rehab for **Louisville** in **2010**.

**SLAMMING:** The Reds lead the Major Leagues with **9 grand slams**, tying the **2002 franchise single-season record** and including a streak of **6 slams** over a **17-game span** from **6/13-7/1**...the **1996 Expos**, **1997 Braves** and **2006 Mets** are the only other teams in **Major League history** to produce at least **6 grand slams** over a **17-day span**...the **9 grand slams** tie the **2010 Yankees** for most ever prior to the **All-Star break**...the National League record for grand slams in a season is **12** (1997 Braves, 2000 Cardinals), while the Major League record is **14** (2000 Athletics, 2006 Indians).

# Tonight's Pitcher - #30 Tyler Mahle, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Tyler Mahle's** last name rhymes with **RALLY**...at just **23 years old** is in his **second Major League season**...tonight is making his 19th start of the season and 23rd appearance and start of his **career**...will be his first career appearance vs the **Indians**, his fourth start of the season and career vs an AL team (**3-0, 1.45, 18.2ip, 3er**)...leads the staff with **7 wins** and **7 quality starts**...hasn't lost since **5/20**...in **8 starts** since then is **4-0, 2.62** (44.2ip, 13er)...in **7 starts** beginning **6/1** is **4-0, 2.04** (39.2ip, 9er) and in that span leads the National League while ranking fifth in the Major Leagues in **ERA** (39.2p minimum)...is the **first winning streak** of his career and ties **Anthony DeSclafani's** for the longest winning streak by a Reds pitcher this season...leads National League rookies in **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts** while ranking sixth in **ERA**...ranks second in the Major Leagues in strikeouts among all pitchers **age 23 and younger** (Col's **German Márquez**, 98)...his career-high **12 strikeouts** in his **12-3 win on 6/30 vs Mil** were the most by a Reds pitcher since rookie **LHP Amir Garrett** had **12 strikeouts** on **4/19/17 vs Bal** and the most by a Reds righthander since rookie **Raisel Iglesias** had **13 strikeouts** on **8/23/15 vs Ari**...in the 12-inning, 9-7 win on **4/24 vs Atl**, took a 5-0 lead and a no-hitter into the seventh before **Freddie Freeman** led off the inning with a solo HR...was the victim of a **blown save** when the Braves tied it at 7-7 with 4 runs in the ninth inning off **Amir Garrett** and **Raisel Iglesias**, including a second HR by **Freeman**, but the Reds won it on **Scouter Gennett's** 2-run, walkoff HR off **Max Fried**...his third-inning single in the 5-0 loss on **4/8 at Pit** was the only Reds hit in **Jameson Taillon's** first career complete game...was the first **Reds pitcher** to record the team's only hit in a game hit since **Earl Yingling** did it on **9/19/1914 at Brooklyn Robins**...was 1 of 5 rookies on the **Opening Day roster** (**RHP Jackson Stephens, RHP Zack Weiss, OF Phillip Ervin, OF Jesse Winker**) and the only rookie to begin this season in the Reds' starting rotation...when he earned the 1-0 win in his season debut on 4/2 vs Cubs, at **23 years, 185 days** was the youngest pitcher in the Major Leagues with a victory.

# Friday at Cardinals - #32 Matt Harvey, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Matt Harvey** on Fri at StL will make his 12th appearance and start for the Reds...will be his **sixth career** appearance and **fifth start** vs the **Cardinals**, his third appearance and second start of the season, and his **third career appearance** and **second start** at **Busch Stadium**...the Reds were **8-27** before he was acquired and 33-24 since then...didn't allow more than 2 earned runs in any of his **last 4 starts** (3-0 1.88, 24ip, 5er)...his active **3-game winning streak** is his longest since he won his **first 5 starts** in **2015**...hasn't allowed a HR since he allowed 3 homers on **6/8 vs StL**, homerless spans of **32.0 innings** and **5 starts**...began the season with the **Mets** and went **0-2, 7.00** in **4 starts** and **4 relief apps** before he was **designated for assignment** on **5/5**...on **5/8** was acquired by the Reds in exchange for **C Devin Mesoraco** and **cash**...from **2012-2018** for the **Mets** went **34-37, 3.66** in **104 starts** and **5 relief apps**.

- On this road trip is 3-for-18 (.167, 1rbi, 4bb, 5r).
- In his last 162 apps beginning 7/3/17 is hitting .308 with 31 doubles, 1 3b, 29 HR and 113 RBI (.506slg, .355obp, .861ops).
- In May (.398, 8hr, 24rbi) became the first Reds player to win the National League Player of the Month Award since Jay Bruce in May 2011...twice in a 3-week span that month won the NL Player of the Week Award (5/7-5/13, 5/21-5/27), the first Reds player to win the weekly award twice in a season since Bruce in 2012 and the first Reds player to win it twice in the same month since Dave Parker in May 1985.
- Since RBI became an official statistic in 1920, is the only Reds second baseman ever to record at least 8 HR and 24 RBI in a calendar month...has done it twice (8hr, 24rbi in May 2018 & 9hr, 24rbi in June 1017).
- Was born in Cincinnati and lived in nearby Lebanon until he was 9 years old, when his family moved to Sarasota.

## 6 BILLY HAMILTON, cf Last 27 Reds Games: .326 (28-86), 12sb, 23r

- In 22 apps beginning 6/17 is hitting .366 (26-71, 2 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, 11sb, 19r, .418obp), raising his season BA from .187...hit safely in 4 of his last 5 apps (9-17, .529, 1 2b, 2bb, 6sb, 6r, .588slg, .579obp).
- In his last 4 apps has 6 stolen bases, including 3 on Sat and 2 on Sun...is the only Major League player this season to record at least 2 steals in consecutive games.
- Has made 9 starts batting leadoff, 1 start batting eighth (4/2 vs Chi) and 67 starts batting ninth...his 67 starts batting ninth are the most by any player in the Major Leagues at that spot in the order...has made 56 straight starts batting ninth since he last led off on 4/26 vs Atl...overall beginning 4/27 is hitting .255 (52-204, .326obp).
- Since his debut on 9/3/13 leads all Major League players in steals with 265, sixth on the Reds' all-time list since 1898...Reds Hall of Famer Eric Davis is fifth at 270.

## 15 DILSON HERRERA Road Trip: 2g, 1gs at 2B, 0-3, 2bb, 1r

- Has made 2 apps since he was promoted from Louisville on Friday...pinch ran for C Tucker Barnhart in the eighth inning of Sun's 10-inning, 6-5 loss at Cubs and started at 2B in Tue's dramatic 7-4 win at Cubs (0-3, 2bb, 1r)...on Tue at Cle, his 2-out walk in the ninth inning preceded Joey Votto's game-winning, 3-run double.
- His apps this season are his first for the Reds and his first in the Major Leagues since 10/3/15 for NYM vs Wsh.
- Recorded his last Major League hits on 9/27/15 for NYM at Cin (3-4, 1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).
- In 9 apps and 4 starts for the Reds during spring training hit .263 (1 3b, 2rbi)...on 3/13 cleared waivers and was outrighted off the roster.
- Began the season at Class A Daytona (21g, .298, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi)...on 5/3 was promoted to Louisville (50g, .297, 10 2b, 7hr, 27rbi)...at both stops combined to make 54 apps at 2B and 11 apps at 3B.

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss Last 27 Reds Games: .293 (29-99), 3hr, 14rbi, 8sb

- Accent mark on the "e" in José.
- Produced a 2-out, pinch-hit RBI-single to drive in the Reds' first run during Tue's 7-run ninth inning at Cle (7-4 win).
- Ranks fourth in the National League in most plate apps per strikeout (8.9)...twice this season made at least 40 plate apps without a strikeout, from 4/15-4/25 (43pa) and from 5/22-6/2 (40pa).
- Beginning 6/26 has reached base safely in 13 of his last 14 apps (18-54, .333, 1 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 10rbi, 4sb, 10r, .630slg, .400obp, 1.030ops).
- In his last 37 apps beginning 5/27 is hitting .322 (46-143, 5 2b, 3 3b, 3hr, 19rbi, 9sb, .382obp), raising his BA from .243.
- In the batting order hit first (21gs), second (34gs), seventh (22gs) and eighth (8gs).
- From 5/26-6/24 reached base safely in 23 consecutive apps (.330ba, .392obp)...was the longest on-base streak of his career, the longest by a Reds batter this season and when snapped the third-longest active streak in the Major Leagues.
- On 6/27 at Atl and 6/28 vs Mil homered in consecutive games for the first time in his career, and in the 8-2 win on 7/1 vs Mil produced his first career grand slam (off Aaron Wilkerson)...was the ninth grand slam by a Reds batter this season, tying the 2002 club record.

## 43 SCOTT SCHEBLER, of Last 27 Reds Games: .261 (23-88), 4hr, 12rbi

- In his last 33 apps beginning 5/30 is hitting .323, raising his season BA from .237 (41-127, 10 2b, 7hr, 18rbi, .567slg, .387obp, .954ops).
- The lefthanded batter ranks seventh in the National League in hitting vs LHP (.342, 25-73, 3 2b, 2hr, 5rbi, .392obp, .466slg).
- Hit .320 through April (3hr, 11rbi), .200 in May (3hr, 9rbi), .330 in June (4hr, 11rbi, .560slg, .392obp) and .281 so far in July (9-32, 2hr, 5rbi).
- Has made 27 career starts batting leadoff, including 22 times this year (30-96, .313)...in his 27 career starts batting leadoff hit .314 (37-118), including .316 (36-114) in his 26 starts batting leadoff for the Reds...his career on-base percentage while batting first is .370.
- Has made a team-high 47 starts in RF, 14 starts in CF and 1 start at DH.
- From 4/9-4/19 missed 10 games (1-9) while on the 10-day disabled list with a right ulnar nerve contusion...suffered the injury in the third game of the season, when he was hit on the right elbow by a Sean Doolittle pitch.

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf Last 27 Reds Games: .347 (35-101), 7hr, 22rbi

- First name is pronounced Ay-you-hay-nee-oh...accent mark on the "a" in Suárez.
- Was voted by his peers to his first All-Star team.
- Despite missing 16 games in April with a fractured right thumb leads the National League lead in RBI...no Reds batter has led the NL in RBI since Dave Parker drove in 125 runs in 1985...the list of Reds batters who led the NL in RBI is on page 397.
- Among the National League leaders also ranks second in on-base percentage, third in both slugging percentage and hitting with RISP (.390), fourth in hitting and sixth in HR.
- In his last 162 apps beginning 6/20/17 is hitting .280 with 26 doubles, 2 triples, 34 HR and 111 RBI (.510slg, .384obp, .894ops).
- Last night entered the ninth 0-for-3 (3k) but produced 2 hits in the inning to extend his hitting streak to 13 games (19-51, .373, 3 2b, 3hr, 11rbi, .608slg, .467obp, 1.075ops)...the 13-game hitting streak ties his career high set earlier this season (6/8-6/23), ties that earlier streak as the longest by a Reds batter this season and is the longest active hitting streak in the Major Leagues.
- Beginning 6/25 has reached base safely in each of his last 15 apps, tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the Major Leagues (20-58, .345, 3 2b, 3hr, 11rbi, .457obp).
- In his last 44 apps beginning 5/22 is hitting .343, raising his season BA from .274 (58-169, 6 2b, 1 3b, 12hr, 37rbi, .604slg, .437obp, 1.041ops).
- From 4/9-4/25 was disabled with a fractured right thumb...suffered the injury on 4/8 at Pit, when he was hit by a Jameson Taillon pitch...missed 16 games (3-13).
- On 3/16 signed a 7-year contract extension through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025...following last season was eligible for arbitration for the first time while under team control through 2020.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b Last 27 Reds Games: .242 (23-95), 3hr, 21rbi

- Was voted by his peers to his sixth All-Star team, the most All-Star apps ever by a player born in Canada (Larry Walker, 5)...Mon at Cle hit his 266th career HR, moving him past Matt Stairs into second place alone on the all-time list of HR by players born in Canada (Walker, 383).
- Leads the National League in on-base percentage and hitting vs RHP (.329) while ranking third in walks...is trying to lead the NL in walks for the sixth time, in on-base percentage for the seventh time and in both categories in the same season for the fifth time...is trying to become only the sixth player in Major League history to lead his league in on-base percentage at least 7 times (Ted Williams 12, Babe Ruth 10, Barry Bonds 10, Rogers Hornsby 7, Ty Cobb 7).
- Reached base safely in 79 of his 91 apps, including an active streak of 7 games...his season-high 20-game on-base streak was snapped on 6/13 at KC (0-4).
- Scored at least 1 run in each of his last 7 apps (8r).
- Through his third plate appearance on 6/6 was hitting .311 (68-219), his highest batting average since he was 3-for-9 (.333) in the third game of the season.
- On 4/17 at Mil reached 1,000 walks in 1,446 apps, the fourth-fewest games to 1,000 walks in National League history...Pete Rose (1,210) is the only other player in Reds history with at least 1,000 walks...Miguel Cabrera and Albert Pujols are the only other active players in the Major Leagues with at least 1,600 hits and 1,000 walks.
- In the Reds' 92 games has made 91 apps and 89 starts...missed his 3 starts on 4/12 vs StL, 5/15 at SF and 5/24 vs Pit...missed his only full game on 4/12 vs StL, snapping at 202 games his streaks of consecutive games played and consecutive games started...prior to that 4/12 day off, had appeared in and started every Reds game since he was given the day off at StL on 9/2/16, when Ivan De Jesus Jr. played 1B...during his 202-games started streak played 1,733.1 of the Reds' 1,782.1 innings in the field (97%)...was the longest games started streak by a Reds player since Pete Rose started 370 consecutive games from 1973-1976.
- From 4/23-4/29 was the NL Player of the Week, his fifth career weekly award.

## 33 JESSE WINKER, of Last 27 Reds Games: .319 (23-72), 3hr, 19rbi

- Among the National League leaders ranks fifth in on-base percentage and eighth in hitting with RISP (.344)...leads NL rookies in walks while ranking second in hits, on-base percentage and multi-hit games (20).
- Has a 6-game hitting streak, including three 2-hit games (9-19, .474, 3 2b, 4rbi).
- In his last 19 apps beginning 6/20 is hitting .412 (21-51, 3 2b, 3hr, 18rbi, 15bb, .647slg, .545obp, 1.192ops).
- Hit .305 through April (0hr, 9rbi, .414obp), .174 in May (1hr, 3rbi), .308 in June (5hr, 20rbi, .432obp) and .455 so far in July (10-22, 5rbi, .591slg, .556obp, 1.147ops)...among National League leaders in June ranked third in on-base percentage, T9th in RBI and 20th in hitting.
- Has made 37 starts in RF, 27 starts in LF and 2 starts at DH...leads the team with 35 starts batting leadoff...on 4/12 vs StL, with Votto off, made his only career start batting third in the order.
