BALTIMORE ORIOLES (24-59) vs PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (45-37)

Tuesday, July 3, 2018 – Citizens Bank Park – 7:05 EDT – Game 83; Home 45

RHP Alex Cobb (2-9, 6.75) vs RHP Zach Eflin (6-2, 3.02)

- SUNDAY'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Washington Nationals, 4-3, in the 13th inning at Citizens Bank Park ... Starter Jake Arrieta (ND) went 5.0 innings and allowed 2 ER ... The bullpen combined for 8.0 innings of scoreless relief as Gabe Kapler deployed eight different relievers ... Andrew Knapp slugged Philadelphia's first walk-off home run in over two years.
- POWERADE SHOWER:** Prior to **Andrew Knapp's** walk-off home run in the 13th inning on Sunday against the Nationals, the Phillies had gone 194 straight home games without a walk-off home run (last: **Ryan Howard**, 11th inning, 4/29/16 vs CLE) ... The 194-game stretch without a walk-off home run at home was the longest for the Phillies since a 202-game stretch at home from 1950 (Andy Seminick, 5/21/50 vs STL, G2) to 1952 (Del Ennis, 9/6/52 vs BOS Braves, G1).
- PHILLIE SPECIAL:** The Phillies enter tonight's contest winners of 10 of their last 15 games (.667 win %) ... All four teams they have played during this stretch currently are above .500 (MIL, STL, WSH & NYY) and the combined record of those four teams is currently 188-144 (.566 win %).
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, the Phillies, through 82 games, stand eight games above .500 at 45-37 and have scored 358 runs and allowed 352 (+6) ... Last season, through 82 games, they were 26 games under .500 at 28-54 and had scored 316 and allowed 406 (-90) ... The Phillies didn't notch their 45th win last season until August 20 ... This season, in seven games (8.5% of their games played thus far) in which they have allowed 10 or more runs, the Phillies have been outscored 91-23 (-68) ... **However, in their 75 other games this year (91.5% of their season), Philadelphia has a +74 run differential, outscoring the opposition 335-261.**
- WEATHERING THE STORM:** The Phillies completed a 42-game stretch on Sunday where they played .500 ball (21-21) against 10 different teams (STL, ATL, TOR, LAD, SF, CHI, MIL, COL, WSH & NYY) who, as of today, had a combined record of 455-381 (.544 win %) with a +349 run differential ... The Phillies won 13 of their final 21 games in that stretch (.619 win %) and took six of their last 10 games against the Nationals and Yankees (6/22-7/1) ... Tonight, the Phillies will play host the Orioles (24-59, -129 run differential) for two games before heading out on an 11-game road trip and face the Pirates (40-44, -22 run differential) for three, Mets (33-48, -58 run differential) for four, Orioles again for one and Marlins (35-51, -109 run differential) for three ... The combined record of Philadelphia's final four opponents before the break is 132-202 (.395 win %) with a -318 run differential.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 12 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 17.9%) and **Cesar Hernandez** (11th, 15.1 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (12th, 14.7%) ... They lead the majors in walk rate by a considerable margin (10.3 %, next-closest: CIN, 9.9 %) and also rank 1st in pitches per plate appearance (4.05) and are 2nd in walks (321) ... Pitch tracking data dates back to 1988 and over the last 30 years, the previous high for a Phillies team was 3.93 pitches per plate appearance in 2017 ... Philadelphia has finished a season with a walk rate greater than 10.0% only eight times in franchise history (last: 2002-05, 4 straight seasons).
- ZACH ATTACK:** Tonight's starter, **Zach Eflin**, is coming off the best month of his young career ... During June, he made five starts and went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER, 30.2 IP) with 28 SO/6 BB ... He allowed only seven extra-base hits (all doubles) to the 120 batters he faced during the month and held opposing hitters to a .218/.269/.282 slash line ... His .551 opponent's OPS during the month was the third-lowest of any Phillies starter over the last 20 years in June (min. 5 starts), trailing only Cliff Lee (.370) and Cole Hamels (.441) in 2011 ... During the month, all five starts were against teams that entered that game in 1st or 2nd place with a .548 winning % or better Four of those starts came after a Phillies loss and three ended a three-game or more losing streak ... With a win tonight, he would become the first Phillies starter since **Cliff Lee** (2011) to win six consecutive starts.
- WHAT A RELIEF:** The Phillies bullpen is coming off a series where they totaled 23.2 innings pitched in four games ... It marks the first time the Phillies bullpen tossed 23.2 innings in a series of four games or less since June 9-11, 1947 vs STL (25.0 IP in 4 G) ... In Sunday's game, eight different pitchers made scoreless appearances in relief of Jake Arrieta ... It marked the first time in franchise history eight or more relief hurlers made scoreless appearances in the same game.
- CITIZENS BANK SPARK:** Dating back to last season, the Phillies have gone 39-21 in their last 60 games at Citizens Bank Park (9/12/17-current) and their .650 win percentage over that stretch ranks 4th in the majors behind only the Yankees (.724), Indians (.692) and Cubs (.681).
- WHAT A CAREER, NO QUESTIONS ASKED:** Best wishes to 2008 World Series Champion **Shane Victorino**, who last night officially announced his retirement ... The Phillies will celebrate Victorino's career on August 3rd with more details to follow ... Selected by the Phillies in the Rule 5 Draft on December 13, 2004, Victorino, in his Phillies career, went on to win three Gold Gloves (2008-10), make two All-Star teams (2009 & 2011) and of course was a member of five-straight division championships (2007-11), two National League Pennants (2008-09) and one World Series championship (2008) ... Victorino will be remembered for hitting one of the biggest postseason home runs in Phillies history, a grand slam in Game 2 of the NLDS on October 2, 2008 at Citizens Bank Park off Brewers' starter, CC Sabathia.

LAST START: 6/27 vs NYY: W, 7.0 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 6 SO ... Eflin vs Cessa ... Rhys Hoskins' 3-run home run in the 2nd inning would be all the offense the Phillies would need as Seranthony Dominguez picked up his 5th save of the season, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings in relief of Eflin.

TONIGHT'S START:

- June Ends Too Soon:** Went 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA (6 ER, 30.2 IP), 6 BB, 0 HR, 28 SO and held opponents to a .218 AVG in 5 June starts ... **All five starts were against teams that entered that game in 1st or 2nd place and with a .548 winning % or better ... Four came after a Phils loss and 3 ended a three or more game losing streak** ... He was the first Phillie to win 5 games in a month since May 2012 (Hamels) and the first Phillie to have at least 30.0 IP in a month and 0 HR allowed since April 2012 (Halladay) ... Was T-1st in the majors in wins in June and HR/9.0 IP, and in the NL ranked 3rd in ERA, 4th in SO/BB (4.97) and 8th in WHIP (0.98)
- #Winning:** His 5 straight wins are a career high, and with a win today will become the first Phillie to win 6 straight starts since 2011 (Lee, 7 straight from 7/30-9/5)
- Going Streaking:** Enters tonight with a 10.0-inning scoreless streak ... The longest by a Phillie in 2018 is 18.2 IP (Arrieta)
- Limiting Longballs:** Has not surrendered a home run in his last 31.2 IP since the 3rd inning of his start on 5/30 at LAD ... **Eflin is the only qualifying NL pitcher to have 0 HR allowed since the start of June, and 1 of 3 ML pitchers to do so (KC's Brad Keller, LAA's Tyler Skaggs)**
- Striking Difference:** He is averaging 9.05 SO/9.0 IP (57 SO, 56.2 IP) this season, almost double his average of 4.65 SO/9.0 IP (66 SO, 127.2 IP) from 2016-17 ... He has struck out nearly a quarter of the batters he has faced this season (57 of 233, 24.5 %) ... Prior to this season had never struck out more than 6 in a start (both times with 6 were CG), and this season has struck out 6 or more in 5 of his 10 starts
- RISPy Business:** Has faced 54 batters with RISP this season, and has allowed a hit to only 7 of them (.171 AVG) ... Batters are 3-23 (.130) with RISP in his last 6 starts
- Pick Six:** In the 17 career starts that Eflin has pitched at least 6.0 innings, 16 have been quality starts and he has allowed 1 ER or none in 8 of them
- Increased Velocity:** Per MLBAM Statcast data, has averaged 94.3 mph on his fastball in 2018, topping out at 97.3 mph ... From 2016-17, his fastball averaged 92.8 mph
- vs AL East:** 1-2, 8.16 ERA (13 ER, 14.1 IP) in 3 starts
- vs Interleague:** 1-3, 8.51 ERA (23 ER, 24.1 IP) in 5 starts

HOME:

- 2018:** 3-1, 2.59 ERA (7 ER, 24.1 IP) in 4 starts
- Career:** 4-6, 4.76 ERA (42 ER, 79.1 IP) in 13 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Clubbed his first major league home run on 5/25 vs TOR
- Struck out a career-high 9 batters on 5/7 vs SF ... Needed only 3.2 innings to surpass his previous high of 6 (which he did twice, both in complete games)
- Took a perfect game through 5.0 innings in his 2018 debut, 5/1 at MIA
- Began the season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) before being recalled on 4/30 by PHI (1.69 ERA in 3 starts with LHV)

2017 SEASON:

- Began the season on the 10-day DL recovering from offseason surgery on both knees
- Had a career-best 29.0-inning streak without issuing a walk, 4/18-5/10; longest by a Phillie since 2013-14 (Cliff Lee, 31.0 IP)
- Had 3 straight starts with at least 7.0 IP and no walks, 4/18-5/4
- Was on the 7-day DL, 6/3-7/8 (right elbow strain)
- Placed on the 10-day DL on 8/22 (retro to 8/19) with a right shoulder strain, causing him to miss the remainder of the season
- Posted a 2.81 ERA (10 ER, 32.0 IP) in his first 5 starts of the season and a 9.46 ERA (34 R, 32.1 IP) in his final 6
