PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (63-49) vs ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (63-51)

Tuesday, August 7, 2018 – 9:40 EDT – Chase Field – Game 113 – Road 57

RHP Nick Pivetta (6-9, 4.75) vs RHP Zack Greinke (12-6, 2.96)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies fell to the Arizona Diamondbacks, 3-2, in 14 innings at Chase Field ... Starter Jake Arrieta (ND) was brilliant, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings as he allowed only 3 hits on 2 walks with 4 strikeouts ... Carlos Santana walked twice and Maikel Franco and Odubell Herrera each had two hits.
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to tonight's game, the Phillies recalled **RHP Enyel De Los Santos** from Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... To make room on the 25-man roster, **OF Dylan Cozens** was optioned to Lehigh Valley (AAA) ... Additionally, this afternoon the Texas Rangers claimed **LHP Zac Curtis** off waivers.
- PROGRESS IN THE PROCESS:** Thus far, through 112 games, the Phils are 14 games above .500 at 63-49 and have scored 493 runs and allowed 457 (+36) ... Last season, through 112 games, they were 28 games under .500 at 42-70 and had scored 445 and allowed 540 (-95) ... **The Phillies, only three games shy of matching their entire 2017 win total, didn't notch their 63rd win last season until September 26.**
- SERIESLY:** Over their last 16 series (6/12-current), the Phillies are 11-3-2 ... Philadelphia's three series losses in that span have come against the Yankees at Citizens Bank Park (1-2, 6/25-27), the Marlins in Miami (1-2, 7/13-15) and the Reds in Cincinnati (1-3, 7/26-29) ... Philadelphia's 11 series wins in that span have come against the Rockies, Brewers, Cardinals, Nationals (2x), Orioles (2x), Pirates, Padres, Dodgers and Marlins.
- WALK IT LIKE I TALK IT:** The Phillies boast three players who rank inside the top 15 in walk rate in the majors: **Carlos Santana** (3rd, 17.8 %), **Cesar Hernandez** (12th, 14.2 %) and **Rhys Hoskins** (15th, 14.1%) ... They rank 2nd MLB in walk rate (9.9 %, best: LAD: 10.0 %) and also pitches per plate appearance (4.02, best: LAD, 4.04) and are T-3rd in walks (425), behind only LAD (435) and CHL (428).
- ARMS RACE:** Philadelphia's starting rotation has amassed a National League-best 58 quality starts this season (next: WSH, 54 QS) ... Additionally, the Phils rotation ranks 2nd in FIP (3.57), WHIP (1.19), opponent OBP (.299) & opponent SLG (.385), 3rd in ERA (3.70) & opponent OPS (.683), 4th in innings pitched (629.2) & strikeouts (618) ... Over their last seven starts (since Nola's gem in Boston on 7/30), the Phillies rotation has posted a 1.64 ERA (9 ER, 49.1 IP) with 39 strikeouts to only 6 walks (6.50 SO/BB ratio).
- REMEMBER THE FIGHTINS:** Since starting the season 1-4, the Phillies are 17 games over .500 at 62-45 (.579) and rank 2nd to the Chicago Cubs (.589) for the best winning percentage in the National League since April 5 ... Sunday's win over the Marlins brought the Phillies to 22-21 vs the NL East this season, giving them a .500 record or better against every division in the majors that they have played ... At 63-49 (.563) on the year, the Phillies currently own a 1.0 game lead over the Atlanta Braves for first place in the National League East.
- BELIEVE IT:** On May 29 at Dodger Stadium, facing LA closer Kenley Jansen, **Rhys Hoskins** fouled a ball off his face resulting in a fractured jaw ... Hoskins returned on June 9, and in 228 plate appearances since being activated off the DL, he is slashing .286/.379/.598 with 35 runs, 14 2B, 16 HR, 44 RBI and 29 walks ... The only other player in the majors with as many walks and home runs as Hoskins since June 9, when he came off the DL, is STL's Matt Carpenter (22 HR, 38 BB) ... This season, Hoskins ranks 1st in the NL in pitches per plate appearance (4.44), 7th in RBI (72), 8th in walks (63) and T-10th in homers (22) ... Friday night marked the 150th game of Hoskins' young career ... His .938 career OPS (648 plate appearances) is the second-best mark among all Phillies players dating to 1900, through the first 150 games of a career, trailing only Hall-of-Famer **Chuck Klein** (1.041 OPS) ... Among all players, through their first 150 games with the Phillies, Hoskins has the fourth-best OPS since 1900, trailing only **Lefty O'Doul** (1.080), **Klein** and Hall-of-Famer **Jim Thome** (.956) ... Among all major league players who have made their debut since the year 2000, Hoskins has the eighth-best OPS through 150 games to begin a career ... Hoskins, 25, crushed his 40th career home run in his 149th career game on Thursday night, becoming the 2nd-fastest Phillies player to 40 career home runs (fastest: Klein, 148 G).
- MAIK ON A MISSION:** Since he resumed a full-time role at third base on June 17, **Maikel Franco** has hit .327 (49-150) with eight doubles, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 20 walks to 11 strikeouts, a .373 OBP and .580 SLG % over 161 plate appearances and 42 games ... Since June 17, Franco ranks 7th in the National League in batting and T-10th in home runs ... Among 57 players in the majors with 18 or more home runs this season, Franco's 51 strikeouts are second-fewest, behind only WSH's Matt Adams (50 SO).
- SNAKE BITTEN:** Philadelphia is just 2-9 against the Diamondbacks since the start of last season, and have been outscored 55-32 in those 11 games ... It is their worst record against any team in baseball since the start of 2017 (min. 10 games) ... They have dropped four straight contests at Chase Field.

LAST START: 8/2 vs MIA: ND, 6.0 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 7 SO, HR ... Pivetta vs Lopez ... Dormant for most of the night, minus another Rhys Hoskins dinger, the Phillies offense erupted in the 9th inning ... Hoskins walked, Santana reached on an infield single, Cabrera walked, Nick Williams grounded into a fielder's choice which plated a run and Franco sent CBP into euphoria with a three-run walk-off home run ... It was the Phils first win this season when trailing after 8.0 innings.

TONIGHT'S START:

- **Striking:** Ranks 2nd among NL starters in SO/9.0 IP (11.18) behind only Max Scherzer (12.22), is 5th in SO rate (29.2 %) and is 7th in the NL in strikeouts overall (141) ... In his last 3 starts, Pivetta has 29 strikeouts in 17.1 IP (14.54/9.0 IP) ... He has recorded at least 30 strikeouts in each month of the season so far ... Became 1 of 3 Phillies starters since 1998 to reach 100 strikeouts before 85.0 IP in a season ... His teammate Vince Velasquez also did so this season, and Curt Schilling did so in 1998
- **Walk Away:** Has walked two batters or fewer in each of his last 9 starts ... Has allowed only 2 free passes in his last 17.1 IP ... His 2.58 BB/9.0 IP is far lower than his mark of 3.86 in 2017
- **Right On:** Has held righties to a .224 batting average this season, limiting them to a .188 AVG (18-96) in his last 9 appearances (8 starts) ... Has struck out 81 RHH as opposed to 60 LHH ... RHH have an OPS almost 200 points lower against him (.660) than LHH (.848)
- **FIP Flop:** Pivetta's FIP (fielding independent pitching) of 3.56 is 24th among 73 qualifying starters in MLB ... It is well over a run lower than his FIP in 2017 (4.87), which was 16th-highest among the 97 starters with 130.0 IP or more
- **vs NL West:** 2-7, 6.99 ERA (37 ER, 47.2 IP) in 10 games (10 starts)

ROAD:

- **2018:** 2-4, 5.63 ERA (29 ER, 46.1 IP) in 9 starts
- **Career:** 6-11, 6.24 ERA (80 ER, 109.1 IP) in 24 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Made his first ML relief appearance, 7/1 vs WSH (W, 1.0 IP)
- Struck out a career-high 13 batters on 6/18 vs STL
- Had a streak of 16 straight starts allowing 6 or fewer hits, 9/18/17-6/7/18, becoming 1 of 4 Phillies since 1908 to do so
- Allowed just 1 run in 19.0 IP (0.47 ERA) over 3 starts, 5/16-27, including a 14.0-inning scoreless streak
- Became 3rd PHI pitcher since 2010 with 7.0 + IP, 2 or fewer hits and 11+ strikeouts in a game on 5/16 at BAL (others: Halladay's perfect game, 5/29/10 at FLA and Hamels' no-hitter, 7/25/15 at CHI)
- Matched up against the Braves and RHP Mike Foltynewicz 4 times in PHI's first 46 games, first time two ML starters have squared off 4 times in first 46 team games since 1959 (PHI's Robin Roberts & MIL's Lew Burdette) - Elias
- Had a career-best 4-game win streak come to an end on 4/28 vs ATL ... It was also the end of a string of 9 team wins in 9 straight Pivetta starts since 9/12/17, the longest such streak since PHI won 9 straight Cole Hamels starts in 2012
- His string of 8 straight starts allowing 5 hits or fewer from 9/18/17-4/22/18 was the longest by a Phillies starter since 1994 (David West, 10)
- Did not allow a home run in 41.2 consecutive IP over parts of 8 starts, 9/18/17 vs LAD to 4/22/18 vs PIT
- Struck out 9 batters and did not walk any on 4/11 vs CIN, becoming the first Phillies starter to do so since Vince Velasquez, 4/14/16 vs SD
- Had a career-best 18.0-inning scoreless streak (since 9/18/17) come to an end in the 3rd inning of his season debut, 3/31 at ATL

2017 SEASON:

- Among ML rookies, was 1st in SO/9.0 IP (9.47, min. 125.0 IP), 3rd in SO (140), 4th in starts (26) and 7th in innings (133.0)
- Was tied for the 9th-most SO in a season ever by a Phillies rookie and had the highest SO/9.0 IP and SO rate (24.0%) of any Phillies rookie ever to make at least 25 starts
- Had the most starts (26) in a single season by a Phillies rookie since 1990, when Pat Combs started 31
- Among all NL pitchers (min. 125.0 IP), ranked 4th in lowest % of pitches put in play (15.7), trailing ARI's Robbie Ray (13.7), WSH's Max Scherzer (14.3) and LAD's Rich Hill (14.7)

CAREER:

- Acquired by Philadelphia from WSH for RHP Jonathan Papelbon and cash, 7/28/15 ... Originally selected by WSH in the 4th round of the June 2013 draft ... Attended New Mexico Junior College
- Pitched for Canada in 2017 World Baseball Classic ... Was a member of the Canadian Junior National Team from 2009-12 ... Was the first Canadian-born starting pitcher to debut for the Phillies since 6/17/06 (Scott Mathieson vs TB)
