### DOG DAZE

- The Colorado Rockies continue their seven-game homestand with the first game of a four-game series vs. the Los Angeles Dodgers.
- Beginning today, the Rockies will play 30 of their final 48 games vs. National League West opponents, including 10 vs. the Dodgers and seven against Arizona.
- Colorado is in the midst of a stretch of 17 consecutive games before the next off day on Monday in Houston.

### SQUEAKY CLEAN

- German Márquez pitched an immaculate inning (three strikeouts on nine pitches) in the fourth inning of yesterday vs. Pittsburgh ... it was the second immaculate inning in Rockies history (also: Rex Brothers, June 14, 2014 at San Francisco), the first ever at Coors Field.

### SHE'LL HOLD TOGETHER

- The Rockies have gone 22-12 since June 28 (.647), the third-best winning percentage in MLB and the best winning percentage in the National League.
- Over that span, the Rockies have posted a 3.53 team ERA (303.1 IP, 119 ER), the third-lowest ERA in the NL.
- Rockies starters have a 3.40 ERA (206.1 IP, 78 ER) over that span, the second-lowest in MLB and second-lowest mark in the NL.
- The 653.2 innings pitched by the Colorado starters this season are the third-most in the NL.

### BEGIN AGAIN

- Prior to Tuesday, Colorado had held their opponents to two or fewer runs in five consecutive home games from July 25-Aug. 6, tying for the longest such streak in franchise history (also: July 30-Aug. 11, 2006) ... since July 2, have held opponents to one run or fewer seven times at home, two runs or fewer in 11 games.

### THE MOUNTAINS WIN AGAIN

- Since their eight-game home losing streak ended June 18, the Rockies have gone 17-6 at Coors Field, including 13-4 since July 2 ...suffered their first home series loss since June 22-24 vs. Miami yesterday after dropping two of three games to Pittsburgh ... ended a streak of five home series without a loss (tied a two-game series vs. Houston).
- The Rockies have posted a 2.75 team ERA (154.0

IP, 47 ER) in 17 home games since July 2, including a 2.43 ERA (107.1 IP, 29 ER) by the starting pitchers ... the 1.71 ERA (89.2 IP, 17 ER) posted by the starters in July was the best at home in a single month in franchise history.

- Held opponents to one run or fewer in six games at home in July, two runs or fewer in 10 ... the six games in which they held opponents to one or fewer runs is a franchise record for a calendar month (previous: five in July of 2006).

### GUESS IT'S TIME FOR...

- The Rockies play the Los Angeles Dodgers 19 times this season, including 10 times at home and nine times in L.A. ... they are 3-6 vs. the Dodgers this season ... won their last series in Los Angeles 2-1, June 29-July 1 ... were swept in three games in Colorado, June 1-3, and have a five-game losing streak against the Dodgers at Coors Field dating back to Sept. 30 of last season.
- Among active players, Carlos González is second in home runs against the Dodgers (24), third in runs scored (76), third in RBI (81), tied for third in triples (he and Charlie Blackmon both with four), fourth in hits (133), eighth in slugging percentage (.532), and is tied for eighth in doubles (22).

### PEDAL DOWN

- Of the 15 series remaining in the Rockies' season, all but two series (three games at home, four games in San Diego) against the Padres are against teams currently at .500 or better.

### HOMETOWN KID

- Kyle Freeland's 3.04 ERA (139.0 IP, 47 ER) is the seventh-lowest in the National League and ranks third in MLB (first in NL) among left-handed starters ... 2.18 ERA (62.0 IP, 15 ER) at Coors Field is the fourth-lowest home ERA in the NL.
- Recorded his fourth career game of seven or more shutout innings at Coors Field on Monday vs. Pittsburgh and his second career game in which he went at least seven innings and allowed two or fewer hits ... in 26 career starts at Coors Field, has a 3.08 ERA (146.0 IP, 50 ER).

### HERE'S JONNY

- Jon Gray is 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (29.2 IP, 5 ER) in four starts since his July 14 recall from Triple-A Albuquerque ... has pitched 7.0 or more innings and allowed two or fewer earned runs in each of his four starts, the first Rockies player to have that long of a streak since Ubaldo Jimenez had a seven-start streak in 2010.

### GRAND NAZTY

- On Tuesday, Charlie Blackmon became the seventh Rockie to reach 1,000 hits in a Colorado uniform ... he joins Todd Helton (2,519), Larry Walker (1,361), Carlos González (1,295), Dante Bichette (1,278), Vinny Castilla (1,206) and Troy Tulowitzki (1,165) as the only Rockies to reach the mark.

### SWEET SWINGIN' LEFTY

- Carlos González has batted .324 (69-for-213) since May 27, the seventh-highest batting average in the NL ... ranks tied for fourth in the NL in runs (45) and is tied for fifth in doubles (19) over that span.
- Is hitting .290 (29-for-100) vs. left-handed pitching this season, including .339 (21-for-62) since May 27 ... since July 2, is 12-for-29 (.414) with three home runs vs. left-handed pitching.

### STO SHOW

- Trevor Story ranks third in the NL in extra-base hits (59), ranks fourth in total bases (237), tied for fifth in RBI (79), is sixth in slugging percentage (.550) and is tied for seventh in home runs (24).
- Since June 2, Story ranks third in the NL with a .341 batting average (75-for-220) and fifth with a .623 slugging percentage.

### SANDBLASTER

- Nolan Arenado is currently second in the NL with 29 home runs and ranks third with 81 RBI ... his .304 batting average ranks seventh in the league.

**QUACKS LIKE A DUCK**

- The 28-year-old left-hander will be making his 24th start of the season, his 12th at Coors Field ... was a member of his second career Opening Day roster in his third Major League season ... made his Major League debut on June 12, 2016 vs. San Diego.
- The University of Oregon product was selected as the Rockies' first-round selection (20th overall) in Major League Baseball's 2011 First-Year Player Draft ... was also drafted in '08 by the Minnesota Twins, but did not sign.

**MILLER HEAVY**

- Suffered his first loss since June 23 last Saturday at Milwaukee ... allowed seven runs on seven hits in four innings pitched ... allowed a career-high tying three home runs (second time), including a first inning grand slam to Travis Shaw.

**UP THE SLEEVE**

- Has allowed 11 runs over 10 innings (9.90 ERA) across his last two starts after a streak of five consecutive starts allowing two runs or fewer ... over that span, allowed five runs (four earned) in 35.1 innings (1.02 ERA) ... allowed 17 hits with 11 walks and 35 strikeouts.
- Recorded consecutive outings of eight scoreless innings June 29 at Los Angeles-NL and July 4 vs. San Francisco ... was the third pitcher in franchise history to record consecutive outings of at least eight scoreless innings (also: Ubaldo Jimenez, May 26-31, 2010 and Jason Marquis, June 30-July 6, 2009) ... was the first pitcher in franchise history to accomplish that feat while allowing four or fewer hits in each start ... was the first pitcher in MLB to accomplish the feat since Jake Arrieta, Aug. 30-Sept. 5, 2015.

**STILL DEALING THOUGH**

- In 11 starts since June 7, Anderson is 3-3 with a 3.18 ERA (70.2 IP, 25 ER), the 12th-lowest ERA in the NL ... his 68 strikeouts rank eighth in the NL and .203 opponent batting average is the third-lowest.

**FAMILIAR FOE**

- Has made two starts against the Dodgers this season, going 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0 IP, 5 ER), four walks and 12 strikeouts ... did not factor into the Rockies 11-8 loss to the Dodgers at Coors Field on June 1 (5.0,7,5,5,3,4).
- In nine career starts vs. the Dodgers, has gone 3-3 with a 4.09 ERA (50.2 IP, 23 ER), 19 walks and 41 strikeouts ... his nine starts against Los Angeles are his most against any one team.
- In five career starts vs. the Dodgers at Coors Field, has gone 2-2 with a 4.66 ERA (29.0 IP, 15 ER) ... over his last three starts since the beginning of last season, has gone 0-2 (Rockies 0-3) with 13 runs allowed in 15.2 innings (7.47 ERA).

**OOO**

- Is 4-1 on the road in 12 starts this season, with the Rockies going 7-5 with him on the mound away from Denver ... has a 4.48 road ERA (64.1 IP, 32 ER) with 22 walks and 58 strikeouts.
- In his career, is 7-8 with a 4.83 ERA (145.1 IP, 78 ER), 45 walks and 130 strikeouts in 27 road starts, 28 appearances.

**80205**

- His 3.48 career ERA at Coors Field is the second-lowest all-time among Rockies starting pitchers with at least 25 starts (lowest: Kyle Freeland, 3.23).
- In 31 career appearances in Denver, 30 starts, has worked 186.0 innings, allowing 72 earned runs ... is 10-8 overall at home with the Rockies 14-16 over his 30 starts.
- In 11 starts at Coors Field this year, is 2-3 with a 3.65 ERA (66.2 IP, 27 ER).
- His 3.00 ERA at home in 2016 was the second-lowest home ERA in franchise history (min. 75 innings pitched) behind Jorge De La Rosa's 2.76 home ERA (81.2 IP, 25 ER) in 2013.

**TAKE A FLIER**

- Has the fifth-lowest ground-ball percentage in the National League at 38.8 ... his 131 fly balls are fifth-most in the NL ... induced 141 ground balls with a grounder-to-flies ratio of 1.08 which ranks fifth-lowest in the NL.

**A GIANT ZERO**

- Was the winning pitcher in the Rockies 1-0 win over the Giants at Coors Field on July 4 ... pitched eight scoreless innings for the second consecutive start, allowing two hits with two walks and a season-high tying nine strikeouts.
- Became the fifth pitcher in franchise history to toss at least eight scoreless innings with two or fewer hits at Coors Field, joining Kyle Freeland (2017), Chad Bettis (2016), Jeff Francis (2006) and Shawn Chacon (2003).

**THE NOT SO DISTANT PAST**

- In 15 starts and two relief appearances in 2017, went 6-6 with a 4.81 ERA (86.0 IP, 46 ER) ... the two relief appearances were the first of his professional career.
- Was 5-6 with a 5.11 ERA (81.0 IP, 46 ER) as a starter, 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (5.0 IP, 0 ER) in his two relief appearances.
- Had two separate stints on the 10-day disabled list and one stint on the 60-day DL ... placed on the 10-day DL on June 4 with left knee inflammation ... reinstated on June 22 but made just two appearances (one start) before being placed on the disabled list again on June 26 ... underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on July 3 and was transferred to the 60-day DL on July 26.

**JUST A TASTE**

- Pitched one inning of relief in the National League Wild Card Game at Arizona ... entered the game in the third inning and allowed two runs on two hits with one strikeout ... allowed a two-run home run to Daniel Descalso.
