HERE'S THE STORY...

- ♦ Arizona is 8-5 in its last 13 games vs. Milwaukee @ Chase Field.
- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 15-1 with a 2.63 ERA (43 ER in 147.1 IP) in 23 starts @ Chase Field since 2017.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has a 6-game hitting streak (.381; 8-for-21).
- ♦ **Jimmie Sherry** has not allowed a run in his first 13 Major League appearances dating back to 2017 (SEE NOTE).
- ♦ The D-backs have lost 6 straight games, their longest losing streak since also dropping 6 in a row from Sept. 5-11, 2016.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- ♦ The D-backs lost the series opener to Brewers, 7-2.
- ♦ **Patrick Corbin** was dealt his first loss of the season, allowing 4 runs on 6 hits with 8 strikeouts in 6.0 innings.
- ♦ **Steven Souza Jr.** (2-for-4, RBI) collected his second multi-hit game with Arizona.
- ♦ **A.J. Pollock** was removed from the game in the ninth inning after suffering a left thumb injury.

ROSTER MOVES

- ♦ Prior to tonight's game, the D-backs placed **A.J. Pollock** on the 10-day disabled list (left thumb avulsion fracture) and recalled **Christian Walker** from Triple-A Reno.
- ♦ Walker has split the season between the D-backs and Aces, hitting .133 (2-for-15) with 1 homer and 2 RBI in 15 games with Arizona and .286 (24-for-49) with 4 doubles, 2 homers and 9 RBI in 13 games with Reno.

ZACK ATTACK

- ♦ **Zack Greinke** has gone 15-1 with a 2.63 ERA (43 ER in 147.1 IP) in 23 starts @ Chase Field since 2017, the most home wins and best home winning pct. (.938) in the Majors in that time, and the seventh-best ERA:
 - **MOST HOME WINS SINCE 2017: 15 – Zack Greinke**, 14 – Corey Kluber, Charlie Morton & Aaron Nola; **13 – Patrick Corbin**.
 - **BEST HOME WINNING PCT. SINCE 2017: .938 – Zack Greinke (15-1)**; .875 – Corey Kluber (14-2); .824 – Charlie Morton (14-3); .800 – CC Sabathia (8-2); .769 – Jose Berrios (10-3).

THE BREW MASTER

- ♦ **Paul Goldschmidt** is a career .392 hitter with 9 home runs and 31 RBI in 41 games vs. Brewers, ranking among the top active players against Milwaukee in OPS, average and slugging pct.:

GETTING DEFENSIVE

- ♦ The D-backs lead the Major Leagues with a .992 fielding pct., ahead of the Astros (.991), Rockies (.990) and Angels (.990).
- ♦ Arizona also leads all of baseball with a 18.3 Defensive Runs Above Average, which measures a player's defensive value relative to league average:
 - **MLB DEF Leaders [source: FanGraphs.com]: 18.3 – D-backs**; 17.0 – Cubs; 14.4 – Indians; 10.6 – Brewers; 9.9 – Brewers.
- ♦ The D-backs, who have the fewest errors in the Majors (12), have not committed a miscue in their last 7 games and just 1 over their last 12.

GREINKE AT A GLANCE

- ◆ Third season with the D-backs...signed a 6-year free agent contract on Dec. 11, 2015.
- ◆ Won the 2009 AL Cy Young Award and finished runner-up in 2015 race to the Cubs' Jake Arrieta.
- ◆ Is a 4-time All-Star (2009, '14-15, '17), won 3 NL Rawlings® Gold Gloves (2014-16) and earned a Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger™ in 2013.
- ◆ 1 of 3 pitchers all-time with a Cy Young, Silver Slugger and Gold Glove (also: Fernando Valenzuela and Orel Hershiser).
- ◆ Won 2 ERA titles: 2009 (2.16) & 2015 (1.66)...1.66 ERA was the lowest in the Majors since Atlanta's Greg Maddux (1.63) in 1995...6 career 200+ strikeout seasons (2009, '11-12, '14-15, '17).

DID YOU KNOW?

- ◆ Gave his 2009 AL Cy Young Award to his parents but kept the samurai sword Mizuno presented him in recognition of his season.
- ◆ Was a tennis prodigy at 8 years old.
- ◆ Began his career at Rookie level as a shortstop and pitcher...after just 1 workout, he gave his infielder glove to Andres Blanco because he decided to become a pitcher.
- ◆ During his 2004 rookie season with the Royals, lived with Hall of Famer George Brett.

LAST START

- ◆ Worked 7.0 innings with 1 run but did not figure in a 2-1, 11-inning loss vs. Astros on May 10.
- ◆ Third D-backs pitcher with a hit, RBI and stolen base in a game (also: Joe Saunders on Sept. 4, 2010 @ Astros and Braden Shipley on Aug. 11, 2016 @ Mets).

CLIMBING THE K CHARTS

- ◆ Ranks 54th on the all-time strikeout list and needs 4 strikeouts to tie Dwight Gooden (53rd, 2,293), 5 to match John Lackey (52nd, 2,294) and 14 to tie Juan Marichal (51st, 2,303).
- ◆ His 2,283 career strikeouts are seventh among active pitchers behind C.C. Sabathia (2,874), Justin Verlander (2,493), Bartolo Colon (2,483), Felix Hernandez (2,387), John Lackey (2,294).

BREW CREW TIES

- ◆ Pitched for the Brewers in 2011-12...in 49 starts, went 25-9 with a 3.67 ERA (120 ER in 294.2 IP), a .248 opponent average and 323 strikeouts.
- ◆ Acquired by the Brewers from the Royals on December 19, 2010, in a 6-player trade that included Lorenzo Cain.
- ◆ Traded by the Brewers to the Angels on July 27, 2012, for INF Jean Segura and 2 other players.

PLAYER PROFILE

- ◆ Is an avid fantasy football player.
- ◆ 2002 Gatorade National Baseball Player of the Year...played shortstop at Apopka (Fla.) High School before transitioning to starting pitcher his senior season.
- ◆ Committed to Clemson University before signing with the Royals.
- ◆ Donates 1% of his annual salary to the Arizona Diamondbacks Foundation.

VS. BREWERS

- ◆ In his last 3 starts, is 1-1 with a 2.50 ERA (5 ER in 18.0 IP), a .143 opponent average (9-for-63) and 19 strikeouts.
- ◆ In 6 career games (5 starts), is 1-3 with a 4.20 ERA (14 ER in 30.0 IP), a .234 opponent average (26-for-111) and 28 strikeouts.

VS. NL CENTRAL

- ◆ In his last 8 starts, is 4-2 with a 3.86 ERA (22 ER in 51.1 IP), a .236 opponent average and 56 strikeouts.

HOME SWEET HOME

- ◆ Has held opponents to 1 run or less in 4 of 5 home starts...is 2-0 with a 1.72 ERA (6 ER in 31.1 IP), a .184 opponent average (21-for-114), 32 strikeouts and 0.92 WHIP.
- ◆ Among all pitchers at home since the start of 2017, he is first with 15 wins, third with 163 strikeouts and a 0.92 WHIP, sixth with a 2.63 ERA and ninth with a .204 opponent average.
- ◆ In 23 home starts (16 quality) since 2017, is 15-1 with a 2.63 ERA (43 ER in 147.1 IP), a .204 opponent average (109-for-535) and 163 strikeouts.

FREE PASSES AT A MINIMUM

- ◆ His 6 walks are tied for eighth fewest by a NL starter (min. 3 GS) [leaders are Miles Mikolas/STL (3) and Ross Stripling/LAD (3)].
- ◆ Since 2017, his 51 walks are tied for fifth fewest by a starter (min. 35 GS), with Masahiro Tanaka, behind Ivan Nova (44), Corey Kluber (46), Jeff Samardzija (47) and Alex Cobb (50).
- ◆ Has 53 strikeouts and 6 walks (8.83), the Major's second-best strikeout-to-walk ratio, behind Miles Mikolas/STL (11.67, 35:3).

MAY NUMBERS

- ◆ In 12 May starts as a D-back, is 8-2 with a 3.21 (29 ER in 81.1 IP), a .206 opponent average (61-for-296), 14 walks and 83 strikeouts.

 - ◆ Is 11-for-12 in save chances with a 0.75 ERA (1 ER in 12.0 IP).
 - ◆ 7 of his last 8 games have been scoreless (1.13 ERA; 1 ER in 8.0 IP).
 - ◆ Registered at least 1 strikeout in 20 of his last 22 outings dating back to 2017.
 - ◆ In 2017, in 30 games, went 4-4 with a 3.38 ERA and 40 strikeouts (12.27 SO/9.0 IP).

 - ◆ His 9 holds in March/April tied the D-backs record for the month (Chad Qualls, 2008).
 - ◆ Went 3-3 with 1 save, a 1.73 ERA, 79 strikeouts and a .207 opponents average in 63 games in 2017, his first season as a reliever.

- ◆ Owns a 1.59 ERA (2 ER in 11.1 IP) over his last 17 games.
 - ◆ Has allowed just 1 extra-base hit to his last 47 lefties faced since Aug. 21, 2017 (32 G).
 - ◆ In 2017, posted career highs in appearances (71) and strikeouts (61).

- ◆ 13 of his last 15 outings have been scoreless (2.45 ERA; 3 ER in 11.0 IP).

 - ◆ In 2017, led Majors with a 3.0 inherited runners scored pct. (1 IRS/33 IR), tied for the lowest pct. since 1974 (also: Wilton Lopez/HOU in 2010).

 - ◆ 11 of his last 13 outings have been scoreless (2.25 ERA; 3 ER in 12.0 IP).
 - ◆ Earned his first Major League win on April 8 vs. Cardinals.
 - ◆ Led Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball League in saves (40) in 2014 and earned Most Valuable Middle Reliever honors in 2011...played 12 seasons (2006-17) with Orix, going 48-69 with 156 saves, a 3.10 ERA in 549 appearances (68 starts).

Homestand: 0 ER/3.0 IP, 2 K
- ◆ **NL RANKINGS (RELIEVERS):** T-1st in IP (25.2).
 - ◆ Boasts a 1.54 ERA (4 ER in 23.1 IP) over his last 9 outings.
 - ◆ Has 3 outings this season of 4.0+ innings, tied with Zeke Spruill (2014) for the most such game by a reliever in team history, behind Josh Collmenter in 2013 (4).
 - ◆ Career-high 77 pitches on April 29 @ Nationals, while his 4.2 innings were 1 out shy of matching his career high (2x, last: April 22, 2016 @ Royals).
 - ◆ Ranked among NL relief leaders in 2017 in groundball pct. (1st, 69.8) and groundball/flyball ratio (2nd, 4.88).

 - ◆ Career-high-tying 3.0 innings April 3 vs. Dodgers (also: April 20, 2011 vs. Nationals).
 - ◆ In 2017, pitched in 48 games with the Mets (released Aug. 15)...signed with the Angels on Aug. 19 and went 1-0 with a 2.63 ERA and 0.66 WHIP in 13 games.
