Since April 27, Wade LeBlanc is 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (6 ER, 33.1 IP) in his last 7 games, 6 starts...during this stretch his 1.62 ERA is the T5th-lowest ERA in the Majors (along with Jeremy Hellickson-WAS), trailing Jacob deGrom-NYM (0.67), Justin Verlander-HOU (1.13), Sean Newcomb-ATL (1.32) and teammate James Paxton (1.60).

The Mariners have not committed an error in 13 consecutive games (5/23-c)...during this span, the Mariners have successfully converted 508 total chances (369 putouts, 139 assists).

VS. HOUSTON

The Mariners and Astros meet for the 6th of 19 games this season (2-3)...these two clubs will meet 10 times at Safeco Field this season and 9 times at Minute Maid Park...since 2013, the Mariners are 32-14 (.696) when scoring at least 4 runs vs. the Astros.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue 6-day, 6-game road trip covering over 5,600 miles with the final of a 2-game series with Houston (1-0)...also includes a 4-game series in Tampa Bay before returning home to Seattle on June 11...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 5 straight...have also won 9 of their last 11 games, 14 of their last 17 games and 16 of their last 21...Seattle is 24-11 in its last 35 games, 29-14 over its last 43 games and 34-18 in its last 52 games...Seattle is 12-10 during the day and 26-12 at night...Seattle is 20-12 at Safeco Field, 18-10 on the road.

- **Extra, Extra!** - the Mariners are 6-0 in extra-inning games this season...tied with Texas (6) for the ML-lead in extra-inning wins.
- **Walk it Off** - the Mariners are tied with the Yankees for 3rd-most walk-off wins in the ML, trailing only the Cardinals (7) and Braves (6)...each of the Mariners 5 walk-off wins has come during extra-innings.
- **Bullpen Bully** - over his last 7 outings (5/18-c), **Juan Nicasio** has retired 26-of-29 batters faced...during that span, he has allowed only 3 hits (.103/3x29) while striking out 16 without issuing a walk...he has struck out 16 of the 29 batters he has faced, including 14-of-the-last-20, dating back to May 26.
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - **Jean Segura** is tied for the Major League lead with 26 multi-hit games, along with Nicholas Castellanos-DET and Nick Markakis-ATL...Segura is also tied for the ML lead with 11 games of 3+ hits (also: Nicholas Castellanos-DET).
- **Eight is Great** - **Ben Gamel** has hit safely in a season-high 8 games (5/24-c), batting .429 (12x28) with 4 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 HBP, 1 walk and 2 stolen bases.
- **Welcome to Seattle** - Since joining the Mariners on May 27, **Alex Colomé** has appeared in 4 of the Mariners 9 games, including recording the save in his Mariners debut on April 27 vs. MIN...overall he has retired 13 of 15 batters faced (1 H, 1 HBP) while striking out 4 over 4.0 scoreless innings.
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 26-7 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-15 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **That was Close** - the Mariners are 18-9 (.667) in one-run games this season, the most one-run wins and one-run decisions in the Majors.

HIGH WATER MARK...the Mariners are a season-high 16 games over .500 at 38-22...with a win tonight, Seattle would be 17 games over .500 for the first time since being 73-56 (.566) after game #129 of the 2007 season...marks the 7th season in club history to be at least 15 games over .500 at any point in a season.

HOT START...Seattle is 38-22 (.633) through its first 60 games of the season, its 3rd-best record in club history, trailing only 2001 (47-13/.783) and 2003 (41-19/.683)...the Mariners currently have a +2.0 lead over the Astros in the American League West...the last time the Mariners led the AL West outright after May was at the end of play on Aug. 24, 2003.

ROAD HOMERS...since 2015, **Nelson Cruz** (75) and **Kyle Seager** (60) have combined to hit 135 home runs on the road...Cruz's 75 road home runs since 2015 lead all Major League players, while Seager ranks T7th...during this stretch as a team, the Mariners have hit 352 home runs on the road, trailing only the Toronto Blue Jays (377), the Houston Astros (360), the Tampa Bay Rays (358) and the New York Mets (357) for most home runs on the road...Cruz (12) and Seager (9) have combined for 21 career home runs at Minute Maid Park.

AS THE STARTING PITCHING GOES...since May 16, the Mariners starters are 9-1 (team is 14-5 overall) with a 2.09 ERA (29 ER, 124.2 IP) with 96 strikeouts and 27 walks in 19 games...Seattle **starters** lead the Major Leagues in ERA during that span, ranking ahead of Tampa Bay (2.57/21 ER, 73.2 IP) and St. Louis (2.64/33 ER, 112.1 IP)...the 124.2 innings pitched by Mariners **starters** are the most in the Majors since May 16...during this same stretch the Mariners relievers are 5-4 with 8 saves and a 2.11 ERA (13 ER, 55.1 IP), including allowing only 1 run (1 ER) over the last 14.2 innings in relief (5/31-c).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...the Mariners will play 15 of the next 22 games and 21 of the final 37 games before the All-Star break on the road...since April 24, the Mariners have won 12 of their last 17 road games...during this stretch the Mariners .706 winning percentage is the 3rd-highest in the Major Leagues, trailing only the Washington Nationals (14-5/.737) and the New York Yankees (13-5/.722)...overall this season the Mariners are 18-10 (.643) on the road, trailing only the Boston Red Sox (21-11/.656), the Washington Nationals (21-11/.656) and the New York Yankees (17-9/.654) and tied with the Los Angeles Angels (18-10/.643) for best road winning percentage in the Majors.

RIBBIES...Seattle boasts 2 of the top-10 players in the Major Leagues in RBI on the road this season...**Kyle Seager** ranks T3rd in the Majors with 25 road RBI, while **Mitch Haniger** ranks T10th with 21 RBI.

DRAFTY...the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft concludes today with rounds 11-40...Mariners selected RHP **Logan Gilbert** (Stetson University) with the 14th overall (1st round) pick and OF **Josh Stowers** (University of Louisville) with the 54th overall (2nd round) pick on Monday.

NO FREE PASSES...**James Pazos** has not issued a walk since his first appearance of the season on April 4, a span of 22 appearances without a walk...Pazos' streak of 22 consecutive games without issuing a walk is the 2nd-longest streak of games without a walk among Major League **relievers** this season...Kansas City's Kelvin Herrera has an active streak of 24 straight games without issuing a walk, dating back to the beginning of the season...Pazos' streak is the 2nd-longest by a **reliever** in club history, trailing only Charlie Furbush, who did not walk a batter in 26 straight outings, May 20 - July 29, 2014.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Nelson Cruz** (.393/11x28, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 2 BB), **Jean Segura** (.323/10x31, 2 2B, 2 3B, HR, 13 RBI) and **Kyle Seager** (.321/9x28, 5 2B, 2 HR, 14 RBI, 4 BB) have combined to hit .344 (30x87) with 7 doubles, 2 triples, 5 home runs, 41 RBI and 6 walks with RISP and 2 outs this season...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners trio each ranks in the top-10 in the American League with RISP and 2 outs (min 25 PA)?...Cruz's .393 average with RISP and 2 outs ranks 2nd in the AL, trailing only J.D. Martinez (.417/10x24)...Segura and Seager rank 8th and 9th respectively among AL leaders.

ABOUT LEBLANC...

- 33-year-old left-hander is making his 12th appearance and 7th start of the season, his 188th career appearance, 86th career start and 3rd start (7th appearance) vs. Houston tonight.
- Signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
- Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L,4,0,8,5,3,1,HR-2).
- Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (*Baseball America*) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
- Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
- Is 3-7 with a 5.25 ERA (43 ER, 73.2 IP) in 27 career G/11 GS in June.

LAST OUTING...earned his first win of the season in a 6-1 Mariners win vs. Texas on May 31...allowed 1 run on 4 hits and 2 walks while striking out 4 batters across 5.0 innings...sole run came on a home run by Nomar Mazara to lead off the 4th inning...escaped a bases-loaded jam in the 4th inning; retired the side in order in the 5th inning.

START IT UP...in 14 career starts with the Mariners, is 4-0 with a 3.32 ERA (28 ER, 76.0 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 15 walks...the Mariners are 12-2 in his 14 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

AS A RELIEVER...is 0-0 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER, 13.2 IP) in 5 relief appearances this season...tossed a season-high 4.2 innings of relief in a 4-10 Mariners loss on April 23 at Chicago-AL...limited the White Sox to 2 runs on 6 hits while striking out 6 after entering the game with the Mariners trailing 0-8 in the 4th inning.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request.

NICE TO SEE YOU AGAIN...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibañez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

SPRING TRAINING...was 0-1 with a 5.27 ERA (8 ER, 13.2 IP) and 10 strikeouts and 1 walk in 7 Grapefruit League appearances with New York-AL...held opponents to 1 earned run or fewer in 5 of his 7 appearances, including 2 outings with 0 earned runs.

2017 SEASON...went 5-2 with 1 save and 4 holds in 50 appearances (0 starts) with a 4.50 ERA (34 ER, 68.0 IP), 54 strikeouts and 17 walks with Pittsburgh...held right-handed batters to a .217 (38x175) batting average against with a .270 on-base percentage and a .389 slugging percentage (.658 OPS against).

LAST TIME AROUND...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...was 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP), 34 strikeouts and 5 quality starts in 8 starts with the Mariners...held opponents scoreless in 2 of his 3 relief appearances...went 0-0-1 with a 5.06 ERA (3 ER, 5.1 IP) with 7 strikeouts in 3 relief appearances.

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE...in his Mariners debut on June 24, 2016, LeBlanc made his first Major League appearance since Sept. 28, 2014 at Seattle with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 634 days between appearances...LeBlanc made his first ML start since Sept. 23, 2014 at Oakland with Los Angeles-AL, a span of 639 days between starts.

FIRST SEATTLE WIN...earned his first win with Seattle on July 1, 2016, vs. Baltimore (6.0,3,2,2,1,5,HR-1), his first Major League win since Sept. 23, 2014, with the Angels at the A's, a span of 646 days between Major League wins.

IN JAPAN...spent the 2015 season with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League...went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts...tossed his second career complete game on April 2, 2015 at Rakuten Golden Eagles, allowing 2 earned runs on 2 hits 9.0 innings (also: 4/25/14 at Reno w/Salt Lake).

CAREER...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP)...overall, is 31-35-3 with a 4.27 ERA (295 ER, 620.1 IP) in 187 career appearances/85 starts...in 85 career starts, is 23-31 with a 4.36 ERA (223 ER, 460.1 IP) with 317 strikeouts and 153 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks.

30-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season tomorrow vs. Tampa Bay...is 2-0 with a 2.91 ERA (11 ER, 34.0 IP), 21 strikeouts and 1 walk over his last 5 games...has not walked a batter in his last 4 starts...did not factor into the decision in his last start, a 4-3, 13-inning Mariners win on 6/1 vs. Tampa Bay (7.0,6,2,2,0,8,HR-2)...**SPRING TRAINING:** went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA (14 ER, 23.1 IP) in 6 starts during Spring Training...**2017:** Went 10-13 with a 3.92 ERA (81 ER, 186.0 IP) in 31 starts combined between St. Louis (4/7-8/26) and Seattle (9/1-24)...went 3-1 with a 2.53 ERA (9 ER, 32.0 IP) in 5 starts with the Mariners after being acquired by Seattle on Aug. 30...**CAREER:** In 9 Major League seasons with Cincinnati (2010-15), San Francisco (2015), St. Louis (2016-17) and Seattle (2017-c), is 88-80 with a 4.02 ERA (678 ER, 1519.0 IP) with 1,032 strikeouts and 358 walks in 250 career games (245 starts)...is 1 of 4 pitchers to make at least 30 starts in every season from 2012-17 (also: Ian Kennedy, Jon Lester and Max Scherzer)...originally signed by Cincinnati with the 8th overall pick of the 2009 MLB Draft out of Arizona State University...**vs. TB:** Is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (6 ER, 20.0 IP) with 14 strikeouts and 2 walks in 3 career starts vs. the Rays...did not factor into the decision in last start vs. the Rays on June 1 (7.0,6,2,2,0,8,HR-2).
