TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7-day, 7-game homestand with the finale (2-0) of three games vs. the Los Angeles Angels...will also face the Boston Red Sox for a four-game series beginning tomorrow... Seattle recently wrapped a 6-day, 6-game road trip, going 4-2 vs. the Astros (1-1) and Rays (3-1)...today's game will be televised exclusively on Facebook Watch and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have won 10 of their last 12 games, 14 of their last 18, 19 of their last 24 and 21 of their last 28...Seattle is 29-13 in its last 42 games, 34-16 over its last 50 games and 39-20 in its last 59 games...Seattle is 13-11 during the day and 31-12 at night...Seattle is 22-12 at Safeco Field, 21-12 on the road.

- **Hottest Team in Baseball** - the Mariners are 24-10 (.706) since May 8, the best record in the Major Leagues during that span...they lead New York (.679/19-9), Houston (.677/21-10), Chicago-NL (.656/21-11) and Milwaukee (.625/20-12) over that time.
- **Balanced Success** - the Mariners are 22-12 at Safeco Field and 21-12 on the road this season...they are one of 3 Major League clubs with at least 20 wins at home and at least 20 wins on the road this season... Boston has 23 wins at home and 23 wins on the road, while New York-AL has 23 wins at home and 20 wins on the road.
- **How Sweep It Is** - with a win today, the Mariners would secure their 14th sweep of the Angels in club history (min. 3-game series)...Seattle's last sweep of the Halos was Sept. 12-14, 2016 in Anaheim...the Mariners last sweep of the Angels at Safeco Field was Aug. 5-7, 2016.
- **Batter Up** - Jean Segura is batting .342 (92x269), 2nd-best in the Majors, trailing Mookie Betts-BOS (.354/67x189)...Segura's 92 hits are also 2nd-most in MLB, behind Jose Altuve-HOU (93).
- **Happy Totals** - since June 4, the Mariners are averaging 5.00 runs per game (40 R, 8 G), posting a record of 6-2...from May 20 to June 3, the Mariners averaged 3.36 runs per game (47 R, 14 G); the Mariners went 11-3 during that span.
- **Three Up, Three Down** - of Edwin Díaz's 25 saves this season, 23 have been 1.0-inning outings...Díaz has faced the minimum 3 batters in 14 of his 23 saves of 1.0 innings, the 2nd-most such outings in the Majors this season, behind Craig Kimbrel-BOS (15).
- **Multi-Hit Madness** - Jean Segura leads the Major Leagues with 30 multi-hit games, ahead of Nick Markakis-ATL (28), Jose Altuve-HOU (26) and Nicholas Castellanos-DET (26)...Segura leads the Majors with 13 games of 3+ hits, ahead of Castellanos (11).
- **Four Score** - Seattle is 31-8 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but 12-16 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- **Series Stuff** - the Mariners have won or tied 20 of their first 23 series, posting a series record of 15-3-5.
- **It's a Dee Thing** - the Mariners are 13-1 when Dee Gordon starts at second base this season.

DO I HEAR TWENTY?...the Mariners are a season-high 19 games over .500 at 43-24...marks the first time the Mariners have been 19 games over .500 since being 73-54 after game #127 on Aug. 25, 2007...with a win today, the Mariners would improve to 20 games over .500 for first time since being 73-53 after game #126 on Aug. 24, 2007.

HOME COOKING...the Mariners have won 13 of their last 15 games at Safeco Field, dating back to May 18, including an active 6-game home winning streak (5/31-c)...since May 18, Mariners pitchers have allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in 13 of 15 home games for a 2.44 ERA (39 ER, 144.0 IP)...overall this season, Seattle is 22-12 (.647) at Safeco Field, the 4th-best home winning percentage in the Major Leagues, behind New York-AL (.719/23-9), Boston (.676/23-11) and Philadelphia (.656/21-11)...Mariners pitchers have combined for a 3.44 ERA (122 ER, 319.0 IP) at home, which ranks 9th-lowest in the Majors.

JUNE BOON...the Mariners are off to a 9-2 start in the month of June...the club is batting .259 (97x375) for the month with 21 home runs, 49 RBI, 27 walks, a .314 on-base percentage and a .461 slugging percentage (.776 OPS), while averaging 4.5 runs-per-game (49 R, 11 G)...Seattle's pitching staff has combined for a 3.12 ERA (35 ER, 101.0 IP) with 90 strikeouts and 21 walks...Mariners starters are 8-1 with a 2.97 ERA (23 ER, 69.2 IP) in the month of June...among all clubs in the month of June, Mariners hitters rank 2nd in home runs, 5th in slugging, 6th in OPS, 8th in batting...Mariners starters lead the Majors in innings pitched in the month of June with 69.2 while also ranking 4th in starter ERA; overall, the club is 7th in team ERA in June...the Mariners and Diamondbacks are tied for the best record in the month of June.

WINS TO GO AROUND...the Mariners are one of two Major League clubs with a quartet of pitchers with at least 6 wins apiece...Marco Gonzales and Mike Leake lead the Mariners with 7 wins each, followed by Félix Hernández (6) and James Paxton (6)...the other club with four pitchers with at least 6 wins each is the Houston Astros: Lance McCullers Jr. (8), Justin Verlander (8), Gerrit Cole (7) and Charlie Morton (7).

WHAT CHANNEL IS THE GAME ON?...today's game will be televised exclusively on Facebook Watch, as chosen by Major League Baseball...as such, it's available exclusively on Facebook Watch, 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network (it is NOT available on ROOT SPORTS)...it is one of 25 MLB games this season to be distributed exclusively on Facebook Watch...the game will be produced by the MLB Network featuring Rich Waltz on the call with a pair of former Mariners left-handers handling color commentary: Ryan Rowland-Smith and Mark Langston (also spent 8 years with the Angels)... Elise Woodward will be the field reporter...fans can watch the game on their desktop, mobile device or by streaming it to their TV.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...Edwin Díaz leads the Major Leagues with 25 saves and ranks 2nd among Major League relievers with 58 strikeouts...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?...**that only 6 pitchers in Major League history (done 8x) have recorded 25 saves and 60 strikeouts prior to the All-Star Break?...Eric Gagne accomplished this feat in 2002 and 2003 with Los Angeles-NL and Craig Kimbrel did so with Atlanta in 2011 and 2014, while Robb Nen-SF (1998), Billy Wagner-HOU (2003), Jason Grilli-PIT (2013) and Kenley Jansen-LAD (2014) have each done so on one occasion...with 2 more strikeouts, Díaz would become the 7th pitcher in Major League history with 25 saves and 60 strikeouts before the All-Star Break and the first to do so in the American League.

ABOUT GONZALES...

- 26-year-old left-hander is making his 14th start of season, 35th career appearance (27th start) and 4th career start vs. Los Angeles-AL.
- Acquired by Seattle from St. Louis in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill on July 21, 2017.
- Native of Fort Collins, CO...attended Gonzaga University for 3 seasons (2011-13).
- Originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program.
- Made his MLB debut with Cardinals June 25, 2014 at Colorado.
- Went 2-1 with a 4.50 ERA (3 ER, 6.0 IP) with 4 strikeouts and 2 walks with St. Louis in the 2014 postseason...earned 2 wins in the NLDS vs. Los Angeles, becoming the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002).

LAST OUTING...won his 4th consecutive game, allowing 2 runs on 5 hits and 0 walks while striking out 3 across a career-high 7.1 innings pitched...held the Rays scoreless until giving up a solo home run to Christian Arroyo in the 5th inning...with one out in the 8th inning, allowed a single to Mallex Smith before being relieved by Alex Colomé; the run would come around to score, bringing Gonzales' total to 2.

SETTLING IN...in 7 starts since May 1, Gonzales has posted a 2.18 ERA (11 ER, 45.1 IP), the 7th best mark in the American League (15th overall)...his 0.81 ERA (3 ER, 33.1 IP) since May 15 leads ML starters...posted a 5.02 ERA (16 ER, 28.2 IP) in 6 starts in April.

GAS IN THE TANK...has pitched 6.0-or-more innings in 8 of his last 9 starts and 9 of his 13 starts overall this season...is 6-1 with a 2.04 ERA (13 ER, 57.1 IP) with 14 walks and 43 strikeouts in his last 9 outings...prior to 2018, Gonzales had only reached the 6.0 inning mark in 1 start, on Aug. 30, 2014 vs. Chicago-NL with St. Louis (6.0,3,1,1,2,5).

UNDER PRESSURE...is 3-2 with a 2.58 ERA (11 ER, 38.1 IP) in 7 starts this season in which he has received 2 or fewer runs of support, holding opponents to a .260 average (38x146) and allowing 1 home run in those 7 outings...in 5 starts when receiving 3 or more runs of support, Gonzales is 4-1 with a 4.04 ERA (16 ER, 35.2 IP), with opponents batting .274 (37x135) with 5 home runs...Gonzales has started in 10 games decided by 2 or fewer runs this season, collecting a 6-1 record in those starts (team is 8-2 in those 9 games).

2017 SEASON RECAP...went 1-1 with a 6.08 ERA (27 ER, 40.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 11 walks in 11 games (8 starts)...was acquired from STL on 7/21/17 in exchange for minor league outfielder Tyler O'Neill...posted a 5.40 ERA (22 ER, 36.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts and 11 walks in 10 games (7 starts) with Seattle.

2017 AAA RECAP...combined for 13 AAA starts last season, 11 with AAA Memphis in the Cardinals organization and 2 with AAA Tacoma after being acquired by the Mariners...was 8-4 with a 3.14 ERA (28 ER, 80.1 IP) with 66 strikeouts and 22 walks in 13 combined starts...went 6-4 with a 2.90 ERA (22 ER, 68.1 IP) with 57 strikeouts and 17 walks in 11 starts with Memphis...was 2-0 with a 4.50 ERA (6 ER, 12.0 IP) with 9 strikeouts and 5 walks in 2 starts with Tacoma.

BULLDOG ROOTS...played 3 seasons (2011-13) with the Gonzaga Bulldogs, compiling a career record of 26-7 with a 2.34 ERA while recording 9 complete games and 4 shutouts...tallied 278 strikeouts over 303.2 innings of work...became the highest draft pick in the history of the Gonzaga baseball program when he was selected 19th overall by St. Louis in 2013...shared West Coast Conference Player of the Year honors with the Cubs' Kris Bryant (University of San Diego) as a freshman in 2011 and as a junior in 2013...in 2013, earned John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year honors as well as WCC Co-Player of the Year for the 2nd time in his career.

POSTSEASON GLORY...added to the Cardinals roster for the 2014 National League Division Series vs. Los Angeles-NL...made 3 appearances in the NLDS, going 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk...picked up the wins in Game 1 and Game 4 vs. the Dodgers...became the 4th rookie in postseason history to win 2 games in the Division Series (also: Dave Righetti-NYY, 1981, Jaret Wright-CLE, 1997 and Francisco Rodriguez-LAA, 2002)...in the 2014 NLCS vs. San Francisco, went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (3 ER, 3.0 IP) with 2 strikeouts and 1 walk in 3 appearances.

ML CAREER...in parts of 4 Major League seasons with St. Louis (2014-15, 2017) and Seattle (2017-c), is 12-6 with a 4.40 ERA (74 ER, 151.1 IP) with 126 strikeouts and 50 walks in 35 games (27 starts)...originally selected by Colorado in the 29th round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Rocky Mountain High School (Fort Collins, CO) but did not sign...drafted and signed by the Cardinals with the 19th overall pick in the 2013 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga University.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP FÉLIX HERNÁNDEZ (6-5, 5.70 ERA)

32-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his 390th Major League start tomorrow vs. Boston...has tossed 5.0+ innings and allowed 3 or fewer earned runs in 8 of his 14 starts this season...L#5 in his last start, a 3-7 Mariners loss on 6/9 at TB (3.0,7,6,5,1,2); marked his shortest outing of the season...W#1 on Opening Day, a 2-1 Mariners win, on March 29 vs. CLE (5.1,2,0,0,2,4); was 11th Opening Day start, building on Mariners record...**SPRING TRAINING:** in 2 Cactus League starts, compiled a record of 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA (2 ER, 5.0 IP) with 5 strikeouts and 1 walk...Félix exited his first spring start after 1.1 inning on 2/26 at CHC after being hit by a line drive on right forearm (1.1,1,1,1,0,2)...allowed 1 R over 3.0 innings in MiL game on 3/19 at SD-AAA (3.0,3,1,1,0,5)...threw 3.2 innings on 3/24 vs. CHC, allowing a leadoff home run before retiring 10 of the last 14 batters he faced (3.2,4,1,1,1,3)...**2017:** Went 6-5 with a 4.36 ERA (42 ER, 86.2 IP) with 78 strikeouts and 26 walks in 16 starts...placed on the 10-day DL on April 26 with right shoulder inflammation...activated on June 23 after making three rehab starts (6/6, 6/11, 6/17 w/AAA Tacoma)...spent a second stint on the 10-day DL on Aug. 5 (retro to Aug. 2) with right shoulder bursitis...activated on Sept. 14...**CAREER:** Signed as a non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002...has played his entire 14-year career with Seattle, going 166-119 with a 3.28 ERA (939 ER, 2579.2 IP)...is Seattle's all-time leader in wins (166), innings (2579.2), strikeouts (2,406) and starts (389)...6-time All-Star (2009, 2011-15), 2-time AL ERA champ (2010-2.27, 2014-2.14)...**vs. BOS:** Will be making his 20th career start against the Sox...is 8-4 with a 4.01 ERA (56 ER, 125.2 IP) in 19 career starts with 2 complete games vs. the Sox...had ND in only 2017 GS vs. the Sox (5.2 IP, 4 H, 4 ER)...has not defeated Boston since 6/23/14 (7.0,6,2,2,0,6)...is 0-2, 9.61 (21 ER, 19.2 IP) in 4 GS since then (ND in 1G in '14, 0-2 in 2G in '15, ND in 1G in '17).
