**AT A GLANCE:** The Yankees are 0-4 so far on their seven-game road trip...begin 3G at Chicago-AL tonight after being swept in 4G at Boston...following this series, return to New York for a season-long 11-game homestand (4G vs. Texas, 1G vs. the Mets, 3G vs. Tampa Bay, 3G vs. Toronto).

- ▶ At 68-42 (.624), have the Majors' third-most wins and third-best record behind Boston (79-34, .699) and Houston (71-42, .628)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 95 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 26G over .500...are 0-5 since reaching their season high watermark of 31G over at the end of play on 7/31...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are a season-high 9.5G behind first-place Boston in the AL East...is the farthest back they have been in the AL East since they were 10.0G behind at the end of play on 9/30/16.
- ▶ Have still lost just five of their last 32 series, going 21-5-6 since 4/19...are 59-33 in their last 92G...are 6-10 in their last 16 games.
- ▶ Are 50-9 (.847) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 42-6 (.875) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 1-5 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).
- ▶ Prior to Sunday's loss, had been a Major League-best 58-0 in games in which they led after eight innings...had won their previous 74 games in which they carried a lead into the ninth inning (last such loss on 9/5/17 at Baltimore).

**YESTERDAY'S NEWS:** The Yankees lost a season-high fifth consecutive game on Sunday at Boston with a 5-4 loss in 10 innings...led, 4-1, after eight innings...**RHP Masahiro Tanaka** (4.2IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 9K, 1HR) started and took a no-decision to extend his career-best unbeaten streak to 14 starts, tied for the longest in the Majors in 2018... matched a season high with 9K...had his career-best scoreless streak snapped at 21.1IP, allowing his first run since 7/15 at Cleveland...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-5, 1RBI) had his third multi-hit effort in his last four games...**LHP Aroldis Chapman** (1.0IP, 1H, 3R/2ER, 3BB, 3K) suffered his second blown save in 31 opportunities this season and had his streak of consecutive converted saves snapped at 22...threw 39 pitches, the third-highest total of his career.

- ▶ Marked the second time in the last three seasons that they were swept in a four-game series by Boston (also 9/15-18/16 at Fenway Park).

**ROCKET LAUNCHER:** According to Statcast, **OF Giancarlo Stanton's** 121.1 mph single in the first inning on Sunday tied for the hardest-hit batted ball in the Majors this season (with Gary Sánchez's lineout on 6/19 vs. Seattle).

- ▶ Has five of the Majors' six base hits in the Statcast era (since 2015) with an exit velocity of at least 120.0 mph, with Aaron Judge having the only other (home run at 121.1 mph on 6/10/17 vs. Baltimore).
- ▶ Had three multi-hit games in 4G at Boston, going 6-for-16 (.375) with 3R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI and 1SF.

**WALK WITH ME:** **CF Aaron Hicks** has drawn at least 1BB in 12 of his last 13 starts (16BB total)...had a streak of 10 consecutive starts with at least 1BB from 7/15-8/2, the second-longest streak in the Majors this season (Joey Votto-11 starts from 6/15-26).

- ▶ Has reached safely in 21-of-41 plate appearances in his last 10G, batting .321/.512/.571 (9-for-28) with 10R, 1 double, 2HR, 5RBI and 12BB.
- ▶ His career-high 56BB are eighth-most in the AL...ranks ninth in the Majors with a 14.9% walk rate.
- ▶ Has also set career highs with 18HR and 34 extra-base hits (also 14 doubles, 2 triples).
- ▶ Ranks ninth among Major League outfielders (and third among center fielders) with a career-high-tying 3.3 WAR (FanGraphs).

**DELLIN DONUTS:** **RHP Dellin Betances** has allowed just 1R in 25.0IP (0.36 ERA, 8H, 13BB, 43K, 3HP) over 26 appearances since 5/27...opponents are hitting .100 (8-for-80) in that span.

- ▶ His current streak of 25 consecutive relief appearances with at least 1K (since 5/29) is the second-longest in Yankees history, behind Andrew Miller's streak of 28G from 5/6-7/17/16...has at least 1K in 43-of-45 appearances this season.

**GLEYBER DAY:** **2B Gleyber Torres** collected his 50th career RBI with a sacrifice fly on Sun. at Boston...reached the mark in his 74th game, the seventh-fastest Yankee to 50RBI, behind Joe DiMaggio (46th game), Joe Gordon (53rd), Tony Lazzeri (57th), Bob Meusel (65th), Gary Sánchez (69th) and Mickey Mantle (73rd).

**IN THE ZONE:** Tonight marks the Yankees' first game outside the Eastern Time Zone since 5/23 at Texas, ending a stretch of 63 consecutive games in the E.T.Z. (went 37-26 in that span).

- ▶ Have played just 13 games outside the Eastern Time Zone this season, going 9-4...will play 12-of-36 games in the Central or Pacific Time Zones from tonight through 9/12.

**CENTRAL PERK:** The Yankees are 16-5 (.762) vs. the AL Central this season, the second-highest winning percentage of any AL team against an AL division this season (Oakland, 21-6, .778 vs. AL Central)...are 20-5 in their last 25G vs. AL Central teams (since 9/18/17)...are 42-18 (.700) outside the AL East and 26-24 (.520) vs. the AL East.

- ▶ Are 75-44 (.630) vs. the AL Central since the start of 2015, the highest winning pct. by an AL team against any AL division in that span...are 22-8-5 in 35 completed series over the span (min. 2G).
- ▶ The White Sox are the only AL team that the Yankees have not yet played in 2018.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Yankees are seeking their first series win on the road since taking 2-of-3 at Toronto from 7/6-8...are 0-2-2 in four series since then, going 5-10 in 15G.

- ▶ Are 7-2-2 in 11 road series outside the AL East, with the only losses coming on 5/15 at Washington (0-1) and 5/21-13 at Texas (1-2).

**STARTING XI:** **RHP Lance Lynn** will be the 11th different pitcher to make a start for the Yankees this season...is the third different pitcher in the last nine days to make his Yankees starting debut for the Yankees (Chance Adams on Sat. at Boston, J.A. Happ on 7/29 vs. Kansas City).

- ▶ The 11 starting pitchers are tied for the highest single-season total in the last four years for the Yankees (also had 11 in 2017).

**ROUGH PATCH:** The Yankees have lost a season-high five straight games...is just their second losing streak of more than four games since the start of 2017 (lost seven straight from 6/13-20/17).

- ▶ Prior to this streak, had been one of two teams that had not lost more than three consecutive games in 2018 (also Boston).

**SAVES THE DAY:** **LHP Aroldis Chapman** suffered just his second blown save of the season on Sun. at Boston...still ranks third in the Majors (min. 15 save opps.) with a 93.5% save conversion rate (29-for-31).

- ▶ Snapped his streak of 22 converted save chances since 5/8...was the third-longest streak of his career and the longest streak by a Yankee since Andrew Miller converted 24 in a row from 4/8-8/6/15.
- ▶ Fanned Brock Holt to begin his appearance, tying a career high with his eighth consecutive strikeout (since 7/28)...prior to the streak, had struck out only two of his previous 15BF.
- ▶ Has recorded each of his last 10 outs via strikeout, and ranks second among qualifying MLB relievers with a 16.16 K/9.OIP ratio (79K/44.OIP).

### TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 6, 1979:** After delivering a eulogy at Thurman Munson's funeral earlier that morning in Canton, Ohio, Bobby Murcer hits a three-run home run in the seventh inning and a two-run single in the ninth, driving in all five Yankee runs in an emotional 5-4 comeback win vs. Baltimore.

### TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

**Aug. 7, 1962:** In his first game back after serving in the military, Tony Kubek hits a three-run home run in his first at-bat, leading the Yankees to a 14-1 win vs. Minnesota.

## TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LANCE LYNN (7-8, 4.89 ERA)

**RHP Lance Lynn** will make his first start as a Yankee (second appearance) in Monday's opener at the White Sox...is his 21st start of the season...will pitch on regular four days' rest after making his Yankees debut in relief on Wed. vs. Baltimore (4.1IP, 5H, 0R, 0BB, 4K)...was acquired by the Yankees along with cash considerations from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for INF Tyler Austin and RHP Luis Rijo on 7/30...went 7-8 with a 5.10 ERA (102.1IP, 58ER) in 20 starts with the Twins before the trade...signed a one-year contract with Minnesota on 3/12/18...was a 2012 NL All-Star with St. Louis...was originally selected by St. Louis in the first round (39th overall) of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Mississippi.

**STARTING XI:** Will be the 11th different pitcher to make a start for the Yankees this season...is the third different pitcher in the last nine days to make his Yankees starting debut for the Yankees (Chance Adams on Sat. at Boston, J.A. Happ on 7/29 vs. Kansas City).

- ✦ The 11 starting pitchers are tied for the highest single-season total in the last four years for the Yankees (also had 11 in 2017).

**LAST APPEARANCE:** Made his Yankees debut in Wednesday's loss vs. Baltimore, tossing 4.1IP scoreless innings of relief (5H, 5K)...was the second-longest relief outing by a Yankee this season and the longest scoreless relief outing by a Yankee since Luis Cessa's 4.2IP on 7/4/17 vs. Toronto...was his first relief outing since 9/9/12 (w. St. Louis) vs. Milwaukee, ending a string of 154 consecutive appearances as a starter...was added to the Yankees' 25-man roster prior to the game.

- ✦ In 20 starts with Minnesota, had just two scoreless start and only one walkless start.

**2018:** Overall, is 7-8 with a 4.89 ERA (106.2IP, 58ER) in 21 games (20 starts) this season.

- ✦ Went 7-8 with a 5.10 ERA (102.1IP, 58ER) in 20 starts with the Twins before the trade.

**VS. CHICAGO-AL:** Is 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA (30.1IP, 9ER) in five career starts against the White Sox...is 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA (11.0IP, 6ER) in two starts this season, both with Minnesota...was born and raised in the Indianapolis area.

- ✦ Has 41K in the five starts, and his 12.16 K/9.0IP ratio is second-highest all-time among pitchers with at least five starts against the White Sox (Danny Salazar-13.72).
- ✦ Is 1-1 with a 4.24 ERA (17.0IP, 8ER) in three career starts at Guaranteed Rate Field...has a 11.50 K/BB ratio (23K/2BB).

**CAREER:** Over parts of seven Major League seasons, has pitched for St. Louis (2011-15, '17) and Minnesota (2018)...missed the entire 2016 season recovering from "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow, performed at the end of 2015...in his final season with the Cardinals in 2017, made 33 starts, going 11-8 with a 3.43 ERA (186.1IP, 71ER)... has reached 10 wins and 150K in each of his five full Major League seasons (2012-15, '17)... appeared in the playoffs each season from 2011-15, posting a 4.50 ERA (52.0IP, 26ER) in 24 postseason outings (seven starts).

**PERSONAL:** Played three seasons at the University of Mississippi (2006-08), setting the Ole Miss single-season strikeout record in 2007 (146) and the career strikeout record (332)...was named to the All-SEC Second Team in 2007 and 2008...was named to the Team USA squad for the 2007 Pan-American Games...was drafted by Seattle in the sixth round of the 2005 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign...graduated from Brownsburg (Ind.) High School in 2005...was the 2005 Gatorade High School Player of the Year for Indiana...was a member of the Brownsburg (Ind.) team that qualified for the 1999 Little League World Series.

**LHP CC Sabathia** will make his 21st start of the season on Tuesday at Chicago-AL...the 38-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...took a no-decision in his last start in the Yankees' 15-7 loss at Boston on Thursday (3.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 4BB, 2K, 1HR)...was just his 15th career start tossing 3.0 innings-or-fewer and first since 8/8/17 at Toronto (also 3.0IP)...is seeking his third straight season with a sub-4.00 ERA after recording at least a 4.50 ERA in all three seasons from 2013-15...was on the 10-day D.L. from 4/7-19 with a right hip strain...has 243 career wins, tied with Juan Marichal (243) for 53rd place on Baseball's all-time wins list (next up is Jack Powell-244)...leads active Major League pitchers in career strikeouts (2,933), complete games (38) and quality starts (309)...ranks second in wins (243), innings pitched (3,424.2) and starts (529) to Bartolo Colon (245 wins, 3,438.2IP, 548 starts)...is 17th on the all-time strikeout list (2,933), third all-time among left-handers...his 2,805K in the AL are sixth-most in AL history (most among left-handers)...is one of eight pitchers in the Modern Era (since 1900) to earn at least 100 wins with multiple franchises (Cleveland, Yankees)...spent 2001-08 with the Indians and was traded to the Brewers on 7/7/08...originally signed with the Yankees on 12/18/08 and re-signed as a free agent to a one-year contract for the 2018 season on 12/26/17...is the longest-tenured Yankees pitcher (10 seasons since 2009), as only OF Brett Gardner (11 seasons since 2008) has played for the team longer...has earned wins against 29 Major League teams (has not defeated the Marlins)...is in his 18th Major League season, second-most among active pitchers (Colon, 21).

**CENTRAL PERK:** In five starts against AL Central opponents this season, has gone 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (27.1IP, 8ER)...since the start of 2017, is 4-2 with a 2.94 ERA (52.0IP, 17ER) in nine starts vs. the AL Central...in his career, has gone 85-44 with a 3.54 ERA (1,102.0IP, 433ER) in 168 starts against the AL Central, the second-most wins by any pitcher against the division in Baseball history (Mark Buehrle, 92-61).
