WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox conclude this seven-day, season-opening trip tonight in Toronto ... RHP Carson Fulmer takes the mound for the White Sox, who are tied with Minnesota for first place in the American League Central.
- The Sox are 2-2 on this trip, rallying to win both games of an abbreviated two-game series in Kansas City before losing the first two games of this series by a combined 18-7 margin.
- Sunday's game against the Royals was postponed due to weather and rescheduled as part of split doubleheader on 4/28.
- Following tonight's game, the Sox return home for six games in seven days vs. Detroit (4/5, 4/7-8) and Tampa Bay (4/9-11).

TONIGHT'S STORYLINES

- Due to a conflict with the Chicago Blackhawks, tonight's game will air on ESPN Radio 1000-AM.
- Happy 66th birthday to Herm Schneider, the longtime White Sox head athletic trainer.
- The White Sox are looking to avoid their first three-game sweep at Rogers Centre since 5/7-9/04 ... the Blue Jays did record four-game home sweeps of the Sox in both 2008-09.
- The Sox are tied for the major-league lead with 12 home runs.
- Tim Anderson is the first player in Sox history with three home runs and three stolen bases through the club's first four games.
- José Abreu is hitting .336 (38-113) with eight doubles, four home runs and 23 RBI in 27 career games vs. Toronto.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP

- Toronto scored seven runs in the eighth inning to break open a two-run game and went on to record a 14-5 victory over the White Sox, clinching a series win.
- Miguel González suffered the loss, allowing six hits (five earned) on eight hits over 5.0 IP ... Héctor Santiago and Gregory Infante combined to allow eight runs over 2.2 IP.
- Avisail García went 3-4 with a solo home run (No. 1), a 481-foot shot off J.A. Happ which per Statcast is the Sox longest since 2015 and the longest in the majors this season.
- Tim Anderson was 3-4 with a home run (No. 2) and three runs scored, Yolmer Sánchez added solo homer (No. 1), and José Abreu added two hits.

ACE IS THE (WHITE SOX) PLACE

- The White Sox Amateur City Elite (ACE) squad has placed 22 players on the Rawlings-Perfect Game pre-season All-America Teams, which recognize the top high school underclassmen in the United States.
- The First, Second and Third-Team All Americans include 300 players (100 juniors, sophomores and freshmen) from the U.S., Canada and Puerto Rico ... other potential top underclassmen are included on two honorable mention lists.

HOME OPENER INFO

- White Sox great and 2005 World Series Championship catcher A.J. Pierzynski will throw out a ceremonial first pitch at tomorrow's home opener (3:10 p.m. CT) ... country music artist Brandon Lay will perform the national anthem.
- Parking lots open at noon and gates to the ballpark open at 1:10 p.m. ... fans are encouraged to be in their seats no later than 2:15 p.m. for the opening ceremony.
- Protective netting has been extended at Guaranteed Rate Field from the backstop to the outfield end of both dugouts ... the state-of-the-art netting extends across 21 sections (Sections 122-142) and matches the existing backstop's 30-foot height.

WHO'S HOT?

- Avisail García is hitting .386/.438/.556 (73-189) over his last 50 games dating back to 8/10/17.
- Jose Abreu is batting .379/.419/.695 (36-95) with six home runs and 20 RBI over his last 24 games (since 9/9/17).
- Tim Anderson owns a .347 average (42-121) with six homers, 15 RBI and 26 runs scored over his last 29 games (since 9/3/17).

WHITE SOX VS. TORONTO

- The Blue Jays lead the season series, 2-0.
- The White Sox are 5-0-1 in the last six season series, going 27-18 during that span (14-9 in Toronto) ... the six-season unbeaten streak against the Blue Jays is the longest in club history.
- The teams split the 2017 series, with each winning two of three on the road.
- The White Sox trail in the all-time series, 190-205 ... they are 101-93 in Chicago (61-50 at Guaranteed Rate Field) and 89-112 in Toronto (56-72 at Rogers Centre).

LOOKING FOR AN EDGE VS. THE EAST

- The White Sox are 179-221 vs. the American League East since 2007, with their only winning record during that span coming in 2016 (19-14).
- The Sox are 0-2 vs. the AL East this season after going 13-20 in 2017, including a 4-12 record on the road.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,317 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, five more than the Mets and 47 more than Oakland, the next-closest American League team.

AT THE HELM

- Rick Renteria is in his second season after being named the 40th manager in White Sox history on 10/3/16.
- Renteria was the only Latino manager in the major leagues in 2017 but has been joined by Boston's Alex Cora and Washington's Dave Martinez in 2018.

ROSTER QUICK FACTS

- The Sox 25-man roster includes 13 pitchers (three LHP), two catchers, six infielders and four outfielders ... the average age is 27.7, including 28.8 for pitchers and 26.4 for position players.
- RHP James Shields (36) is the oldest player, and 2B Yoán Moncada (22) is the youngest ... RHP Nate Jones (2012-) is the longest tenured, followed by OF Avisail García (2013-).

ABREU IN ELITE COMPANY

- José Abreu is one of three players in major-league history to begin his career with at least four consecutive seasons of 25-plus homers and 100-plus RBI, joining Hall-of-Famer Joe DiMaggio (1936-41) and Albert Pujols.
- Abreu also has joined Al Simmons (11, 1924-34), Pujols (10, 2001-10), Ted Williams (1939-42, '46-49) and DiMaggio (1936-42) as the only players in history to record 100 or more RBI in each of his first four seasons.
- He led the American League with 343 total bases in 2017, joining Albert Belle (399 in 1998), Minnie Miñoso (304 in 1951) and Joe Jackson (293 in 1916) as the only players in Sox history to accomplish that feat.

CALL TO THE HALL

- Jim Thome, who played for the White Sox from 2006-09 and serves as a special assistant to the general manager, will be inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame on 7/29/18.
- Thome, who ranks eighth in major-league history with 612 home runs, received 89.8 percent of the votes to become the fifth former Sox player inducted on the first ballot.
- He will join Chipper Jones, Vladimir Guerrero, Trevor Hoffman, Jack Morris and Alan Trammell in the Class of 2018.

ON THE FARM

- The White Sox minor-league system is rated by *Baseball America* as the fourth-best in baseball.
- The Sox organization features five of *Baseball America's* Top 100 prospects: OF Eloy Jiménez (No. 4), RHP Michael Kopech (No. 11), RHP Alec Hansen (No. 57), OF Luis Robert (No. 58) and RHP Dane Dunning (No. 82) ... Jiménez (No. 4), Kopech (No. 10), Robert (No. 28), Hansen (No. 54), RHP Dylan Cease (No. 71), Dunning (No. 92) and OF Blake Rutherford (No. 99) are ranked in MLB.com's Top 100.
- The Sox full-season, minor-league teams begin play tomorrow.

ON DECK: VS. DETROIT TIGERS

- The White Sox tomorrow open a six-game, seven-day home-stand vs. Detroit ... RHP James Shields (1-0, 6.00 ERA) is scheduled to start tomorrow's home opener.
- The Sox went 10-9 in 2017 for their first season series victory over the Tigers since 2008 ... they won six of the nine games at home, outscoring Detroit by a 48-26 margin.
- José Abreu is a career .345 (95-275) hitter with 19 doubles, 15 home runs and 47 RBI in 73 career games vs. Detroit, while Avisail García has 52 RBI in 68 games against his former team.
