AT A GLANCE: The Yankees begin a season-long 11-game homestand, with 4G vs. Texas (tonight-Sun.), 1G vs. the Mets (Mon.), 3G vs. Tampa Bay (8/14-16) and 3G vs. Toronto (8/17-19)...went 3-4 on their seven-game road trip, sweeping 3G at Chicago-AL after being swept in 4G at Boston.

- ▶ Have won three consecutive games after a season-long five-game losing streak...is just their second winning streak longer than 2G since 6/22 (won three straight from 7/28-31).
- ▶ At 71-42 (.628), have the Majors' third-most wins and third-best record behind Boston (81-34, .704) and Houston (73-42, .635)...the Yankees and Red Sox have held (at least a share of) the Majors' two best records on 84 of the last 98 days (since the end of play on 5/3).
- ▶ Are 29G over .500...are 3-5 since reaching their season high watermark of 31G over at the end of play on 7/31...had not reached 31G over .500 since finishing the 2011 season 32G over .500 (97-65).
- ▶ Are 9.0G behind first-place Boston in the AL East.
- ▶ Have lost just five of their last 33 series, going 22-5-6 since 4/19...are 62-33 in their last 95G...are 9-10 in their last 19 games.
- ▶ Are 51-9 (.850) when scoring first...are a Major League-best 44-6 (.880) when their starter tosses at least 6.0 innings.
- ▶ Are 4-5 so far in their stretch of 20 consecutive game days (7/31-8/19).

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees completed a three-game sweep of the White Sox in Chicago on Wednesday with a 7-3 win...**RHP Luis Severino** (7.0IP, 7H, 3ER, 0BB, 8K, 1HR) snapped a three-start losing streak to earn his career-high 15th win, tied for the Major League lead...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (1-for-4, 1BB) punctuated a six-run second inning with his sixth career grand slam...**CF Aaron Hicks** (1-for-4, 1BB) hit his 19th HR in the fifth...**RHP Chad Green** (1.0IP, 1H, 1BB, 3K) and **RHP Jonathan Holder** (1.0IP, 1H, 1K) each threw scoreless innings.

- ▶ Marked their second road series sweep of at least 3G this season (also 4/27-29 at Los Angeles-AL, 3-0).
- ▶ The Yankees' six-run second inning was their highest-scoring frame since scoring 6R in the fourth on 6/4 (G1) at Detroit.

STRIKE FORCE: Yankees pitchers recorded 12 more strikeouts on Wednesday at Chicago-AL to finish the series with 43K, a club record for a three-game series...broke the previous mark of 42K from 5/5-7/17 at Chicago-NL...had 20K on Tuesday, just the second time in franchise history to reach 20K in a single game.

- ▶ Have 60K in 40.2IP over the last four games.
- ▶ Have a 10.01 K/9.0IP ratio (1134K/1,019.1IP), which would be the third-highest single-season figure in Major League history, behind the 2018 Astros (10.59) and 2017 Indians (10.08)...have struck out 26.7% of batters faced...rank second in the Majors in strikeouts (Houston-1,218).

SEVY SEASON: RHP Luis Severino tossed 7.0IP (7H, 3ER, 0BB, 8K) on Wed. at Chicago-AL to snap a three-start losing streak and earn his career-best 15th win of the season...marked his longest outing since 6/26 at Philadelphia (7.0IP).

- ▶ Are the most wins by a Yankee in a season since 2012, with Phil Hughes (16-13), Hiroki Kuroda (16-11) and CC Sabathia (15-6)...the club's six-year drought without a 15-game winner was tied for the second-longest in the Majors, with Philadelphia's last 15-game winner also in 2012 (Cole Hamels, 17-6) and San Diego's in 2007 (Jake Peavy, 19-6).

FAN FAVORITES: Through 54 home games, the Yankees lead the AL in total home attendance (2,340,346) and average attendance per home gate (43,340), trailing only the Dodgers in average attendance (46,860).

- ▶ Their 21 sellouts this season have set a single-season record for the current Yankee Stadium (previous: 20 in 2011)...have sold out 14 of their last 19 home games (since 6/16).
- ▶ Also lead the AL in average road attendance, drawing 32,604 per road game...no other AL club is above 31,000.

STAND IN THE PLACE WHERE YOU ARE: The Yankees kick off a season-long 11-game homestand tonight...Elias confirms that this is their longest homestand since they played home games on 13 consecutive days from 6/14-26/05, and went 8-5 vs. Pittsburgh (3-0), Chicago-NL (3-0), Tampa Bay (1-3) and the Mets (1-2).

- ▶ Starting tonight, will play 18 of their next 24 games at home...are also in the midst of playing 19 of their first 29G following the All-Star break at Yankee Stadium (so far, are 5-3 at home and 4-6 on the road).

HOME COOKING: The Yankees are 38-16 (.704) at Yankee Stadium in 2018, the second-best home record in the Majors, behind Boston (42-15, .737)...are 33-11 in 44 home games since 4/21.

- ▶ Since their only home series loss of the season (1-3 from 4/5-8 vs. Baltimore), are 12-0-4 in 16 home series, their longest streak without dropping a series at home since going 20-0-5 over 25 home series from 9/15/97-8/16/98...are 12-0-3 in 15 home series since 4/19.
- ▶ Are 19-1-4 in their last 24 home series (since 8/31/17), going 52-20 in 72G over that span.
- ▶ This series marks their third consecutive home series vs. the AL's three last-place teams...are 4-2 so far, going 3-1 vs. Kansas City and 1-1 vs. Baltimore.
- ▶ Have not lost consecutive home games since 5/10-11.

I GOT FIVE ON IT: Yankees batters have scored at least 5R in 10 consecutive home games, the longest streak at the current Yankee Stadium and the longest home streak in the Majors this season...is their longest such streak at home since a 10-game streak from 7/21-8/13/07...have just one longer streak since 1962, scoring at least 5R in 11 straight home games from 8/11-28/05.

- ▶ There has been only one longer streak in the Majors in the last 10 seasons (since the start of 2009), an 11-game streak by Cleveland from 7/29-8/14/16.

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters hit 2HR in all 3G in their series at Chicago-AL after recording just three multi-**HR** efforts in their first 15G after the All-Star break.

- ▶ Have hit a Major League-leading 181HR...are on pace to hit 259HR (the MLB record is 264HR by Seattle in 1997).
- ▶ Six Yankees have hit at least 15HR this season: Giancarlo Stanton (27), Aaron Judge (26), Didi Gregorius (20), Aaron Hicks (19), Gleyber Torres (18), Miguel Andújar (15)...the Dodgers are the only other team with six 15HR hitters.
- ▶ Rank second in the Majors in runs (582), runs per game (5.15), SLG (.452), OPS (.781) and XBH (398).

STANTON ISLAND: OF Giancarlo Stanton hit his sixth career grand slam in the second inning on Wed. at Chicago-AL...was his first since hitting a "walk-off" grand slam on 4/18/14 w/ Miami vs. Seattle; hit 170HR in between grand slams...was the fourth grand slam by a Yankee this season, tied for seventh-most in the Majors.

- ▶ In 7G on the road trip, hit .310 (9-for-29) with 6R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 9RBI and 3BB.
- ▶ In his last 45G (since 6/18), is hitting .333 (60-for-180) with 29R, 11 doubles, 11HR, 36RBI and 15BB.
- ▶ His 27HR are the most by a Yankee in his first season with the team since 2009, when Mark Teixeira hit 39HR and Nick Swisher hit 29HR.

PICKING UP HICKS: CF Aaron Hicks is batting .302/.456/.558 (13-for-43) with 11R, 2 doubles, 3HR, 7RBI and 13BB over his last 13 games.

- ▶ In 12 home games since the start of July, is batting .395/.547/.868 (15-for-38) with 13R, 3 doubles, 5HR, 9RBI, 14BB and 1SB...has reached safely (via H/BB/HP) multiple times in 10-of-12 contests.

IT'S A START: Yankees starting pitchers are 2-0 with a 1.82 ERA (24.2IP, 19H, 5ER, 5BB, 38K, 2HR) in their last four starts...have recorded at least 8K in all four outings.

TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 9, 2015: The Yankees are blanked by Toronto in Yankee Stadium for the second straight day, ending a streak of 2,665 straight games without being shut out in consecutive games, a Major League record.

Aug. 9, 2014: The Yankees hold "Paul O'Neill Day," honoring him with a Monument Park plaque.

Aug. 9, 1919: Ralph Houk is born in Lawrence, Kansas. He played eight seasons as a backup catcher with the Yankees (1947-54), then managed the club for 11 seasons (1961-63, '66-73), winning World Series titles in 1961 and '62.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Aug. 10, 1986: In a pregame ceremony, the Yankees unveil a plaque in honor of Alfred Manuel "Billy" Martin in Yankee Stadium's Monument Park. Both a player and manager with the Yankees, Martin's No. 1 is also retired.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP J.A. HAPP (11-6, 4.05 ERA)

LHP J.A. Happ will make his second start as a Yankee and 22nd start of the season tonight vs. Texas...the 35-year-old will be reinstated from the 10-day D.L. prior to the game...was placed on the disabled list on 8/2 (retroactive to 7/30) with hand, foot and mouth disease...earned the win in his Yankees debut on 7/29 vs. Kansas City (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP)...was acquired from the Toronto Blue Jays in exchange for INF Brandon Drury and OF Billy McKinney on 7/26/18...his first name is pronounced "JAY"...according to STATS, LLC, is the fourth pitcher to make starts for both the Yankees and Blue Jays in the same season, and the first since David Cone in 1995...finished sixth in 2016 AL Cy Young Award voting after going 20-4 with Toronto and tying for the second-most wins in the Majors...the Yankees are his sixth Major League team, also the Phillies (2007-10), Astros (2010-12), Blue Jays (2012-14, '16-18), Mariners (2015) and Pirates (2015)...was originally selected by Philadelphia in the third round of the 2004 First-Year Player Draft out of Northwestern (Ill.) University.

LAST START: Earned the win in his Yankees debut on 7/29 vs. Kansas City (6.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 1HR, 1HP)...began his Yankees tenure with five scoreless innings before allowing a two-out solo HR to Salvador Perez in the sixth inning.

NEXT STOP – 161 ST/YANKEE STADIUM: Is 5-1 with a 3.67 ERA (54.0IP, 22ER) in nine career starts at Yankee Stadium...has won each of his last four starts here since the start of 2016, posting a 2.39 ERA (26.1IP, 7ER).

- ★ Started for Philadelphia in the 22nd game in Yankee Stadium history on 5/23/09, yielding 2ER in 6.0IP (4H, 0BB, 4K, 1HR) in a no-decision.
- ★ In 12 home starts with Toronto in 2018, was 6-4 with a 5.22 ERA (69.0IP, 64H, 42R/40ER, 18BB, 78K, 12HR).

BEAST OF THE EAST: Since the start of 2017, is 6-7 with a 2.44 ERA (99.2IP, 77H, 36R/27ER, 37BB, 95K, 12HR) in 18 starts vs. AL East clubs...has held opponents to a .206 BA (77-for-373) in that span.

- ★ Has allowed 2ER-or-fewer in all 10 starts vs. Boston since the start of 2015, going 4-1 with a 1.78 ERA (60.2IP, 12ER)...is tied for the third-longest such streak vs. the Red Sox since earned runs became an official statistic in the AL in 1913, behind the Yankees' Bob Shawkey (14GS from 6/29/1921-4/15/1924) and Cleveland's Gaylord Perry (11GS from 9/9/1972-9/11/1974).

HIRED HAND: Has been traded at four of the last nine July non-waiver trading deadlines...in 35 post-trade games (31 starts) with his new clubs, has compiled a 16-8 record with one complete game and a 3.22 ERA (181.2IP, 150H, 68R/65ER, 66BB, 178K, 13HR).

- ★ Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (6.0IP, 1ER) in one start as a Yankee.
- ★ On 7/31/15, was acquired by Pittsburgh from Seattle in exchange for RHP Adrian Sampson...went 7-2 with a 1.85 ERA (63.1IP, 13ER) in 11 starts as the Pirates reached the NL Wild Card Game...was scoreless in 5-of-11 turns and ranked third among MLB pitchers in ERA from 8/1 through the end of the season (min. 50.0IP).
- ★ On 7/20/12, was acquired by Toronto from Houston in a 10-player trade...was 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA (40.1IP, 21ER) in 10 games (six starts) for the Blue Jays that season...made his first four appearances in relief (5.14 ERA, 7.0IP, 4ER) before joining the rotation for his final six starts (3-2, 4.59 ERA, 33.1IP, 17ER).
- ★ On 7/29/10, was acquired by Houston from Philadelphia, along with OF Anthony Gose and INF Jonathan Villar, in exchange for RHP Roy Oswalt...went 5-4 with a 3.75 ERA (72.0IP, 30ER) in 13 starts for the Astros...tossed 6.0 shutout innings (2H, 4BB, 6K) in his Astros debut on 7/30/10 vs. Milwaukee...a month later, threw a two-hit shutout (1BB, 4K) on 8/30/10 vs. St. Louis.

VS. TEXAS: Is 4-2 with a 2.97 ERA (36.1IP, 12ER) in six career regular season starts against the Rangers...has 37K and just 6BB...has completed 6.0IP and allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of his last five starts (since 2012).

- ★ Also earned the win in 2016 ALDS Game 2 w/ Toronto at Texas, yielding just 1ER in 5.0IP (9H, 1BB, 5K).

2018: Is 5-2 with a 2.47 ERA (51.0IP, 14ER) in nine starts outside of Rogers Centre...has retired 92-of-124 batters leading off an inning (.258 opp. OBP)...opponents are hitting .145 (9-for-62) against his slider and .201 (43-for-214) against his four-seam fastball (Brooks Baseball).

- ★ Is 1-1 with a 1.23 ERA (14.2IP, 7R/2ER) in his last three starts.
- ★ Made his first career All-Star Game, selected by MLB as Toronto's lone representative.
- ★ Earned his 100th career win on 6/8 vs. Baltimore.
- ★ Won six consecutive decisions from 5/16-6/25, going 6-0 with a 2.60 ERA (52.0IP, 15ER) in eight starts.
- ★ Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 vs. the Yankees (L, 4.2IP, 4H, 3R/2ER, 1BB, 5K, 1HR).

THERE'S A HAPP FOR THAT: Has a career-best 9.90 K/9.0IP ratio (132K/120.0IP) and 26.6% strikeout rate.

- ★ Had a season-high 10K twice: 5/16 at the Mets and 4/24 vs. Boston.
- ★ Has four games with at least 9K and 0BB, tied with Justin Verlander for the most in the Majors...on 4/24 vs. Boston (10K) and 4/29 vs. Texas (9K), became the second Blue Jay to record at least 9K with 0BB in consecutive games (Roger Clemens, 5/5-10/97).

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER VS. TEXAS: RHP MASASHIRO TANAKA (9-2, 3.76 ERA)

RHP Masahiro Tanaka will make his 19th start of the season in Friday's game vs. Texas...the 29-year-old will pitch on regular four days' rest...did not factor in the decision in Sunday's 4-3, 10-inning loss at Boston (4.2IP, 6H, 1ER, 1BB, 9K, 1HR)...had his career-high, scoreless inning streak snapped at 21.1IP...was the longest streak by a Yankee since CC Sabathia from 6/30-7/10/2011...is undefeated in his last 14 starts, going 7-0 with a 3.12 ERA (80.2IP, 28ER) and 86K over the span...was on the 10-day D.L. from 6/9-7/10 with mild strains of left and right hamstring (missed 29 team games)...has 160 career wins between MLB (61) and NPB (99)...went 13-12 with a 4.74 ERA (178.1IP, 180H, 100R/94ER, 41BB, 194K, 35HR) in 30 starts in 2017...recorded his 700th career strikeout on 6/2/18 at Baltimore, becoming the sixth Japanese pitcher to record at least 700 Major League strikeouts...was only the second Yankee to record at least 700K through his first five Major League seasons (Andy Pettitte-709K through five seasons)...the 2014 AL All-Star was acquired by the club via the posting system from the Rakuten Golden Eagles of Japan and signed to a seven-year contract on 1/22/14...his contract runs through the 2020 season.

#17 AARON BOONE—MANAGER Career Managerial Record: 71-42

- Was ejected in the sixth inning of 7/14 win at Cleveland by 1B Umpire Jerry Meals (arguing strike three call on Stanton)...was his second career managerial ejection (also 5/22 at Texas, balls and strikes).
- Was named the 33rd manager in Yankees history on 12/4/17, signing a three-year contract through the 2020 season with a team option for 2021.
- Is the 18th Yankees manager to have also played for the club.
- Won his managerial debut (3/29 at Toronto) and first home game (4/3 vs. Tampa Bay).
