TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final homestand of the season with the second (0-1) of 4 games vs. the Texas Rangers...the Mariners opened the homestand losing 2-of-3 to the Oakland Athletics...went 6-4 on the final road trip of the season, going 3-1 at Los Angeles-AL, 2-1 at Houston and 1-2 at Texas...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners have lost back-to-back games...are 7-7 in their last 14 games and 8-9 in their last 17...are 21-23 in their last 44 games since Aug. 9...are 31-42 in their last 73 games since July 4 after winning a season-high 8 straight games, spanning June 25 - July 3...the Mariners are 46-49 in their last 95 games since June 10...Seattle is 72-62 in its last 134 games (4/28-c) and 77-65 over its last 142 games (4/20-c)...Seattle is 24-27 during the day and 62-46 at night...Seattle is 42-36 at Safeco Field, 44-37 on the road.

- Pitching In** - the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make at least 25 starts each (**Mike Leake**, 31; **Marco Gonzales**, 29; **Félix Hernández**, 28; **James Paxton**, 27; **Wade LeBlanc**, 26)...four clubs (Cleveland, Colorado, Houston & Philadelphia) have 4 pitchers with 25+ starts each.
- Ring 'Em Up** - the Mariners pitching staff has recorded 1,297 strikeouts this season, tied with the 2013 club for 3rd-most in franchise history...trails only the Mariners clubs of 2016 (1,318) and 2014 (1,317).
- Exist to Assist** - **Mitch Haniger** has 12 outfield assists this season, tied with Andrew Benintendi-BOS and Billy Hamilton-CIN for the Major League lead...each of Haniger's 12 outfield assists came as a right fielder, tops by any right fielder in the Majors...Haniger's 12 outfield assists are the most by a Mariners player since **Ichiro Suzuki** also had 12 outfield assists in 2004.
- Four Score** - the Mariners are 63-19 when scoring 4-or-more runs, but are 23-54 when scoring 3-or-fewer runs.
- Get Through 8** - the Mariners are the only Major League club with a 1.000 winning percentage (74-0) when leading after 8 innings this season.
- Division Rivals** - the Mariners are in the midst of playing their final 17 games (7-7) vs. AL West foes...Seattle is 37-33 (.521) vs. the AL West this season (10-9 vs. OAK, 10-9 vs. HOU, 11-8 vs. LAA and **7-9 vs. TEX**).

NEAT SEASON, WADE!...**Wade LeBlanc** began the season in the Mariners bullpen, where he made 5 appearances before being moved into the starting rotation on May 3...since May 3, he is 8-5 with a 3.45 ERA (55 ER, 143.1 IP) with 112 strikeouts and 35 walks in 26 starts...among American League leaders since May 3, LeBlanc ranks T3rd in starts, 7th in ERA and 16th in innings pitched...10 of his 26 starts have been quality starts...the Mariners are 16-10 in LeBlanc's 26 starts this season...LeBlanc has established several single-season career-best marks in 2018...he has a career-high in starts with 26 (previous: 25, 2010 w/SD), innings pitched with 157.0 (previous: 146.0, 2010 w/SD) and strikeouts with 124 (previous: 110, 2010 w/SD)...he is currently tied for his most wins in a season with 8 (also: 2010 w/SD).

JEAN, JEAN THE HIT COLLECTOR...**Jean Segura** ranks 6th in the AL with 175 hits, trailing Whit Merrifield-KC (188), J.D. Martinez-BOS (185), Nicholas Castellanos-DET (181), Francisco Lindor-CLE (181) and Mookie Betts-BOS (178)...Segura's 175 hits rank T4th-most in club history among primary shortstops (also: Alex Rodriguez, 2000)...trails only Rodriguez's seasons of 1996 (215), 1998 (213) and 1997 (176).

INNINGS EATERS...five Mariners pitchers have worked at least 150.0 innings this season...**Mike Leake** (185.2) leads the club, followed by **Marco Gonzales** (166.2), **Wade LeBlanc** (157.0), **Félix Hernández** (155.2) and **James Paxton** (154.1)...the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers work at least 150.0 innings...Cleveland, Colorado and Houston each have 4 pitchers with 150.0 IP.

AIMING FOR ROYAL BROUGHAM...four of the top-6 all-time leaders in home runs at Safeco Field are active for this 4-game series...**Nelson Cruz** has 83 career home runs at Safeco Field (74 w/SEA, 8 w/TEX and 1 w/BAL), tied with Raúl Ibañez for the all-time record at the ballpark...**Kyle Seager** ranks 3rd with 67 career home runs at Safeco Field, followed by Bret Boone (62), **Robinson Canó** (57) and Rangers 3rd baseman Adrián Beltré (56).

RIBBIES...**Nelson Cruz** leads the Mariners and ranks T8th in the American League with 96 RBI this season...with 4 more RBI, Cruz would become only the 7th Mariners player in club history to record at least 3 seasons with at least 100 RBI...Cruz, who accomplished this feat in 2016 and 2017, would join Ken Griffey Jr. (7x; 1991-93 and 1999-99), Edgar Martinez (6x; 1995-98 and 2000-01), Alex Rodríguez (4x; 1996, 1998-2000), Bret Boone (3x; 2001-03), Jay Buhner (3x; 1995-97) and Raúl Ibañez (3x; 2006-08).

COMING IN HOT...**Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in 44 of his last 52 games, dating back to July 31...during that span, he's batting .323 (70x217) with 36 runs, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 8 home runs, 23 RBI, 2 HBP, 17 walks, a .374 on-base percentage and a .544 slugging percentage (.918 OPS)...among Major League leaders since July 31, Haniger ranks T2nd in hits, T3rd in doubles, T5th in extra-base hits (30), T11th in batting, T16th in runs, 17th in OPS...Mitch has hit safely in 13 of his last 15 games (9/11-c), batting .349 (22x63) with 13 runs scored, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs, 6 RBI and 4 walks.

SAVE ME...**Edwin Díaz** has recorded 56 of 58 (96.6%) of Seattle's team saves this season...his 96.6% of team saves is currently the highest mark ever by a closer since saves became an official stat in 1969 (min. 50 team saves)...he ranks ahead of John Smoltz-ATL in 2002 (96.5%, 55x57), Fernando Rodney-TB in 2012 (96.0%, 48x50), Rod Beck-SF in 1993 (96.0%, 48x50) and Eric Gagne-LAD in 2003 (94.8%, 55x58).

DOUBLING UP...this series features two of the top-5 all-time leaders in doubles by Dominican-born players...**Robinson Canó** ranks 5th with 533 career doubles while Rangers third baseman Adrián Beltré is 2nd with 634...Albert Pujols is the all-time leader with 639, followed by Beltré (634), David Ortiz (632), Manny Ramírez (547) and Canó (533)...since his debut in 2005, Canó has more doubles than any other Major League player, ahead of Miguel Cabrera (504) and Nick Markakis (474).

AS YOU KNOW...**Jean Segura** is batting .301 (175x581) this season, 7th-best in the American League...**AND AS YOU ALSO KNOW**...Segura hit .300 (157x524) in his first year with Seattle last season...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...that Segura is on pace to become the 8th Mariners player in club history to hit at least .300 in back-to-back seasons?...the last Mariners player to accomplish this feat was Ichiro Suzuki, who hit .300-or-better in 10 consecutive seasons from 2001-10...the other Mariners to hit .300 in consecutive seasons are Edgar Martinez (1995-2001 and 1990-92), Ken Griffey Jr. (1990-94 and 1996-97), Alex Rodriguez (1996-98), Bruce Bochte (1979-80), Phil Bradley (1985-86) and John Olerud (2001-02).

ABOUT LEBLANC...

- 34-year-old left-hander is making his 32nd appearance and 27th start of the season, his 208th career appearance, 106th career start and 5th career appearance (4th start) against Texas tonight.
- Signed with Seattle on March 25, 2018 after being released by New York-AL at his request.
- Previously played with Seattle in 2016...acquired on June 22, 2016 from Toronto in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations...was traded to Pittsburgh on Sept. 13, 2016 in exchange for a player to be named later or cash considerations.
- Selected by San Diego in the 2nd round of the 2006 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- Native of Lake Charles, LA...attended Alfred M. Barbe High School.
- Made his Major League debut with the Padres on Sept. 3, 2008 at Los Angeles-NL (L, 4.0, 8, 5, 3, 1, HR-2).
- Pitched for the University of Alabama, 2004-06...was 24-9 with a 2.81 ERA (100 ER, 320.1 IP) and 334 strikeouts in 46 career G/45 GS...holds Alabama's all-time record for strikeouts with 334...National Freshman of the Year (*Baseball America*) and SEC Freshman of the Year in 2004 after going 8-4 with a 2.08 ERA (26 ER, 112.2 IP) with 98 strikeouts in 16 G/15 GS while posting 8 complete games, including 2 shutouts.
- Went 2-5 with a 4.23 ERA (21 ER, 44.2 IP) in 8 starts with the Seibu Lions in the Japan Pacific League in 2015.
- Is 9-9-1 with a 3.69 ERA (65 ER, 158.2 IP) in 45 career games (23 starts) in September.

LAST OUTING...L#5 in the Mariners 1-6 loss at Texas on Sept. 23...allowed 3 runs on 8 hits and 1 walk while striking out 5 over 5+ innings pitched...faced 3 batters without recording an out in the 6th inning (2B, BB, 2B) before being relieved by Nick Vincent.

FINISHING STRONG...over his last 6 starts, LeBlanc is 1-2 with a 1.83 ERA and 3 quality starts...he has allowed 1 or fewer earned runs in 4 of those 6 outings and has pitched at least 5.0 innings in each of them...his 3.55 season ERA is the best mark among Mariners starters (min. 10 GS), and his 1.17 WHIP (38 BB, 145 H, 157.0 IP) trails only **James Paxton** (1.10 / 42 BB, 127 H, 154.1 IP).

FOR STARTERS...since moving into the Mariners rotation on May 3, is 8-5 with a 3.45 ERA (55 ER, 143.1 IP) with 112 strikeouts and 35 walks in 26 starts...the Mariners are 16-10 in those starts...among American League leaders during that span, ranks 6th in WHIP (1.14/35 BB, 129 H, 143.1 IP), 7th in ERA, 8th in BB/9.0 IP (2.20/35 BB, 143.1 IP) and 15th in K/BB (3.20/112 K, 35 BB).

START IT UP...in 34 career starts with the Mariners, is 11-5 with a 3.69 ERA (77 ER, 188.0 IP) with 146 strikeouts and 44 walks...the Mariners are 23-11 in his 34 starts with the club...made 8 starts with Seattle in 2016, going 3-0 with a 4.43 ERA (22 ER, 44.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts and 9 walks.

SCORELESS IN SEATTLE...did not allow a run over 19.0 innings pitched (8/25-9/12), the longest scoreless innings streak among Mariners starters this season.

HE'S A WINNER...made 21 career starts with the Mariners before suffering a loss (6/24/16-7/8/18)...only 1 American League pitcher in the live-ball era had a longer such streak to begin a tenure with a single club (Whitey Ford-NYY, 22, 7/6/50-6/12/53)...among all pitchers in the live-ball era, LeBlanc's streak trailed only Ford and Kirk Rueter-MON (22, 7/7/93-6/15/94)(STATS).

MAKE YOURSELF AT HOME...signed to a contract extension through the 2019 season with annual club options through 2022 on July 3.

THAT'S NEAT!...turned in one of the best starts of his career June 16 vs. Boston, allowing 2 hits and striking out 9 across 7.2 scoreless innings...faced just 1 over the minimum, thanks to a 1st-inning double play...retired 22 straight batters after allowing a leadoff single in the 1st inning, ending with a 2-out single in the 8th...his 7.2 innings and 9 strikeouts were both his most since 2011 with San Diego.

WELCOME (BACK) TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on March 25 after being released by New York-AL at his request...became the 43rd player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners...Mike Blowers (1992-95, 1997, 1999), Raúl Ibáñez (1996-2000, 2004-2008, 2013), Norm Charlton (1993, 1995-97, 2001) and Jeff Nelson (1992-95, 2001-03, 2005) are the only players who spent three separate stints with the Mariners.

CAREER...10-year MLB veteran with 7 clubs (San Diego, Miami, Houston, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Pittsburgh & Seattle)...overall, is 38-39-3 with a 4.22 ERA (344 ER, 733.2 IP) in 207 career appearances/105 starts...in 105 career starts, is 30-36 with a 4.28 ERA (272 ER, 572.1 IP) with 406 strikeouts and 182 walks...in 102 career relief appearances, is 8-4-3 with a 4.02 ERA (72 ER, 161.1 IP) with 125 strikeouts and 43 walks...appeared in 11 games (8 starts) with the Mariners in 2016, going 3-0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (25 ER, 50.0 IP).

ALL HANDS ON DECK...the Mariners have used a total of 53 different players this season...that's the 3rd-most players used in a single season in franchise history, trailing only the 61 players used in 2017 and the 54 used in 2016...Seattle has used 32 different pitchers (including 2 position players: **Andrew Romine**, 3 games, and Taylor Motter) this season; that's tied for second-most ever (1. 40 in 2017; T2. 32 in 2016)...all 38 players on the Mariners current active roster have already appeared in a game this season.

NEED TO GET TO 4...Seattle lost 2-0 vs. the Rangers last night...was the 77th time this season the Mariners had scored 3 or fewer runs in a game, and Seattle fell to 23-54 in those games...77 team games with 3 or fewer runs are T4th-most in the AL (also: KC), trailing only BAL (90), DET (81) and LAA (80) and ranks T8th in MLB...Seattle's 23 wins when scoring 3 or fewer is T1st in the Majors, with the Cubs (23-51) and ahead of the Giants (21-67), Rockies (21-42) and A's (21-40).

OUR LEADERS...Mariners leadoff hitters this season – **Dee Gordon** (99 games), **Mitch Haniger** (43 games), **Jean Segura** (14 games), **Guillermo Heredia** (2 games) and **Denard Span** (1 game) – have combined to hit .353 leading off a game this year, going 54-for-153 with 9 extra-base hits, including 2 home runs...the .353 average leads MLB.

IN THE BLACK...at 86-73, the Mariners have clinched a winning season...2018 is just the third time in franchise history that Seattle never took the field with a record under .500...the Mariners were exactly .500 3 times this year (at 1-1, 3-3 & 4-4) but never fell under .500...the only other seasons the Mariners have been .500 or better on every day of the season were 1996 and 2001.

FOR STARTERS...**Matt Festa** (1.0 IP on Sept. 19) was the 11th different starting pitcher used by the Mariners this season...the 11 starters used by the Mariners this season is tied (w/7 other teams) for 16th-most starters used this season...for Seattle, 5 guys (**Mike Leake**, **Marco Gonzales**, **Félix Hernández**, **James Paxton**, **Wade LeBlanc**) have combined for 141 starts, with each making at least 26, and **Erasmo Ramirez** has chipped in 10, with five other pitchers combining for 8 starts (Elias, 3; Bergman, 2; Festa, Miranda, Vincent, 1)...Seattle used a club-record tying 17 starters in 2017.

THE ROTATION...**Mike Leake** (31 GS), **Marco Gonzales** (29 GS), **Félix Hernández** (28 GS), **James Paxton** (27 GS) and **Wade LeBlanc** (26 GS) have all made 25+ starts this season...the Mariners are the only club in the Majors this season to have 5 pitchers make 25+ starts apiece...2018 is just the fourth time in Seattle franchise history that the club has had five pitchers make at least 25 starts...this year joins 2006 (**Hernández**, Meche, Moyer, Piñeiro & Washburn), 2003 (Franklin, Garcia, Meche, Moyer & Pineiro) and 1991 (DeLucia, Hanson, Holman, R. Johnson & Krueger).

DON'T WALK...Mariners pitchers did not walk a Padres batter Sept. 11, marking the 22nd game this season in which Seattle hurlers did not issue a free pass...the Mariners 22 games issuing 0 walks are tops in the American League and 2nd-most in the Majors this season...they trail only the Dodgers (28), while ranking ahead of Washington (16), Oakland (15) and San Diego (14)...the 22 games with 0 walks issued by Mariners pitchers are the most in single-season club history, surpassing the previous mark of 17 such games set by the 2002 Mariners.

GOOD TO BE HOME...**Nelson Cruz** has hit 21 home runs at Safeco Field this season, which is tied for the most all-time at Safeco Field, along with Richie Sexson's 21 home runs at Safeco Field in 2005...Cruz, who hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in 2017, is joined by Bret Boone (2001) and Edgar Martinez (2000) as the only other players to hit 19 home runs at Safeco Field in a single season...overall this season, Cruz's 21 home runs at home are 5th-most in the American League, trailing only J.D. Martinez-BOS (25), Khris Davis-OAK (23), Joey Gallo-TEX (23) and Justin Upton-LAA (22).

40/100...**Nelson Cruz** has 37 home runs and 96 RBI this season in 159 team games; that puts him on pace for 38 home runs and 98 RBI...Cruz is the only player in baseball to have averaged more than 40 homers and 100 RBI over the past five seasons...since the start of the 2014 campaign, Cruz leads the Majors with 203 home runs (40.6 per year) and is 3rd (trailing Nolan Arenado, 559, & Edwin Encarnación, 548) with 521 RBI (104.0 per year)...he had at least 39 homers and 93 RBI in every season from 2014-2017.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME...the Mariners finished their road slate at 44-37 (.543), and are currently tied for the 6th-most road wins in the Majors...the Mariners are tied with Chicago-NL (44-37), Colorado (44-37), Los Angeles-NL (44-34), Milwaukee (44-37) and St. Louis (44-34), while trailing Houston (54-23), Boston (51-30), Atlanta (46-32), Oakland (46-32) and New York-AL (45-33)...in Mariners club history, the 2018 club is also tied for the 5th-most road wins in a single season (also: 2000, 44-37/.543), trailing 2001 (59-22/.728), 2014 (46-35/.568), 2002 (45-36/.556) and 1997 (45-36/.556).

HOME ON THE ROAD...Seattle finished its road schedule at 44-37 (see above)...Mariners have had a winning road record just 9 times in franchise history, last turning the trick in 2016 (also: 2014, 2003, 2002, 2001, 2000, 1997, 1996).

MR. CONSISTENT...**Mike Leake** has made 31 starts this season, his 7th consecutive season of 30 or more starts...Leake is just the second pitcher in the live ball era with at least 7 straight seasons of 30+ starts and 50 or fewer walks...Leake enters play tonight with 34 walks this year...only Greg Maddux (13 straight, 1996-2008) had more than 7 consecutive 30+ GS/50 or fewer walk seasons...Roy Halladay (2006-11) and Fritz Peterson (1969-74) each had 6 such seasons.

THE OCHO...**Edwin Díaz** had 8 saves vs. both Oakland and Houston this season; that matches the Mariners club record for most saves by a Mariners pitcher vs. any single opponent in a single season...Fernando Rodney (8 vs. OAK in 2014) is the only other Mariners pitcher to record 8 saves vs. 1 opponent in a single season...the AL record is 10, shared by Neftalí Feliz-TEX vs. LAA (2010), Mariano Rivera-NYY vs. BAL (2004) and José Valverde-DET vs. KC (2011).
