OAKLAND ATHLETICS (4-6) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (6-3)

SUNDAY, APRIL 8, 2018 — ANGEL STADIUM — 1:07 P.M. PDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Won last night and have split the last six games with Texas (2-2) and Los Angeles-AL (1-1)...lost three of four to Los Angeles (AL) to start the season...this is the A's 51st season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, two AL Wild Cards, six AL pennants and four World Championships in their 50 seasons in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world titles (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 118th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

BRING IT ON: Despite losing last Sunday when Shohei Ohtani started on the mound, Oakland has won 6 of the last 7 starts made by opposing Japanese-born starters...before the loss, defeated Masahiro Tanaka (2x), Yu Darvish (2x) and Hisashi Iwakuma (2x)...since 2012, the A's are 27-18 against Japanese-born starters...since the 2012 season, have faced Hisashi Iwakuma (16x) and Yu Darvish (16x) the most.

RIGHT FEELS RIGHT: Oakland is facing a right-handed starter today before facing back-to-back lefty starters against the Dodgers on Tuesday and Wednesday...since the start of the 2016 season, Khris Davis leads the Majors with 69 home runs against right-handed pitching, four ahead of New York's Giancarlo Stanton (65) and five ahead of Cleveland's Edwin Encarnacion (64).

JUST GET ON: Matt Chapman has reached base safely via hit or walk at least twice in each of his last 8 games (since March 31)...it is the longest single-season streak by an A's player since Billy Butler reached base safely via hit or walk at least twice in nine straight games (Aug. 31-Sept. 9, 2015)...during the streak he is hitting .483 (13-for-26) with 9 runs, 1 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and a .545 on-base percentage.

WALK AS GOOD AS A HIT: Depite hitting .233 (7-for-30) this year, Matt Joyce has reached base 15 times via hit or walk in his 10 games this year...has .385 on-base percentage on the season...his 15 times reaching base are T4th-most on club behind Matt Chapman (20), Jed Lowrie (18) & Matt Olson (16).

BULLPEN WORKLOAD: The A's bullpen has tossed 36.1 innings this season, 5th-most in the American League and 8th-most in the Majors...in the AL, rank behind just the Angels (44.2), Texas (39.1), Tampa Bay (37.1) and Baltimore (36.2)...amongst AL relievers, Emilio Pagán's 6.2 innings are 4th-most, and Blake Treinen (6.0) ranks T8th in the AL.

HEATING UP: Over the last four games, the A's are hitting a combined .306 (41-for-134) with 25 runs, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 23 RBI, a .390 on-base percentage and a .507 slugging mark, averaging 6.25 runs per game...in the first 6 games of the season, the club hit .239 (49-for-205), averaging 3.0 runs per game...are batting .265 overall, which ranks fourth in the American League and sixth in the Majors...rank second in the AL in walks (40) and second in on-base percentage (.350)...are third in most strikeouts (84).

ROAD WARRIOR: Jed Lowrie has reached base safely via hit or walk in his last 24 road games (since Aug. 19, 2017)...in his last 32 road games (since July 26), he's hitting .299 (35-for-117) with 20 runs, 9 doubles, 1 triple, 6 home runs, 22 RBI, a .407 on-base percentage and a .547 slugging mark...in his first 46 road games of 2017, he hit .253 (43-for-170) with a .326 on-base percentage and a .388 slugging mark.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's continue their first road trip of the season today, an eight-game trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-1), Los Angeles-NL (two games) and Seattle (three games)...went 3-5 on the first homestand against Los Angeles-AL (1-3) and Texas (2-2)...last year, the A's went 46-35 (.568) at home compared to 29-52 (.358) on the road...tied for the fifth best home record in the American League but tied for the second worst road record.

PITCHING: The A's walked two batters yesterday and have issued two free passes or fewer in eight of the first 10 games...have walked 20 batters for the season, which is T2nd-fewest in the Majors, while tossing 91.0 innings, which is the most in the Majors (TEX, 88.0)...are averaging 1.98 walks per nine innings...lead the Majors in wild pitches (10) ahead of Pittsburgh (8)...tallied a franchise record 84 wild pitches last year, which was second most in the majors...have the second highest opponents batting average in the American League (.268).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-5 to start the season and the losses are tied for the most in the Majors...Sean Manaea picked up the first win by an A's starting pitcher Wednesday night...starters had been 0-4 to start the season, which marked the second time in Oakland history A's starters lost at least each of their first four decisions (went 0-7 to start the 1979 season)...yielded 10 runs in the four-game series against vs. Texas (3.47 ERA) after surrendering 16 runs in four-game series against the Angels (6.04 ERA).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-3 in games started by a left-handed pitcher compared to 4-3 when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 3-1 when scoring first, 1-5 when the opponent scores first...have committed one error in six of the 10 games and are tied for third in the AL in errors (6)...last year, the A's led the majors in errors (121) and unearned runs (83).

SCHEDULE NOTES: The A's will play each of their first 22 games on the west coast...began the season with an eight-game homestand against Los Angeles (AL) and Texas and continue an eight-game road trip to Los Angeles (AL), Los Angeles (NL) and Seattle today...return home for a six-game homestand against Chicago (AL) and Boston beginning April 16...this series with the Angels will conclude a season-opening stretch of 11 games in 11 days...have Monday and Thursday off next week and will play eight games over the second 11 days of the season (April 9-19).

THE DISABLED LIST: Oakland has placed outfielders Chad Pinder and Boog Powell on the disabled list in each of the last two days and now have seven players on the DL...the A's began the season with five players on the disabled list for the third consecutive season (Blackburn, Cotton, Dull, Núñez, Phegley)...Blackburn and Cotton are on the 60-day DL...Oakland used the DL 23 times last year and the players combined to miss 1058 games, an average of 46.0 games per stint...it marked the third consecutive season and seventh time in the last 11 years the A's have used the DL at least 20 times...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on DL since end of 2006 season (1).

A'S ON THE RADIO: 95.7 FM The Game is in its eighth season as flagship of the A's Radio Network...due to conflicts with the Warriors, the following games will air in the Bay Area on Q102 (102.1 FM): TODAY against the Angels and Tuesday against the Dodgers...additional updates will be announced based on the Warriors postseason schedule.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have two players under contract beyond the 2018 season...Yusmeiro Petit is signed through 2019 with a club option for 2020 and Stephen Piscotty is signed through 2022 with a club option for 2023.

A'S vs. ANGELS: The A's have lost 4 of the 6 meetings this season vs. the Angels...went 7-12 vs. the Angels last year for the second straight season...the 12 losses matched the most in Oakland history vs. Angels (2009 and 2016)...have lost four straight season series and are 33-49 (.402) against Los Angeles over last five years...this marks the first time the Athletics franchise (Kansas City and Oakland) has lost four straight season series to Angels...went 5-5 in Oakland last year and 2-7 in Anaheim...the seven losses matched Oakland's most in a season at Anaheim (2010 and 2014)...have lost 11 of the last 14 games at Angel Stadium and 27 of the last 39...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 430-370 vs. the Angels...that includes 225-174 in Oakland and 206-195 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 480-446 vs. the Angels.

TODAY'S TOWELS

Matt Joyce has drawn a walk in 5 straight starts and has 8 walks in 7 starts this season...**Matt Chapman** has a Major League leading six multiple hit games...has career-high nine-game hitting streak (15-for-333, .455)...**Jonathan Lucroy** has thrown out 5-of-8 (62.5%) attempted base stealers and the five caught stealings are the most in the majors...has tossed out 182 dating back to 2010, the most by any Major League catcher over that span.

OAKLAND A'S 50th ANNIVERSARY MOMENT

In **1982** Rickey Henderson ties a club record with five walks but the A's lose to California 8-6 in 16 innings...in **2003** Barry Zito extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 2-1 win at Texas, the fifth winning streak of 10 or more games in Oakland history...in **2006** Zito combines with the A's bullpen on a one-hit shutout in a 3-0 win at Seattle after the A's pitching staff tosses a two-hit shutout against the Mariners the night before...the three hits allowed in consecutive games sets an Oakland record.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (0-1, 8.10 ERA)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...has surrendered four home runs over his first two starts, which is tied for the most in the American League...has allowed at least four runs in each start and his 8.10 ERA is fourth highest in the AL...has struck out just one batter in each start...is in his fifth season in the majors and is on his fourth consecutive Opening Day roster...made his second consecutive Opening Day start to become just the second A's pitcher to start back-to-back openers over the last 13 years (Sonny Gray, 2014-15)...Oakland has used 11 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 13 years (Zito, Haren, Blanton, Braden, Sheets, Cahill, McCarthy, Anderson, Gray twice, Hill, Graveman twice).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-5, 11-inning win on Opening Day last Thursday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Simmons RBI single and a Maldonado RBI double...then surrendered solo home runs to Calhoun in the fourth, Cozart in the fifth and Pujols in the sixth...the three home runs allowed matched the Oakland Opening Day record set by Carlos Reyes in 1996...left trailing 5-4 but the A's tied the game with a run in the seventh to get him off the hook.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a Chirinos RBI ground out and an Odor RBI single, and one more in the third on a solo home run by Gallo...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the third, but he allowed another run in the fourth inning on an Odor RBI single.

GRAVEMAN vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 2-2 with a 4.33 ERA (68.2 ip, 73 h, 34 r, 33 er, 16 bb, 46 so, 12 hr) in 12 career starts...is 1-2 with a 4.96 ERA (18 er in 32.2 ip) in six starts in Anaheim and 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA (15 er in 36.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-5 A's win on Opening Day in Oakland on March 29 (see first start above)...went 1-1 with a 4.66 ERA (29.0 ip, 30 h, 15 r, 15 er, 9 bb, 25 so, 5 hr) in five starts last year...the win came in the A's 4-2 victory in Oakland on Opening Day, April 3...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Trout in the third

inning...those were the only runs he would allow in six innings of work...then took the loss in a 2-1 decision at Los Angeles April 27...allowed a RBI single to Pujols and a RBI double to Cron in the first inning but retired each of the next eight batters...Oakland was held to a run on three hits by Nolasco and four relievers...had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win over Los Angeles (AL) May 8 in Oakland...surrendered a two-run home run to Valbuena in the first inning, but those were the only runs he would allow...also had a no decision in the A's 10-8 loss at Anaheim Aug. 30...allowed a solo home run to Trout in the first and a two-run home run to Pujols in the third...allowed two runs in the fifth on another two-run home run by Pujols and left after five innings with an 8-5 lead...the Angels scored five times in the seventh for the win (Hatcher blown save)...had his third no decision in an 8-7, 10-inning loss on Sept. 5...allowed three runs in the second inning on a Phillips RBI single, an Upton bases loaded walk and a Pujols sacrifice fly...the A's scored a run in the fourth but he gave that back on a Pujols RBI single in the fifth...left after five innings with a 5-4 lead but the pen allowed two runs in the sixth for the blown save.

2017 RECAP: Went 6-4 with a 4.19 ERA in 19 starts in a season shortened due to two stints on the disabled list with a strained right shoulder...the ERA was a career high as was his opponents batting average (.280), on-base percentage (.338), slugging percentage (.442) and OPS (.780)...allowed 12 home runs and his average of 1.03 home runs per nine innings was a career low...his 19 starts are his fewest in his three seasons with Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average broke down to .238 (44-for-185) against left-handed hitters compared to .315 (70-for-222) against right-handers...entered the season with a .273 career average against lefties, .272 against righties...opponents batted .266 with runners in scoring position but just .186 with RISP and two outs...eight of the 12 home runs he allowed came with runners on base...had a .240 opponents batting average with two strikes, which was second highest in the American League among pitchers with 100 or more innings pitched...the opponents number three hitter batted .479 with a .528 on-base percentage and .833 slugging percentage.

HOME AND AWAY: Went 5-0 with a 2.94 ERA in 11 starts at home compared to 1-4 with a 6.39 ERA in eight starts on the road...joins Kenny Rogers (11-0 in 1998) and Todd Burns (5-0 in 1988) as the only starting pitchers in Oakland history to go undefeated at home with five or more decisions...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-11 with a 3.66 ERA (92 er in 226.0 ip) in 37 starts in Oakland compared to 10-14 with a 4.85 ERA (103 er in 191.0 ip) in 36 starts on the road.

SUPPORT: Went 0-3 in seven starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 in 12 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-21 in 33 career starts with run support of two or fewer, 21-4 in 40 starts with support of three or more...the bullpen blew the save in five of his 19 starts...over the last three years, the pen has blown 10 saves in his 52 starts.

DAYS REST: Was 3-0 with a 3.47 ERA in eight starts on four days rest, 3-4 with a 4.82 ERA in 11 starts on five days rest or more...is now 11-8 with a 3.91 ERA (89 er in 205.0 ip) in 35 career starts on four days rest compared to 11-17 with a 4.50 ERA (106 er in 212.0 ip) in 38 starts on five days rest or more.

THIS AND THAT: Made 15 of his 19 starts at night... went 5-2 with a 3.39 ERA in 14 starts against AL West competition compared to 1-2 with a 7.52 ERA in five starts against everyone else...had a 7.11 ERA in the first inning, a 3.54 ERA from the second inning on...had four double plays, which tied for second among AL pitchers...tied for ninth in the AL in triples allowed (4).

MORE 2017: Was the A's Opening Day starter on April 3 against Los Angeles (AL) and picked up the win in a 4-2 decision...became the A's 11th different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last 12 years, but just the second to pick up the win...was 2-0 with a 2.00 ERA and .203 opponents batting average in three starts when he was placed on the 10-day disabled April 17 retroactive April 15 with a strained right shoulder...did not have a rehab assignment and was reinstated April 27...had the second unassisted double play by a pitcher in Oakland history April 27 at Los Angeles (AL)...went 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA in four starts in April...the ERA was the second lowest single month ERA of his career (1.93 in June, 2015)...left his start on May 14 at Texas with a 4-3 lead but Madson blew the save...it was the first of five times the bullpen blew a save in one of his starts...was 0-2 with a 4.97 ERA and .289 opponents average in five starts after his April 27 reinstatement from the DL before returning to the DL a second time with a right shoulder strain on May 29 (retroactive to May 26)...was sent to Triple-A Nashville on a rehab assignment July 19 and went 0-1 with a 7.20 ERA and .383 opponents batting average in three starts...was reinstated from the DL Aug. 3 and went 4-2 with a 4.47 ERA and .297 opponents batting average over his final 11 starts...struck out a career-high tying eight batters in a 9-3 victory over Baltimore Aug. 13...that began a season-ending stretch where he went 4-1 with a 3.35 ERA over his final nine starts...the bullpen had three blown saves in his four no decisions over that span and he tossed 2.0 scoreless innings in the other start before he was removed following a rain delay.

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Sean Manaea (1-1, 1.15 ERA): Is scheduled to make his third start of the season...tossed 8.0 innings of 1-run ball in 6-2 win over Texas on April 4...was losing pitcher in his first start, a 2-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Friday in Oakland (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 7 so)...is will be facing the Dodgers for the first time in his career on Tuesday...went 1-0 with a 2.53 ERA in three games this spring, all starts...also pitched in a minor league game on March 23...allowed a .237 opponents batting average...issued five walks in 10.2 innings...compiled a 12-10 record and a 4.37 ERA in 29 starts in his second season in the majors...went 1-3 with a 5.52 ERA and .179 opponents batting average over his first six starts, 7-2 with a 2.92 ERA and .246 opponents average over an 11-start span from May 20 to July 16 and 4-5 with a 5.55 ERA and .328 opponents average over his final 12 starts.

- Have allowed runs in four straight games after going two games without allowing a run.
- Allowed a season-worst eight runs, three earned in the loss on Friday night...it was the most runs the A's bullpen has allowed since 6/4/2017 vs Washington.
- Compiled a 4.57 ERA last year, which was third highest in the AL, eighth highest in Oakland history and the highest since 1998 (4.62).
- Converted 35-of-60 (58.3%) save opportunities...had the third lowest save percentage in the AL, the third most blown saves (25) and tied for the fourth fewest saves (35).
- Allowed 63-of-211 (29.9%) inherited runners to score, which ranked 10th in the AL...the inherited runners were the fewest in the AL.
