PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (32-26) vs CHICAGO CUBS (33-24)

Wednesday, June 6, 2018 – Wrigley Field – 8:05 EDT – Game 59; Road 31

RHP Aaron Nola (7-2, 2.14) vs LHP Jose Quintana (6-4, 4.30)

- LAST NIGHT'S ACTION:** The Phillies defeated the Chicago Cubs, 6-1, at venerable Wrigley Field ... Starter Zach Eflin (W, 2-2), tossed 7.2 innings and allowed 1 run on 8 hits with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts ... Nick Williams hit a two-run home run in the 2nd inning, every player in the starting nine had one hit and the Phillies collected six walks, their most since May 13 (7 BB).
- TRANSACTIONS:** Prior to today's game, **SS J.P. Crawford** (right forearm strain) was activated from the 10-day DL ... To make room for Crawford on the 25-man roster, **INF Mitch Walding** was optioned to Lehigh Valley (AAA).
- NOLA NIGHT AT WRIGLEY:** Tonight, **Aaron Nola** makes his second career start at Wrigley Field, his first since July 26, 2015 when he went 7.2 innings and picked up his first career win in his second career major league start ... Over his first 42 career starts, from July 21, 2015-June 16, 2017, Nola was 15-16 with a 4.39 ERA (117 ER, 239.2 IP), .261/.313/.397 slash line and 23.2% strikeout rate ... However, since June 22, 2017 (a 30-start span), Nola is 16-8, 2.67 ERA (58 ER, 195.1 IP), with a .218/.271/.338 slash line and 27.2% strikeout rate ... **Since June 22, 2017, Nola's 195.1 innings pitched are the most of any starter in the National League** and are the fourth-most of any starter in the majors, trailing only CLE's Corey Kluber (230.0), HOU's Justin Verlander (205.2) and NYY's Luis Severino (198.0) ... Additionally, over the last calendar year (6/6/17-current), Nola's 6.4 fWAR is second-best of any National League starter behind only WSH's Max Scherzer (7.7 fWAR).
- YES SER!** Since making his major league debut on May 7, **Seranthony Dominguez** has tossed 14.2 scoreless innings over 12 appearances and has allowed only two singles and a hit by pitch ... In other words, he has faced 46 batters this season and has retired 43 of them, 16 by strikeout (34.8% SO rate) ... The Phillies are 11-1 in games which Dominguez has pitched ... His 14.2-inning scoreless streak to begin his career is the longest by a Phillies reliever since Todd Frohwirth began his career with 14.2 scoreless innings (1987-88), per *Elias*.
- ENTER STRANDMAN:** The Phillies bullpen has successfully stranded 59 of their last 67 inherited runners (4/9-current) and their 88.1% strand rate is tops in the majors over that stretch (next: SD, 48-58, 82.8%) ... Overall this season, the Phils pen has stranded 66 of the 82 runners they have inherited and their 80.4% strand rate ranks 2nd among all major league bullpens (best: SD, 61-73, 83.6%) ... Individually, **Seranthony Dominguez** has stranded all eight runners he has inherited and **Luis Garcia** is 17-for-18 (94.4%) in stranding runners.
- MY KIND OF TOWN:** Since 2007, the Phillies are 20-17 (.541 win %) in 37 games at Wrigley Field ... That is the highest win percentage for any visiting Major League team with at least 10 games played on the North Side ... In fact, the Phillies are one of only four visiting teams with a record of .500 or better at Wrigley since 2007: Dodgers (20-19, .513), Reds (51-50, .505) and White Sox (16-16, .500) ... Philadelphia has a 5-4-2 series record in their 11 series against the Cubs at Wrigley in that span as well as a +24 run differential in those 37 contests ... A win today or tomorrow would mark Philadelphia's first series win at The Friendly Confines since July 24-26, 2105, when the Phils swept the Cubs 3-0 ... Jerome Williams started the first game of that series, Cole Hamels tossed a no-hitter in game two and Aaron Nola made his second career start in game three.
- STAFF NOTES:** Over their last 27 games (5/5-current), the Phillies starting rotation has posted a 2.45 ERA (43 ER, 158.0 IP) and has struck out 170 of the 635 batters they have faced (26.8%) ... **Philadelphia's 2.45 ERA in that span is best in the majors (next: WSH, 2.50 ERA) and their 26.8% strikeout rate ranks 4th (best: WSH, 29.0%)** ... The staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 23 of those 27 games and 2 ER or fewer in 21 of 27.
- THANK YOU FOR YOUR PATIENCE:** The Phils have seen a total of 8,771 pitches over 2,182 plate appearances this season and their 4.02 pitches per plate appearance rank 2nd in the NL (best: LAD, 4.04) and 4th in the majors (best: NYY, 4.04) ... Philadelphia has the 2nd-best walk rate in the majors at 10.1% (best: NYY, 10.2%) and rank 3rd among all ML teams this season in walks (220) ... Philadelphia currently boasts three different players among the top 14 in walks this season in the majors: Cesar Hernandez (39, T-4th), Carlos Santana (39, T-4th) and Rhys Hoskins (34, T-14th) ... The Phillies have not had three players finish in the top 10 in walks since 1993 when Lenny Dykstra (2nd, 129 BB), Darren Daulton (5th, 117 BB) and John Kruk (8th, 111 BB) did so.
- EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Phillies have collected at least one extra-base hit in 54 consecutive games (since 4/4) and are one of just three teams in 2018 to have a streak of 50 or more straight games with an extra-base hit: Chicago Cubs – 57 straight games (3/29-current) & Texas Rangers – 50 straight games (4/3-5/27) ... This current stretch marks Philadelphia's longest extra-base hit streak since 2015-16, when they did so in 54 straight games (9/22/15-5/20/16) ... An extra-base hit tonight would give the Phils their longest extra-base hit streak since August 30, 2008-June 25, 2009 when they did so in 97 straight games.
- A TALE OF TWO MONTHS:** Over 28 games and 81 plate appearances since May 1, **Nick Williams** is slashing .270/.333/.531 with 6 HR, 13 RBI and 5 walks ... His 6 homers in that span rank 2nd on the team trailing only Carlos Santana (7) ... Williams started the year with a .532 OPS through 59 plate appearances from 3/29-4/30 but from May 1 on, has posted an .874 OPS in 81 plate appearances.

LAST START: 5/31 at LAD: W, 7.0 IP, 2 H, R, ER, BB, 7 SO ... Nola vs Kershaw ... Seranthony Dominguez was summoned in relief of Nola and retired all 6 Dodgers he faced as he recorded a two-inning save as the Phillies split the four-game series.

TONIGHT'S START:

- Minimalist:** Has tossed at least 6.0 innings and allowed 2 or fewer hits in each of his last 2 starts, something he also did in a 2-start span in 2016 (4/28-5/3) ... Per Elias, **the only other Phillie in the modern era (since 1900) to do so twice in his career was Grover Cleveland Alexander (both in 1915)** ... No Phillie has had three straight such starts (last MLB'er: Sean Newcomb, 5/2-13/18)
- May Day:** Finished May with a 1.80 ERA (8 ER, 40.0 IP) in the month ... Ranked 7th among qualifying NL pitchers in IP and 7th in ERA in May and **was the only NL pitcher to have a sub-2.00 ERA in at least 40.0 IP** ... No Phillies pitcher has done that in a month since Cole Hamels in Sept. 2014 (1.96 ERA in 41.1 IP) ... **Additionally, per Elias, since the NL started recording ER in 1912, the only two Phillies pitchers (min. 10 GS) to have both a lower season ERA and lower season WHIP through the end of May than Nola (2.18, 0.932) were Hall of Famers Robin Roberts (1.99 ERA, 0.919 WHIP, 1952) & Grover C. Alexander (1.58 ERA, 0.928 WHIP, 1915)**
- Best of the Best:** Per Fangraphs, in the last calendar year, Nola ranks 3rd in IP (214.1), 5th in fewest HR/9.0 IP (0.76), T-6th in wins (17), 7th in WHIP (1.07), T-8th in starts (33), 9th in ERA (2.81) and 10th in SO (229) and lowest OPP AVG (.219) ... **In that span, Nola's WAR of 6.1 ranks 6th, trailing Corey Kluber (9.1), Max Scherzer (7.7), Luis Severino (7.1), Justin Verlander (6.8) and Chris Sale (6.2)**
- 2018 ML Starter Rankings:** 2nd in OPP OPS (.521), 6th in ERA (2.18), WHIP (0.93) & HR/9.0 IP (0.46), 9th in fewest pitchers/IP (14.9), 10th in OPP AVG (.201)
- Trifecta:** Per Fangraphs, Nola's changeup (2nd), fastball (4th) and curveball (15th) all rank in the top 15 in terms of pitch value (how well a pitcher performed using a certain pitch) among qualified pitchers
- vs NL Central:** 10-5, 2.65 ERA (33 ER, 112.0 IP) in 17 starts

- 2018:** 2-2, 2.45 ERA (10 ER, 36.2 IP) in 6 starts
- Career:** 12-12, 4.02 ERA (95 ER, 212.2 IP) in 37 starts

2018 SEASON:

- Carried a no-hitter through 6.2 innings, 5/26 vs TOR, the longest no-hit bid of his career ... Retired 18 straight at one point ... Struck out 10
- Won each of his first 5 home starts, something no Phillie had done since 2010 (Roy Oswalt)
- Allowed 3 ER or fewer in 13 straight starts, 9/7/17-5/13/18
- Struck out a career-high 12 batters on 5/8 vs SF, becoming the first Phillie since 8/3/06 (Hamels) to finish a start with at least 12 strikeouts and 25 or fewer batters faced ... Recorded 9 straight outs via strikeout during his start vs SF (last out of 2nd to 2 outs in 5th)
- His start on 5/2 at MIA (7.1 IP) was the 2nd-longest scoreless start of his career (longest: 8.0 IP, 8/23/15 at MIA)
- Had a 14.1-inning scoreless streak, 4/27-5/8
- Surrendered 2 runs or fewer in 8 straight starts from 9/13/17 to 4/21/18, marking the 7th time a Phillies starter has accomplished the feat since 1893 when the current mound distance was established (had a PHI record 10 straight last season)
- Allowed 4 or fewer hits in each of his first 4 starts of the season, the first Phillie to do so in his first 4 starts since 2005 (Rob Tejada, 5)
- Tied a career high with 8.0 IP on 4/10 vs CIN
- Made his first career Opening Day start on 3/29 at ATL ... At 24 years, 298 days old, he was the club's youngest Opening Day starter since Dennis Bennett in 1964 (24 years, 192 days old)

2017 SEASON:

- Had the most SO (184) ever by a Phillies pitcher who made fewer than 30 starts in a season
- Averaged 9.86 SO/9.0 IP (184 SO/168.0 IP), becoming the 2nd qualifying Phillie with a SO/9.0 IP that high (other: Curt Schilling, 11.29 in 1997 and 10.05 in 1998)
- Had 10 straight starts with 2 or fewer runs allowed (6/22-8/12), the longest such streak by a Phillie since the current mound distance was established in 1893

CAREER:

- Selected by the Phillies in the 1st round (7th overall) of the June 2014 draft out of Louisiana State University ... Was signed by Mike Stauffer ... Originally selected by Toronto in the 22nd round of the June 2011 draft, but did not sign
- His 23.0-inning scoreless streak, 4/22-5/8/16 remains the longest by a Phillies starter since Cole Hamels' 24.2-inning streak, 6/1-21/14
- Was the first player drafted by Philadelphia to make his ML debut the very next season since Pat Combs in 1989
