RECENT RESULTS: The Tigers suffered a 5-2 loss to the Cardinals on Sunday afternoon at Comerica Park. Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of doubles in the game, while Ronny Rodriguez added a hit and a RBI. Michael Fulmer started for Detroit and took the loss after allowing five runs, only three earned, on five hits with three walks and five strikeouts in 6.1 innings. The Tigers continue their six-game homestand tonight as they begin a three-game series vs. Houston. Following the three-game set vs. the Astros and an off day on Thursday, Detroit heads to Cleveland for a three-game series against the Indians.

IN THE NICK OF TIME: Nicholas Castellanos had a pair of doubles in yesterday's game to post his 48th multi-hit game of the season, which is tied for the fifth-most in the American League. With two doubles yesterday, Castellanos now has 39 on the season, which ranks tied for fifth in the AL. Castellanos has hit safely in 12 of his last 17 games, and is batting .343/.421/.507 with nine runs scored, five doubles, two home runs and eight RBI during that stretch.

FIRE THE McCANNON: James McCann threw out Yairo Muñoz attempting to steal in the sixth inning of yesterday's game. McCann now has 21 catcher caught stealings this season, which is the third-most in the Majors, trailing only Oakland's Jonathan Lucroy (23) and Kansas City's Salvador Perez (22). Since the start of the 2015 season, McCann ranks third among active catchers with 88 catcher caught stealings, trailing only Lucroy (103) and Perez (91).

START ME UP: Detroit starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs-or-less in nine straight games, dating back to August 31. During that stretch, Tigers starters have posted a 2.86 ERA (50.1IP/16ER) with a .169 (30x178) opponents batting average and 55 strikeouts. Detroit's .169 opponent batting average during that time period is the lowest among American League starting staffs, while they rank second in ERA.

STEWART MAKES MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT: Christin Stewart made his Major League debut in yesterday's game, pinch hitting in the ninth inning. Stewart, who is ranked as the sixth-best prospect in the Tigers organization by MLB Pipeline, became the eighth Detroit player to make his Major League debut this season.

FAMILIAR FACE: Former Tiger Justin Verlander takes the mound for the Astros tonight in the series opener. Verlander, who was traded by Detroit to Houston on August 31, 2017, pitched for the Tigers for 13 seasons, posting a 183-114 record with a 3.49 ERA (2511.0IP/975ER) and 2,373 strikeouts in 380 starts. He ranks second in franchise history in strikeouts, while he is fifth in games started, seventh in wins and eighth in innings pitched.

AT COMERICA PARK: Detroit is 2-1 on its current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. St. Louis (2-1) and three games vs. Houston (September 10-12). The Tigers are currently in a stretch that will see them play 13-of-16 games at home. Detroit is 36-34 at Comerica Park this season, where the team is hitting .252/.310/.394 as a team, and the pitching staff has posted a 4.04 ERA (650.0IP/292ER).

TIGERS AND ASTROS: The Tigers and Astros continue their six-game season series tonight. Houston won two-of-three games over Detroit when the teams played at Minute Maid Park earlier this season. The Astros won the season series in 2017, 4-3, but the Tigers took two-of-three games at Comerica Park, where they have an overall record of 17-6 vs. Houston. Detroit has won the overall season series in three of the last five years.

WILD, WILD WEST: Detroit is 10-21 against teams from the American League West this season. The Tigers have not finished with a winning record against the AL West since 2014 (18-16), and they are 36 games under .500 against the division since 2015 (47-83, .362).

NOTES ON THE SKIPPER: Ron Gardenhire is in his first season as the Tigers manager after being named to the position on October 20, 2017.

*Enters tonight's game with a 59-84 (.413) record as the Tigers manager and a 1,127-1,123 (.501) career record as a manager, which is the eighth-most wins among active managers and ranks 53rd in baseball history...is two victories away from tying Art Howe for 52nd.

*Earned the 1,100th win of his managerial career on June 13 vs. Minnesota.

*Spent the 2017 season as the bench coach for the Arizona Diamondbacks, who captured a National League Wild Card spot and advanced to the National League Division Series.

*Served as manager of the Minnesota Twins from 2002-14 and is the winningest manager in Twins history, posting a record of 1,068-1,039 (.507) over his 13 seasons...is one of 10 managers in baseball history to win 1,000-or-more games with a single team.

*Guided the Twins to six postseason appearances (2002-04, 2006, 2009-10), including a berth in the 2002 American League Championship Series...was the first manager in MLB history to guide his team to the postseason in six of his first nine seasons.

*Named the BBWAA American League Manager of the Year in 2010...also finished runner-up for the honor on five occasions.

WHITECAPS ELIMINATED FROM PLAYOFFS: Single A West Michigan was eliminated from the Midwest League playoffs last night with a 3-1 loss at Bowling Green. The Whitecaps advanced to the postseason for the fifth consecutive season.

ABOUT FRANCISCO: Liriano will make his 24th appearance overall and 23rd start of the season tonight in the series opener vs. Houston.

LAST TIME OUT: Liriano picked up his first win since April 28 on Tuesday at Chicago (AL), allowing three runs, two earned, on seven hits with one walk and five strikeouts in 5.0 innings.

VS. HOUSTON: Liriano, who was traded to the Astros last July and helped the club to the World Series title, will make his fifth career start against Houston tonight. In four previous starts against the Astros, he has a 2-1 record with a 4.37 ERA (22.2IP/11ER) and 18 strikeouts. He faced Houston earlier this season on July 15 at Minute Maid Park, and received a no decision after giving up one run on one hit with three walks and three strikeouts in 3.0 innings.

AT COMERICA PARK: Liriano is making his 24th career appearance and 20th career start at Comerica Park tonight. In his previous 23 outings in Detroit, Liriano has a 6-10 record with a 5.63 ERA (102.1IP/64ER) and 102 strikeouts. In eight outings, including seven starts, at home this season, Liriano is 2-3 with a 5.35 ERA (38.2IP/23ER) and 34 strikeouts.

AGAINST THE AL WEST: Liriano has made 70 career appearances, including 54 starts, against teams from the American League West and has a 20-19 record with one save, a 4.37 ERA (313.1IP/152ER) and 288 strikeouts. In four starts vs. AL West teams this season, Liriano has a 0-1 record with a 2.70 ERA (20.0IP/6ER) and 14 strikeouts.

RECORD IN SEPTEMBER: Liriano has made 63 appearances, including 42 starts, in his career during the month of September, posting a 16-14 record with a 4.21 ERA (248.0IP/116ER) and 271 strikeouts. In 10 relief outings last September, Liriano had a 0-0 record with a 1.59 ERA (5.2IP/1ER) and seven strikeouts.

LEFT VS. RIGHT: Liriano has limited lefthanded hitters to a .217 (314x1444) batting average in his career, while righties have hit .250 (1258x5024). In 23 appearances, including 22 starts, this season, lefties are hitting .146 (12x82), which is the third-lowest batting average against lefthanded hitters among American League pitchers (min. .80 at-bats). Righthanded batters are hitting .290 (98x338) against Liriano.

PILING UP THE PUNCHOUTS: Liriano has posted 27 games of 10-or-more strikeouts in his career. His last double-digit strikeout performance came on April 13, 2017 vs. Baltimore, when he punched out 10 batters. Liriano enters tonight's game with 1,729 strikeouts in his Major League career, which are the fifth-most by a Dominican-born pitcher in MLB history.

IMPRESSIVE START TO 2018: Liriano began the season by allowing three runs-or-fewer in each of his first seven starts. The streak was his second longest to start a season in his career, trailing only a streak of 10 straight starts from May 19-July 8, 2006.

TIGERS PITCHER OF THE MONTH FOR MARCH/APRIL: Liriano was named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for March/April after posting a 3-1 record with a 3.38 ERA (29.1IP/11ER) and 21 strikeouts in five starts. He ranked 10th in the American League with a .196 (20x102) opponents batting average.

DON'T CALL IT A COMEBACK: Liriano has twice earned Comeback Player of the Year honors, receiving the honor in the American League with the Minnesota Twins in 2010 and in the National League with the Pittsburgh Pirates in 2013. He is the only player to win the award multiple times.

TOSSING A NO-NO: Liriano threw a no-hitter as a member of the Minnesota Twins on May 3, 2011 at Chicago (AL). He became the fifth pitcher born in the Dominican Republic to throw a no-hitter, joining Juan Marichal (1963), Ramon Martinez (1995), Jose Jimenez (1999) and Ubaldo Jimenez (2010).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Liriano was signed by the Tigers as a free agent on February 23, 2018. He was originally signed by the San Francisco Giants as a non-drafted free agent on September 9, 2000. Liriano has played with six teams at the Major League level, including Minnesota (2005-12), Chicago (AL) (2012), Pittsburgh (2013-16), Toronto (2016-17), Houston (2017) and Detroit (2018).

ABOUT JORDAN: Zimmermann will make his 22nd start of the season tomorrow night vs. Houston.

LAST TIME OUT: Zimmermann earned his seventh win of the season on Wednesday at Chicago (AL), throwing 5.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and three strikeouts.

VS. HOUSTON/AT COMERICA PARK: Zimmermann has faced the Astros seven times in his career, posting a 2-3 record with a 3.09 ERA (43.2IP/15ER) and 37 strikeouts. Zimmermann has allowed three earned runs-or-less in six of his seven career starts vs. the Astros. He made two starts vs. Houston last season and went 0-1 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0IP/5ER) and five strikeouts. Zimmermann has made 35 appearances, including 34 starts, at Comerica Park in his career, compiling a 14-15 record with a 5.96 ERA (188.2IP/125ER) and 130 strikeouts. In 10 home starts this season, Zimmermann is 4-3 with a 4.06 ERA (57.2IP/26ER) and 51 strikeouts.
