WHITE SOX AT A GLANCE

- The Chicago White Sox have lost seven straight games, 11 of 12, 13 of 17 and 20 of 25 as they continue a five-game, six-day trip this afternoon with the finale vs. the Cubs at Wrigley Field.
- RHP Lucas Giolito, who owns a 4.07 ERA on the road (13.89 at Guaranteed Rate Field), takes the mound for the White Sox.
- The White Sox 9-27 (.250) record is the worst in baseball, behind Baltimore (12-28, .300) and Cincinnati (13-27, .325) ... they are the only club in MLB without 10 wins.
- Following this afternoon's game and an off day tomorrow, the Sox will conclude the trip with two games at PNC Park (5/15-16).
- The White Sox went 1-5 on their last homestand vs. Minnesota and Pittsburgh from 5/3-9 and 3-4 on their last trip at Kansas City and St. Louis from 4/26-5/2.

TODAY'S STORYLINES

- Chicago is a season-high 18 games under .500 ... the club's 9-27 start is the worst in club history ... the Sox worst 37-game win-loss mark was 10-27 in 1948.
- The White Sox have lost six consecutive games, 10 of the last 13 and 12 of the last 16 on the road ... they have scored two runs or less four times during the six-game losing streak.
- The White Sox are trying to avoid being swept for the sixth time this season, and third on the road (series of two-plus games).
- Lucas Giolito is 1-2 with a 9.00 ERA (18 ER/18.0 IP), .310 opp. average and 1.94 WHIP over his last four starts (one QS).
- Yolmer Sánchez is hitting .389/.389/.583 with three doubles, two triples and four RBI in his last nine games (hit safely in eight).
- José Abreu has hit safely in 10 of his last 12 games vs. the Cubs, batting .386 (17-44) with three homers and eight RBI.

YESTERDAY'S RECAP

- José Abreu grounded out to first base with the bases loaded as the Cubs stymied the White Sox rally in their 8-4 victory.
- The Sox loaded the bases on Leury García's single, Trayce Thompson's reach-on-an-error and Tim Anderson's walk before Brandon Morrow retired Abreu, who represented the tying run.
- The Cubs led 5-0 after two innings, highlighted by Anthony Rizzo's three-run home run ... the Cubs added three more in the seventh before the White Sox responded with three in the eighth on Matt Davidson's three-run homer (No. 10) to right field.
- James Shields suffered the loss after allowing five runs on seven hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 6.0 IP ... he retired 14 of the final 15 batters he faced.
- Adam Engel went 3-4 with a double and two runs scored as the leadoff hitter, and Abreu went 2-5 with a double ... the Sox went 1-9 with RISP and left eight runners on base.

BURY THE BROOMS

- The Sox are trying to avoid being swept by the Cubs for the eighth time in Crosstown Cup series history (two-plus games).
- They have been swept six times at Wrigley Field (1998, 2004, '07, '08, '13, '16) and once at Guaranteed Rate Field (2017).
- By comparison, the White Sox have swept the Cubs six times: twice at Guaranteed Rate Field (2008, '16) and four times at Wrigley Field (1999, 2012, '14, '15).

HOME AWAY FROM HOME

- Lucas Giolito is 1-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 ER/24.1 IP) and .221 opponents average (19-86) over his four road starts ... he has allowed three runs or less in three of the outings.
- By comparison, he has allowed 18 runs on 16 hits, including 12 walks, over 11.2 IP at Guaranteed Rate Field.

HIP HIP ELOY!

- Class AA Birmingham OF Eloy Jiménez last night had his 15-game hitting streak snapped at Mobile ... the hitting streak was the longest in the Southern League this season.
- He is hitting .366 (26-71) with nine doubles, five home runs, and 19 RBI over his last 16 game ... Jiménez has hit safely in 18 of his 23 games with the Barons this season, including 11 multihit efforts (nine straight from 4/30-5/9).
- He ranks among SL leaders in RBI (T1st, 24), homers (T2nd, 7), SLG (2nd, .632), AB/HR (2nd, 13.57) and average (9th, .316).

NO RISP, NO REWARD

- The White Sox rank 14th in the American League and 29th in MLB with a .211 (60-284) average with RISP this season.
- Chicago is hitting .214 (15-70) with RISP in the last 10 games, compared to .305 (18-59) in the previous eight ... the Sox have been limited to two hits or less w/RISP 28 times in 2018.

WHITE SOX VS. CHICAGO CUBS

- The Cubs lead the season series, 2-0, with one game remaining at Wrigley Field and three at Guaranteed Rate Field.
- The Sox have lost seven of the last eight games and 10 of 14 ... the club is 1-6 in the last seven and 5-8 in the last 13 at Cubs.
- The White Sox went 1-3 last season, splitting two games at Wrigley Field and losing both contests at Guaranteed Rate Field ... the Sox scored three runs or less in all four games, and were outscored, 22-11, in the season series.
- The White Sox are 1-2-2 in season series since 2013 after winning four straight from 2009-12.
- The Sox lead the all-time series, 58-56, going 30-26 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 28-30 at Wrigley Field.

CROSTOWN CONNECTIONS

- Below is a breakdown of Crosstown Cup connections for members of the White Sox roster, coaches and broadcasters:
 - ◆ Manager Rick Renteria led the Cubs to a 73-89 record in 2014.
 - ◆ C Wellington Castillo played for the Cubs from 2010-15 after signing with the club as an international free agent on 12/8/04.
 - ◆ RHP Chris Volstad appeared in 21 games for the Cubs in 2012.
 - ◆ TV analyst Steve Stone and radio analyst Darrin Jackson played for both clubs ... Stone spent 20 years as a Cubs TV analyst.
- A breakdown of Crosstown Cup connections for members of the Cubs roster, coaches and broadcasters:
 - ◆ Pitching coach Jim Hickey is a Chicago native, graduate of Kennedy High School and was selected by the White Sox in the 13th round of the 1983 draft ... he pitched in the Sox system from 1983-87.
 - ◆ LHP José Quintana pitched for the White Sox from 2012-17, and was named an American League All-Star in 2016.
 - ◆ Quintana was acquired by the Cubs from the Sox in exchange for four prospects, including OF Eloy Jiménez and RHP Dylan Cease on 7/13/17 ... it marked the teams' 15th trade involving MLB players.
 - ◆ TV analyst Ron Coomer is a Chicago native and Lockport H.S. grad.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT

- The White Sox are 0-6 during interleague play, their worst start vs. the National League in a season in franchise history.
- Chicago has lost seven straight and 15 of the last 17 road IL games ... its last road IL win came on 7/24/17 at the Cubs.
- The Sox went 6-14 during IL play last season and have not recorded a winning record since 2014 (11-9).
- The Sox are 206-183 (.530) all-time during IL (since 1997).
- José Abreu owns a 13-game, IL hitting streak, batting .440/.463/.940 with five doubles, six home runs and 14 RBI.

PUT AWAY THE SUITCASE

- The White Sox currently are in a stretch playing 17 of 19 games in Chicago, including 14 at Guaranteed Rate Field, from 5/3-24.
- In addition to the just completed six-game homestand and this weekend's series at Wrigley Field, the Sox will play four-game series vs. Texas (5/17-20) and Baltimore (5/21-24).
- The club's only road games are at the Pirates from 5/15-16.
- Chicago has been outscored, 104-62, at home in 2018.

STOP! THIEF!

- The White Sox lead the American League and rank second in baseball with 32 stolen bases ... the club ranks third in the major leagues with an 82.1 (32-39) success rate.
- Tim Anderson (2nd, 10), Leury García (T9th, 6) and Adam Engel (T11th, 5) rank among AL steals leaders this season.
- The Sox are on pace to steal 144 bases this season ... by comparison, they stole 71 bases in 2017 and 77 in 2016.

ONE (RUN) AND DONE

- Chicago has gone 4-10 in one-run games in 2018, tied for the fifth-most in the major leagues ... Tampa Bay (5-12) leads MLB with 17 one-run games this season.
- The Sox 10 one-run losses are the second-most in baseball.
- The Sox were 21-23 in one-run games in 2017.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY

- The White Sox have made a major-league leading 1,328 quality starts since the start of the 2003 season, three more than the second-place New York Mets (1,325) and 43 more than Oakland (1,285), the next-closest American League team.
- The Sox are 5-8 when receiving a QS this season.

ON DECK: AT PITTSBURGH PIRATES

- Pittsburgh leads the season series, 2-0, after winning both games at Guaranteed Rate Field from 5/8-9.
- The Sox are hitting .296/.342/.549 with four homers, own an 8.00 ERA (16 ER/18.0 IP) and have been outscored, 16-11.
- The White Sox have lost six consecutive games to the Pirates after being swept in the four-game season series in 2015 ... they have been outscored, 36-15, during the losing streak.
- Chicago is 17-15 all-time, going 9-7 at Guaranteed Rate Field and 8-8 on the road (6-5 at PNC Park).

GIOLITO AT A GLANCE

- The 23-year-old makes his eighth start of the season (fifth on the road) and first against the Cubs.
- Is 1-2 with a 4.07 ERA (11 ER/24.1 IP) in four road starts this season and 0-2 with a 13.89 ERA (18 ER/11.2 IP) over three starts at home.
- Is receiving just 3.00 runs of support per 9.0 IP, the fifth-lowest in the American League and 10th-lowest in the major leagues ... has received zero runs of support four times and one run once.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster.
- Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP) over his final six starts with the White Sox in 2017.
- Lost 10 pounds in the offseason, dropping from 255 to 245.
- Was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Reynaldo López in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.
- Bio is on pages 83-84 of the 2018 White Sox media guide.

LAST START

- Posted a no decision on 5/8 at Pittsburgh ... allowed four runs on a career-high tying seven hits over 4.0 IP ... walked two and struck out three ... was staked to a 4-0 lead after one inning but gave up four runs in the second ... left with a 4-4 tie after throwing 98 pitches (60 strikes) ... Sox lost, 10-6.

2018 NOTES OF INTEREST

- Has limited opponents to a .231 (27-117) average but has issued 6.5 walks per 9.0 IP (24 BB/32.0 IP) with a 0.78 SO/BB ratio ... is tied for the American League lead with 23 walks and is tied for second with five hit batsmen ... has made three quality starts in seven outings.
- Earned his first victory of the season and first career road win on 4/26 at Kansas City ... allowed career highs of nine runs and seven walks over 2.0 IP on 4/21 vs. Houston ... his three HBP on 4/7 vs. Detroit were the most by a Sox starter since Chris Sale on 9/21/16 at Philadelphia (also three).

DAY AND NIGHT

- Has gone 3-2 with a 2.52 ERA (11 ER/39.2 IP) and .167 (23-138) opponents average over six starts during the day since 2017, compared to 1-5 with a 6.43 ERA (30 ER/42.0 IP) and .269 (43-160) opponents average in eight starts at night.
- His 0.99 ERA during the day in 2017 would have led the American League with the required IP.

IT'S ALL ME

- Is one of 35 members of the Taylor Hooton Foundation advisory board, which is recognized as the leader in advocacy against appearance and performance enhancing drug use by the youth of America.
- The advisory board is comprised of at least one member from each of the 30 Major League clubs ... the players will participate in the THF 2018 public service campaign, including "It's All Me" themed PSAs which will appear in MLB's 2018 All-Star Game, League Championship Series and World Series programs.

2017 RECAP

- Made 24 starts with Class AAA Charlotte and seven with the White Sox in his first season in the organization.
- Went 3-2 with a 1.83 ERA (8 ER/39.1 IP), 30 strikeouts, a .177 (25-141) opponents average and 0.94 WHIP over his final six starts ... five of the outings were quality.
- Was recalled on 8/23 and made his White Sox debut that night vs. Minnesota (4 ER/6.0 IP; 3 HR) ... earned his first win with the Sox on 8/27 vs. Detroit, allowing just three hits over 7.0 scoreless IP.
- Allowed one run and struck out a career-high 10 over 7.0 IP on 9/3 vs. Tampa Bay ... became the first Sox pitcher to strike out 10-plus batters within his first three starts with the club since Chris Sale in 2012.
- Received a ND on 9/13 at Kansas City, allowing one run on four hits in 6.1 IP ... became the 15th Sox pitcher to make four-plus straight starts of 5.0-plus IP and four hits or less allowed ... earned the win in his final start on 9/24 vs. Kansas City (1 ER/7.0 IP).
- Began the season with Charlotte ... at the time of his promotion, ranked among the IL leaders in shutouts (2nd), starts (T2nd), strikeouts (3rd), SO/9.0 (4th, 9.37) and IP (7th).
- Went 3-1 with a 1.71 ERA (6 ER/31.2 IP), 28 strikeouts and just two home runs allowed over his final five starts ... threw his first professional no-hitter on 5/25-1 vs. Syracuse (7.0 IP), marking the first no-hitter in BB&T Ballpark history ... was named IL Pitcher of the Week for 5/22-28.
- Entered the season ranked by MLB.com as the No. 12 Prospect in baseball.

- His parents, Rick Giolito and Lindsay Frost, are Hollywood actors ... Rick has appeared in "As the World Turns," "Who's the Boss," "Hunter," "Jake and the Fatman," "Twin Peaks" and "Hit the Dutchman" ... Lindsay acted in "The Ring," "Collateral Damage," "Without a Trace," "The Unit," "Boston Legal," "Crossing Jordan," "Lost," "Frasier" and "CSI."
- His uncle, Mark Frost, is a co-creator and writer of the ABC and Showtime drama "Twin Peaks."
- Grandfather, Warren Frost, was a veteran actor who played George Costanza's father-in-law, Henry Ross, on the award-winning sitcom "Seinfeld."

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

- Was selected by Washington in the first round (16th overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft ... was committed to play baseball at UCLA prior to signing with the Nationals.
- Is a 2012 graduate of Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles, where he was teammates with RHP Max Fried ... Fried was selected by San Diego with the seventh overall pick in the 2012 draft and currently pitches for the Atlanta Braves.

VS. CHICAGO CUBS

- Makes his first career start against the Cubs and fourth career during interleague play ... is 0-2 with a 5.74 ERA (10 ER/15.2 IP) lifetime in IL play ... posted a no decision in his last start on 5/8 vs. Pittsburgh (see "Last Start") ... lost on 5/2 at St. Louis despite making a quality start (3 ER/6.1 IP).

TUESDAY'S PROBABLE STARTER

- RHP Reynaldo López (0-2, 2.44) is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season (fourth on the road) and third career against Pittsburgh (second in a row) ... ranks among the American League leaders in ERA (8th) and opponents average (9th, .196) ... has allowed two or fewer earned runs in six of his seven starts.
- Posted a ND in his last start on 5/8 vs. Pittsburgh despite allowing two runs on three hits over a career-high 7.1 and leaving with a 4-2 lead ... struck out 10 batters on 4/16 at Oakland ... lost on 4/8 vs. Tampa Bay despite allowing one unearned run on two hits over a career-high tying 7.0 IP ... became the first Sox starter since at least 1908 to lose a game in which he threw 7.0-plus IP while giving up two or fewer hits and one run which was unearned (source: Baseball Reference and STATS LLC).
- Won his only previous start at PNC Park on 9/24/16 (with Washington), allowing three hits over 5.1 scoreless IP ... was acquired from Washington on 12/7/16 with RHP Dane Dunning and RHP Lucas Giolito in exchange for OF Adam Eaton.
